CHANNI TAKES OATH AS PUNJAB CM

CHANDIGARH: Congress leader Charanjit Singh Channi was Monday sworn in as Chief Minister of Punjab, making him the first Dalit to hold the top post in the state. Sukhinder Singh Randhawa and OP Soni, both outgoing ministers in the previous Amarinder Singh cabinet, were also administered oath of office and secrecy by the Punjab Governor. They will be designated as deputy CMs. In his first remarks after being sworn in, the 58-year-old Channi asked the Centre to withdraw the three contentious farm laws.

HAVE LOST FAITH IN JUDICIARY: KANGANA

MUMBAI: Actor Kangana Ranaut appeared before a Mumbai court Monday in connection with a criminal defamation complaint against her by lyricist Javed Akhtar, and said she had "lost faith" in the magistrate's court as it indirectly "threatened" her of issuing a warrant if she failed to appear before it in a bailable offence. Ranaut also moved a counter complaint against Akhtar for alleged "extortion and criminal intimidation", and her lawyer said they have filed an application before chief metropolitan magistrate, seeking transfer of hearing into another court.

BMC under fire over killer drains

■ The death of a 15-year-old boy in an open drain of the city has rallied people and the opposition parties on a single platform

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: The Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation (BMC) Monday came under fire from residents and opposition parties here who held the civic body responsible for constant neglect of open drains that claimed yet another life, Sunday.

After about 19 hours of frantic search, the Odisha Fire Service personnel Monday recovered the body of the 15-year-old boy who went missing after falling into a road-

side open drain at Shatabdi Nagar in the state capital here, police said.

The 15-year old boy was swept away by storm water in Shatabdi Nagar. After a massive search operation, his body was recovered at Panchashakha Nagar. The city has now witnessed seven deaths including three minors since 2015 after falling into open drains.

A nine-year-old boy had drowned in an open drain near Nayapalli. Two persons of Patia-Chandrasekharpur were found dead after they were washed away in a drain in 2017. In more recent tragedies, Hari Patnaik, a resident of Pichupadia Slum in Unit-VI, died after falling into an open drain in August 2018. A lady, 68, had drowned in an open drain near

Ekamra Villa road in 2019.

"The BMC has become absolutely indifferent to the most important issues plaguing our city. It is quick to raise holding tax and fine citizens who violate norms," said Suranjan Sahoo, a resident.

"Where has the money gone? Why do the drains continue to remain open? The death of a child in the open drain is disturbing and is the result of administrative apathy," said Congress leader Narasingha Mishra. BJP's Bhubaneswar president Babu Singh lodged a complaint at the Khandagiri police station against BMC Commissioner Sanjay Singh holding him responsible for the mishap. They demanded Rs1 crore compensation for the deceased boy. The BJP staged a dharna outside the Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation office at 11am Monday.

The government had sanctioned Rs750 crore to the BMC for widening, covering, and de-silting of drains in the city. However, the civic body could de-silt only 383 km of its 625 km of drainage sys-

Bidyabharati faces lie detection test

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: Bidyabharati Panda, the wife of deceased Assistant Conservator of Forests (ACF) Soumya Ranjan Mohapatra, underwent a lie detection test (polygraph) at the State Forensic Science Laboratory (SFSL) at Rausalgurh here Monday.

Bidya was accompanied by her father for the polygraph test. She reached the SFSL early in the morning. Crime Branch sleuths reportedly asked several questions to Bidya during the four-hour long test at the SFSL. They tried to find out the relationship between her and Mohapatra. What was she doing when her husband caught fire July 12 night and her alleged relationship with the DFO.

The state agency probing Soumya's death recently conducted lie detection tests of Gajapati DFO Sangram Keshari Behera and Mohapatra's cook Manmath



Kumbha, who along with Bidyabharati are the key accused in the case. The deceased ACF's father Abhiram Mohapatra had earlier lodged an FIR against Bidyabharati, DFO Behera and the cook alleging that the trio is involved in the case which is apparently a murder.

More than 100 questions were asked to Behera during a three-hour long polygraph test carried out September 18, the source added.

As there was gross mismatch in statements of the DFO and the cook earlier recorded by police and the CB, the duo had to undergo the lie detection tests.

Barabati to host T20I Feb 15, 2022

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: Barabati Stadium in Cuttack will host the first match of the three-T20I series against West Indies February 15 next year, BCCI announced in its international itinerary Monday.

This will only be the third T20I at the iconic ground since its beginning of its T20I journey in October 5, 2015 in a six-wicket loss to South Africa. India, however, registered a huge 93-run victory over Sri Lanka in their second visit to the Silver City December 20, 2017.


The last time Barabati Stadium had hosted an international match was in 2019, when India defeated West Indies by four wickets in an ODI in December 22, 2019.

According to the itinerary, the Indian team will play 14 T20Is, just four Tests and three ODIs at home between November 2021 and June 2022.

Severe staff crunch cripples scientific wings of state police

■ Despite dismal rate of convictions in criminal cases courtesy poor probes, the state govt has failed to appreciate the urgency to adequately staff the scientific wings of the state police

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: Experts in criminal justice system insist on the need to adopt advanced scientific methods during investigation to crack complex criminal cases without resorting to third degree torture in police custody.

Investigating officers rely heavily on the reports of scientific experts at the forensic science laboratories and fingerprint bureaux in various districts as well as the

State Forensic Science Laboratory (SFSL) and State Finger Print Bureau (SFPB) in Bhubaneswar.

However, severe staff crunch has crippled the capabilities of the prime scientific wings of the state police force for past several years resulting in huge pendency of cases.

The "Finger Print in India-2020", annual report released by National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) said there is more than 50 per cent vacancy in SFPB and other fingerprint bureaux across the state. The report claims as many as 34 posts out of the sanctioned strength of 66 are lying vacant at SFPB, Bhubaneswar and various districts of the state. There are only 20 Sub Inspectors (SIs) working



in the bureau in place of sanctioned 38 SIs.

All Assistant SI posts are lying vacant while only one constable is deployed as against the sanc-

tioned six posts in the state. Similarly, one director's post is also lying vacant at the SFPB here.

Meanwhile, the cops deployed at various courts of the state man-

aged to send only 15 fingerprints of criminals post conviction to the SFPB in 2020. The SFPB of Punjab received 11,593 finger print records during the same period. Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh managed to record the fingerprints of 5,566 and 5,469 convicts in 2020.

All major states recorded much higher record slips than Odisha in 2020. The SFPB receives a number of requests from the investigators to search and trace the identity of the accused to trace their criminal antecedents using the storage of finger prints in its possession.

The SFPB managed to trace the identity of the accused in 4,813 cases out of the finger print records of 1,90,356 including 17,701 received

last year. The SFPB succeeded in helping the cops in identifying the accused in 24 cases by collecting evidence from crime scene.

The situation of forensic science laboratories is also no better than the finger print bureaux.

Recently, the Orissa High court, while hearing a case, expressed its concerns over the huge manpower shortage at the laboratories across the state. The HC directed the state government to strengthen the laboratories and fill up vacancies to deal with the huge pendency of cases. As per reports, as many as 589 cases in connection with DNA tests are pending with SFSL. Other sections of SFSL have also recorded a huge number of pending cases.

Shooting at Russian varsity leaves 8 dead

Moscow, Sept 20: A gunman opened fire Monday at a university in Russia, leaving eight people dead and 28 hurt, officials said.

The suspect was detained after being wounded in an exchange of fire with police, the Interior Ministry said. There was no immediate information available on his identity or possible motive.

During the attack, students and staff at Perm State University locked themselves in rooms, and video posted on Russian news sites showed some students jumping out of second-story windows.

In some footage, a black-clad, helmeted figure could be seen striding on a campus sidewalk cradling a long-barreled weapon. Russia's Investigative Committee said the gunman fired a smoothbore hunting weapon. That could indicate he used a shotgun.

A traffic police unit was the first to reach the scene, and the suspect opened fire on them, according to the Interior Ministry. He was wounded when police returned fire and then was disarmed, the ministry said. Although firearms laws are strict in Russia, many



people obtain permits for hunting weapons. News reports cited officials as saying the suspect had a permit for a pump-action shotgun, although it was not clear if it was for the weapon used.

In May, a gunman opened fire at a school in the city of Kazan, killing seven students and two teachers, with a registered weapon.

The university, which has 12,000 students enrolled, said about 3,000 people were on the campus at the time of the shooting. The school is in the city of Perm, which is about 1,100 kilometers (700 miles) east of Moscow with a population of about 1 million. The Investigative Committee said 28 people were injured, some of them hospitalised, but did not give details.

LOS ANGELES: Shows such as *The Crown*, *Ted Lasso* and *Mare of Easttown* bagged 10 of the 12 acting awards during the 73rd Primetime Emmy Awards, hosted by Cedric the Entertainer Sunday night at LA's Microsoft Theater.

Actor Jason Sudeikis was named outstanding lead actor in a comedy for his turn as the soccer coach in *Ted Lasso*, while Hollywood star Kate Winslet won the lead actress title in a limited series or movie for her role as a detective sergeant in *Mare of Easttown*.

Network Apple TV Plus' *Ted Lasso* and HBO's *Mare of Easttown* picked up the first awards of the night, each winning the pair of supporting acting awards for a comedy and limited series, respectively.

Stream giant Netflix's *The Crown* took over the drama fields while the show Hack dominated the comedy fields.

Jean Smart took home her fourth Emmy of her career for her role as stand-up comic *Deborah Vance*, and the show took home the writing and directing for a comedy awards.

The series will also give a detailed account of the highly publicised split between the two tennis players.

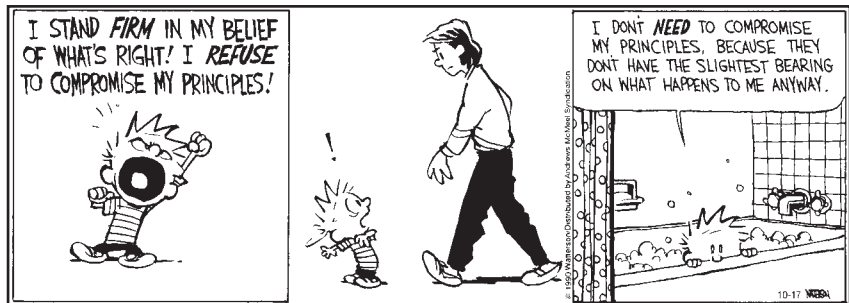

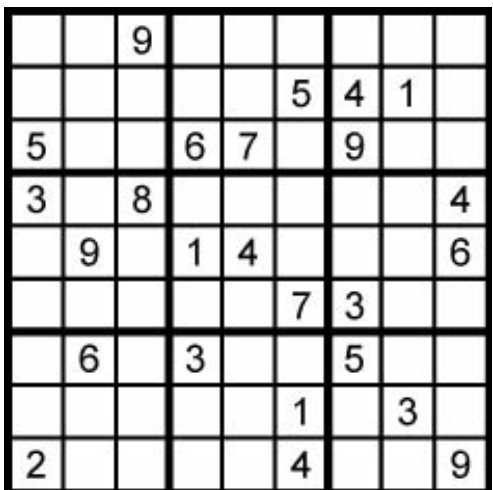

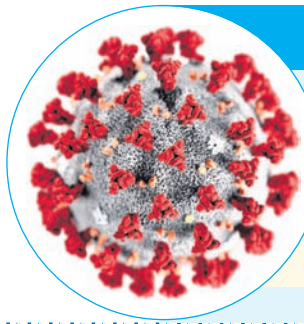

Another wet spell on the cards

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: As if the rain related misery is not enough and at a time when the coastal Odisha are still grappling with deluge owing to last week's torrential rain, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) Monday predicted heavy rain from September 26.

