New Delhi, May 28: Aviation regulator Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) Saturday said it has imposed a fine of ₹5 lakh on IndiGo airline for denying boarding to a specially-abled child at Ranchi airport May 7.

IndiGo had May 9 said the boy was denied permission to board the Ranchi-Hyderabad flight as he was "visibly in panic". As the boy was prohibited from boarding, his parents also de-

cided not to enter the plane.

The DGCA had May 9 formed a three-member team to investigate the incident. "It has been observed that the handling of the special child by the Indigo ground staff was deficient and ended up exacerbating the situation," said a statement by the DGCA.

Bhubaneswar, May 28: The special task force (STF) of the state Crime Branch has seized over 1 kg brown sugar valued at ₹1.20 crore during a raid in Bhubaneswar and arrested two persons. One of the accused was carrying fake ID cards and photos with police uniforms, the police said Saturday.

Acting on a tip-off, the STF conducted a raid at Baramunda area of Bhubaneswar Friday evening and seized the narcotic drugs along with ₹17,000 cash from the two drug peddlers, said DSP of STF Sachidananda Rath.

The accused - identified as Kapildev Majumdar, a resident of Kalyani Simanto under Kalyani police limits in Nadia district of West Bengal, and Rasmiranjan Bhol alias Silu of Damanbhuin under Jankia police station in Khurda - have been arrested and forwarded to court, the STF said.

Lioness dies from 'snakebite' in zoo

Barang, May 28: A lioness at Nandankanan Zoological Park here died from suspected snakebite in its enclosure, Saturday. The 15-year-old African lioness

nicknamed 'Ganga' was brought to the zoo from Israel in 2015. The animal suddenly fell ill and the animal keeper noticed its unusual behaviour Saturday morning before he informed the zoo authorities.

A poisonous snake was spotted slithering inside its enclosure due to which it was suspected that the lioness was bitten by the reptile. A veterinary team rushed to the spot and administered anti-venom injection to the animal. Despite efforts by the veterinarians, the lioness died due to thickening of the blood, said the deputy director of the zoo Sanjit Kumar.

With the death of Ganga, the lion population in the zoo has now come down to 16.

Post-mortem of the lioness will be conducted to ascertain the actual reason of her death.



Bhubaneswar, May 28: A special court here Saturday sentenced a former top official of the Women and Child Development (W&CD) Department to two years of rigorous imprisonment after he was found guilty of accumulating properties disproportionate to his known sources of income.

The convict was identified as Dr. Surendranath Pati, a native of Kendrapara. Pati resides in Nayapalli area of the capital city, sources said. The court also slapped a penalty of ₹20,000 on Pati. Nonpayment of the penalty amount would invite imprisonment for additional three months.

Bhubaneswar, May 28: The Odisha Public Service Commission has said it will keep in abeyance the recruitment process of teachers, after the UGC alleged violation of a Supreme Court order on implementation of the Odisha Universities (Amendment) Act 2020

The UGC, in separate letters to the OPSC and the Higher **Education department**, said the hiring process of faculty or non-teaching staff in universities should not be conducted for three months in the wake of the apex court order

The move comes a day after the UGC, in separate letters to the OPSC and the Higher Education department, said the hiring process of faculty or non-teaching staff in universities should not be conducted for three months in the wake of the apex court order.


The OPSC interview for appointment to the post of assistant professors for certain subjects were scheduled from June 4.

The Act was passed in the Assembly, but the opposition alleged that the law will curtail the financial and administrative autonomy of universities, and the varsities will come under direct

control of the state government. The University Grants Commission had filed special leave petitions before the Supreme Court challenging the Act, and the court put an interim halt on its implementation.

IIT Kanpur develops smartwatch for visually impaired

Around 49 million blind and 285 million visually impaired persons in the world face difficulty in easily interacting with devices due to the absence of tactile interface and India is home to about 20 per cent of the total blind people in the world

team of researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kanpur Saturday announced that it has developed a novel touch-sensitive smart watch for visually impaired persons that are equipped with modern techniques

The watch comprises sensors like PPG (Photoplethysmography) to read health parameters such as the heart rate and SpO2.

An accelerometer is used to measure the step count to keep track of daily activity. All these parameters can be individually read using the haptic menu.

"One of our objectives at IIT Kanpur has been to make innova-



tions inclusive for all. This haptic smart watch is a significant invention in this regard, which I believe will be of great help for the blind and the visually impaired, Abhay Karandikar, Director, IIT Kanpur, said in a statement.

'The touch-sensitive and vibration-based features would prove to be revolutionary in giving the sense of time to the blind and the

The invention is said to be a cost-effective smart wearable device with a touch-sensitive tactile interface that displays information

using vibrations. The dial face consisting of tactile touch-sensitive hour markers and vibration-based output is used to read time, create an interface to select different apps, haptically recognize different apps, and to

sense the numbers. The report said that around 49 million blind and 285 million visually impaired persons in the world face difficulty in easily interacting with devices due to the absence of tactile interface and Indiais home to about 20 per cent of the total blind people in the world. IANS



SDJM court grants 5-day remand for Rajesh, Robin

Bhubaneswar, May 28: The Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate (SDJM) Court Saturday allowed the City police to take two members of the notorious 'Katuri' gang on five-day remand for further investigation.

