



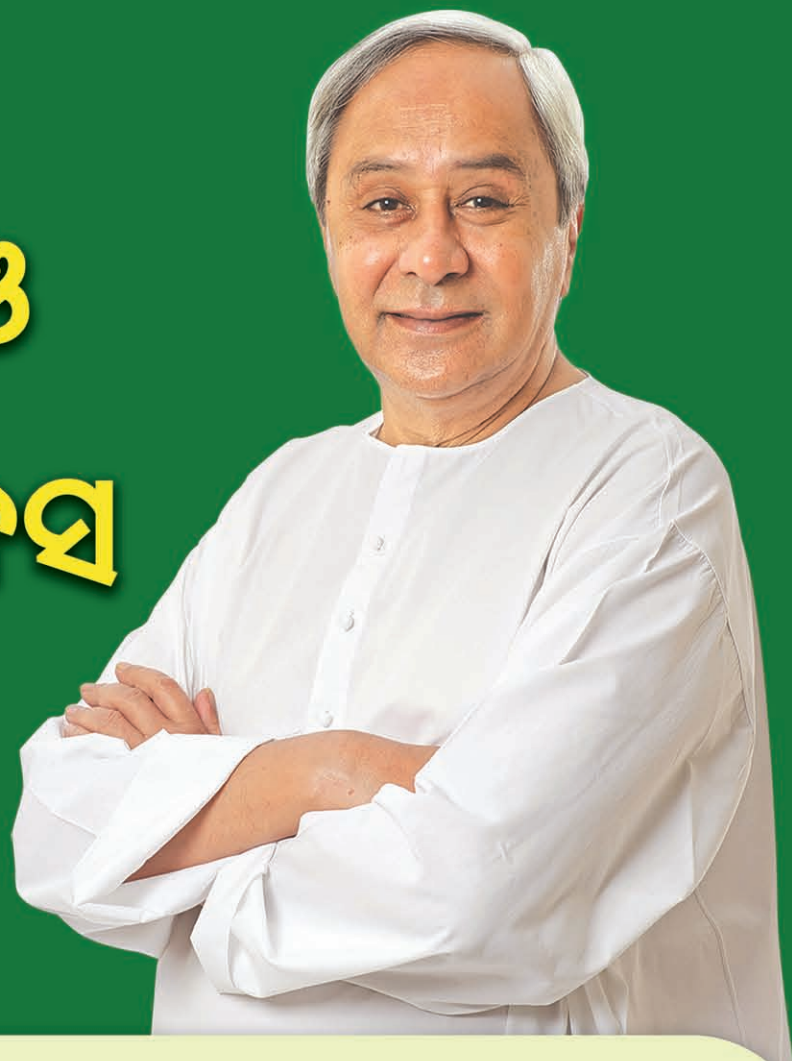

shop where the actors were introduced to different aspects of theatre, he added.

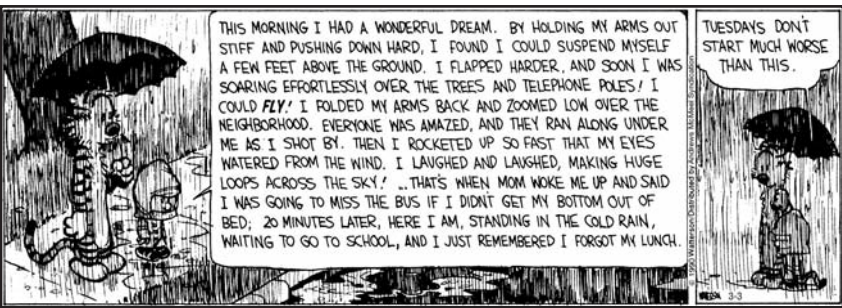

Action against people showing fake papers for Covid-19 shots

Bhubaneswar, March 4: The Health department Thursday asked citizens to refrain from the practice of furnishing fake co-morbidity certificates to get the Covid-19 vaccination in the ongoing drive.

State Health and Family Welfare director Bijoy Panigrahi told reporters that strict actions could be taken against such persons indulging in unfair practice.

“Those found indulging in such activities would be handled as per law and punished accordingly. Till now we have not seen such activities. The doctors at such vaccine centres are verifying the health conditions too,” he said.

The official said that the health ministry norms had been disseminated to all hospitals where 20 forms of co morbidities were identified. “The vaccine centre handlers have been asked to verify the comorbidity certificates. Only an MBBS doctors or those having higher qualifications can issue such certificates. Fake certificates could not be accepted at the vaccination centres,” he said.

The Health department now claims that the vaccination drive for Covid-19 for senior citizens is going on smoothly in the state. The drive for frontline workers and health workers is also running parallel.

The official said it has been working to expand the number of vaccination centres across the state. “There are now around 36 private hospitals that are onboard for vaccination. The process is on to expand the private sector vaccination centre. We are increasing the vaccination centres across the state now,” the official added.

Meanwhile, the state Prisons

State sees 81 fresh cases, tally 3,37,529

The state’s Covid-19 caseload mounted to 3,37,529 Thursday after 81 more people tested positive for the infection, a Health department official said.

The coastal state’s death toll remained unchanged at 1,917 as no fresh fatality was reported since Wednesday.

Of the 81 new cases, 49 were cases of quarantine—at home or designated centres—and the rest were detected during contact tracing, the official said. The positivity rate stands at 4.02 per cent.

Sambalpur accounted for the

maximum number of new cases at 14, followed by Mayurbhanj at eight. Currently, Odisha has 792 active cases, while 3,34,767 patients have recovered from the highly infectious disease. Over 84 lakh sample tests have been conducted in the state so far, including 21,850 in the past 24 hours.

As many as 28,260 people, comprising senior citizens, healthcare workers, other frontline Covid-19 warriors and people in the age group of 45 to 59 years were inoculated across the state Wednesday, the official added.

Directorate has directed all the jail superintendents across Odisha to

take steps for Covid-19 vaccination of prisoners above 60years of age.

Few takers for Citizen Portal in twin city

Bhubaneswar, March 4: Even though the state government had launched a citizen centric portal under the Crime and Criminal Tracking Network and Systems (CCTNS) in 2015, denizens of twin city are showing little interest in seeking help of the police through the portal.

The citizens were urged to avail various police related services through the portal without going to the police stations.

The services offered through the portal include filling of complaints with the local police and FIR copy download, issuance of character certificates, permissions for taking out processions and rallies, nod for holding events and performances, protests and strikes, verifi-



cation of tenants, employees, missing person registration and reporting about lost property.

However, data received through RTI revealed that very few people have filed complaints with local police through the citizen portal during the last few years.

According to the information, Khandagiri police station received 1,276 complaints through the portal

Airfield police received 55 complaints while 25 persons lodged complaints with CS Pur police through the portal

tal while Laxmisagar police received 231 complaints between 2015 and 2020.

Similarly, 135 victims lodged their complaints with Mahila police during the above mentioned period.

Airfield police station received 55 complaints while 25 persons lodged complaints with Chandrasekharapur police through the portal. As many

as 71 persons sought the help of Nayapalli police through online.

Capital police station received 95 complaints while Tamando and Jatni police have received 12 and 40 complaints online respectively.

Most of the other police stations either received no complaints or a very few between 2015 and 2020.

Speaking on the issue, Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Umashankar Dash said that a complainant has to come to the police station again after lodging of the complaint through citizen portal for formal registration of an FIR. “This is the reason why many are not showing interest in lodging complaints online, the DCP added.

Sources in the police revealed that the courts are also yet to accept e-FIRs.

BHUBANESWAR: The state police has launched a special drive to trace such minors who are missing for long. The special drive that commenced February 28 will end March 6. Police have already recovered 160 children during the first four days of the drive.

‘Mo College Abhiyan’ likely to be rolled out March 21

Bhubaneswar, March 4: Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik is likely to launch the much awaited ‘Mo College Abhiyan’ March 21, 2021 at the Lok Seva Bhawan here, an official letter from Higher Education department said, Thursday.

Higher Education department’s additional secretary Rajashree Mohanty through a letter to officer on special duty of ‘Mo College Abhiyan Parichalana Sangathan’ said that the Chief Minister will launch Mo College Abhiyan March 21, 2021 at 5pm from the convention centre of Lok Seva Bhawan through videoconference.

The state government had earlier planned to launch ‘Mo College’ campaign for holistic development of colleges across the state from second week of March.