Under the influence of a cyclonic circulation, a fresh spell of heavy rain is likely to lash the state from September 26

The weatherman, in its forecast Monday, said that a cyclonic circulation is likely to form over east-central and adjoining north-east Bay of Bengal around September 25. The

system is likely to move west-north-westwards and reach Odisha coast during the subsequent 48 hours (by September 27). Under its influence a fresh spell

of heavy rain is likely to occur over several parts of Odisha from September 26, the Met department said. The southwest monsoon has

now been active over Odisha. Light to moderate rain/ thundershower has occurred at most places over the districts of north interior Odisha and many places. Heavy rainfall was at a few places of Kalahandi, Ganjam, Balasore and Sambalpur districts, it said.

As per the IMD prediction, some places in Bargarh, Jharsuguda, Sundargarh, Kalahandi, Bolangir, Nuapada, Sonepur, Sambalpur and Deogarh districts would witness heavy rainfall Tuesday.

Squally weather with surface wind speed 40-50 kmph (gusting to 60 kmph) is very likely over north-west Bay of Bengal, along and off Odisha-West Bengal coast due to a cyclonic circulation over Gangetic West Bengal. Therefore, the weather office has advised fishermen not to venture into along and off Odisha-West Bengal coast & north-west Bay of Bengal during next 24 hours.

MST, QST restored for 6 special trains

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: For the convenience of daily commuters, the East Coast Railway (ECOR) has allowed train journey with monthly season tickets (MST) and quarterly season tickets (QST) in six special trains. These special trains are Puri-Angul-Puri Special, Khurda Road-Kendujhargarh-Khurda Road Special, Visakhapatnam-Gunupur-Visakhapatnam Special, Visakhapatnam-Raipur-Visakhapatnam Special, Titlagarh-Bilaspur-Titlagarh Special and Visakhapatnam-Kakinada Port-Visakhapatnam Special.

On the other hand, passengers can now recharge their automatic ticket vending machine (ATVM) smart card online through UTS on website and mobile app instead of visiting the station booking counter.

They can use all digital payment options for recharging of ATVM smart cards. For this, they have to visit www.utsonmobile.indian-rail.gov.in. If a passenger is already registered for mobile ticketing, same account can be used.

After successful login, the passenger has to select menu, then smart card recharge, and then feed ATVM smart card stock number which is printed on the card. Then passenger has to enter a valid recharge amount and agree to complete the top up at ATVM within specified time period.

The girl was immediately admitted to Capital Hospital here and later handed over to her family who came from Ganjam to pick her up, said police sources.

The students alleged that as per the assessment formula devised for Plus II, regular students have been awarded scores in theory papers on the basis of their per-

formance in Class X board exam. However, in case of ex-regular students, marks have been awarded in theory papers based on their performances in previous CHSE examinations, which is unacceptable.

An ex-regular student Manoranjan said, "We want marks to be awarded as per our performance in Class X since we were not told in advance that an offline exam would be conducted. We have been neglected and cheated. Regular students, who had passed Class X with 70 per cent marks, were

awarded similar marks in Plus II. But many of us who scored good marks in the matriculation exams have been marked failed."

Earlier, the dissenters had attempted to march towards Naveen Niwas September 6. Their attempt to gherao the Chief Minister's residence was foiled by the police during their demonstration near Master Canteen Square.

The students' wing of the Congress party had backed the protest saying the fate of the students hanged in balance due to the 'apathy of the state government and CHSE'.

The pass percentage of ex-regular students in Arts stream was 26 as only 7,161 students passed the exam while 27, 595 had appeared for it. In commerce, 2,530 ex-regular students were assessed, from which a total of 1,386 students passed and the pass percentage stood at 54.78 per cent.

"We faced difficulties in assessing ex-regular students as many of them had not appeared any examination under the CHSE in the last few years. The council searched for marks they had secured in their latest examinations," said School and Mass Education Minister Samir Ranjan Dash.

Bhubaneswar, Sept 20: The state Monday registered a slight decline in the daily Covid-19 cases with 510 people testing positive for the infection which pushed Odisha's caseload to 10,20,754, a Health department official said.

The state Sunday had reported 623 cases while it was 695 Saturday.

Of the 510 new cases, 79 were children and adolescents in the age group of 0 to 18 years. The rate of infection among the children and adolescents was 15.49 per cent against 15.24 per cent Sunday.

While 297 new cases were reported from quarantine centres, the remaining 213 were local contact cases.

Khurda district, of which the state capital Bhubaneswar is a part, reported the highest 197 cases, followed by Cuttack (78). Khurda and Cuttack districts together accounted for 53.92 per cent of the total

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No water for farmers in dist with 5 rivers

Jajpur, Sept 20: Considering Jajpur district's continuous contribution of crores as revenue to the state exchequer, and the fact that rivers like Brahmani, Baitarani, Kharasrota, Birupa and Budha flow through the district, the farmers here should have had better irrigation facilities. But here on ground, the situation is quite the opposite.

The government is laying emphasis on irrigation, setting a target to irrigate hundred percent of all agricultural land in state. For this, the number of pani panchayats and their capacity are said to be increased through Command Area Development programme, for equal distribution of water, maintenance of canals and increasing the capacity of the projects.

Similarly, a huge amount of money is being spent every year to construct field irrigation canals, to repair and resurrect community ponds.

But looking at the evident current scenario, it doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure out how Jajpur district is neglected with respect to providing irrigation facilities to the farmers.

The Minor Irrigation department in the district has had proposals to construct 74 minor irrigation projects (MIPS) for a long period now. Of these projects, Barchana block has maximum 19 projects, followed by Sukinda

(17), Danagadi (10), Korei (eight), Dharmashala (six), Jajpur (five), Binjharpur and Dasarathpur (four each) and Rasulpur (one). But no progress has been achieved in this regard.

It is expected that once these projects are completed and functional, more than 5,000 hectare of agricultural land would be irrigated. With these projects still confined to proposals only, the apprehensions of drought leave the farmers in a state of panic. As of now, according to the government sources, a total of 4,479 hectare of land is being irrigated through only 58 MIPS.

Neglecting the farmers, gallons of water is being supplied daily to

the 12 industries in Kalinganagar Industrial area by IDCO. For this, an intake well has been set up on the riverbank at Pankapala. Similarly, 90 percent of the water in the Baitarani River flows into the sea.

What surprises the locals is that not a single irrigation project has been constructed in the upper catchment area of these two main rivers which flow right through the district. Not for nothing are the people of the district terming that the two rivers are not for farmers but for industries.

The government is claiming that out of total 1,45,450 hectare of agricultural land in the district, through major and minor irrigation projects, 61,322 hectare

(42.16%) and 34,600 hectare (23.78%) is irrigated in kharif and rabi seasons respectively.

But the ground report tells a different tale. From the Baitarani-Budha anicut, 10,000 acre of land in Sadar, Dasarathpur and Binjharpur blocks and 8,384 hectare of land in Barchana and Dharmashala blocks gets water in kharif season. At the same time, this 164.005 kilometre-long canal fails to irrigate 680.89 hectare of land.

Woman's body fished out from Brahmani river

Purusottampur, Sept 20: A man has been allegedly bludgeoned to death by some unidentified miscreants while he was asleep at Chingudighai village under Purusottampur police limits in Ganjam district, late Sunday night.

On being informed by locals, Purusottampur police reached the spot and recovered the body of the deceased.

Police have registered a case in this connection and launched a probe into the incident.

a liquor shop owner and was sleeping near a temple when he was attacked by the miscreants, IIC Priya Ranjan Chhotray stated.

The exact cause of death has

not been ascertained yet. It appears to be a valid reason that he must have been murdered by some local bootleggers as Binayak repeatedly complained about them,

a senior official of Purusottampur police station expressed.

Primary evidences suggest that more than one person are involved in the alleged murder of Binayak. The miscreants have written with blood of the victim the name of their next target as 'driver Gouda'.

Likewise, they have left a note mentioning the name of their target Prabha Gouda, Purusottampur SDPO Suryamani Pradhan said.

The targeted driver had been staying in Surat of Gujarat for past several years and returned to the village recently.

Police have initiated a manhunt to nab the killers, the SDPO added.

Flood plays spoilsport for cage fish farming in Balasore

THE FISHERIES DEPARTMENT HAD CULTIVATED AROUND 5.5 QUINTAL OF POMPANO FISH FINGERLINGS IN CAGE FISHING METHOD BUT HARVESTED ONLY 16 QUINTAL IN 40 DAYS

Rupsa, Sept 20: Low pressure triggered rainfall and the subsequent flood have played spoilsport for cage fish farming near the Bahabahalpur fish landing centre under Sadar block in Balasore district, a report said.

Incessant rainfall coupled with the flood muddled the sea water and increased its salinity, following which the fisheries department had to harvest the fish within a period of 40 days, much before the designated period of three months. However, this has not deterred the department or the fishermen as they plan to cultivate more fish in 22 cages after a month.

The department had cultivated around 5.5 quintal of pompano fish fingerlings in cage fishing method but got only 16 quintal due to premature harvest. The fish after their harvest were auctioned at ₹127 per kg.



PREMATURE HARVEST

Reports said that cage fish farming involves this newer method of growing fish in existing water resources by means of an enclosed net or cage which allows free flow of water. It is an

aquaculture production system made up of a floating frame, net materials and mooring system.

Fish farming in marine cages is providing a ray of light for many fishermen who are reeling under dwin-

dling catches coupled with the rising operational cost of vessels and environmental degradation. Fishermen are getting attracted to cage aquaculture because of the huge profit margin in this method.

The cage aquaculture had been taken up in the area by National Fisheries Development Board and Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI). The project was inaugurated at Bahabahalpur by Pratap Chandra Sarangi, former Union Minister of Animal Husbandry, Fisheries and Dairying, January 10.

The project was taken up as a pilot project and the former Union minister launched the project by releasing 1600 Indian Pompano fingerlings weighing 50 grams each in eight cages, August 7. The fish were to be allowed to grow for a period of three months and then harvested.

However, the fish were harvested much earlier after the incessant rainfall and flood played spoilsport. Subhadip Ghosh, Gyanaranjan Das, Biswajit Das from CMFRI and Manas Sinha from NFDB, marine fisheries officer Nalinikanta Das, fishermen and fish traders were present during the harvest.

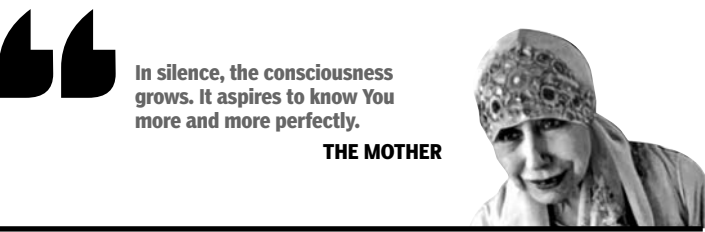

New Captain

Some may consider it a sad commentary on the Congress leadership that it took four years and seven months to oust Captain Amarinder Singh as Punjab Chief Minister and find his replacement. It may be a grave mistake to presume that the Captain had no contribution in strengthening his party in that state. Also, the change leaves the new incumbent barely four months to prove his mettle and redeem unfulfilled pledges made by the outgoing Captain. This replacement could have been prompted by a desire to simply offer a new face without any encumbrances. Whether that alone will fetch enough votes for the party to retain power can only be seen in the elections to be held soon. The Congress leadership might have been prompted to react the way it did in Punjab by seeing how the BJP, too, has been behaving in different states recently.