The Commissionerate Police had earlier sought the court's permission to take Rajesh Mohapatra on a remand for ten days.

Saturday, the Khandagiri police requested the court to grant ten-day remand for Robin Satpathy alias Jagan, another member of the gang. However, the court permitted the police to take both the accused on a remand for five days in the case.

Notably, Rajesh along with other members of the Katuri



gang had robbed a jewelry shop owner of ₹6 lakh at Saubhagya Nagar a few days ago.

Robin, along with six others including Rajesh's mother Jyotshna Rani Mohapatra, was arrested by special squad of Commissionerate Police May 24. Rajesh had later surrendered before the SDJM court here Thursday. Both Rajesh and Robin are resiCapital police limits.

Police had also recovered several sharp weapons and a toy gun during a raid at the residence of Rajesh April 14. However, Rajesh and his family members had managed to escape before the raid.

Similarly, the special squad also managed to arrest dreaded criminal Chakara Barik, also a ring leader of the group, after a shootout at Baramunda May 11.

According to sources in police, Rajesh's family member used to receive and dispose of the booty looted by the gang. They would also distribute the money among the members. There are around 20 cases pending against Rajesh at different police stations in City.

2 yrs on, Dhenkanal smart park a non-starter

Dhenkanal, May 28: Although sanctioned two years ago for the construction of a smart park in town. funds of ₹1 crore lay unspent with the Dhenkanal Municipality authorities, a recent report said.

The civic authorities are yet to acquire a land for the purpose. As a result, the smart park in town is yet to be built.

The state government had planned to construct the park spanning two acres with various facilities, keeping pace with the rapid urbanisation and growing aspirations of the residents.

Kansarjharan dam project shelved for 30 years amid irrigation woes

Locals say no effort has been made to realise former CM Biju Patnaik's assurance of building a dam across the hilly stream

Sambalpur, May 28: About 30 years have passed after a proposal was made for building a dam at Kansarjharan under Jujumura area in Sambalpur district. But the much-anticipated has been left in the cold store. Farmers in the area have been struggling to irrigate their farmlands and meet their water needs solely from the stream.

Reports said, former Chief Minister Biju Patnaik had inaugurated Kayakud panchayat office building and Jujumura market complex during his visit to Jujumara in 1992. At that time, farmers and local people had demanded construction of a dam. highlighting before Patnaik the need of a water reservoir at Kansarjharan. The former Chief Minister had assured the locals to look into their demand in the larger interest of farmers. Former Rairakhole MLA and minister Basant Mahananda was present

Later, following a directive from Patnaik, a team of officials had also conducted a survey in the area and held discussions with people. But the project has remained a

non-starter till date. Many locals have repeatedly approached the district administration and various departments in Bhubaneswar in

this regard, but in vain. The people of Kansar panchayat still lamented over the fact that the assurance of the former Chief Minister has remained unrealised. They are still

waiting for the project. They pointed out that most of the panchayats under Jujumara block are forested and hilly areas. There are several streams in the area. These natural water sources can be harnessed for irrigation purpose if conserved in a reservoir. Debjharan waterfall originates from Jarang forest area and flows though many areas. Water of streams like Kansarjharan, Debjharan and Kutherjharan flows through Naktideula and finally mingles with a stream at Kanchanpur. All these streams flow perennially all through the year. Locals said that only Debjharan has been developed as

an eco-tourism spot with various

Kansarjharan should be developed as an irrigation facility to boost farming. Many people are eager to spare their land for The government should seri-

ously consider the long awaited proposal of the reservoir across Kansarjharan, which will provide irrigation to farmers of Gadgadbahal, Musakani, Kansar and Janumunda. The district administration and the forest department should take up a survey on the proposed project. However, executive engineer Santosh Pattnaik of the Water Resources department said that a survey was conducted years ago, but the work could not be carried forward due to presence of forest land around the proposed site.

Historic coast canal hurtles towards death

Bahanaga, May 28: Historic Odisha coast canal, built during the British era, is fast losing its existence in Balasore due to illegal constructions at several places, it was alleged.

Now, roads have been laid on the canal bed in Bahanaga block by blocking the water. Such sights are dime a dozen at Abhana, Baripada, Aruhabada and Kharasahaspur areas. Local farmers have expressed their anguish over such development, alleging that such illegal way of building roads across the historic canal will finally strike its death knell and in a few years. They said that there is no law that allows damaging a canal and building roads on it.

On the other hand, renovation of the canal, at some places, has been taken up under MGNREGS. However, lakhs of rupees have been bungled through shoddy renovation work.

In 2011, a portion of the canal at Talapada under Remuna block was



filled up and a small bridge was built there. Following allegations, the irrigation department had looked into the matter and blamed it on the gram panchayat. Later, the bridge and the road were pulled down.

In 2017, a similar development took place near Balarampur in Baripada panchayat under PMGSY. The road work was halted while a bridge was built at the place.

A few years ago, a road was laid across the canal after filling up its bed in Abhana panchayat. Locals alleged that the Water Resources department and the drainage division have turned a blind eye to

such illegal activities They pointed out that the canal used to resolve issues like irrigation, drainage, flood control and ingress of saline water from the sea. The canal would be of immense help for farmers in irrigating the farmlands, if the state government pays attention to its renovation.