'Mo School' inspection drive

Chairperson of Mo School Susmita Bagchi has directed the team to start a monitoring drive. To ensure effective implementation of the programme at the school level, the programme monitoring team and senior officials of Mo School will visit the schools regularly. The officials will submit a detailed report on project implementation in the schools. Accordingly, from March 6, the Mo School team will cover 200 schools in 50 days and review the projects.

After the launch of ‘Mo School Abhiyan’ in 2017, the government had decided to roll out ‘Mo College’ initiative last year. However, the outbreak of Covid-19 delayed its implementation, sources said.

Bhubaneswar, March 4: The state government is going to conduct a survey to identify children with disabilities from April 1.

The Social Security and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (SSEPD) department is conducting the survey to identify the differently-abled children through Anganwadi workers.

Identification of children with disabilities within the first couple of years of their birth is important for affective treatment and mitigation of their disabilities.

The SSEPD secretary, Bhaskar Jyoti Sarma, has sought cooperation from District Collectors for smooth conduct of the survey.

Supervisors, Child Development Project Officers (CDPOs) and District Social Welfare Officers (DSWOs) working under Integrated



Child Development Services (ICDS) projects will monitor the survey at field level, sources said.

A mobile application is being developed for the purpose. Training of master trainers is in progress. Master trainers will provide training to some other officials at district level following which training for Anganwadi workers will begin. All these process will end by March 26, the source said.

To identify such children in non-

I want to ask the BJP to refrain from raking up issues which are not needed.”

BRIDGE COLLAPSE

NHRC seeks report from Nabarangpur Collector

Bhubaneswar, March 4: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has directed the District Magistrate (Collector) of Nabarangpur seeking an action-taken report (ATR) regarding collapse of an under-construction Biju Setu near village Talapadar in the district January 10, 2021.

One worker had died while several others sustained severe injuries during the mishap.

The deceased was identified as Mahendra Malli, 45, of Raighar in the district.

The Collector has been asked to submit the ATR within four weeks of the receipt of the NHRC notice. The commission issued the notice while after a plea filed by rights activist Akhand.

The activist had urged the apex rights panel to direct the authorities to take stringent action against erring officers who were responsible for the alleged sub-standard work and lack of safety measures that led to the fatal mishap. He had also sought compensation for the next kin of the victim, Malli.

Notably, the under-construction bridge over Nagi River in Nabarangpur caved in January 10 evening resulting in the death of Malli.


A team of engineers after initial inspection at the spot claimed that the mishap occurred due to weak centering support, use of substandard raw materials and compression of the ground where the foundation was laid.

FUEL AND POLLS

Petrol and diesel prices have been relentlessly rising over past few months. Petrol currently sells at over Rs100 per litre in a few states like Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh. Petrol price had shot to Rs100 per litre in Malkangiri. The Opposition and people in general have been clamouring for a cut in the fuel prices as they fear such mindless rise in fuel rates will automatically push up the prices of common essentials and then will make life painful for the common man. As it is, people are reeling from joblessness and many more ills caused by the economic recession and then COVID-19 pandemic. Such rise in fuel prices, even when the economy is still stuttering, has shocked one and all. Amid all this clamour and protests centering on the rise in fuel prices, the government has done precious little. Last week Union Petroleum Minister Dharmendra Pradhan said the rates will come down once winter goes. This was cold comfort. The Centre and the state governments have brazened out the protests against fuel rates all these months. Meanwhile, the government is reportedly planning to cut down the excise tax on fuel. The cut could be as high as ₹8.50 per litre of petrol. Not only petrol, and diesel, has LPG rate also gone out of control. The gas price has firmed up by over ₹100 over last one month alone – a never seen before phenomenon. Excise duty was raised between Rs13 and Rs16 per litre on petrol and diesel between March 2020 and May 2021 which now stands at ₹31.8 on diesel. But, the government did not restore the taxes to their original levels when oil prices recovered. Central and state taxes make up for 60% of the retail price of petrol and over 54 per cent of diesel. The Modi government raised Excise duty on petrol and diesel on nine occasions between November 2014 and January 2016. Therefore, there is no reason why it cannot roll back the tax when the price of fuel has reached a three-digit mark. Making the rollback decision contingent on electoral interests is unfair.

It is a no brainer why the government is reportedly exploring the option of slashing the excise rate now when it was sitting quite all this while. Five states and a Union Territory, including the all important West Bengal are going to polls beginning March. There has been no rise in the fuel rates for five days now. Ever since the Election Commission (EC) announced the dates for the Assembly polls, there has been a halt in the upward movement of fuel rates. Last year, there was a similar pause on the runaway rise in fuel prices ahead of the Assembly elections in a few states, including in Bihar. However, as soon as the elections were over, oil companies increased the retail prices. Similarly, this time around the Centre is exploring the options of cutting down the excise rate on fuel. If the cut really happens, it would mean the government had enough room to scissor the excise rate without impacting its target for revenue from the tax on the fuels. If it is so who prevented it from doing so all these months. The NDA government certainly waited for the EC to announce the dates before it goes about easing or hitting the pause button on fuel price rise.

Bug

The most common version of this story is that bug results from an incident with the US Navy's Harvard Mark II computer soon after the end of World War Two, in which a technician cured a fault by extracting a moth from between the contacts of a relay in the system. It is also said that this was the source of debug, the process of finding and removing errors from a computer programme. The incident really did happen: the log book, dated 9 September 1947, survives with the actual moth taped to it and is available online; that page says it happened in 1945 but recent research shows it actually happened two years later. The log entry itself blows to pieces the story about this being the origin of bug by noting under the insect, "First actual case of bug being found". This makes it clear that bug for a fault was already in use. Indeed, Rear Admiral Grace Hopper (an early programmer who worked on the machine and who inspired the computer language COBOL) used to tell this story in lectures and would remark that the word was applied to problems in radar electronics in World War II. It's actually older still.


Bully pulpit

It's certainly in the news at the moment. I wonder, though, if the meaning that I think you have in mind is really known to everybody? When I first came across it, years ago, I assumed that bully was in the usual current sense of a person who intimidates others through force and that bully pulpit meant that some person in authority was abusing his powers. This is by no means an uncommon assumption: It was a while before I realised that bully here had a different sense, one now hardly known, of something first-rate or excellent. Oddly, the two senses are from the same source, since bully was originally a term of endearment, from Dutch boel, lover, and later became a compliment for a male companion, meaning admirable. Our current sense grew out of this as the word went down in public estimation. At one time you might have heard people say bully for you as a way to express admiration for another's action. The term became known, though hardly fashionable, in the years that followed its first appearance, most frequently in commentaries on Roosevelt's presidency, but then largely fell out of use.

HARBINGER OF INDO-US TIES

Today on the occasion of the birth anniversary of Biju Patnaik, it is propitious to recall his seminal role in laying the foundational edifice of the strategic defence and security cooperation with USA to face the China threat. A major offshoot of the Sino-Indian war of 1962 was the intensification of cooperation and confidentiality between the intelligence agencies of the two countries – the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) of the USA and Intelligence Bureau (IB) of India.

Immediately after the 1962 war, the USA assisted India in raising certain paramilitary formations in the India-China border. The creation of Tibet force was one such instance, which was conceptualised to co-opt the Tibetans refugees and convert them into warriors. The idea was mooted by Biju Patnaik to Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru who endorsed it. With the help of American financial aid and a CIA instructor team General Sujan Singh Uban, it was decided to set up the camp in the tranquil hill village of Chakrata. The Tibetan unit exceeded all expectations. The Tibetans particularly excelled as parachutists and had the distinction of conducting jumps at the altitude up to 15,400 feet using chutes specially procured by the CIA. In later years the unit developed into what is now called the Special Frontier Force which valiantly fought in the Galwan Valley on August 29/30 last year. One of its brave soldiers Nyima Tenzin sacrificed his life while defending the Indian border.