This sort of a change in regional leadership is not new in Indian politics. Congress had been doing this throughout Indira Gandhi's lifetime. The assumption was that the average voter voted for the supreme leader. It was considered that the people in between did not matter in any way. Keen political observers may be able to draw parallels between the behaviour of the Congress of the old times and the BJP of today. The BJP too, now at least, thinks that all those who vote for it are doing so in the name of Narendra Modi. The ignominious manner in which strong man BS Yediyurappa was shown the door in Karnataka is a great example. All he had to do to retaliate was to give a statement that 'Let us not be under any illusion that we can win all elections by using Modi's name'.

The damage has been done. To what extent this will impact the BJP's fortunes will be measureable after the next polls. These are astute leaders whose words hold deep meaning for the common man. Looking at the Congress, it is interesting to note that while the national leadership most likely wanted Navjot Singh Sidhu as the next CM of Punjab, outgoing CM Amarinder Singh had to utter a few words to queer the pitch for him. Amarinder stated 'Navjot Singh Sidhu is an incompetent man. He has a connection with Pakistan. It will be a threat to national security'. Those words were enough to bury Sidhu's political dreams six feet under the ground.

The Congress did benefit from Indira Gandhi's name which did have a tremendous sway over the Indian voters for a long time. Yet, in 1977, not only was the Congress defeated but Indira was personally humbled by a non-entity called Raj Narain. After her death, the damage wreaked by Indira's style of functioning has made the Congress leaderless at the bottom of the pyramid today. Now, with no national figure to charm the voter, the party seems to be doomed to slowly wither away.

Instead of opting for so-called young leaders, it may be wiser for the Congress to hold on to the old guns that are still capable of delivering. All the young leaders promoted during the UPA decade have been unable to retain even their own constituencies. Some prominent ones have defected and weakened the party, thus proving that the selection process was wrong from the beginning. Interestingly, the choosing was done primarily with the idea of promoting legacies which were expected to take prime positions in the future. While the parents might have been stalwarts, the offspring have proven to be useless. This could also mean that new age Indian politics requires leaders at the lowest level. The Congress does not seem to have any machinery capable of encouraging or even recognizing new elements. Without a bunch of fresh faces and new ideas, the party seems to be going down in a spiral.

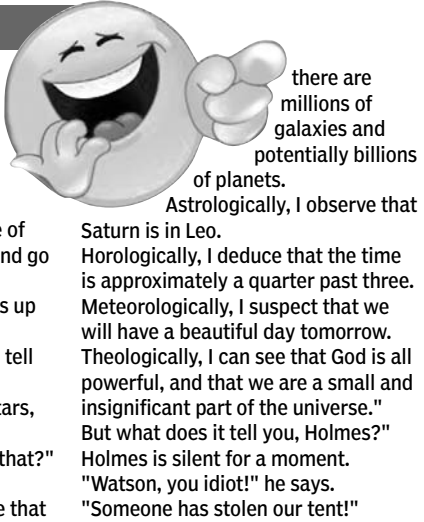
Can of worms

To open a metaphorical can of worms is to examine some complicated state of affairs, the investigation of which is likely to cause trouble or scandal and which you would much prefer was left alone. A recent example appeared in the Washington Times: “Uncovering past ownership, however, can open its own legal can of worms in exposing art theft.” It has long since become an overused and overrated journalistic cliché, which rather lends itself to mixed metaphors: “Africa is a huge can of worms and we can no longer stick our heads in the sand” (from the Daily Record of Glasgow of 17 March 2006). The earliest example I've found is from a syndicated article in the Ironwood Daily Globe of Michigan in 1951: “The question of command for Middle East defense against Soviet aggression is still regarded as ‘a can of worms’ at General Eisenhower's SHAPE headquarters here.” The evidence suggests that the original cans of worms were real cans with actual worms in them, collected as bait for fishing. Here's one in a largely forgotten work of 1914, Diane of the Green Van, by Leona Dalrymple: “There are times, alas, when even fish are perverse! Thoroughly out of patience, Diane presently unjoined her rod, emptied the can of worms upon the bank, and returned to camp.” Fishermen have told me that the most annoying aspect of opening a can of worms is that, being live bait, they crawl out and are difficult to put back. So there may well be an association with the idea of Pandora's Box, as you suspect. It's easy to see how an angler — more probably a non-fishing friend or relative of an angler — who opened a can containing a wriggling mass of worms would see it as something that was best left closed and unexamined.

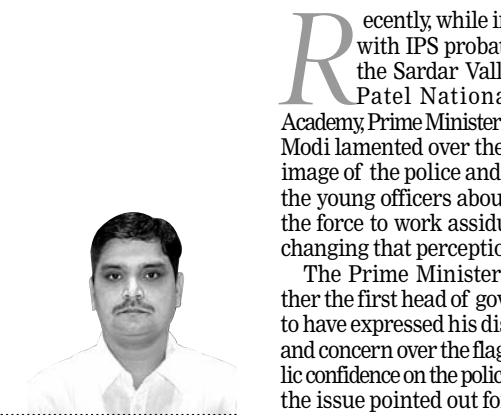

WHAT AILS OUR POLICE

WHY IS THE IMAGE OF THE POLICE CLOUDED WITH DISTRUST, SUSPICION AND FEAR AND WHAT FOR DOESN'T IT CHANGE DESPITE SIGNIFICANT INTERVENTIONS AND REFORMS? ARE THE POLICE PERSONNEL SINGULARLY RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL THAT IS WRONG WITH THE INSTITUTION AS A WHOLE?

Recently, while interacting with IPS probationers at the Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel National Police Academy, Prime Minister Narendra Modi lamented over the negative image of the police and exhorted the young officers about to enter the force to work assiduously on changing that perception. The Prime Minister was neither the first head of government to have expressed his displeasure and concern over the flagging public confidence on the police, nor was the issue pointed out for the first time. The dwindling confidence of the public towards the police force has been discussed ad nauseam and volumes have also been written about the people's lack of trust in the police. However, given that ignominy still persists and the public perception of police in India still remains clouded, it is pertinent to discuss the issue and more importantly search for workable solutions. Police is an important and integral part of the state machinery and is the fulcrum through which the State enforces law and maintains order. Therefore, managing trust is important for the police as it is the foremost institution that sets the criminal justice system in motion. It goes without saying that the sacrifice the police force makes in maintaining law and order, fighting crime, terrorism and violence and responding to disasters and pandemic is immense. However, it is indeed unfortunate that the mention of police today evokes images of corruption, abuse of power, human rights violations, collusion with criminals, acting under influence, and an overall unprofessionalism lined with insensitivity towards the common citizens they are meant to serve. As we discuss the issue of public trust and confidence vis-à-vis police, few pertinent questions arise. Why is the image of the police clouded with distrust, suspicion and fear and what for doesn't it change despite significant interventions and reforms? Are the

police personnel singularly responsible for all that is wrong with the institution as a whole? What can be done to change the work culture of the police to build confidence and create an environment of mutual coordination with the public? Is there a way out of this quagmire of disbelief and cynicism?

The answer to these questions has been dealt seriously both by independent police researchers and other institutions such as courts, civil society and by successive governments as well as by police leaders leading the force. While the former have unequivocally be-moaned the multiple prejudices that have plagued the police and have attributed this to the colonial legacy of the present police system, the latter have flagged the issues of the harsh and challenging working conditions, long working hours, non-existent social life, hostile environment and lack of public empathy and support, as the reasons affecting the behaviour and work culture of the force. Be that as it may, one may wonder if the situation will ever ac-

tually change, or are the police ordained to wear the badge of distrust and disparagement forever? Are citizens doomed to accept the contemporary police as fait accompli or deserve a sensitised, modern and a people's police? The answer to these questions perhaps lies in “technology”.

As we know, policing demands interaction of police officers and personnel with the public. It is during these interactions that a common man often complains of experiencing a rude, insensitive and uncouth police force. Intimidating interaction, unfriendly gestures, denial and delay in redressing the grievances, perfunctory investigation, and corruption in providing services, use of brute and violent methods makes the experience of a citizen with the police harrowing and tormenting.

It is in this backdrop that technology has the potential to be a game changer. Sensitive policing can be fostered by leveraging technology to both reduce the burden of work on police personnel, while automating administrative and

other day-to-day tasks, thereby minimising police interaction with citizens for these routine procedures and maximising the potential of the workforce.

For example, a simple facility of e-FIR now available in many police jurisdictions in the country is a pioneering example of technology coming to the aid of police personnel as well as citizens. It has reduced the discretion of the police in not registering cases and bringing transparency in the process.

Using technology to mediate traffic maintenance and including automated tickets for traffic violation have proved useful in eliminating petty corruption and harassment of citizens by police.

The use of body cameras used by police personnel on the ground dealing with law and order and other enforcement activities have proved as an effective check in the use of disproportionate force.

The use of DNA technology in investigation of sensational crime has the potential of enhancing the credibility of the police investigation. Other emerging fields such as artificial intelligence and innovative use of social media have been playing a significant role in bridging the communication gap between police and the public.

Technological innovations have been changing the police landscape rapidly. It's a new world out there, and it continues to throw up challenges and opportunities that are markedly different from what we have been used to. India of the 21st century needs a modern, adaptive police force that reflects not the fears and apprehensions of people, but their hopes and aspirations. Therefore, an educated and professionally trained police force that knows how to leverage technology for effective policing is essential in order to meet the challenges and opportunities as well as to uphold the trust of the people.

Afghanistan's forsaken women



OF ALL THE TRAGEDIES WITNESSED SO FAR THIS DECADE, NONE MAY BE WORSE THAN THE ONE NOW FACING THE 19 MILLION WOMEN IN AFGHANISTAN

Wing to the pandemic and other calamities, many referred to 2020 as a “biblical year.” Now, however, it is starting to look like we are in a “biblical decade.” Between the floods in Western Europe, the wildfires in Greece and Turkey, and the Delta and Mu variants of COVID-19, our planet and traditional way of life are coming increasingly under pressure.

Yet nothing this year can compare to the tragedy that is being visited upon Afghanistan's 19 million women who face an acute threat of being plunged back into the dark ages. The international media has duly highlighted the risks, with many outlets reminding us of the oppression that women suffered under Taliban rule between 1996 and 2001. The Taliban have responded with reassurances that women's rights — especially their rights to work and receive an education — will be respected as long as they are consistent with the values of an Islamic society under Sharia law. The next few months will show whether this promise will be kept. One can only hope that Afghanistan's new rulers will stay true to their word and resist the backward-looking forces within their ranks. Doing so would be a clever strategy, not only because it would buy them much-needed good

will with the international community, but also because it would be good economic policy. A society that oppresses women is a society that quashes its prospects for growth and development.

A growing body of research has shown that promoting gender equality benefits not only women but the entire economy. An influential 2019 paper in Econometrica shows that the reduction of occupational gender gaps and other distortions contributed to a more efficient allocation of talent and generated sizeable productivity and welfare gains in the United States. The authors attribute a remarkable 20-40% of growth in aggregate market output per person between 1960 and 2010 to the improved allocation of talent.

Eliminating gender and other forms of discrimination could plausibly generate even larger gains in developing countries, many of which exhibit severe resource misallocations and low productivity. Obviously, an economy has a much better chance of achieving its full potential when half of its population is not restricted from deploying its skills and talents. As Christine Lagarde and Jonathan D. Ostry of the International Monetary Fund argued in 2018, excluding women from economic activity prevents a country from benefiting

from complementarities between male and female labour.