When contacted, BDO Gourang Ghose said canal renovation is being carried out under MGNREGS after getting permission from the

project director of the DRDA. "At places, the canal is being

ast month, a set of over 100 retired government servants wrote a letter to the prime minister. The signatories included a former head of the Research and Analysis Wing or RAW, and a former National Security Advisor. They wrote that communal violence in India "is no longer just the politics of an assertive Hindutva identity, nor the attempt to keep the communal cauldron on the boil – all that has been going for decades and in the last few years had become a part of the new normal. What is alarming now is the subordination of the fundamental principles of our Constitution and of the rule of law to the forces of majoritarianism, in which the state appears

It is difficult to disagree with what the letter said and that is not the point I am making today. In response, another set of over 100 retired government servants wrote in support of Hindutva politics and accused the signatories, which again it should be noted included a former RAW head and former NSA,

This is to me more interesting and it is a reflection on the state of our civil services. It has almost nobody from within questioning what is going on in India today. I can think of two IAS officers who quit the service in protest against what the government was doing. One is the young officer Kannan Gopinathan who resigned in protest against the restrictions on Kashmiris in 2019. The other one was Harsh Mander who resigned in 2002 over the Gujarat

Two officers over 20 years is all I can think of. Perhaps there are others,

but there cannot be many. It appears that for the rest either they approve of what is going on in the government they work for; or they disapprove but carry on anyway for other reasons; or they are immune and do not care what the government does.

This is not a minor issue and is a reflection on Indian morality. It means that the entire bureaucracy is fine with violence against minorities catalysed by the State. And that they are fine with eccentric economic policies that devastate the lives of the vulnerable and the poor, such as taking away their currency notes (which surely was also a matter over which there ought to have been resignations)

Other things arise from here. Bureaucrats carry out orders. Meaning that those running We do not appear to bulldozers over the homes and shops of the poor without any backing of the law, and those who continue to destroy homes despite a stay from the Supreme Court (as happened in Jahangirpuri) are willing participants.

The brutalisation of Aryan Khan by one officer was acceptable to that officer's colleagues and superiors, because they gauged the wind and found that the government wanted this per-

A report in the Indian Express headlined "Cruise drug raid case: One officer went rogue, agency looked other way" says the following about the case. The SIT's internal report says: "It is strange to note that in spite of clear cut

denial by Arbaaz (Merchant) — Khan's friend from whom small amount of charas was seized — regarding involvement of Aryan in procurement or possession of drugs, Investigating Officer started looking at WhatsApp chats of Arvan without even formally seizing his mobile phone. It appears the IO was motivated to somehow implicate Aryan Khan in the drug case." Why did the department and his colleagues not stop this 'rogue' officer from implicating an innocent man while the entire nation was watching for weeks? And while the media and the BJP government thoroughly demonised him. The answer is again that they either approved, or disapproved and refused to intervene or they didn't care. Such total absence of ethics in an agency with sweeping powers to destroy lives is troubling and frightening. But it must be examined.

So many of our ugly features have been exposed in recent years that this one has escaped notice or has not been commented on as much as it should have been. We do not appear to have the internal resistance a democracy must have. When one of its branches begins to malfunction (or 'go rogue') the rest of it must step in. The Americans call it checks and balances and it is the ability of the judiciary, legislature and executive to ensure one of the three doesn't overstep. This system necessarily presumes that it is the individuals inside the system, the judges, the civil servants, the administrators and the elected, who will step up when they see something problematic. It appears to have worked for them. It is not working for us. We must ask ourselves why there is such an absence of ethics and personal responsibility in the 'world's largest democracy'.

Talaria

f we wanted to invent a classical replacement for the idiom from head to toe, we might choose from petasus to talaria. The latter is one of those words - like aglet for the little tube at the end of a shoelace or philtrum for the groove in the upper lip below the nostrils - that identify something we know well but usually can't name. The two words petasus and talaria - and a third, caduceus — are associated with Hermes, the Greek herald and messenger of the gods whom the Romans knew as Mercury. He's usually portrayed as having wings on his sandals. The Romans called these talaria, a plural noun from the adjective talaris, relating to the ankle, from talus, ankle. Hermes was given his talaria by his father Zeus, who also gave him a low-crowned, broad-rimmed traveller's cap of a type well-known in classical times and which Greeks called a petasus. In later times, the hat changed to a brimless one with wings on, but it kept the name. The third traditional item of equipment of Hermes and Mercury, the caduceus, was the wand of office of a Greek or Roman herald, which usually had two snakes wound around a wooden staff. Long ago, this became confused with another rod, the staff of Asclepius, the god of healing, which only had the one snake; the twin-snake version of Hermes and Mercury replaced it and remains common as a symbol of medicine.

FOCUS INFORMATION WARFARE

FIGHTING BIG LIES

rom the Protocols of the Elders of Zion to Russian President Vladimir Putin's absurd claims that Ukraine is run by Nazis who are pursuing genocide against the country's Russian-speakers, the Kremlin has long been an expert in the dark art of disinformation. A forgery published in Russia

at the beginning of the twentieth century, the Protocols supposedly exposed a Jewish conspiracy to achieve world domination. It was as big a lie as has ever been told, and it became a pillar of the virulent anti-Semitism that led eventually to the extermination of most European Jewry by Hitler's Third Reich.