Yet another programme with the objective to lend air support to the Tibetan commandos and agents was the Aviation Research Centre (ARC), a covert aviation outfit for use along the India-China border: This was also the brain child of Biju Patnaik. The ARC was actually a subsection of the Intelligence Bureau (IB) and was staffed by IB officers and aircrews deputed from

The Indian Air Force. Its aircraft consisted of transport and light planes that mostly came from USA, courtesy the CIA. Biju Patnaik was again instrumental in setting up the project. Patnaik visited the USA in 1963 to work out the concept with the CIA. The Americans saw merit in the plan and dispatched two officers to India for initial fact finding tour: Rameshwar Nath Kao was its first Director. As the USA was deeply concerned about China's nuclear programme, it wanted to keep a tab on the development of nuclear weapons by China. Not many options were available to monitor China's nuclear programme. One option available to the USA was satellite imagery, which was not very developed then and the resolution of the imagery were not of very high order. Another US option, the U-2 spy plane, had its own set of problems. As China's test sites

were believed to be concentrated in distant Xinjiang, spy planes launched from airstrips in Taiwan did not have the range to make the round trip. The CIA had earlier made discreet use of an airfield at Peshawar, Pakistan, which put Xinjiang within range. But that had ended after the diplomatic furore following the shoot-down over the Soviet Union of a U-2 launched from Peshawar in 1960. It was against this backdrop that the ARC airbase at Charbatia configured between USA and India. In May 1964, a small CIA team arrived at Charbatia with an unmarked spy plane. As planned, the plane performed a single mission over Xinjiang and headed back to Charbatia. As it touched down, its brake failed, and the U-2 rolled off the end of the runway. Wary of the media exposure, ARC personnel put the aircraft into the hanger and waited for the CIA

technicians to make the necessary repairs. Once they were completed, the plane was discretely flown out without attempting further over-flights from Indian soil. A report based on a set of declassified documents obtained from the CIA under the freedom of Information Act in August 1963, the independent National Security Archive (NSA), shed more light on the incident. According to this report, the use of Charbatia, was agreed during a meeting between President John F Kennedy and the visiting Indian President S Radhakrishnan on June 3, 1963. However, as the Indian work to improve it took longer than expected, the missions presumed from Thailand's Takhili. The report further said that the first mission out of Charbatia did not take place until May 1964. The operation ceased consequent to the death of Prime Minister Nehru. The US detachment stayed on at Charbatia till 1967 and served as an adjunct to the main operational base in Thailand. The report further said, the pilots and aircraft left Charbatia, but others remained in place to save staging costs. In December 1964, when Sino-Indian tensions increased along the border, Detachment G returned to Charbatia and conducted three highly successful missions, satisfying all requirements for the Sino-Indian border region. By this time, however, Takhili had become the main base for Detachment G's Asian operations, and Charbatia served merely as a forwarding staging base. The information gathered from aerial surveillance was yet another aspect of the close Indo-US cooperation in the immediate aftermath of the Sino-Indian war of 1962.

The social returns of ending son bias

In much of emerging Asia, persistent bias in favour of sons remains a barrier to girls' life prospects – and often to life itself. Pre- and postnatal sex selection, including abortion and infanticide, has led to significant demographic imbalances. Son preference also perpetuates large-scale social problems. Because a majority of the population still values sons more highly than daughters – a preference reinforced by cultural traditions in which sons play an important role (like performing funeral rituals in Hinduism) – South Asia is rife with domestic violence, child marriage, and deaths due to dowry disputes. And parents' cultural preference for sons can create additional human-development challenges. Nowhere is this more evident than in India. Educational and economic opportunities for boys and girls remain deeply unequal, as the country's rapid economic growth since the 1990s was not accompanied by large-scale changes in gender attitudes and traditional social values. And, owing to sex selection, the country's ratio of males to females is imbalanced, with millions of girls and women missing from schools and the labor market. The problem is getting worse. Most deaths among girls under five are due to postnatal sex selection, and the spread of ultrasound

technology has aggravated the imbalance. Consequently, the number of "missing" women in India has doubled over the last 50 years. According to the United Nations Population Fund's State of the World Population 2020 report, India alone now accounts for 46 million missing girls, nearly a third of the global total of 142 million. Understanding sex bias in fertility is important for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, particularly SDG 4 (quality education) and SDG 5 (gender equality), because it helps to explain parents' unequal treatment of daughters, particularly in rural or poverty-stricken areas. The large gender disparities in South Asian educational outcomes must be addressed at the root. Traditional gender norms – men as breadwinners and women as homemakers – could explain the higher value placed on male children, as could the perceived economic benefits of having sons (who, for example, will receive a dowry rather than costing his parents one). These traditional views underpin gender inequality in educational attainment, with the gap perpetuating further inequalities in the next generation. In contrast, more educated women tend to have smaller families, with healthier and better-educated children. Ending son bias in desired fertility, curbing the preferential

treatment of boys, and addressing parents' underinvestment in daughters requires increased spending on public education for girls. Bangladesh offers an example of the long-term social returns of such an approach. In a recently published paper, we analyzed the desired and actual fertility choices of thousands of Bangladeshi women of child-bearing age. Although fertility decisions are still influenced by son preference, our results confirm a decline in the desire for sons. Moreover, women with secondary schooling are more likely to desire gender balance in fertility. This finding contrasts with a 1994 study, which suggested the opposite relationship between Bangladeshi mothers' secondary education and son preference. What has changed? Three decades ago, educated Bangladeshi women had limited income-earning opportunities, and their economic status remained low. There simply were not enough educated women to shift son preference in favour of daughters. Since then, however, girls' education has benefited from the nationwide Female Secondary School Assistance Project, which was introduced in the early 1990s. The program provided financial aid for girls, and encouraged them to delay marriage in favor of education. Bangladesh has since leaptfrogged neighboring India in

girls' secondary education. Thus, as a consequence of increased female education and employment, son preference is giving way to a desire for gender balance. This is reflected in improvement in Bangladesh's sex ratio. Excess female deaths as a share of overall under-five mortality rate is now around 3%, indicating a decline in pre- and post-natal sex selection. In 1992, former World Bank chief economist Lawrence H Summers famously identified women's education as the single most influential investment that can be made in the developing world. Our research confirms this finding. The policy lesson from Bangladesh is that investment in girls' schooling and the creation of economic opportunities can have important intergenerational effects at birth, in education, and beyond.

Bangladeshis desperate for domicile certificates

A husband and his nephew jointly attacked a woman as she refused to sign papers that would have otherwise designated the nephew as an Indian citizen in Kendrapara

The immigrants after entering Kendrapara district have started showing their might on local residents. If unchecked, this might result into a serious law and order problem.

In the latest case, a woman was allegedly assaulted by her husband and nephew after she refused to accept that the latter is her biological son, a report said. The woman was identified as Subhadra Ray, wife of Bikash Ray of Barkolikhal village under Mahakalapara block. The accused were identified as Bikash Ray and nephew Amit Ray.

The dispute arose after Subhadra refused to acknowledge Amit as her own son which the later wanted to get a domicile certificate and other papers. Enraged, Bikash and Amit attacked her rendering her critical. She was admitted to Mahakalapara community health centre. Later, she lodged a complaint at Jambu Marine

Police station but police are yet to take any action.

Subhadra is originally a native of Malkangiri district and was once a Zilla Parishad member. Later, she came in contact with Bikash, a Bangladeshi immigrant who was then living in Malkangiri and eventually married him. The couple soon shifted to Barkolikhal village. She alleged that her husband is a native of Arwel village in Bangladesh.

Two years back Amit came to live with them. He tried to generate the papers to prove his nativity for which he asked Subhadra to identify her-

self as his mother to which she denied. As a result, Bikash and Amit started torturing her.

She lodged a complaint with then Collector following which Amit was asked to leave the country and his Bangladeshi passport and voter identity card of India were seized. Amit again trespassed into the area and asked Subhadra to help him get the papers. He and Bikash assaulted Subhadra after she declined to oblige them.

The assault of the woman is indicative of the serious problem posed by the Bangladeshi immigrants in the

district. However, the problem is on the rise as the political leaders and the administration are keeping mum due to vote bank politics. The district administration is equally silent and is only waiting for an order from the government.

Residents have demanded an enumeration of the actual citizens in the district. Senior citizen Pratap Kumar Tripathy, social activist Sunil Kumar Gantayat, Bibhuti Bhushan Rout and Amarbar Rout said the population of Bangladeshi immigrants has grown exceptionally posing a serious threat to the security of the country. However, only 1237 immigrants were permitted to stay in the district during the Bangladesh war.

The district administration had issued deportation notice to 1551 immigrants in 2005 which was rejected by the Orissa High Court 15 years later in February.

When contacted, ADM Basant Kumar Rout said the local police have been asked to take action on the complaint of the woman. Jambu Marine IIC Maneswar Sethi said a primary inquiry has been ordered.

People in mine-rich Joda block live in dark; no use of DMF fund

Joda, March 4: Roida is a mineral-rich area under Joda block in Keonjhar district. As mines operate around the Bhuyan Roida panchayat, the mines areas are illuminated. But paradoxically, Mankad hutting village has been in the dark. Electricity and other basic amenities are a dream for its residents.

There is no shortage of funds in the district mineral foundation in the district, but this mines-encircled village has remained under developed, a report said. According to the report, people in the villages still depend on oil lamps after sunset even 73 years after independence.