Even prior to the recent regime change in Kabul, women's prospects in Afghanistan were bleak. One indication of this came from the World Bank's “Women, Business and the Law” (WBL) score, which measures the degree of legal gender discrimination as it affects women's economic opportunities. A score of 100 indicates complete equality (under the law) between men and women; a score of zero indicates that women have none of the rights afforded to men. In 2020, Afghanistan's WBL score was 38.1, compared to a global average score of 76.1 and a South Asian regional average score of 63.7.

Afghanistan's 2020 score of 38.1 means that women there faced severe legal restrictions in almost every category covered by the index even before the Taliban returned. For example, women still were not allowed to travel outside their home or choose where to live in the same way as men. But this is not to suggest that the country made no progress in the 20 years since the Taliban last held power. Despite the enormous political challenges it faced, women's rights were expanded in some important areas. A 2015 law, for example, allowed women to apply for passports in the same way as men, thus affording them more mobility.

In recent joint work, I argue that while Sharia law imposes some constraints on women, it is not necessarily inconsistent with making progress on legal gender equality. Indeed, several authors have argued that it is patriarchal culture, not Islamic law, which often lies behind stark gender inequalities. Here, Tunisia serves as a good example of how gender equality in the family sphere can be incorporated within the bounds of Sharia. In 2020, the country received a WBL score of 67.5, remarkably higher than the Middle East and North African regional average of 51.5.

Let's hope that the Taliban will not reverse the small gains of the past 20 years. If they uphold their new commitments, they will win some measure of international good will and improve Afghanistan's prospects for economic development. For its part, the international community must keep applying diplomatic, political, and economic pressure to ensure that the country's women are not abandoned to a wretched fate yet again.

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Gap between Covishield doses

Sir, These days many medical experts are favouring a reduced time gap between the two doses of Covishield vaccine. Earlier, the gap between the first dose and the second one was 42 days, but now it is 84 days. The increased gap is possibly due to supply of vaccination not in keeping pace with the demand. Supply should be stepped up and the gap between the two doses should be narrowed down so that more and more people can avoid being infected by the deadly coronavirus. Experts are of the view that “the primary purpose of protection from the severe disease is well met by the available vaccines, including Covishield”. Single-dose recipients are not fully immune to the disease. Some experts are said to be recommending reduction of the time gap to four weeks from the present eight weeks. According to virologist, Prof. Shahid Jameel, science supports the increased gap of 8-12 weeks. Mixed opinion among experts in respect to the gap between two Covishield vaccine doses can be seen. If the increased gap of doses is more effective, then what about the fate of the people who were administered vaccine with a reduced gap of 42 days as against 84 days?

Wooing the Dalits

Sir, Speculations over the new Punjab Chief Minister finally came to an end as Charanjit Singh Channi was elected as a Dalit face of the Congress replacing Captain Amarinder Singh. Channi is a close aide of Punjab Pradesh Congress chief Navjot Singh Sidhu, who relentlessly opposed the Captain's leadership. Channi was among the Cabinet ministers who criticised the Captain's handling of the sacrilege issue and failure to curb the drugs and transport mafia and believed that the former Chief Minister had failed to fulfill his 2017 election promises. Channi is the first Dalit leader in a state that has a Dalit population of about 32% but whose Chief Ministers have almost always been Jat Sikhs. The battle to win Dalit votes seems to be raging with the Shiromani Akali Dal, which is in an alliance with the Bahujan Samaj Party, as well as the Aam Aadmi Party promising to elect a Dalit as Deputy Chief Minister if they are voted to power.

New twist to Kotia tale

ODISHA GOVERNMENT TO CONDUCT SEPARATE POLLS IN KOTIA PANCHAYAT AFTER AP ANNOUNCES ‘ELECTION’ RESULTS

Koraput/Pottangi, Sept 20: The feud between the Odisha government and Andhra Pradesh government over control of the Kotia panchayat took a new turn Monday. The Koraput district administration has started its preparation to hold panchayat elections in Kotia. This move comes months after the Andhra Pradesh government conducted polls to the Kotia panchayat.

Both the Andhra and the Odisha government have been at loggerheads regarding territorial rights in Kotia region. The actual jurisdiction of the Kotia region lies in Odisha, the state government has claimed repeatedly in the past. The dispute over Kotia is a long-pending border issue between Odisha and Andhra Pradesh. Both the States have been claiming their sovereign rights on the area, which consists of 27 small tribal hamlets.

Reports said that the district administration of Vizianagaram conducted the counting of votes at Government Degree College in Salur and announced the names of the winning candidates. YSR

Congress’ candidate Majhi Appalamma secured victory in the rural polls in Tala Ganjeipadar panchayat defeating his nearest rival by 41 votes. He secured 124 votes. Similarly, Koneti Gindo received 311 votes in Phagunsineri panchayat and won as a Samiti member. Ambadi Anil Kumar received 16,305 votes and became a Zilla Parishad member. The YSR Congress candidates were very successful in the ‘polls’ conducted by the Andhra government.

The Andhra government had conducted the panchayat elections April 8 after changing the names of Ganjeipadar, Phaguna Sineri and Phaatu Sineri. However, due to an Andhra Pradesh High Court order the results had been not been announced. They were finally announced Sunday.

This happened because the BJP, Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and

Jansena had knocked on the doors of Andhra Pradesh High Court April 6 with a plea to nullify the elections held in Kotia as well as across the state. A three-member division bench heard the matter and stayed the declaration of results. In spite of the high court order, the Andhra government went ahead with the polls. After the stay order was vacated Monday last, the results of the Kotia panchayat were declared Sunday. Notably, Andhra Pradesh had recognised Tala Ganjeipadar, Phagunsineri and Phatusineri villages in Kotia as three separate panchayats and conducted the elections for the posts of sarpanch in all the three.

Meanwhile, the Koraput district administration has started preparing to hold three-tier panchayat polls in Kotia panchayat. The Odisha government will conduct the three-tier rural body election of its own in the Kotia group of villages in due course of time. It has no connection with the election which was conducted recently by the Andhra Pradesh government, District Information and Public Relation Officer (DIPRO) of Koraput, Jagannath Prasad Rayguru said Monday in a press note. He said that the Andhra government-conducted polls holds no meaning for the Odisha government as it does not consider Kotia to be a part of the neighbouring state. The elections to the Kotia panchayat will be conducted with other parts of Odisha, informed Rayguru.

At that time, local candidates can file nominations while the people of Kotia will elect their leaders for the Panchayati Raj Institution (PRI), the DIPRO further said in the press note

MGNREGS programme goes haywire in Kalahandi district

BLAME GAME OF OFFICIALS STOPS RURAL PARK CONSTRUCTION

Phulbani, Sept 20: With an aim to provide work to people under MGNREGS during the pandemic, the Phulbani block administration in Kalahandi district started the construction of a rural park at Tudipaju village. However, work has been left midway into the construction drawing anger of the locals. They have criticised the block administration for its failure to complete the project.

However, some officials pointed out that the funds sanctioned for the project were not sufficient enough to complete the work.

To provide job opportunities to the unemployed, the block administration had decided to set up the rural park. It would not only be a scope of employment, but also a chance for children living in the village to enjoy the atmosphere of a park like their city counterparts do.

Subsequently, a budget was sanctioned for the children’s park in Tudipaju village. As it was MGNREGS-related work, a villager (called ‘mate’) was given charge of execution of the project. However, the ‘mate’ failed to execute the job properly. It was not his fault alone as a large number of job card holders did not show any interest to work in the project.

Matters turned worse as both



the block and panchayat officials blamed each for failure to finish the construction work.

When contacted, Tudipaju sarpanch Mrutyunjay Kanhar said the park is to be developed for village kids. “A fund of Rs 9,00,000 has been sanctioned for the project. But we are not getting labourers or job card holders to carry out the construction work. Vendors are also reluctant to supply materials as the work order is in the name of the ‘mate’. Initially in May, some work was done, but since then there has been no progress,” Kanhar said.

The version of ABDO, Santosh Digal, a former gram panchayat extension officer, however, did not match with that of the sarpanch.

“A fund of Rs 15 lakh has been sanctioned for the park. This money will be spent towards the wages of job card holders, buying materials and installing swings and carrying out other ancillary work. But construction has stopped. Efforts are on to restart the work,” Digal informed.

Junior engineer of Phulbani block Umesh Chandra Sahu when contacted gave a budget figure that did not match with those provided by the sarpanch and ABDO. “A budget of Rs 5,00,000 has been sanctioned for the park. Since money is not being released for stone chips, sand, cement etc, there is no progress in construction,” informed Sahu.

LEOPARD SKIN SEIZED, 2 HELD IN BARIPADA

Baripada, Sept 20: Forest department officials seized Monday a leopard skin and arrested two persons, including an engineering student, during a raid at a hotel here, police informed. Acting on a tip-off, personnel of the Forest department posing as traders had contacted the person who had the leopard skin. The leopard had been killed inside Similipal National Park, a police officer said.

The Similipal National Park in Mayurbhanj district is home to tigers, elephants, leopards, barking deer, wild boars, chausingha (four-horned antelope), and giant squirrels.

The seized leopard skin was 71 cm long and 23 cm wide, Santosh Joshi, divisional forest officer, Baripada said. The two arrested persons were identified as Bikas Binay Singh of Palasbani village and Bikas Chandra Bentkar of Khanua village in Mayurbhanj district, the forest official informed.



Villagers forced to drink unhygienic pit water

Jhumpura, Sept 20: With the sole rural drinking water project in Kasia village of Malda gram panchayat under Jhumpura block in Keonjhar district lying defunct for over four months, the villagers are being forced to use water from an unhygienic pit (chua in local parlance). Surrounded by a dense forest, Kasia village falls under Ward No-6 of the panchayat. The village has four sahis and is inhabited by over 600 people. Continuous drinking of the pit water has led to many being affected by various types of stomach ailments.

There had been an effort to ease the drinking water woes in the village. Under the ‘Basudha Scheme’, a drinking water supply project spending over lakhs of rupees from District Mineral Foundation (DMF) fund was set up in the village in 2018-19. A deep bore well was dug up, a water overhead tank was constructed, an electric motor was installed and pipes were laid.

However, within two years of the initiation of the project, the pipes developed cracks leading to the disrupted water supply. Due to lack of proper maintenance, the pipes in the

pump house were also damaged. Lastly, the electric motor pump also developed snags leading to the complete failure of the project.

The villagers have made numerous visits to the panchayat and the Rural Drinking water supply offices in Jhumpura. They have met officials and requested their intervention to make the project functional but to no avail.

“We have submitted letters to the officials concerned on several occasions, requesting them to take steps to end our problem. It seems there is none to listen to our problem. We have again been forced to use the same pit water,” rued Shukadeb Munda, Ganda Munda, Durga Munda, Keshab Munda, Shirapani Munda, Kunu Naik and Madan Naik of Ghutu Sahi of Kasia village.

When contacted, junior engineers on the concerned department Mohan Singh and Subhasmita Khamari said the electric motor pump has been sent for repair. Once it is repaired and brought back, the pipes and other materials would be repaired or replaced, as their conditions demand, and the project would soon be made functional.

Both reached Priyanka Gandhi Vadra's cottage located amid forests of pine and cedar in the suburbs of the Himachal Pradesh capital where she is already holidaying with her family.

Sonia reached Chandigarh, the joint capital of Punjab and Haryana, by air in the morning from where she headed straight to the cottage by road.