As for Putin's own big lie, it has deceived almost no one outside of Russia, but it may well have incited some of the atrocities that Russia's poorly trained, ill-informed soldiers have committed in Bucha and elsewhere. Disinformation and lies can kill. They can also tip a country over to the wrong side of history.

Western democracies had a wake-up call in 2016, when Russia interfered in the US presidential election on Donald Trump's behalf, and in the United Kingdom's Brexit referendum in support of Leave. These two shocks alerted the world's democracies to the fact that authoritarian states are unleashing a new kind of information warfare against them. The objective is to destabilise, divide, and weaken democratic societies. politics, and institutions – starting with the European Union.

Until recently, we in France had hardly considered the threat of foreign interference in our politics. But that changed with the 2017 presidential election, when emails stolen from Emmanuel Macron's campaign were dumped online just days before voters cast their ballots. Mixed in with real emails were fake ones designed to suggest, falsely, that Macron had offshore bank accounts. In 2019, similar hack-and-leak attacks were launched against German Chancellor Angela Merkel and hundreds of other German politicians.



After years of Kremlin-sanctioned Russian interference in Western elections, the threat posed by information warfare has become too big to ignore, and too serious to leave to the discretion of private online platforms.

Lawmakers should recognise disinformation campaigns for what they are: deliberate attacks on free societies

By the time the 2019 European Parliament elections were held, Russian attempts at meddling had become a foregone conclusion, and the European Commission responded by setting out an Action Plan against Disinformation and additional measures to protect the electoral process. Nonetheless. democracies remain doubly disadvantaged in the face of electoral interference, manipulation, and information warfare.

For starters, democracies cannot respond with their own counterpropaganda, lest they lose credibility in the eyes of an already distrustful public. As such, they are confined to fact-checking, which has only limited effects. Moreover, democracies cannot renounce essential principles like freedom of expression, which the 1789 French Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen describes as 'one of the most precious rights.'

Of course, this freedom is not absolute. One does not have the right to infringe on others' rights. And, unlike in the United States, many European countries have laws against hate speech. In France and elsewhere, for example, Holocaust denial is a criminal offense, and white supremacist demonstrations would be inconceivable.

Perhaps owing to these differences, the EU has done much more than the US to regulate digital platforms, which are increasingly expected to serve as guarantors of informational integrity. Under the EU's Digital Services Act, which will enter into force in 2023, online platforms will have to meet new transparency requirements, such as by explaining how their algorithms work, and by publishing an $nual\,reports\,on\,the\,illicit\,content$ (such as hate speech) that they have removed

Platforms will also be obligated to inform law enforcement about information that may constitute criminal offenses or indicate a serious threat to people's lives or security. And companies that fail to comply with the DSA will face penalties of up to 6 per cent of their annual global revenue.

But the text of the law does not really regulate "disinformation." which is a term coined by the Soviets in the 1920s to describe their preferred instrument of propaganda and destabilisation. Rather, the EU is concerned with "verifiably false or misleading information created, presented, and disseminated for economic gain or

to intentionally deceive the public," or more precisely: "coercive and deceptive efforts to disrupt the free formation and expression of individuals' political will by a foreign state actor or its agents.

In practice, the text of the DSA leaves disinformation to be dealt with through online platforms' own codes of conduct. The past few years have shown that approach to be far from satisfactory Lawmakers must be more creative and direct. Though we do not want to create anything like a thought police, we should be treating big lies for what they are: deliberate attacks on our societies.

Signaling a step in the right direction, the EU General Court recently rejected an appeal by RT following the suspension of its broadcasting license in France The court found that the balance of interests between the Kremlincontrolled broadcaster and the EU clearly fell in the EU's favour. The EU's interests, it ruled, "aim to protect Member States against campaigns of disinformation and destabilization that would be carried out by the media under the control of the Russian leadership and that would threaten public order and security of the Union, in a context marked by military ag-

gression against Ukraine.' This reasoning should not be limited to the context of a military invasion. Sanctions against any one peddling fake news should be designed on the same basis. Now that the EU-US Trade and Technology Council has agreed to pursue coordinated measures against disinformation, it has an opportunity to craft a more effective response to the threat of authoritarian information warfare.

To paraphrase Clausewitz, the world's democracies must recognise that disinformation is nothing but the continuation of war by other means. Defending against such threats will require not just stronger logistical means, but also stronger legal tools.

We have given Kashi a political thrust for installing Hindu nationalism as India's dominant political credo.

> Musim clerics aver the Hindutya Sangh has found its golden goose: Reclaiming temples by breaking mosques to get the Hindu majority to keep bringing them back to power on an emotive issue built on the foundation of aastha and badla from Muslim invaders, who are history. The method is simple: instill a feeling of victimisation within Hindus that they had been dealt unfairly by the Muslim minority, first by Mughals and now by Congress which believed in Muslim appeasement.

Today, this victim complex has now culminated into a superiority complex within a cross-section of the majority community which wants to assert its identity by demolition of mosques and "reclaiming" temples. Ayodhya and Babri were the political investments made three decades ago.

Already, seven BJP states have passed laws that criminalise mar-

namaaz, hijab, beef and talaq. The message is also larger — demonisation of the Muslims. One can call them terrorists, anti-nationals or rabid fundamentalists to completely destroy India's pluralism.