In the absence of electricity, life of people is fraught with dangers from wild animals from nearby forests. "It is dangerous to go out after the sunset when darkness prevails everywhere," locals lamented.

The village with a population of 600 is surrounded by forests and mines. Most of the residents are of tribal communities. Mining provides livelihood for a few people while a majority of them eke out their living from selling minor forest produce.

On the east of the village is Tata mines while OMDC mines



are on its west. On its north are OMC and IDC mines. Sri Metallic's is on its south. Conscious citizens and social activists say, there is no dearth of funds from the mining sector, but the people affected by the mines are in darkness. Nearly, Rs 3000 core has been collected from the DMF, which is supposed to be spent on development works in the mining-affected areas.

Locals alleged that mining firms had been claiming to be working for peripheral development only through advertisements, but the reality is different on the ground.

Ward member Gopal Oram, former ward member Sanka Purty, local like Samara Bentakar, Krishna Purty, Debasish

Bentakar, Arjun Munda, Gopal Munda lamented that they had apprised the Collector and the authorities of the Joda electricity division office about the need of electricity for villages in Roida and Makad Hutting several times in the past, but all reminders have fallen on deaf ears.

They alleged that for lack of electricity, their wards are unable to study at night. Bhuyan Roida sarpanch Jyotish Chandra Nayak said efforts are on to electrify the Makad Hutting. As the area is in the forest area, approval for electrification has been pending. Locals warned that they would resort to dharna if nothing happens.

Jumbo tramples man to death

Manu Bhai's herbal tea a big draw

Balasore, March 4: Every town has its own popular restaurants, fast food centres and tea stalls. In Balasore town, the town denizens' favourite haunt is Manu Bhai's tea stall. The stall's claim to fame is its herbal tea.

Situated near the Fakir Mohan roundabout in the town, Manu Bhai's tea stall has been here since 1984. The tiny tea joint experiences hundreds of footfalls every day.

Muna Bhai, 68, says he adds ginger, cinnamon powder, small cardamom powder, clove powder, black pepper powder, bay leaf, molasses, lemon juice, honey, rock salt, raw turmeric, basil leaves, Shunthi, Pippali, Juani, Ashwagandha and



Muesli in their proper proportion to the tea.

Manoranjan Das, who is fondly known as Manu Bhai, is a native of Simulia. In search of livelihood, he along with his family shifted to Balasore town in 1984. Then he put

up a tea stall near the Fakir Mohan roundabout.

Until COVID-19 pandemic, he was selling milk tea and snacks. The pandemic induced lockdowns and shutdowns hit him hard.

"As the restrictions were lifted

and shops were allowed to open, I opened my tea stall. But I could not get customers for milk tea. I noticed people demanding for red tea. Then the idea of selling herbal tea occurred to my mind," said Manu Bhai. In order to save his business, he went through several Ayurvedic books and collected some roots and herbs. "Adding these Ayurvedic ingredients in their proper portions, I prepared Ayurvedic tea. And people started liking my tea," he admitted. He said he is selling over 200 cups of tea a day, with a cup of tea selling at Rs 5. He opens his stall at 7:00 am and keeps it open till 10:00 pm. "Whatever I am earning today is enough to meet my family expenses," he said with a smile, suggesting his satisfaction.

30 hurt as bus overturns

The police have arrested Kumar's wife Anshu (32) for allegedly faking the firing incident along with her husband and making bogus PCR call. Her husband, however, will be arrested after he is declared fit by the doctors, a senior police official said.

Gairsain: Uttarakhand Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat Thursday presented a Rs 57,400.32 crore budget for 2021-22 in the Assembly here with emphasis on health, rural infrastructure, education, employment generation and agriculture. SHIV SENA OUT OF BENGAL POLLS, TO BACK MAMATA

New Delhi, March 4: The Shiv Sena has decided to opt out of the upcoming West Bengal Assembly elections, but the party has decided to 'wholeheartedly' support All India Trinamool Congress leader and Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, a top official said here Thursday.

Sena MP and Chief Spokesperson Sanjay Raut said that since the West Bengal polls are turning out to be 'Didi vs All', the Shiv Sena has decided not to contest the elections, but will stand in solidarity with her. "Looking at the present scenario, it appears like a 'Didi vs All' fight. All M's - Money, Muscle and Media - are being used against Mamata Didi. We wish her a 'roaring success', because we believe she is the real 'Bengal Tigress'" said Raut.

He said that the decision was taken after discussions with Shiv Sena President and Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray. However, MVA sources said the move could have been prompted to ensure that there is no division of votes in the West Bengal polls that could damage Trinamool's prospects vis-a-vis the BJP as the Sena was tentatively planning to contest around 60 seats. As part of its strategy to acquire an all-India presence, in January, the Sena had announced plans to sound

the poll bugle in West Bengal where it had contested the 2016 Assembly and 2019 Lok Sabha polls, but notched nil in terms of seats.

Earlier, the Sena -- ruling Maharashtra in alliance with Nationalist Congress Party and the Congress -- has contested various elections in different states including Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Gujarat, Jammu & Kashmir and Goa besides West Bengal.

The saffron party has justified its ventures in other states on grounds that the Bharatiya Janata Party at the Centre has been attempting to destabilize or dethrone Constitutionally-elected governments in all Opposition-ruled states, including Maharashtra and West Bengal. Incidentally, ruling ally NCP President Sharad Pawar has already said he would visit Kolkata to extend support to Mamata

Banerjee -- as part of plans to build up a 'grand alliance' of national and state opposition parties -- before the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

Similarly, political sources also do not rule out the possibility of a repeat of Maharashtra's MVA experiment -- Sena-NCP-Congress with differing ideologies joining hands -- in West Bengal if the eastern state brews up a fractured mandate in the elections, the results of which are expected in early-May. "The unthinkable happened in Maharashtra and it is working smoothly. Anything is possible... even in WB. The MVA is cited as a national example to make states strong," a senior state leader said guardedly, on the odds with three arch-rivals in West Bengal - Congress, Left Front and Trinamool Congress -- hugging each other post-polls to keep the BJP at bay.

'Metro Man is BJP's CM candidate'

Thiruvalla/Kochi, March 4: 'Metroman' E Sreedharan, who recently joined the BJP, will be its chief ministerial candidate for the Kerala assembly elections April 6, senior leader and Union Minister V Muraliedharan said Thursday.

"BJP4Keralam will fight Kerala polls with E Sreedharan Ji as its Chief Ministerial Candidate. We will defeat both CPIM Kerala & INCKerala to provide a corruption-free, development-oriented Governance for the people of Kerala," Muraliedharan said in a tweet.

His social media post on Sreedharan's leadership in the Assembly polls came hours after the party's state chief K Surendran said he has requested the party's national leadership to announce 'Metroman' as the NDA's chief ministerial candidate.

The 88-year-old technocrat also on Thursday announced his decision to end his 24-year long career with the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC). If the NDA, "under the leadership of 'Metroman',

gets an opportunity to rule the state, "we are confident we will be able to implement development works under Prime Minister Narendra Modi with a ten-fold force in Kerala," Surendran said. Addressing a party meeting here, he highlighted the achievements of Sreedharan, including the completion of the reconstruction of Palarivattom flyover here in five months, much ahead of the stipulated time.

"He completed the project in five months without any corruption. That is why we requested Sreedharan and our party leadership that he should be projected as the (NDA's) Chief Minister candidate," he said at the meeting organised as part of the "Vijay Yatra" led by him.

This was the first time the party indicated that Sreedharan will be the NDA's chief ministerial candidate. The party sought to project Sreedharan's leadership in the polls amid the process of determining the candidates for the assembly election. Sreedharan has said his main aim was to help the party come to power in Kerala and that he will be open to chief ministership.

3 J'KHAND COPS KILLED IN MAOIST ATTACK

Ranchi, March 4: Three Jharkhand Police personnel were killed and two others injured, including one from CRPF, as an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) went off in West Singhbhum district Thursday morning.

The explosive device was planted by the Maoists. The incident took place around 8.45 a.m. when a "pressure IED blast" took place in thick forested area near Hoyahatu village under Toklo police station area in West Singhbhum.

Central Reserve Police Force's (CRPF) 197 Battalion along with the Jharkhand Jaguar (AG 11) of the state police were on an operation in the area when the incident took place, said CRPF Spokesperson Dalip Ambesh said.

As Jharkhand is afflicted by the scourge of extremism, the state government on February 19, 2008 sanctioned the creation of 20 Assault Groups (AGs) of Special Task Force (STF) for eradication of extremist activities.