In the evening Rahul too reached here after attending the oath-taking ceremony of newly appointed Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi. Rahul reached the Raj Bhawan as the ceremony was about to end. After spending some time with party leaders, he headed to Shimla by road.

The Gandhis are expected to stay here for two-three days and



there is no plan to meet any party functionary during the stay, an official said in a statement.

Priyanka's five-room cottage -- with wooden frames and shingled exteriors and a sloping tiled roof -- is at a height of more than 8,000 feet in Charabra, some 15 km uphill from here.

Priyanka along with her children and mother regularly visits the cottage, just close to Wildflower Hall, on a four-bigha plus agricultural plot that was purchased in 2007. The Congress Sunday picked Charanjit Singh Channi as the next Chief Minister of Punjab.

After having picked Channi as the next Chief Minister of Punjab, the Congress is likely to pick two senior leaders from the state as Deputy CMs. A tweet from senior Congress leader Pawan Kumar Bansal, who is AICC treasurer, revealed the names of two senior leaders and outgoing ministers in

the previous Amarinder Singh's cabinet -- Brahm Mohindra and Sukhjinder Singh Randhawa -- as the party's choice for the Deputy chief minister's posts.

While Mohindra is the Hindu face of the party, Randhawa is the Jat face. Mohindra was considered a close confidant of former Chief Minister Amarinder Singh.

"Heartiest congratulations to @Charanjit channi for elevation as #Punjab CM and @Brahm Mohindra & @Sukhjinder INC as Dy CMs. Best wishes for their grand success in the services of Punjab under the leadership of Smt. Sonia Gandhi and Sh @Rahul Gandhi," Bansal, a former MP from Chandigarh, tweeted.

Channi Sunday had met Governor Banwarilal Purohit to stake claim to the top job in the poll-bound state soon after being elected as the leader of the Congress Legislature Party.

Amarinder Singh was nudged into quitting ostensibly over his "failure" to fulfil the promises made by the party in the 2017 assembly polls.

DENGUE CRISIS IN DELHI 53 CASES IN LAST 1 WEEK

New Delhi, Sept 20: Over 50 fresh cases of dengue have been reported in the national capital in the last one week, taking the total count this year to more than 210, according to a civic report released Monday.

In this month alone, 87 cases have been recorded till September 18, which is about 41 per cent of the cumulative cases.

The number of dengue cases for January 1-September 18 period is also the highest this year since 2019 when the count had stood at 217 in that same duration.

According to the civic report issued by the municipal corporations last week, 158 cases of dengue were recorded till September 11 this year.

So, 53 fresh cases have been logged in one week.

Seventy-two cases were reported in the month of August, according to the report.

Cases of vector-borne diseases are usually reported between July and November, but the period may stretch till mid-December.

The month-wise distribution of cases are -- January (0), February (2), March (5), April (10) and May (12), June (7) and July (16), it said.

In the previous years, the cases in the same period were -- 1,375 (2016), 1,465 (2017), 343 (2018), 217 (2019) and 172 (2020), according to the report.

According to the civic report released Monday, 86 cases of malaria and 44 cases of chikungunya have also been reported till September 18 this year.

Malaria, dengue and chikungunya are accompanied with high fever and therefore, doctors feel that people might suspect that they have contracted Covid-19.

Dengue cases reported in the national capital till date are "under control" and the Delhi government is alert and all prepared to handle any situation arising out of the

Civic bodies in Delhi have intensified their measures to prevent outbreak of vector-borne diseases.

However, no deaths have been reported due to dengue in the city till now

vector-borne disease, city Health Minister Satyendar Jain had told reporters September 15.

The Delhi health minister also said that the government's anti-dengue drive, '10 Hafte, 10 Baje, 10 Minute' running for the last two weeks or so to raise awareness on its prevention, and it will be further intensified.

South Delhi Mayor Mukesh Suryan recently had alleged that the Delhi government was playing "campaign politics" when it came to the fight against the vector-borne diseases, termed its anti-dengue drive an "eyewash".

The senior BJP leader in the party-ruled South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC), at a press conference here, had claimed that Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal was "taking credit" in controlling vector-borne diseases in the city.

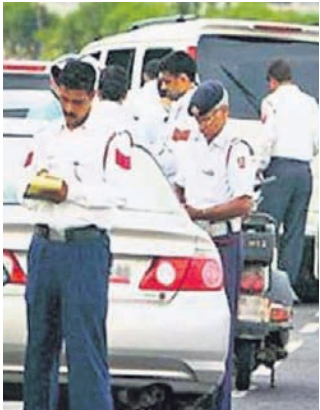
Vehicle owners need to carry PUC certificate

New Delhi, Sept 20: The Delhi government has asked vehicle owners to carry valid pollution under control (PUC) certificates or pay a fine of Rs 10,000 along with an additional action of suspended driving license for three months.

"The Transport department, Government of NCT of Delhi, in its ongoing efforts to control pollution and improve air quality in Delhi, requests all motor vehicle owners in the city to ply their vehicles only with valid PUC certificate," said a notice issued by the Delhi Transport department on Sunday.

"All registered vehicle owners are requested to get their vehicles checked from the pollution checking centres authorised by the state Transport department to avoid any penalty/imprisonment/suspension of driving licence," the notice further added.



As per the record, there are more than 900 pollution checking centres set up at petrol pumps and workshops spread all across Delhi, making it easier for motorists to get their vehicles checked at their convenience.

According to the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, vehicles including BS1, BS2, BS3, BS4 and BS6 require to carry the PUC. Even vehicles fitted with CNG and LPG kits require to have the certificate, which is renewed for a year for few diesel vehicles, any BS4 and above petrol vehicle and three months for the rest.

Delhi hosp treats 1st case of black fungus in kidney



India always had the highest reported numbers of mucormycosis in the world, but when coupled with Covid it became a disease of epidemic proportions in several states during the 2nd wave of Covid-19

New Delhi, Sept 20: A 34-year-old man from Ghaziabad has been successfully treated for a complicated case of Mucormycosis, also known as black fungus, after recovering from Covid infection, doctors at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital said here Monday.

The Mucor had not only pene-

trated the nasal cavity but also spread to his left lung and the right kidney -- reported in medical literature as the first case in the world after Covid infection, the hospital said in a statement.

The patient Ranjeet Kumar Singh presented to the hospital with post-Covid illness, which included breathing difficulties, blood in sputum and high grade fever.

After investigation the doctors were shocked to find that Mucor had not spread from the nasal cavity to his left lung and the right kidney.

Since mucor is a fast spreading disease and could further damage other organs, a part of his left lung and the entire right kidney was removed immediately as a life-saving procedure. The complicated surgery lasted for six hours. Mucormycosis is labelled as a rare and emerging fungal infection.

Delhi to get its 1st wild animal rescue centre

New Delhi, Sept 20: Delhi's first wild animal rescue centre at Rajokri will be launched during the wildlife week next month, forest and wildlife department officials said Monday.

"The facility has come up on a 1.24-acre plot in Rajokri in New Delhi district where a monkey rescue centre was lying abandoned. We have upgraded it to a wild animal rescue centre. It will be launched during the wildlife week," a for-

est department official said.

There was no such private or government facility in the national capital. Until now, the forest department, along with wildlife NGOs, used to rescue stranded or injured animals and rehabilitate them at Asola Bhatt Wildlife Sanctuary in South Delhi. "The engagement with the NGOs to rescue animals will continue. A veterinarian from the South Delhi Forest Division will be deployed at the centre for their treatment," the official said.

Placement-linked skill training boon for Himachal rural youth

There are scores of others who availed the benefit of the scheme and skilled themselves in getting employment, an official said.

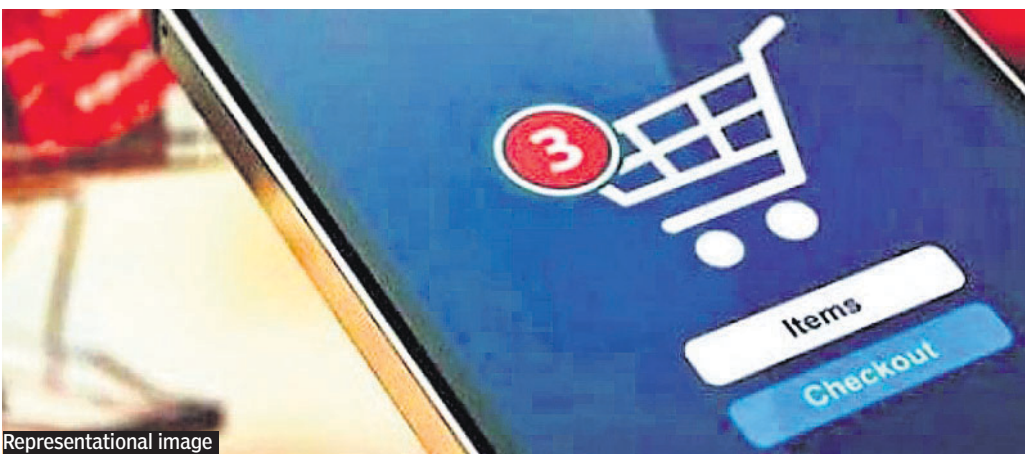

Shimla, Sept 20: Himachal Pradesh's famous handmade shawls, sweaters, carpets, organic honey, fruits and spices will soon be available on e-commerce platforms like Amazon, Flipkart and Government e-Marketplace (GeM).

Himachal Pradesh's Rural Development Minister Virender Kanwar said the state government is planning to facilitate 2.80 lakh women belonging to 27,000 self-help groups (SHGs) access to the e-commerce platforms so that they can sell their products in a wider market.

The e-commerce platforms will enable small artisans living in remote or snowbound areas of the hill state to showcase their organic, natural and handmade products and connect them with buyers from across the country, Kanwar said

in a statement. The uploading of the SHG products on e-commerce platforms is under progress and will be available under 'Him Ira' brand.

This is a major step towards women empowerment and will give a big boost to the women entrepreneurs, he said. The necessary standardisation procedure and

quality tests along with paper works are being completed expeditiously to provide sustainable livelihood opportunities to the women from SHGs. The minister said this would

also integrate SHGs with the government's public finance management system (PFMS), thus helping them get their payments without difficulties. The state government will help the SHGs in branding, packaging and pricing their products to make them market competitive. This will open doors of growth and ensure the rural women folks get maximum profit, Kanwar said.

At present, the products made by women SHGs are available only at government and a few other outlets. Following an initiative of Kanwar, the state tourism department has agreed to display these products at all the tourist hotels in Himachal Pradesh so that the SHGs products are easily available to the tourists.

In Himachal Pradesh, about 15,000 SHGs are involved in agri-

cultural activities while 12,000 SHGs in non-farm activities under the ambit of the National Rural Livelihood Mission. Some SHGs sell products at 'Him Ira' shops and weekly markets under the 'Him Ira' brand.

At present 40 'Him Ira' shops are in operation in various parts of Himachal Pradesh and the state government is planning to set up around 100 'Him Ira' shops in all districts of the state so that small farmers and SHGs reach markets without interference of a middle man or vendor.

A woman member of a SHG earns around Rs 200-300 daily and the state government is providing Rs 50,000 to every SHG to start livelihood activities, the minister said.

The central government has also provided them interest subvention on loans up to Rs 3 lakh.

Naga peace talks commence after over a year

Kohima, Sept 20: After over a year, crucial meetings between the Government of India envoy and Naga insurgent outfits began here Monday to settle the long-pending Naga political issue involving various bodies, including the NSCN (IM).