Basically, it all boils down to a desire for political power, a struggle for resources, ethnic rivalries and economic competition. The repeated finger pointing between Hindus-Muslims reveals that for power both will adopt diabolical machinations to create a secularcommunal divide. There is no desire to uphold equal respect for various faiths. Instead unashamedly use religion to increase their socalled popularity with voters.

In this milieu wrought with friction our leaders need to understand that by playing Hindus and Muslims against each other they are only serving their vested interests. Communalism thrives on one community's hate for the other along with playing up the psychosis of retaliation. At the end of the day, when our polity does a cost-benefit analysis, they need to answer a simple question: Is there vote-bank politics really worth the price the country is paying? Who will bear the cost and answer to Gods? INFA

Ranipet creates world record in waste collection

Chennai, May 28: Tamil Nadu's Ranipet district has created a world record with 20,000 vounteers collecting 186.914 metric tonnes of plastic waste in just three hours.

Super cyclones will be even more devastating in future: Study

New Delhi/London, May 28: Super cyclones, the most intense form of tropical storms, are likely to have a much more devastating impact on people in India in the future due to climate change, according to a modelling study.

Researchers from the University of Bristol in the UK examined the 2020 Super Cyclone Amphan - the most costly cyclone to make landfall in South Asia -- and predicted its implications under several scenarios of sea-level rise caused by global warming.

The study, published in the journal Climate Resilience and Sustainability, showed that if greenhouse gas emissions continue at the current rate, more than two and a half times (250 per cent) of India's population would experience flooding of greater than one metre, compared to the event in 2020.

"South Asia is one of the most climate-sensitive regions in the world, with super cyclones causing tens to hundreds of thousands of deaths in historical cases," said study lead author Dann Mitchell, Professor of Climate Science at the University of Bristol. "Comparatively, very little climate impact research has been done in South Asia, despite the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change highlighting it as such a critical region," Mitchell said in a statement.

The study presents a critical piece of evidence in support of ramping down greenhouse gas emissions to achieve the Paris Agreement climate goals, where other lines of evidence all too often focus on high-income countries where impacts are lower, and adaptation is more easily achievable, the researchers said.

They used sophisticated climate



model projections to anticipate the scale of those affected by cyclones in the rest of this century. Although the increasing number of people at risk is anticipated to be more modest in Bangladesh, estimated to rise by 60 per cent to 70 per cent, this factors in declining coastal populations in the fu-

ture, the researchers said.

They noted that if the Paris Agreement climate goals of 2 degrees Celsius warming above preindustrial levels are adhered to, population exposure to flooding dropped close to zero in Bangladesh. However, even in this climate warming scenario, the exposures



This study shows that population exposure in Bangladesh and India will be increased up to 200 per cent in the future for extreme storm surge flooding (greater than 3 metres) from intense cyclones under high emission scenarios," Islam said. Kolkata, May 28: The West Bengal government is planning to amend the law to remove Governor Jagdeep Dhankhar as 'visitor' of private universities in the state and appoint the education minister in his place, a senior official said Saturday.

A discussion in this regard was held during Thursday's state cabinet meeting and the process has already been started, he said.

The development comes amid the state cabinet's decision to make Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee the chancellor of state-run varsities, replacing the Governor.

There is a proposal for altering the law so that the Governor can be replaced by the education minister as the 'visitor' of private varsities. In Thursday's Cabinet meeting, there was a discussion on this and the proposal was supported by the members," the official told PTI. "Hopefully, the next meeting will give its approval," he said, adding that the government will explore the legal options in this regard

As per the West Bengal government's policy and guidelines for setting up private universities, the Governor has to be appointed the 'visitor' and he can preside over the convocations.

The 'visitor' also has the power to call for any paper or information relating to the affairs of the universities.

The official said that the government was open to take an ordinance route if the Governor does not clear the proposed bill for making the Chief Minister the chancellor of state-run varsities.

The Governor, by virtue of his position, is the chancellor of all state-run universities.

The decisions of the TMC government come amid a bitter turf war with the Governor over several issues, including some relating to the running of universities. Dhankhar earlier alleged that

vice-chancellors of 24 universities have been "appointed illegally without the chancellor's approval."

After the vice-chancellors of the private universities skipped a meeting called by him in Raj Bhavan in December last year, he had hit out at the ruling dispen-

Agartala-Kolkata bus service via Dhaka to resume after 2 years

Agartala, May 28: The Agartala-Kolkata bus service via Dhaka will resume from June 10 after a hiatus of over two years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, an official of the Tripura government said Saturday.

The bus service was initially planned to restart from April 28 but postponed owing to "some technical reasons", he said.

International bus service will benefit people amid soaring air fares and suspension of trains due to landslides in neighbouring Assam

State transport department principal secretary LH Darlong has written letters to Bangladesh's Ministry of External Affairs and the Indian High Commission to the neighbouring country, apprising them of the proposed resumption of the international bus service.

"Tickets for the bus service will be available at the Tripura Road Transport Corporation counter at Krishnanagar from June 1. Passengers need to have a valid passport and visa to board a vehicle," a transport department official said. In a separate letter to the joint secretary of the Ministry of External Affairs in New Delhi, state additional secretary S Chowdhury informed all concerned about the resumption of the cross border bus service.

The fare from Agartala to Kolkata via Dhaka will be ₹2,300 per passenger, including travelling tax, while it will be ₹1,000 from Tripura capital to Dhaka.