This force was later given the distinctive name of Jharkhand Jaguar (JJ), and also a distinctive uniform.

INDIA IS NOW ONLY 'PARTLY FREE' UNDER MODI REGIME

CIVIL LIBERTIES IN INDIA HAVE BEEN IN DECLINE SINCE PM NARENDRA MODI CAME TO POWER IN 2014, SAYS FREEDOM HOUSE IN ITS REPORT DEMOCRACY UNDER SIEGE

New Delhi, March 4: India's status as a free country has changed to "partly free", according to an annual report on global political rights and liberties.

Civil liberties in India have been in decline since PM Narendra Modi came to power in 2014, said *Freedom House* in its report Democracy under Siege.

It said the change in India's status is part of a global shift in the balance between democracy and authoritarianism.

There was no immediate response from the Indian government to the report. US-based *Freedom House*, a non-profit organisation which conducts research on political freedom and human rights, added that the number of countries designated as "not free" was at its highest level since 2006. It added that India's "fall from the upper ranks of free nations" could have a more damaging effect on the world's democratic standards. Since 2014, it says, increased pressure on human rights organisations, intimidation of journalists and activists, and a spate of attacks, es-



pecially those against Muslims, had led to a deterioration of political and civil liberties in the country. And this decline only "accelerated" after 2019, it added.

In 2014, India's Hindu nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) won a landslide general election victory. Modi returned to power with an even greater majority five years later. "Under Modi, India appears to have abandoned its potential to serve as a global democratic leader, elevating narrow Hindu nationalist interests at the expense of its founding values of inclusion and equal rights for all," the report said. It said that the crackdown against those protesting against the Citizenship Amendment Act, a bill which offers amnesty to

non-Muslim illegal immigrants from three neighbouring countries had contributed to India's decline in the ratings. The government argues that the law will give sanctuary to people fleeing religious persecution. Critics say the bill is part of the BJP's agenda to marginalise Muslims in Hindu majority India.

The report also noted the government's response to the pandemic, saying it had exacerbated the global decline in freedom. Last year, in March, India imposed a sudden lockdown which left millions of migrant workers stranded in cities across India without work and money to get home. Many walked hundreds of miles, while some died because of exhaustion or in accidents along the way.

Bomb scare at Taj Mahal following hoax call

New Delhi/Agra: The Taj Mahal complex in Agra was vacated Thursday morning following a hoax bomb call, police said. The caller, identified as Vimal Kumar Singh, has been detained for questioning in Firozabad, Additional Director General (ADG) of Police, Agra zone, A Satish Ganesh said Singh called the 112 emergency response number of the Uttar Pradesh police at around 9 am and claimed that a bomb was kept inside the monument that is conserved by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) and protected by armed personnel of the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF). The police immediately informed the CISF personnel, who asked the visitors to vacate the premises of the iconic 17th-century monument and launched anti-sabotage checks around 9:15 am. Nothing suspicious was found during the checks at the monument, a CISF officer said in Delhi. An initial probe revealed that Singh is a resident of Patiiali in Kasganj and was presently staying in his maternal grandmother's house in Okhra village in the Narkhi area of Firozabad, the ADG said.

India not utilizing vax to full capacity, says Delhi HC

New Delhi, March 4: The Delhi High Court on Thursday showed apprehensions over non-utilization of coronavirus vaccine to its full capacity by the country, asserting that it is either being donated or sold off to foreign countries rather than being provided to Indians.

Justice Vipin Sanghi made the observations while hearing a suo motu public interest litigation concerning vaccination of judges, court staff and lawyers on priority and for them to be treated as frontline workers so that they could receive it without limitations of their age or physical condition.

In the recent phase of the vaccination drive which commenced on

The Government of India has been asked to indicate the transport capacity of the vaccine and the extent to which it is being used. The Centre has also been asked to explain the rationale over strict class of persons that can be vaccinated.

HK court denies bail to activists

Hong Kong: A Hong Kong court Thursday denied bail to 32 out of 47 pro-democracy activists charged under a Beijing-imposed national security law, ending a four-day marathon court hearing. The group of activists was charged with conspiracy to commit subversion under the law and detained Sunday over their involvement in an unofficial primary election last year that authorities said was a plot to paralyze Hong Kong's government.

Mongolia to open air border

Ulan Bator: Mongolia is planning to reopen its air border from May 1 to resume international passenger flights, according to the country's government press office. "At the direction given by Prime Minister Luvsannamsrai Oyun-Erdene, it is planned to reopen Buyant-Ukhiaa international airport from May 1 to resume international passenger air traffic," the press office said in a statement Thursday. Mongolia suspended international passenger flights in mid-February 2020 to prevent the spread of Covid-19, the Xinhua news reported.

Lanka approves Sputnik V vax

Colombo: Sri Lanka's drug regulatory body has approved the Russian Sputnik V vaccine as the second available for use in the Indian Ocean island nation. The state minister overseeing pharmaceutical products, Channa Jayasumana, said Sri Lanka has requested doses from Russia's Gamaleya Research Institute and was awaiting confirmation of the amount it would get.

Gunmen kill 7 in Afghan

Kabul: At least seven Afghan civilians were shot and killed by unknown gunmen overnight in the country's east, a provincial security official said Thursday. Gen Juma Gul Hemat, provincial police chief in Nangarhar province said the victims of the brutal attack were workers at a plaster factory in the Sorkh Rod district. Police arrested four suspects, he added. In a separate attack in Jalalabad, a female doctor was killed when a sticky bomb attacked to a rickshaw she was traveling in exploded, the provincial governor's office said.

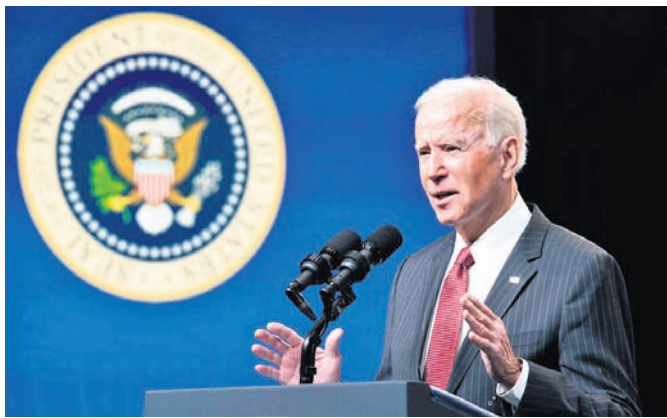
New York, March 4: Issuing a high alert about the growing dangers to the international system from China, President Joe Biden has called for building alliances with like-minded countries and said the US will deepen its ties with India.

The Interim National Security Guidance he released Wednesday singled out China as the only "competitor" capable of mounting a sustained challenge with its multifarious capabilities to the international order.

He said in the document that the US will support China's neighbours and declared, "We will deepen our partnership with India."

Introducing the document, he said it would "convey my vision for how America will engage with the world" and guide his administration while Washington begins work on a new National Security Strategy.

He sketched a vision of a cooperative of democracies to face China, which "has rapidly become more as-



sertive". He called Beijing "the only competitor potentially capable of combining its economic, diplomatic, military, and technological power to mount a sustained challenge to a stable and open international system".

To counter this as well as the challenge from Russia, the US will have to "promote a favorable distribution of power to deter and prevent adversaries from directly threatening the United States and our allies, inhibiting access to the global commons, or dominating key regions", he said.

"We can do none of this work alone. For that reason, we will reinvigorate and modernise our alliances and partnerships around the world," he said.

"Our democratic alliances enable us to present a common front, produce a unified vision, and pool our strength to promote high standards, establish effective interna-

Security tight at US Capitol post militia attack warning

Washington: Security has been tightened around the US Capitol in Washington - scene of a deadly assault in January - after police warned that a militia group might try to attack it Thursday, an important day in the calendar for some pro-Trump conspiracy theorists. An unidentified group of "militia violent extremists" discussed plans in February to "take control of the US Capitol and remove Democratic lawmakers on or about March 4," according to a bulletin issued on Tuesday by the Department of Homeland Security and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The police force that guards the US Capitol, seat of the legislature, said in a statement that it had "taken immediate steps to enhance our security posture and staffing for a number of days, to include March 4." Capitol Police also said that they were "aware of and prepared for any potential threats towards members of Congress or towards the Capitol complex," including the possible militia attack.

N KOREA MAY BE TRYING TO EXTRACT PLUTONIUM

Seoul, March 4: North Korea may be trying to extract plutonium to make more nuclear weapons at its main atomic complex, recent satellite photos indicated, weeks after leader Kim Jong Un vowed to expand his nuclear arsenal.