Officials in Kohima said that former special director of the Intelligence Bureau (IB) and Central government representative AK Mishra and the NSCN (IM) leadership led by Thuingaleng Muivah held a meeting at the police complex in Chumoukedima. NSCN-IM leader Rh Raising told the media after the meeting that everything should be initiated on the basis of the Framework agreement signed with the government in 2015. "We reiterated our commitment to the Framework agreement in letter and spirit. After the Covid-19 pandemic, the talks have resumed. The Government of India has sent us a letter stating that Mishra will hold talks with our leaders," Raising told a television channel.

Stating that a separate flag and constitution are uncompromising issues, Raising said: "Any agreement without separate flag and constitution is unacceptable and meaningless."



'Covid may be heading towards endemic stage'

Top virologist Dr Gagandeep Kang said Monday that the coronavirus pandemic in the country may be heading towards endemic stage, adding that a third wave, if it does take place, is likely to be due to local flare-ups that would be smaller and spread wider across the country. "When you have something that is not going away in the near future, then it is heading towards endemicity. Right now, we are not looking at eliminating SARS-CoV-2. This means that the virus has to become endemic," Dr Kang, who teaches at Vellore's Christian Medical College, said in an interview. An endemic stage is one when a disease or illness, instead of going away, is regularly found in a particular region, meaning that people there have to learn to live with it.

Modi's 71st birthday. The daily Covid-19 vaccination in the country was over 1 crore September 6, August 31 and August 27.

India took 85 days to touch the 10-crore vaccination mark, 45 more days to cross the 20-crore mark and 29 more days to reach the 30-crore mark, according to the ministry.

The country took 24 days to reach 40 crore from 30 crore doses and then 20 more days to cross the 50-crore vaccination mark on August 6, it said. It took 19 more days to go past the 60-crore mark and took only 13 days to reach 70 crore from 60 crore September 7, the ministry said.

India to resume vaccine export

India's vaccination drive has been a role model for the world and it is marching ahead with great speed

New Delhi, Sept 20: India will resume export of surplus Covid-19 vaccines in the fourth quarter of 2021 under the 'Vaccine Maitri' programme and to meet its commitment to the COVAX global pool, but vaccinating its own citizens remains the topmost priority of the government, Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya said Monday.

Addressing the media, the minister said the government will receive over 30 crore doses of Covid-19 vaccines in October and over 100 crore doses in the next three months. He also said that cumulative doses administered so far across the country have crossed 81 crore and the last 10 crore doses were administered in only 11 days. Asserting that vaccination of our own citizens remains the government's topmost priority, Mandaviya said the export of surplus vaccines would begin in the next quarter (October-December) under the Vaccine Maitri programme and in order to fulfil the commitment of India towards COVAX. This is in line with our motto of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam', he said.

He said that the surplus supply of vaccines will be used to fulfil India's commitment towards the world for the collective fight against Covid-19. COVAX is co-led by Gavi, the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI) and WHO.

Highlighting the importance of indigenous research and production of Covid vaccines in India, he said that it is due to the relentless efforts and guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi that India was simultaneously undertaking research and production of Covid vaccines in such a big way.

Talking about the expected production and supply trends in the coming months, he said that more than 30 crore doses will be produced in October and more than 100 crores in the coming quarter.

India Friday administered a record number of over 2.50 crore Covid-19 vaccine doses on the occasion of Prime Minister Narendra

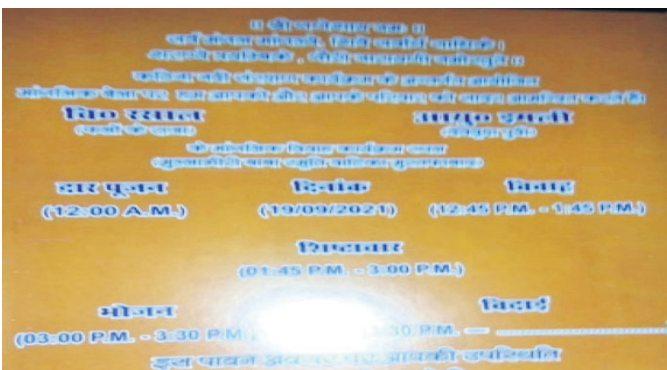
Mango 'weds' tamarind to revive UP river

Can't give 'judicial diktat' to send kids to schools: SC

New Delhi, Sept 20: The Supreme Court Monday observed it can't give a 'judicial diktat' for sending children to schools disregarding the possibility of a fresh spike in Covid cases as it refused to entertain a Class 12 student's plea seeking resumption of physical classes across the country.

Stating that it should be left to the government to take a call on "governance issues", the top court also advised the 17-year-old student from Delhi to focus on studies instead of getting involved in seeking Constitutional remedies. At the same time, the court said it would not call the student's Public Interest Litigation (PIL) a "publicity gimmick" but it was a misplaced petition and that children must not get involved in such issues.

A bench of Justices D Y Chandrachud and B V Nagarathna said the student may pursue his remedies with the state government.

"Ask your client to focus on studies in school and not get involved himself in seeking Constitutional remedies. You see how misplaced this petition is. Imagine the (Covid) situation in Kerala. Maharashtra



cannot be the same in Delhi. I am not saying it is a publicity gimmick but this is why children must not get involved in these issues. We don't have any kind of data before us", the bench told advocate Ravi Prakash Mehrotra.

The top court then perused the prayers in the PIL and said the petitioner wants re-opening of schools to enable physical classes. The court said that after Article 21A has been brought into force, it has obligated the state governments to provide free and compulsory

education to all children between the age 6 and 14. "You see the governments are ultimately answerable. They are also concerned about the need for children to go back to schools.

That is the purpose of schools. We cannot, by judicial diktat, say that you shall send your children back to school, oblivious of the dangers which may be there."

The country has just come out of the second Covidwave but there is still danger of a possible spike of viral infection, the court said.

ARRESTED SPY TURNS OUT TO BE ISI AGENT

Bangalore, Sept 20: In a joint operation by the Military Intelligence and Karnataka Police a spy, who was working for Pakistan's Inter-Security Intelligence (ISI), was arrested here Monday, police said. The accused has been identified as Jitendra Singh from Rajasthan's Barmer district, according to police sources.

Accused spy Jitendra Singh took the videos and photos of Army bases, firing ranges and movement of the Indian Army and sent them to the ISI agents, sources said.

The accused wore an Indian Army uniform while taking pictures and videos. After sending the videos, photos and voice messages, he would delete all of them. However, the police officers have managed to retrieve all the deleted messages, sources said.

Jitendra Singh was trapped through a fake Facebook account called 'Neha Aka Pujari' by an ISI agent. The agent struck a friendship with Singh as he had put up a picture of him in army uniform.

Sources further said he came in touch with ISI in 2016. After sweet talks for years, he was asked to send videos, photos and other information in return for a huge sum of money. The accused agreed and carried their orders. He was paid digitally from different accounts, sources add.

MAHANT NARENDRA GIRI FOUND DEAD AT ALLAHABAD MUTH

Allahabad, Sept 20: Mahant Narendra Giri, the president of Akhil Bharatiya Akhada Parishad, was found dead Monday at Baghambari Muth here, police said.

The Parishad is the largest organisation of sadhus in India. According to Inspector General of Police K P Singh, Mahant Giri's body was found hanging from the ceiling by his disciples.

A purported suicide note was also found at the site in which the seer had written that he was mentally disturbed and was ending his life. He had also delegated various responsibilities to his disciples in the note, the police said.

The IGP said that police had received a call at 5:30 PM from the Muth that Giri had hanged himself.

Prima facie it appeared to be a case of suicide but things will be clearer after the post-mortem and forensic tests, the police said. The influential Hindu seer was hospitalised in April after he tested positive from Covid-19.

Khaleda's prison suspension extended

Dhaka: The Bangladesh government has extended the suspension of former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia's jail sentence for another six months. Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan made the announcement, saying that she can receive treatment at home but cannot leave the country during this period, reports Xinhua news agency. The decision came as the opposition Bangladesh Nationalist Party chief's family has long been seeking permission from the government to allow her to go abroad for better treatment.

Afghan schools reopen for boys

Kabul: Secondary and high schools, as well as madrasas, for boys across Afghanistan have reopened after more than a month of the country's takeover by the Taliban, the Ministry of Education said. In its announcement on Sunday, the Ministry however did not say when the schools for girls would reopen. "Boy students and male teachers of all private and government-run secondary, high schools, and madrasas or religious schools have been asked to return to schools in all 34 provinces of Afghanistan," the ministry said in a statement.

Israel re-allows foreign tourists

Tel Aviv: Israel has re-allowed foreign tourist groups to enter the country, the Israeli Ministry of Tourism said. The resumption from Sunday is limited to tourist groups only from countries without high Covid-19 morbidity; Xinhua news agency quoted the Ministry as saying. It added that all tourists in the groups must be vaccinated with three doses, or with the second dose given in the last six months. Since the outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic in late February 2020, the government has suspended the entry of tourists into the country.

2 killed in Libya copter crash

Cairo: Forces loyal to a powerful Libyan commander said two military planes crashed Sunday over a village in eastern Libya, killing at least two officers. The self-styled Libyan Arab Armed Forces, led by Gen. Khalifa Hifter, said the helicopters collided in the air over the village of Msus, 130 kilometers southeast of the city of Benghazi. A two-officer crew was killed in the crash, while the second helicopter crew survived, the forces said in a brief statement.

France opts for confrontation with US

Paris, Sept 20: Choosing a full-fledged confrontation with the United States due to the loss of a mega-contract for submarines for Australia, France is making a risky bet and other nations are not rushing to its defense. After Australia renounced its deal for conventional submarines in favour of the US nuclear-powered ones, France took the extraordinary step of pulling its ambassadors from both Washington and Canberra for consultations. Bertrand Badie, an international relations professor at the Sciences Po institute in Paris, said France had put itself in a position where it can only appear to be backing down or losing face once its ambassador re-

turns to the United States, its historic ally. "When you get into a crisis like this, you better know where the exit is," he said. Australia said it decided that nuclear submarines were a better choice to ensure its maritime edge as it announced a new three-way alliance with the United States and Britain widely seen as aimed at China – whose rise has been the overriding priority of US President Joe Biden's administration. French President Emmanuel Macron, who has stayed subdued publicly, is set to speak to Biden in the coming days. But Foreign Minister Jean-Yves

Le Drian has used language rarely used among friendly nations, alleging "lying" and "duplicity" and saying France was "stabbed in the back" by Australia. He so far has no meeting scheduled on the sidelines of this week's UN General Assembly in New York with US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, himself a French speaker known for his love of Europe. No backing from Europe With a contract worth Aus\$50 billion (\$36.5 billion, 31 billion euros) on its signing in 2016, the French anger may show the country's powerful Defense industry

that political leaders are pressing their case. But the diplomatic impact is less certain, with France appearing isolated at the start of the UN General Assembly. Fellow EU power Germany, which holds elections next Sunday, is hardly eager to get involved. The government simply said it took note of the dispute. Celia Belin, an expert on transatlantic relations at the Brookings Institution, said that France could rally fellow European nations around shared perceptions that the Biden administration is lacking a Europe strategy. "France needs to share this assessment with European allies and put it on the table with the Americans to find solutions," she said. While most European nations rejoiced at seeing Biden defeat the divisive Donald Trump, Biden also triggered criticism from European allies over his determined withdrawal from Afghanistan, which led to a swift Taliban victory after a 20-year NATO-backed war. Another sore point is the continued Covid-19 ban on most Europeans from traveling to the United States, even as the European Union – spurred by nations depending on tourism – relaxed entrance requirements for Americans.