The international bus service will benefit people amid soaring air fares and suspension of long-distance trains due to landslides in neighbouring Assam.

The bus will cover a distance of around 500 km from Agartala to Kolkata via Dhaka in around 19 hours. A train journey between the two destinations via Guwahati takes around 35 hours, another official said.

The bus facility on this route was suspended in March 2020 after the pandemic struck.

New macaque species Senior nurses to double as docs in rural discovered in Arunachal

Kolkata, May 28: Scientists of the Zoological Survey of India (ZSI) have discovered a new macaque species in Arunachal Pradesh. The new species, named 'Sel

Macaque' (Macaca selai), was found in western and central parts of the state, ZSI director Dhriti Baneriee said.

"Scientists collected a few samples and undertook a detailed phylogenetic analysis and we found this monkey is genetically different from the other species in the region," she said.

The new species is separated from the Arunachal macaque of Tawang district by Sela Pass, Banerjee said. ZSI scientist Mukesh Thakur said the Sela Pass acted as a barrier and prevented migration between the two macaque species



for around two million years.

The Sela macaque is genetically closer to the Arunachal macaque and both species have many similar physical characteristics such as heavy built and long dorsal body hair, he said. However, there are also some distinct morphological char-

acteristics, he said. The Arunachal macaque has a dark face and dark brown colour coat, while the Sela macaque has a pale face and brown colour coat,

GJM ATTEMPTS TO REGAIN POLITICAL GROUND

IF BIMAL GURUNG CONTINUES HIS AGITATION AND SUCCEEDS IN GETTING SUPPORT FROM THE HILLS POPULATION WHO CLAIM THAT THEIR ASPIRATIONS HAVE NOT BEEN MET BY THE CENTRE OR THE STATE, THINGS COULD TAKE A TURN FOR THE WORSE

Kolkata, May 28: Will Bimal Gurung's bid to regain political ground lead to another upheaval in the north Bengal Hills? Gurung, president of the Gorkha Janmukti Morcha (GJM), is presently on an indefinite hunger strike and has called for a boycott of the Gorkhaland Territorial Administration (GTA) polls slated for June 26.

GTA elections were held last in 2012. In 2017, when elections were due, the GJM and other parties in the Hills launched a massive agitation, resulting in vio-

lence and a 104-day strike. "The next few weeks are going

to be very crucial for the Hills. Tourists are flocking there by their thousands after a two-year lull. The season will gradually come to an end after June 15. In 2017, the strike had also begun from June 15. Gurung had then given a call for a separate state of Gorkhaland. This time, he has gone in for a hunger strike demanding the addition of 396 Gorkha-dominated mouzas and more departments to the GTA. It has to be seen what kind of support he receives," a political observer from the Hills said.

Several cases were filed against Gurung after the 2017 strife and he went into hiding. By the time he emerged in Kolkata in 2020,



the GJM had split with his former aide Binay Tamang leading a faction and lending support to the Trinamool Congress. Gurung followed suit, broke ties with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and got into an alliance with the Trinamool. The West Bengal government not only stopped pursuing charges against Gurung, the Trinamool also allowed the GJM to contest the 2021 Assembly Elections in the state from the Darjeeling, Kurseong and Kalimpong constituencies.


Gurung realized that his support base had eroded in the Hills after failing to win any of these seats.

While the BJP won in Darjeeling and Kurseong, Kalimpong went to an independent fielded by the Tamang faction of the GJM (the Calcutta High Court had forbidden both factions from using the GJM symbol to contest elections). Tamang finally quit the party in December 2021 and joined the Trinamool. Now, it was time for Gurung to consolidate. It didn't take him long to realise that his political base had eroded.

"New entities like the Hamro Party (HP) and the Bharatiya Gorkha Prajatantrik Morcha (BGPM) have come up. The Darjeeling Municipality election, held earlier this year, was an eyeopener. While the HP bagged 18 of the 32 seats, the BGPM won nine. The GJM cut a sorry figure with 3 seats. The remaining two went to the Trinamool. Mind you, the GJM had contested 22 seats, leaving 10 to the Trinamool. Gurung now realizes that the GJM is in no position to contest the June 26 GTA polls. Neither is the BJP-GNLF alliance. No wonder, both have demanded that the GTA elections be deferred. If the 396 mouzas are included in the GTA, the GJM will stand a better chance, Gurung believes. Addition of departments will turn the GTA more powerful, both administratively and financially. Moreover, both are issues close to the hearts of the Gorkhas," a lawyer and activist from Darjeeling said.

The state administration has made it clear that the GTA elections won't be deferred. There is also little possibility of transfer of departments. If Gurung continues his agitation and succeeds in getting support from the Hills population who claim that their aspirations have not been met by the Centre or the state, things could take a turn for the worse. The BJP-GNLF combine is likely to lend support. The common man in the Hills is apprehensive. People gave their all during the agitation of 2017 but got nothing in return. The administration will take a leaf out of the book from five years ago and not hesitate to crack down on any effort to disrupt normal life in the Hills.

Maha reports Omicron's **B.A.** variants

Mumbai, May 28: For the first time in Maharashtra, four patients of B.A.4 sub-lineage and three cases of B.A.5 sub-lineage of the Omicron variant of coronavirus have been found, the state health department said on Saturday.