The 38 North website, which specialises in North Korea studies, cited the imagery as indicating that a coal-fired steam plant at the North's Yongbyon nuclear complex is in operation after about a two-year hiatus. Smoke was observed emanating from the plant's smokestack at various times from late February and early March.

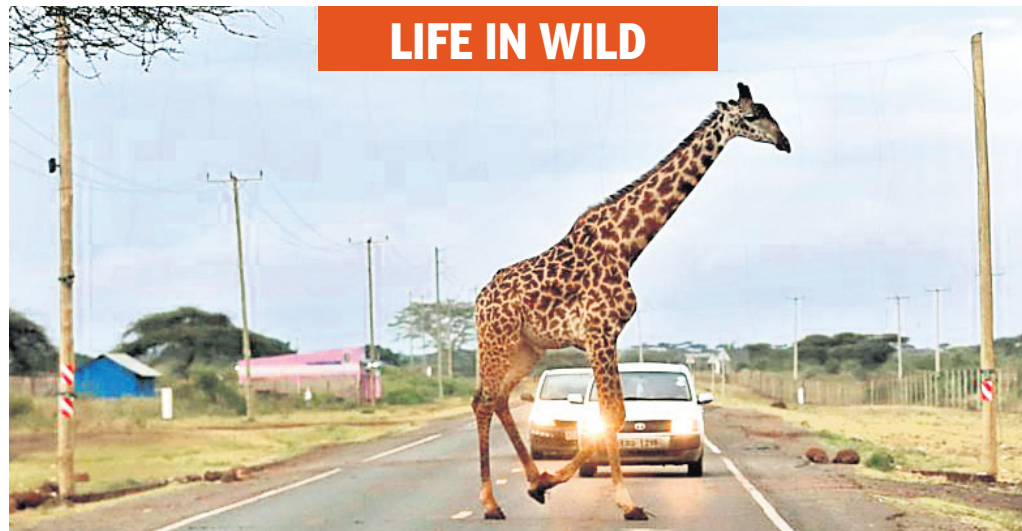
This suggests "preparations for spent fuel reprocessing could be underway to extract plutonium needed for North Korea's nuclear weapon," the website said Wednesday. But it added that "this could also mean simply the facility is being prepped to handle radioactive waste."

Earlier this week, International Atomic Energy Agency Director General Rafael Mariano Grossi

said some nuclear facilities in North Korea continued to operate, citing the operation of the steam plant that serves the radiochemical laboratory at Yongbyon. The laboratory is a facility where plutonium is extracted by reprocessing spent fuel rods removed from reactors.

"The DPRK's nuclear activities remain a cause for serious concern. The continuation of the DPRK's nuclear program is a clear violation of relevant UN Security Council resolutions and is deeply regrettable," Grossi told the IAEA's board of governors, according to IAEA's website. DPRK refers to North Korea's official name, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

Plutonium is one of the two key ingredients to build nuclear weapons along with highly enriched uranium. The Yongbyon complex, north of the capital city of Pyongyang, has facilities to produce both ingredients. It's not clear exactly how much weapons-grade plutonium or highly enriched uranium has been produced at Yonbyong and where North Korea stores it.

‘CO₂ emission cuts must increase 10x to tackle climate emergency’

London, March 4: Sixty-four countries reduced their fossil carbon-dioxide emissions during the period between 2016 and 2019, but the rate of global reduction needs to increase tenfold to meet the Paris Agreement goals to fight climate change, according to a study.



The researchers at the University of East Anglia (UEA), UK, Stanford University in the US and the Global Carbon Project examined the progress in cutting fossil CO₂ emissions since the Paris Agreement was adopted in 2015.

The findings, published in the journal Nature Climate Change, show the need for far greater ambition ahead of the important UN

climate summit in Glasgow, UK, in November.

"Countries' efforts to cut CO₂ emissions since the Paris Agreement are starting to pay off, but actions are not large-scale enough yet and emissions are still increasing in way too many countries," said Corinne Le Quere, Royal Society Professor at UEA.

"The drop in CO₂ emissions from

responses to COVID-19 highlights the scale of actions and of international adherence needed to tackle climate change," Le Quere, who led the study, said.

The researchers noted that the annual cuts of 0.16 billion tonnes of CO₂ are only 10 per cent of the 1-2 billion tonnes of CO₂ cuts that are needed globally every year to tackle climate change. They explained that emissions decreased in 64 countries during 2016-2019, they increased in 150 countries.

According to the study, Global carbon emissions grew by 0.21 billion tonnes of CO₂ per year during 2016-2019 compared to 2011-2015.

The researchers noted that in 2020, confinement measures to tackle the COVID-19 pandemic cut global emissions by 2.6 billion tonnes of CO₂, about 7 per cent below 2019 levels. They explained that 2020 is a "pause button" that cannot realistically continue while the world

‘Western powers scrap plan for IAEA rebuke of Iran’

Vienna, March 4: Britain, France and Germany have scrapped a US-backed plan for the UN nuclear watchdog's board to criticise Iran for scaling back cooperation with the agency, diplomats said Thursday, amid concerns about efforts to revive Iran's nuclear deal.

The European powers, all parties to the 2015 nuclear deal, have been lobbying for the International Atomic Energy Agency's 35-nation Board of Governors to adopt a resolution at this week's quarterly meeting expressing concern at Iran's latest breaches of the deal and calling on it to undo them.

However, Iran has bristled at the prospect, threatening to end a recent agreement with the IAEA that limits the impact of its latest moves and enables monitoring of its facilities to continue in a black-box-type arrangement for up to three months. Three diplomats who follow the IAEA closely said the so-called E3 had scrapped their plan

for a resolution. "Cooler heads are prevailing," said one diplomat from a country on the board that had been sceptical about the proposed resolution. Other countries had expressed concern that a resolution would undermine attempts to rescue the deal.

Separately but almost simultaneously, the IAEA said its chief Rafael Grossi would hold a news conference at midday (1100 GMT). Two of the diplomats said Grossi had told the IAEA board he plans to hold technical discussions with Iran next month. The Europeans' draft resolution circulated earlier this week also expressed "deep concern" at Iran's failure to explain uranium particles found at three old sites, including two that the IAEA first reported on last week.

One diplomat said that would be the subject of the technical discussions, and if Iran's cooperation was insufficient the plan for a resolution could be revived at the next quarterly board meeting in June.

7.3 quake hits off NZ coast, Tsunami feared

Wellington, March 4: A shallow, powerful earthquake struck off the northeastern coast of New Zealand Thursday, with officials warning of a possible tsunami threat. There were no immediate reports of serious damage or casualties.

New Zealand's National Emergency Management Agency said it was still assessing whether the quake had triggered a tsunami that could affect the country. It measured the quake at magnitude 7.3.

It advised people near the coast to immediately move to high ground if they felt strong or long shaking.



The US Geological Survey said the quake measured a preliminary 6.9 magnitude and was centered at a depth of 10 kilometers (six miles) about 178 kilometers (111 miles) northeast of the city of Gisborne. Residents of Gisborne reported light to moderate shaking, it said.

A magnitude 6.3 quake hit the city of Christchurch in 2011, killing 185 people and destroying much of its downtown.

New Delhi, March 4: With retail petrol and diesel prices going through the roof, India Thursday again urged oil producers group OPEC to ease production curbs to fulfill their promise of stable oil prices.

Though the average price of crude oil India imports was less than \$50 per barrel between April and December 2020 and comparable to 2019-20 average rate of \$60.47 in months thereafter, petrol and diesel prices are at a historic high now as the government has so far not rolled back the taxes it levied when prices plummeted almost a year back.

The record taxes coupled with international rates returning to pre-



Covid levels on resurrecting demand have meant that petrol has crossed ₹100 mark in some places in Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra.

Speaking at the CERAWeek conference by IHS Markit, Oil Minister Dharmendra Pradhan said India, where fuel demand is recovering to pre-pandemic levels, wants reasonable and responsible oil prices.

India, the world's third-biggest oil

importer and consumer, had supported the decision of the oil producers' cartel OPEC and its allies to cut production last year in view of the oil demand collapsing due to the spread of Covid-19.

"At that point in time, the producers especially OPEC assured the global market, that by the beginning of the 2021 demand will be coming back and production will be as usual. But I am sorry to say the production is yet to be normal," he said.

"If you do not supply properly, if there is a gap in demand and supply artificially (created), there is a price rise." Crude, rebounded this year to over \$82/barrel after the OPEC slashed output to drive a rebalancing of the market following last year's slump.