US begins mass expulsion of Haitian migrants

Del Rio (US), Sept 20: The US is flying Haitians camped in a Texas border town back to their homeland and blocking others from crossing the border from Mexico in a massive show of force that signals the beginning of what could be one of America's swiftest, large-scale expulsions of migrants or refugees in decades. More than 320 migrants arrived in Port-au-Prince on three flights Sunday, and Haiti said six flights were expected Tuesday. In all, the US authorities moved to expel many of the more 12,000 migrants camped around a bridge in Del Rio, Texas, after crossing from Ciudad Acuña, Mexico. The US plans to begin seven expulsion flights daily Wednesday, four to Port-au-Prince and three to Cap-Haitien, according to a US official who was not authorized to discuss the matter publicly. Flights will continue to depart from San Antonio but authorities may add El Paso, the official said. The only obvious parallel for such an expulsion without an opportunity to seek asylum was in 1982 when the Coast Guard intercepted Haitian refugees at sea, said Yael Schacher, senior US advocate at Refugees International whose doc-

toral studies focused on the history of US asylum law. Similarly large numbers of Mexicans have been sent home during peak years of immigration but over land and not so suddenly. Central Americans have also crossed the border in comparable numbers without being subject to mass expulsion, although Mexico has agreed to accept them from the US under pandemic-related authority in effect since March 2020. Mexico does not accept expelled Haitians or people of other nationalities outside of Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador. When the border was closed Sunday, the migrants initially found other ways to cross nearby until they were confronted by federal and state law enforcement. An Associated Press reporter saw Haitian immigrants still crossing the river into the US about 1.5 miles (2.4 kilometers) east of the previous spot, but they were eventually stopped by Border Patrol agents on horseback and Texas law enforcement officials. As they crossed, some Haitians carried boxes on their heads filled with food. Some removed their pants before getting into the river and carried them. Others were unconcerned about getting wet.

107-yr-old Japanese twins certified as world's oldest

Tokyo, Sept 20: Two Japanese sisters have been certified by Guinness World Records as the world's oldest living identical twins, aged 107 years and 330 days, the organisation said Monday. The announcement coincided with Respect for the Aged Day, a national holiday in Japan. Sisters Umeno Sumiyama and Koume Kodama were born on Shodoshima Island in western Japan November 5, 1913, as the third and fourth of 11 siblings. The sisters as of September 1 broke the previous record of 107 years and 175 days set by famous Japanese twin sisters Kin Narita and Gin Kanie, Guinness World Records Ltd. Said in a statement.



About 29 per cent of the population of 125 million in Japan, the world's fastest aging nation, are 65 years or older, according to the health and welfare ministry. About 86,510 of them are centenarians – half of whom turned 100 this year. Sumiyama and Kodama were separated after finishing elementary school, when Kodama was sent to work as a maid in Oita on Japan's southern main island of Kyushu. She later married there; while Sumiyama remained on the island they grew up on and had her own family.

Pro-Kremlin party on track to retain majority in parliament

Moscow, Sept 20: Russia's ruling party was on course Monday to retain the super majority needed to ensure President Vladimir Putin's continued grip on power after parliamentary elections that most Opposition politicians were barred

from and that were marred by multiple reports of violations. The vote has been watched closely as key to the run-up to the 2024 presidential election. It's not yet clear whether Putin will run again, choose a successor or outline a different path – but he is expected to keep his hand on the tiller whatever he decides, and an obedient State Duma, or parliament, is crucial to those plans. Results from about 95% of the country's polling stations gave the ruling United Russia party 49.64% of the vote for the 225 seats apportioned by parties, according to the Central Election Commission. Another 225 lawmakers are chosen directly by voters, and the re-



sults Monday morning showed United Russia candidates leading in 199 of those races. Top United Russia official Andrei Turchak suggested that the party will get 315 out of the 450 seats – a result that would give them more than two-thirds of the legislature's seats.

In fact, the results indicated there would be almost no Opposition voices in the Duma at all, with three other parties that usually tow the Kremlin line set to take many of the remaining seats, along with the New People party, which was formed last year and is regarded by many as a Kremlin-sponsored project. Cries that the results had been manipulated mounted Monday, when the results of online voting in Moscow were still not available to the public. The results in the other six regions that were allowed to vote online have been released. In Moscow, approvals of the ruling party have always been particularly low and protest voting has

been widespread, and Kremlin critics were calling for protests of the vote later in the day. Any fraud allegations aside, the Kremlin sweep was widely expected since few opposition candidates were even allowed to run this year after Russian authorities unleashed a sweeping crackdown on Kremlin critics. Organisations linked to imprisoned Opposition leader Alexei Navalny have been declared extremist, and anyone associated with them was barred from seeking public office by a new law. Navalny is serving 2½-year prison sentence for violating parole over a previous conviction he says is politically motivated.

Hundreds starve to death in Ethiopia's blockaded Tigray

FORCED STARVATION IS THE LATEST CHAPTER IN A CONFLICT WHERE ETHNIC TIGRAYANS HAVE BEEN MASSACRED, GANGRAPED AND EXPELLED

Nairobi, Sept 20: In parts of Ethiopia's Tigray region, people now eat only green leaves for days. At a health center last week, a mother and her newborn weighing just 1.7 pounds died from hunger. In every district of the more than 20 where one aid group works, residents have starved to death. For months, the United Nations has warned of famine in this embattled corner of northern Ethiopia, calling it the world's worst hunger crisis in a decade. Now internal documents and witness accounts reveal the first starvation deaths since Ethiopia's government in June imposed what the UN calls "a de facto humanitarian aid blockade."

Forced starvation is the latest chapter in a conflict where ethnic Tigrayans have been massacred, gang-raped and expelled. Months after crops were burned and communities stripped bare, a new kind of death has set in. "You are killing people," Hayelom Kebede, the former director of Tigray's flagship Ayder Referral Hospital, recalled telling Ethiopia's Health Ministry in a phone call this month. "They said, 'Yeah, OK, we'll forward it to the Prime Minister.' What can I do? I just cry." He shared photos of some of the 50 children receiving "very intensive care" because of malnutrition, the first such images to emerge from Tigray in months. In one, a small child with startled-looking

eyes stares straight into the camera, a feeding tube in his nose, a protective amulet lying in the pronounced hollow of his throat. Medicines have almost run out, and hospital staffers haven't been paid since June, Hayelom said. Conditions elsewhere for Tigray's 6 million people are often worse. The blockade and the starvation that comes with it mark a new phase in the 10-month war between Tigray forces and the Ethiopian government, along with its allies. Now the United States has issued an ultimatum: Take steps to stop the fighting and let aid flow freely or a new wave of sanctions could come within weeks. The war began as a political

dispute between the Prime Minister, 2019 Nobel Peace Prize winner Abiy Ahmed, and the Tigrayans who had long dominated Ethiopia's repressive national government. Since November, witnesses have said Ethiopian forces and those from neighboring Eritrea looted food sources and destroyed health centers. In June, the Tigray fighters took the region, and Ethiopia's government declared a ceasefire, citing humanitarian grounds. Instead, the government has sealed off the region tighter than ever, fearing that aid will reach the Tigray forces. More than 350,000 metric tons of food aid are positioned in Ethiopia, but very little of it can get into Tigray.

Mumbai, Sept 20: New initial public offerings (IPOs) will help add USD 400 billion to the overall market capitalisation over the next three years, an American brokerage said Monday.

The estimate comes on the back of a surge in IPO activity in the last few months, which has seen companies raise USD 10 billion from public markets since the beginning of the year – higher than the money raised in the three years prior to that, Goldman Sachs said. “We expect the IPO pipeline to remain robust over the next 12-24 months, based on recent announcements from ‘new economy’ unicorns and our objective framework for estimating new listings,” it said.

The number of such ‘unicorns’, which are companies having a valuation of USD 1 bn and above, has surged in India in recent years, enabled by the rise of the internet ecosystem, availability of private capital and favourable regulatory environment, it said.

“We estimate nearly USD 400 billion of market cap could be added from new IPOs over the next 2-3 years. India’s market cap could increase from USD 3.5 trillion currently to over USD 5 trillion by 2024, making it the 5th largest market by capitalization,” it said.

At present, Indian equity indices are among the ‘oldest’ in the

However, as the large digital IPOs get included, the new economy sector’s exposure could rise from 5 per cent to 12 per cent (at 50 per cent float) and 16 per cent (full inclusion) over the next 2-3 years, it said. Among the companies which have debuted on the stock markets is Zomato, while others like the fin-tech player Paytm are in the fray.

While Indian equities have done well this year (trading 26 per cent up since January), being the best

performing market regionally has prompted overheating concerns, the brokerage said, but added that it is overweight on expectations of a strong cyclical recovery and supportive flows.

Investors can find attractive return opportunities, as long as they don’t overpay for growth, as evidenced by significant outperformance of China’s new economy stocks over the past decade. Financial intermediaries may have substantial revenue opportunities from growth in issuance-related activities, it added.

PNB earns ₹170 cr by levying charges: RTI

New Delhi, Sept 20: State-owned Punjab National Bank (PNB) collected nearly ₹170 crore by levying charges on customers for not maintaining the required minimum balance in their accounts during 2020-21, according to RTI (Right To Information).

The lender’s revenue earned from such charges stood at ₹286.24 crore in 2019-20. Banks levy such charges on a quarterly basis during a fiscal year.

The quarterly average balance (QAB) in the April-June period of 2020-21 stood at ₹35.46 crore (both on savings and current account); while no such charges were levied in the second quarter of FY21.

MINIMUM BALANCE

In the third and fourth quarters, the QAB non-maintenance charges stood at ₹48.11 crore and ₹86.11 crore, respectively, PNB said in a reply to Right to Information (RTI) sought by Madhya Pradesh-based social activist Chandra Shekhar Gaur.

Also, the lender earned ₹74.28 crore in the form of ATM transaction charges during the year. In the preceding 2019-20, it was ₹114.08 crore.

The bank said it waived the ATM transaction charges during the first quarter of 2020-21 vide an IBA letter and government guidelines.

In response to a query on the number of operative and inoperative accounts, the lender said 4,27,59,597 accounts were dormant as of June 30, 2021, while a total of 13,37,48,857 accounts were operative.

Zero tolerance for corruption: Amazon

New Delhi, Sept 20: Amid reports of Amazon probing bribery-related charges against some of its legal representatives in India, the US e-commerce giant Monday said it takes allegations of improper actions seriously and investigates them fully to take appropriate action.

Without confirming or denying allegations, Amazon said it has “zero tolerance for corruption”.

When contacted, an Amazon spokesperson said: “We have zero tolerance for corruption. We take allegations of improper actions seriously, investigate them fully and take appropriate action. We are not commenting on specific allegations or the status of any investigation at this time”.

A person aware of the development said US-headquartered companies such as Amazon take whistleblower complaints seriously, especially those related to payment of bribes to foreign government officials in order to retain or obtain business. This is also to ensure compliance with corporate governance rules. Meanwhile, traders’ body CAIT has demanded a CBI inquiry saying the matter relates to the credibility of the government and is counter to the vision of removing corruption at all levels within the government.

The Confederation of All India Traders (CAIT) also demanded that names of officials involved in the matter be made public and ex-

emplary action be taken against them.

CAIT National President BC Bhartia and Secretary General Praveen Khandelwal said it needs to be inquired whether the alleged bribery has “any connection with the ongoing investigation or related with continuous violation of the law and rules by Amazon”.