These were mild sub-lineages and there was no cause for concern, a senior health official said The sub-lineages of Omicron were found in April in some parts of the world including South Africa. Last week, cases were also reported in Tamil Nadu and Telangana in

"The whole genome sequencing was conducted by the Institute of Science Education and Research, and its finding has been confirmed by the Indian Biological Data Centre in Faridabad. As many as seven patients, all from Pune, were detected with the infection of the sub-lineage of Omicron," a health department official said.

"Four patients have the infection of B.A. 4 variant while others have contracted the B.A. 5. Four of them are men and three women. Four patients are above 50 years of age while two are in 20-40 age group while one patient is a nine-year-old child," he added. "All the six adults have com-

pleted both the dosages of vaccine while one has taken the booster shot too. The child is unvaccinated. All of them had mild symptoms of COVID-19 and were treated successfully in home isolation," the official said. Their samples were taken be-

tween May 4 and 18. Two of them had travelled to South Africa and Belgium, while three had travelled to Kerala and Karnataka. The other two patients had no recent travel history, he said.

Dr Pradeep Awate, epidemiologist and the State Surveillance Officer, Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme, said that B.A. 4 and B.A. 5 are sub-lineages of Omicron which itself is known for being mild. Hence, "there is nothing to worry about its sub-lineages," he said.

'However, it is highly transmissible, which is one of the reasons behind the growing number of COVID-19 cases in the last couple of weeks. The cases are steadily going up everywhere, but patients are not being hospitalised in large numbers," Awate added

Over 21,000 pvt vehicles fined for bus lane violations

New Delhi, May 28: Over 21,000 private vehicles have been challaned for violating designated bus lanes within two months of the launch of an enforcement drive by Delhi government's Transport department, according to officials.

Nearly 391 DTC buses and 328 cluster buses were penalised under the drive that started from April 1. Between April 1 and May 26, 21.820 challans were issued while there were 819 violations recorded on the part of bus drivers.

The violations by bus drivers also included 100 instances of violations by other kinds of buses. As many as 21,001 private vehicles were penalised for lane violation while 359 vehicles were either lifted or towed away by authorities.

From May 9, the Transport Department started issuing challans to private bus operators and drivers for not adhering to designated bus lanes.

Cardinal Angelo Sodano no more

Vatican City: Cardinal Angelo Sodano, a controversial Vatican power broker for more than a quarter of a century who was accused of covering up one of the Catholic Church's most notorious sex abusers, has died at the age of 94. Sodano, who had been ill for some time and died Friday night, was secretary of state under two popes -- John Paul II and Benedict XVI -- holding the number two post in the Vatican hierarchy for 16 years between 1990 and 2006.

Ireland confirms 1st monkeypox case

Dublin: Ireland has confirmed its first case of monkeypox, the country's health agency said Saturday. A separate suspected case is also being investigated and test results are awaited, the Health Service Executive (HSE) said in a statement. Around 20 countries where monkeypox is not endemic have reported outbreaks of the viral disease, with more than 200 confirmed or suspected infections mostly in Europe. Argentina reported two cases of the monkeypox virus Friday in men who had recently arrived from Spain, marking the first time the presence of the virus has been confirmed in Latin America during this latest outbreak.

Nigeria church fair stampede kills 31

Abuja: A stampede Saturday at a church charity event in southern Nigeria left 31 people dead and seven iniured, police said, a shocking development at a programme that organisers said aimed to "offer hope" to the needy. The stampede at the program organised by the Kings Assembly pentecostal church in Rivers state involved many people who were seeking assistance, according to Grace Iringe-Koko, a police spokeswoman in the state. Many of the victims came to an annual "Shop for Free" charity programme organised by the church.

15 dead, 3 missing as rains lash China

Beijing: At least 15 people have died in torrential rains across southern China, state media reported Saturday. The storm damaged roads, bridges and telecommunications and power facilities in Yunnan's Qiubei county, which is about 130 kilometers north of the border with Vietnam. Video posted online showed streets flooded with muddy water and some roads partially washed away. More than 1,600 people were evacuated.

The disclosure of local law enforcement's delay in pursuing the teenaged gunman armed with a semi-automatic rifle came as the nation's leading gun-rights advocacy group, the National Rifle Association, opened its annual convention 275 miles away in Houston

Uvalde, May 28: Frantic children called 911 at least half a dozen times from the Texas classrooms where a massacre was unfolding. pleading for police to intervene, as some 20 officers waited in the hallway nearly an hour before entering and killing the gunman, authorities said Friday.

At least two children placed several emergency calls from a pair of adjoining fourth-grade classrooms after 18-year-old Salvador Ramos entered on Tuesday with an AR-15 semi-automatic rifle, according to Colonel Steven McCraw, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Ramos, who had driven to Robb Elementary School from his home after shooting and wounding his grandmother there, went on to kill 19 children and two teachers in the deadliest US school shooting in nearly a decade.

"He's in room 112," a girl whispered on the phone at 12:03 pm, more than 45 minutes before a US Border Patrol-led tactical team finally stormed in and ended the siege.

The on-site commander, the chief of the school district's police department in Uvalde, Texas, believed at the time that Ramos was barricaded inside and that children were no longer at im $mediate\ risk, giving\ police\ time\ to$ prepare, McCraw said.

However Hanna Malyar, Ukraine's deputy defence minister, said the battle for Lyman continued, the ZN.ua website reported.