EPFO keeps interest rate unchanged at 8.5% for FY'21

New Delhi, March 4: In a major relief for India's working class, the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) has decided to keep interest rates on Provident Fund deposits for the financial year 2020-21 unchanged at 8.5%.

Thursday, the Central Board of Trustees, EPF, recommended 8.50% annual rate of interest to be credited on EPF accumulations in members' accounts for the Financial Year 2020-21.

The interest rate would be officially notified in the government gazette following which EPFO would credit the rate of interest into the subscribers' accounts.

At 8.5%, PF is generating maximum returns over various other savings instruments available to individuals. The bank fixed deposit rate has gone down to almost 5.5 to 6% level, Kisan Vikas Patra is offering rate of 6.9%, government's employees' GPF is giving 7.1%, Sukanya Samridhi Yojana 7.6%, PPF 7.1%, 5-year NSC 6.8%, 5-year senior citizen savings scheme 7.4%, recurring deposit 5.8%, 5-year monthly income account - 6.6%.

Since FY 2014 EPFO has consistently generated returns not less than 8.50%, said an official statement. A high EPF interest rate along with compounding, makes a significant difference to gains of subscribers. This is despite the fact that EPFO has consistently followed a conservative approach to-

'SPECTRUM BUYS TO BOLSTER TELCOS' MARKET POSITION'

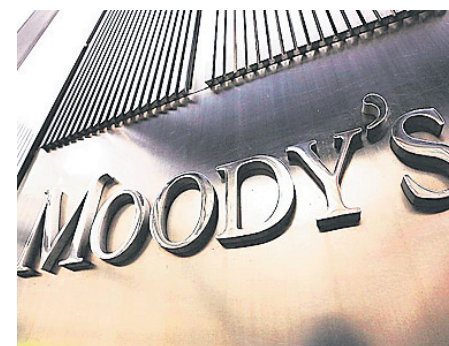
New Delhi, March 4: Spectrum renewals in the recently-held auction will boost telcos' market position and there may not be a significant impact on their balance sheets, as pricing competition abates and profitability improves, Moody's Investors Service said Thursday.

The spectrum renewals and additional purchases will help the incumbents - Jio and Airtel - strengthen their radio wave holdings and improve their network coverage.

At the same time, as some telcos have large cash holdings while others recently raised debt to fund the purchases, there will not be a sig-

nificant impact on their balance sheets particularly, as pricing competition abates and profitability improves across the sector, Moody's said in its report. It also expects operators to opt for deferred spectrum payments, thus helping to mitigate the effect on liquidity and cash flows. Spectrum will be offered for a period of 20 years.

Successful bidders can pay the entire bid amount in one go (upfront), or exercise an option to pay a certain amount (25% for spectrum won in 700 MHz, 800 MHz, 900 MHz bands or 50% for spectrum won in 1800 MHz, 2100 MHz, 2300 MHz, 2500 MHz bands) upfront with the remaining amount in a maximum up to 16 equated annual instalments,



after a moratorium of two years.

It is pertinent to mention that bids were received in 800 MHz, 900 MHz, 1800 MHz, 2100 MHz and 2300 MHz bands, but airwaves in the premium 700 MHz and 2,500 MHz

bands went unsold. Reliance Jio's purchase of 488.35 MHz of spectrum across the 800MHz/ 1800MHz/2300MHz bands will enhance its spectrum footprint and improve its network coverage

and capacity, Moody's noted.

The company had consolidated cash holdings of \$30.1 billion as of January 2021, implying that the upfront payment of \$2.7 billion "can be easily absorbed", it said.

Bharti Airtel Limited's renewal of its expiring spectrum, along with the purchase of additional bandwidth, would strengthen its network coverage. The company recently issued \$1.25 billion of bonds, a portion of which is likely to be used to fund the upfront payment for its spectrum purchases. So, the effect on credit metrics of the total spectrum outlay has already been taken into consideration, Moody's said.

Spectrum purchases by Vodafone Idea will not have any impact on the

credit quality of Vodafone, Moody's concluded. "This is because Vodafone does not intend to inject any further capital to support VIL. Vodafone's liability related to VIL is capped at ₹8,400 crore for certain identified contingent liabilities relating to legal, regulatory, tax and other matters, including the adjusted gross revenue case," it said.

India's first auction of telecom spectrum in five years ended on Tuesday with ₹77,814.8 crore of airwaves being acquired by telcos, with billionaire Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Jio speaking the most.

Reliance Jio picked up 488.35 MHz spectrum in bands such as 800 MHz, 1800 MHz and 2300 MHz for ₹57,122.65 crore.

Govt bought paddy worth ₹1.26L cr at MSP so far

New Delhi, March 4: Procurement of Kharif paddy has increased nearly 15% to 669.59 lakh tonnes at MSP so far in the current Kharif marketing season, costing over ₹1.26 lakh crore, amid ongoing farmers protest against three new farm laws. Kharif Marketing Season (KMS) starts in October. Paddy is a major Kharif (summer-sown) crop but it is also grown in rabi (winter-sown) season. "In the ongoing Kharif Marketing Season (KMS) 2020-21, the government continues to procure Kharif 2020-21 crops at MSP (Minimum Support Price) from farmers as per existing MSP schemes, as was done in previous seasons," an official statement said.

The government has 669.59 lakh tonnes of paddy till March 3, up 14.78 per cent from 583.34 lakh tonnes in the corresponding period of the previous year.

"About 97.70 lakh farmers have already been benefitted from the ongoing KMS procurement operations with MSP value of ₹1,26,418.70 crore," the statement said.

Out of the total purchase of 669.59 lakh tonnes, Punjab has contributed 202.82 lakh tonnes.

'State must procure products from local SMEs'

Bhubaneswar, March 4: The SMEs bodies Thursday demanded that the Odisha government should procure products from state's units instead of other outside industries through government e-marketplace (GeM).

SME bodies like Orissa Young Entrepreneurs Association, Utkal Pharmaceutical Manufacturers' Association, Orissa Small Scale Industries Association and OASME organised a press meet to address the issue.

OSSIA president Smarajit Mohanty said, "To help MSEs in marketing their products, Directorate of Export Promotion and Marketing (DEPM) was created which was entrusted with registration of MSE manufacturing units and formulating a process of procurement for the state government, known as 'Rate Contract System'.

Since then, this time tested procurement system is followed for procurement of goods and services and has been incorporated in OGFR as one of the procurement processes for goods and services benefiting majority of MSEs of our state."

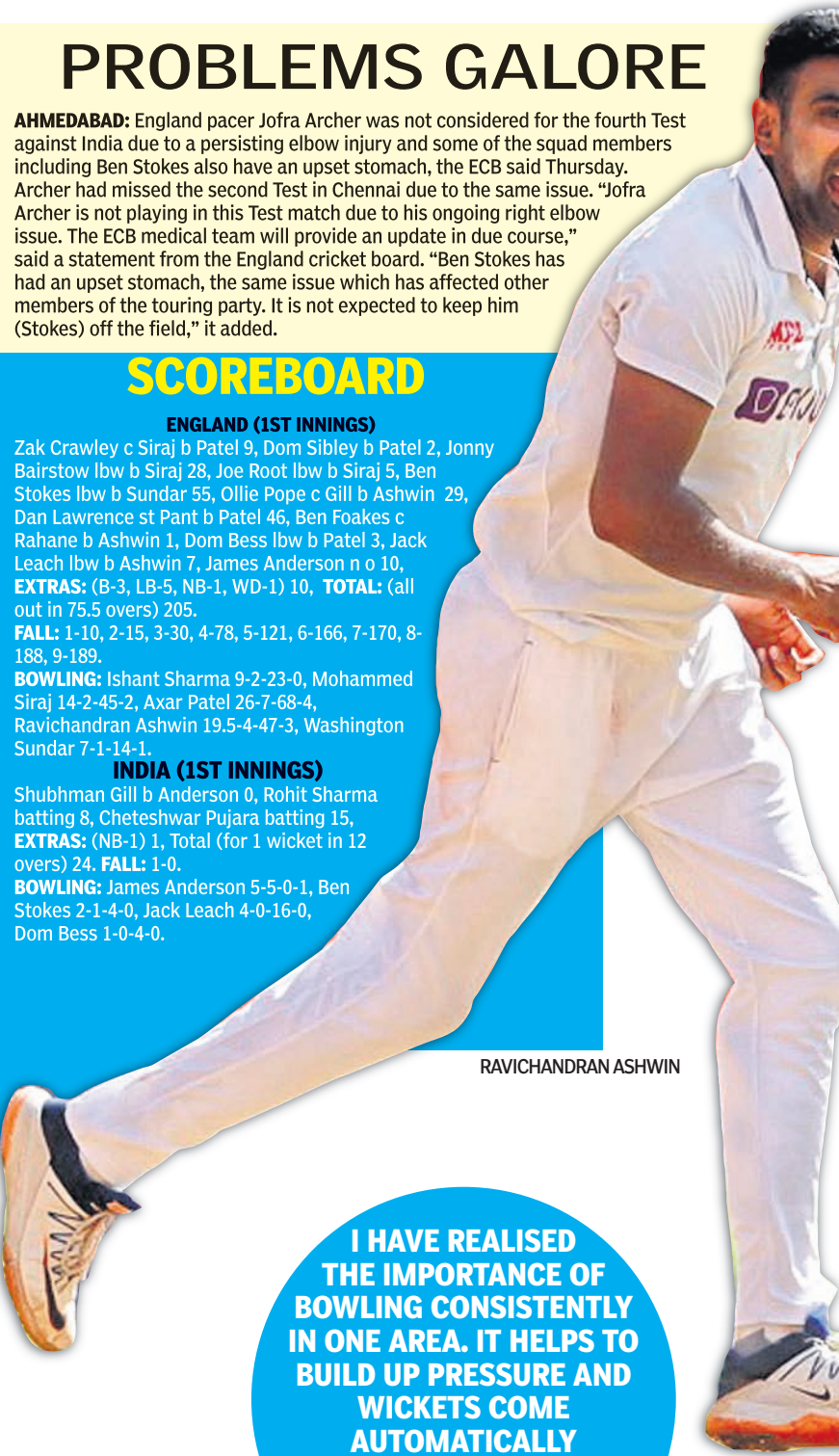
The state government issued a new circular mandating all procurement through only GeM which will lead big loss of over 1000 industries of Odisha.