These steps are required to protect Indian e-commerce market and the retail trade from undue influence, abuse of dominance and connivance with government officials, which falls under Anti-Corruption Act, they added.

Evergrande sparks fears over Chinese economy

New Delhi, Sept 20: Chinese company Evergrande has started to repay investors in its wealth management business with property, as the world’s most indebted real estate developer faces a key test this week, the BBC reported.

Major banks have reportedly been told that they won’t receive interest payments on loans that are due Monday, while interest payments of \$84m on the firm’s bonds are also due Thursday.

New Delhi, Sept 20: Investors’ wealth has tumbled by ₹51,261.2 crore in two days of equity market decline amid a bearish trend overseas.

Sliding for the second consecutive session Monday, the 30-share BSE benchmark Sensex plunged

524.96 points or 0.89 per cent to close at 58,490.93. During the day, it dropped 626.2 points to 58,389.69.

In the previous session, the index settled 125.27 points or 0.21 per cent lower at 59,015.89. Following the weak trend, the market capitalisation of BSE-listed companies tumbled ₹51,261.2 crore in two

days to reach ₹2,55,47,093.92 crore.

Tata Steel was the biggest loser on the Sensex chart, diving 9.53 per cent, followed by SBI, IndusInd Bank and HDFC. In contrast, HUL, Bajaj Finserv, TITC, HCL Tech, Nestle India, Bajaj Finance and RIL settled with gains. Sectorally, BSE metal, basic materials, realty, power and

utilities indices tanked up to 6.80 per cent, while FMCG closed higher.

In the broader market, the BSE midcap and smallcap indices declined up to 1.84 per cent.

The Indian markets finally seem to be taking a small pause, largely driven by nervousness in the global markets.

Annual salary increments to touch 8.6% in 2022: Survey

New Delhi, Sept 20: Average annual salary increments are expected to touch pre-pandemic levels of 8.6 per cent in 2022, early estimates from Workforce and Increments Trends Survey by Deloitte reveal. In line with gradual improvement in business confidence in recent months, about 25 per cent of the companies surveyed have projected a double-digit increment in 2022, the report said.

As per the second phase of the survey 2021, 92 per cent companies gave an increment in 2021 at an average of 8 per cent, compared with only 4.4 per cent in 2020, where just 60 per cent companies had ex-



tended a pay hike.

Moreover, GDP forecasts for FY 2021-22 were revised down after the second wave and we expect or-

ganisations to closely watch similar developments while managing their fixed cost increases next year, Ghose noted.

IT is the only sector that is expected to extend double-digit increments with some digital e-commerce companies planning to give some of the highest increments.

Retail, hospitality, restaurants, infrastructure, and real estate companies continue to project some of the lowest increments in line with their business dynamics.

Going forward, function-specific increment differentiation may become more prevalent as attrition rates vary significantly across different skills, noted Anubhav Gupta, partner, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu India.

The survey further noted that approximately 12 per cent employees were promoted in 2021, as com-

pared to 10 per cent in 2020. Almost 12 per cent companies have updated their bonus or variable pay plans to align their rewards structures with the changing priorities.

In most cases where such a survey was conducted, employees seem to prefer a hybrid work arrangement (combination of work from home and office, wherever feasible). However, at an all India level, only 40 per cent organisations have finalised their return to work strategy.

Some leading organisations are taking specific initiatives to prepare managers to lead teams in a virtual/hybrid workplace model and drive collaboration through training programmes, the survey said.

Opening the bowling, architect-turned-mystery spinner Varun Chakravarthi (3/13) did the star turn with three wickets in an excellent four-over spell. Star all-rounder Andre Russell (3/9) also bagged three wickets, including AB de Villiers' golden duck, while there were two for Lockie Ferguson. Devdutt Padikkal was the high-

est scorer with 22 runs in a forgettable outing in skipper Virat Kohli's 200th game for RCB.

Bowling the day's second over, right-arm medium pacer Prasidh Krishna dealt RCB a big blow when he had Virat Kohli trapped in front of wicket with his fourth delivery that jagged in and hit him above the knee-roll.

Dubai, Sept 20: Liam Livingstone and Evin Lewis' explosive batting will meet its match in Chris Gayle's power and KL Rahul's finesse when Rajasthan Royals lock horns with Punjab Kings to improve upon their mid-table position in the IPL here Tuesday.

The two IPL teams have been perennial under-achievers in the league and would be desperate to change their fortunes after disappointing one and all with their underwhelming performances over the past few seasons.

More so for Punjab Kings, the only team that has lacked any kind of stability over the 14 seasons of IPL with captains and coaches being changed like musical chairs.

For skipper KL Rahul, who has been a prime performer in IPL, it will not just be about the runs he scores but also about how he leads the team with guidance from Anil Kumble, who will also want to prove his mettle as a franchise coach. However, the match Tuesday will be more about the kind of starts that the top-orders players provide.

Livingstone has been a rage in shortest format for last couple of years now and is coming into his own with some great performances in 'The Hundred'. His potential opening partner is likely to be West Indies man Lewis, who has often been Indian cricket team's nemesis in various games.

Mohammed Shami is expected



to be partnered by either Chris Jordan or Nathan Ellis. If Livingstone and Lewis can be explosive in the Powerplay overs, Royals will expect skipper Sanju Samson to be more consistent in that number three position.

What will be Royals' advantage is Punjab's weak Indian bowling set-up save Shami as they have to depend on either Adil Rashid or Ravi Bishnoi for wrist spin. Their pace line-up with left-arm Arshdeep Singh as the domestic pick doesn't look the strongest.

Royals' third and fourth foreign player in the playing XI will be interesting choices as Chris Morris as an all-rounder is a certainty, while the fourth slot will go to either David Miller in the middle-order or world's No 1 T20 spinner Tabraiz Shamsi.

However, it is the Indian players like Rahul Tewatia, Riyan Parag, Jaydev Unadkat and Chetan



Sakariya, who will like to step up their game in the next four weeks to ensure a play-off berth for Royals, which many believe is the weakest unit in absence of Ben Stokes, Jofra Archer and Jos Buttler.

Similarly for Punjab Kings, Rahul and Mayank Agarwal are expected to open with Chris Gayle still an enforcer par excellence at the age of 41 which will keep the Rajasthan bowlers on tenterhooks.

In the middle-order, Nicholas Pooran, who had a horrendous outing in the first phase will like to put a far better account of himself along with M Shahrulkh Khan.

50% additional match fee for domestic players

New Delhi, Sept 20: The BCCI Monday announced that domestic cricketers affected by the COVID-curtailed 2020-21 season will be paid 50 per cent additional match fee as compensation for the disruption and also hiked their remuneration for the upcoming season.

Many Indian cricketers struggled financially after the Ranji Trophy was not held last year for the first time in its history due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The BCCI compensation package for these players was awaited for a long time.

"Cricketers who participated in 2019-20 Domestic Season will get 50 per cent additional match fee as compensation for season 2020-21 lost due to COVID-19 situation," BCCI general secretary Jay Shah said in a tweet.

This effectively means that all players who participated in the last season and played Mushtaq Ali T20 and Vijay Hazare Trophy will get a compensation of Rs 70,000 per Ranji Trophy match (half of match fees of Rs 1.40 lakh).

The decision to give compensation and increase the match fee was taken during the BCCI's Apex Council meeting on Monday.

The per day fee for the top Ranji cricketers, who have played more than 40 matches, was also almost

doubled to Rs 60,000, which will ensure that such players earn Rs 2.40 lakh per first-class match.

Those who have played 21 to 40 matches will be paid Rs 50,000, while players with experience less than that will be entitled to a remuneration of Rs 40,000 per day. The move will likely benefit more than 2,000 male cricketers from the under-16 to the senior level.

On an average, a senior level domestic cricketer if he plays a full season of first-class, one-day and T20 matches can now earn up to Rs 20 lakh even if he doesn't have an IPL contract.

Shah also said that domestic players will be paid an increased match fee. According to the announcement, the cricketers in U-23 and U-19 category will get Rs 25,000 and 20,000 per day respectively. The U-16s will now get Rs 7000 per day instead of Rs 3,500 during earlier seasons.

Before Monday's decision, a first XI player in a Ranji Trophy game was entitled to Rs 35,000 per day. For Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy, the BCCI pays Rs. 17,500 per game.

The BCCI also announced remuneration for women cricketers and the senior players will now be paid Rs 20,000 per match instead of Rs 12,500 from previous seasons. The U-23 and U-19 girls will receive an increased match fee of Rs 10,000.

VINICIUS, BENZEMA LIFT REAL

Madrid, Sept 20: Only a few games into the season, Real Madrid already knows it has an attacking duo it can rely on. Vinicius Junior and Karim Benzema added to their impressive starts to the season by scoring late goals in Madrid's 2-1 win against Valencia in the Spanish league Sunday.

Vinicius scored his fourth goal of the season in the 86th minute, and Benzema netted his sixth two minutes later to give Madrid their third straight win in the league. The victory leaves Madrid top with 13 points, two more than defending champion Atletico Madrid, who were held 0-0 at home by Athletic Bilbao Saturday.

Vinicius and Benzema have com-

bined for 11 of the team's 15 goals in their first five league matches and top the league's scoring charts.

Valencia, who entered the weekend tied for first with Real and Atletico, opened the scoring with a goal from Hugo Duro in the 66th after a mistake by Madrid defender Lucas Vazquez, who replaced the injured Dani Carvajal in the first half.

Vinicius restored parity with a shot that deflected off a defender before going in, and then made a well-placed cross for Benzema's winning header that stunned Valencia fans at Mestalla after the hosts had played well for most of the match.

Valencia had won their first two home games for the first time since 2014-15, when they went on to win five in a row at home. Madrid was coming off three victories in all competitions, including at Inter Milan in the Champions League Wednesday.

SEVILLA HOLDS SOCIEDAD

Mikel Oyarzabal missed a first-half penalty kick as Real Sociedad was held to a 0-0 draw against Sevilla in a matchup between teams expected to be near the top at the end of the season.

Oyarzabal had his 27th-minute penalty stopped by Sevilla goalkeeper Bono, who also came up with some key saves later in the game. It was Sociedad's second consecutive draw after three straight victories in all competitions. Sevilla drew their last three games. Sociedad is fourth in the standings, with Sevilla in sixth place.

Team India to play 4 Tests, 3 ODIs, 14 T20Is at home

BCCI announces int'l calender for India between November 2021 to June 2022

New Delhi, Sept 20: The Indian cricket team will play 14 T20Is and just four Tests at home between November 2021 and June 2022 as the BCCI announced its international itinerary, which features just three ODIs.

The teams that will visit India during the eight-month period are New Zealand (in November-December), West Indies (in February, 2022), Sri Lanka (February-March 2022) and South

Africa (in June, 2022).

In between in December-January, India will be touring South Africa and the IPL will happen between April-May. Against New Zealand, India will be playing two Tests and three T20Is while West Indies are due to play three ODIs and five T20Is.

Sri Lanka will play two Tests and three T20Is while South Africa will come for the shortest tour where they would play five T20Is in a space of 10 days.

"We have kept 14 T20Is because we have another T20 World Cup in

Australia in a year's time and we need to have adequate matches before the big event," a BCCI official said.

The four Test matches will be played at Kanpur and Mumbai for the New Zealand series while Bangalore and Mohali will host Sri Lanka in the traditional format.

As per the rotation system, most of the cities will be getting the 17 white-ball games that has been scheduled. Jaipur, Ranchi, Lucknow, Vizag, Kolkata, Ahmedabad, Cuttack, Trivandrum, Chennai, Rajkot, Delhi have all got matches.