The Russian forces were likely to try to cross the river in coming days in the next phase of the Kremlin's Donbas offensive, the

Russia shows off Zircon hypersonic cruise missile

Russia successfully test-fired a hypersonic Zircon cruise missile over a distance of about 1,000 km (625 miles), the defence ministry said Saturday. The missile was fired from the Barents Sea and hit a target in the White Sea. it said. Video released by the ministry showed the missile being fired from a ship and blazing into the sky on a steep trajectory. President Vladimir Putin has described the Zircon as part of a new generation of unrivalled arms systems. Hypersonic weapons can travel at nine times the speed of sound, and Russia has conducted previous test-launches of the Zircon from warships and submarines in the past year.

Sharing a video of the protest in which the agitators were seen carrying black flags and shouting antigovernment slogans, the Daily Mirror newspaper tweeted, "50 days of the Galle Face Struggle -People's Representatives and many civil activists march from Kollupitiya Junction to Galle Face."

"Our struggle would only end when the Rajapaksa family leaves the political arena and be hauled before the people's court for all the wrongs they have done," Chameera Jeewantha, a protester who has been at the site all 50 days said.



The company has signed a sale and franchise agreement for select popular brands with Inbrew, a joint statement said.

'USL and Inbrew have executed definitive agreements for the sale of the entire business undertaking associated with 32 brands, including iconic brands Haywards, Old Tavern, White-Mischief, Honey Bee, Green Label and Romanov, for a total cash consideration of approximately ₹820 crore, subject to customary adjustments," it said.

The transaction does not include the McDowell's or Director's Special brands, which will be retained by USL. "The sale portfolio covers the entire business undertaking associated with the 32 brands set out below, including the related contracts, permits, intellectual property rights, associated employees, and a manufacturing facility,'

In addition, USL and Inbrew have entered into a 5- year franchise arrangement for 11 other brands, including Bagpiper. "USL has also granted Inbrew a right, subject to certain conditions, to convert the fixed term franchise arrangement into one with perpetual rights to use and/or a call option to acquire the brands at a pre-agreed consideration," it said.

Russia mulls crypto for int'l payments

Moscow, May 28: Russia is considering allowing cryptocurrency to be used for international payments, Interfax news agency quoted a government official as saying

"The idea of using digital currencies in transactions for international settlements is being actively discussed," Ivan Chebeskov, head of the finance ministry's financial policy department, was quoted as saying.

Russian officials are wrestling with how to regulate the country's crypto market and use of digital cur rencies, with the finance ministry opposed to the central bank's calls for a blanket ban.

Discussions have been ongoing for months and though the government expects cryptocurrencies to be legalised as a means of payment sooner or later, no consensus has yet been reached.

The finance ministry is discussing adding the latest proposal on international payments to an updated version of a draft law, the Vedomosti newspaper reported on Friday, citing government officials.

Fake reviews on e-commerce sites

The Taste of India

New Delhi, May 28: The government Saturday said it will develop a framework to keep a check on fake reviews posted on e-commerce websites to protect consumer interest

The consumer affairs ministry along with the Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI) held a virtual meeting on Friday with stakeholders, including ecommerce entities, to discuss the magnitude of fake reviews on their platforms.

According to an official statement, the Department of Consumer Affairs (DoCA) will develop these frameworks after studying the present mechanism being followed by the e-commerce entities in India and best practices available globally.

Consumer forums, law universities, lawyers, FICCI, CII and consumer rights activists, among others, participated in the meeting to discuss the magnitude of the problem and roadmap ahead for fake reviews on websites.

Since e-commerce involves a virtual shopping experience without any opportunity to physically view or examine the product, consumers heavily rely on reviews posted on platforms to see the opinion and experience of users who have already purchased the good or service.

"Traceability by ensuring the authenticity of the reviewer and the

associated liability of the platform are the two key issues here. Also ecommerce players must disclose as to how they choose the 'most relevant reviews' for display in a fair and transparent manner,' Consumer Affairs Secretary Rohit Kumar Singh said.

All stakeholders agreed that the issue deserves to be monitored closely and appropriate framework governing the fake reviews should be developed for protection of consumer interest, the statement said. Stakeholders from e-commerce

companies claimed they have frameworks in place by which they monitor fake reviews and would be pleased to take part in developing a legal framework on the issue,

Won't make vehicles in India until allowed to sell locally: Musk

New Delhi, May 28: American electric carmaker Tesla, which has been seeking reduction in import duties to sell its vehicles in India, will not manufacture its products locally unless it is allowed to first sell and service its cars in the country, company founder and chief executive Elon Musk has said.

In a tweet responding to a user asking about Tesla setting up a manufacturing plant in India, he said, "Tesla will not put a manufacturing plant in any location where we are not allowed first to

sell & service cars. Last month, Union Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari had said if Tesla was ready to manufacture its electric vehicles in India then there was 'no problem' but the company must not import cars from China.

In August last year, Musk had said Tesla may set up a manufacturing unit in India if it first succeeds with imported vehicles in the country.

He had said Tesla wanted to launch its vehicles in India "but import duties are the highest in the world by far of any large country!'

Currently, India imposes 100 per cent import duty on fully imported cars with CIF (Cost, Insurance and Freight) value more than \$40,000 and 60 per cent on those costing less than the amount.