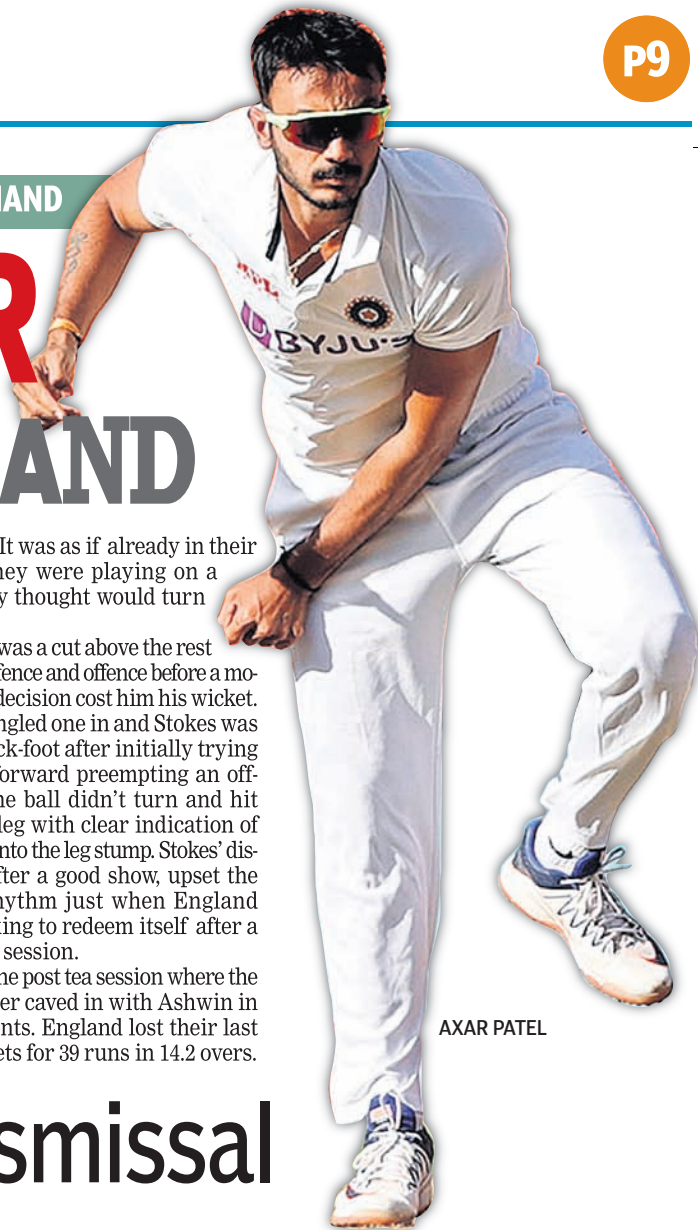

Ahmedabad, Mar 4: England's batsmen lost the battle of both the mind and skills in yet another shoddy performance to surrender the momentum to India with Axar Patel (4/68) and Ravichandran Ashwin (3/47) calling the shots on the opening day of the fourth and final Test here Thursday. The visitors were bowled out for 205 and in reply India were 24 for the loss of Shubman Gill's (0) wicket at stumps. Cheteshwar Pujara (15 batting) and Rohit Sharma (eight batting) were at the crease when stumps were called.

It was certainly not what England skipper Joe Root had hoped for after winning the toss and opting to bat. England batted on the first day pitch

and the conditions will certainly deteriorate as the game progresses. There was turn and bounce but the pitch was far from being a minefield that some of the England batsmen save Ben Stokes (55, 121b, 6x4, 2x6) made it out to be. Axar and Ashwin weaved a magic web around the already clueless England batsmen. They were well-supported by Washington Sundar (1/14) and pacer Mohammed Siraj (2/45). Sundar dismissed Stokes while Siraj got the wicket of Root (5). A cursory look at the England line-up, loaded with an extra batsman, will reveal that four players got starts but failed to convert. They were Stokes, Jonny Bairstow (28), Dan Lawrence (46) and Ollie Pope (29). The others came in and went without breaking a bead

of sweat. It was as if already in their minds, they were playing on a track they thought would turn square. Stokes was a cut above the rest both in defence and offence before a moment's indecision cost him his wicket. Sundar angled one in and Stokes was on the back-foot after initially trying to come forward preempting an off-break. The ball didn't turn and hit the back leg with clear indication of crashing into the leg stump. Stokes' dismissal, after a good show, upset the team's rhythm just when England were looking to redeem itself after a poor first session. It was the post tea session where the lower order caved in with Ashwin in his elements. England lost their last five wickets for 39 runs in 14.2 overs.

Similarly, he had done his homework on Jonny Bairstow's apparent weakness against in-coming deliveries. The in-cutter that got Bairstow was bowled at more than 146kmph.

“Bairstow, I wasn't bowling him at a lot of pace at the start. But whatever footages I have seen of him, he gets out to in-swinging deliveries. So I wanted to bowl in one area and bring it back consistently and it worked,” informed Siraj. Siraj said that both skipper Virat Kohli and senior pacer Ishant Sharma had told him about the importance of bowling in the right areas. “They told me not to try too much and hit one area consistently,” Siraj informed. The Hyderabad bowler was also asked about the heated exchange Kohli and Ben Stokes had also on the field. “Well Stokes was giving me gali (abusive language). I told Virat bhai and he took up the matter with Stokes,” Siraj informed. As far as the pitch is concerned, what Siraj said would certainly not be music to England batsmen's ears. “This is a fantastic batting wicket,” Siraj said.

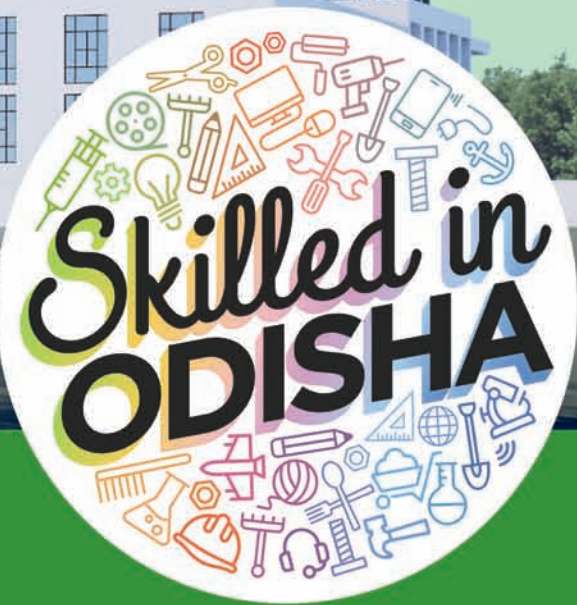
