#### Monkeypox a global emergency: WHO

**GENEVA:** The World Health Organisation (WHO) said the expanding monkeypox outbreak in more than 70 countries is an "extraordinary" situation that now qualifies as a global emergency, a declaration Saturday that could spur further investment in treating the oncerare disease and worsen the scramble for scarce vaccines. WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus made the decision to issue the declaration despite a lack of consensus among members of WHO's emergency committee. It was the first time the chief of the UN Health agency has taken such an action. "We have an outbreak that has spread around the world rapidly through new modes of transmission about which we understand too little and which meets the criteria in the international health regulations," Tedros said. ### Chilika MLA's bail plea opposed in SC

NEW DELHI: Odisha police has opposed the bail petition filed by Chilika MLA Prasanta Jagadev in the Supreme Court and said that the MLA is a habitual offender having as many as 13 cases registered against him. In an affidavit, filed through advocate Sibo Sankar Mishra, the state police submitted to the apex court that the legislator was granted bail in other cases on the condition that he would not commit any crime. But the MLA has violated the bail condition by committing more heinous crimes and an application also filed for cancellation of bail granted in other cases, the police said. Opposing the bail petition, the police said that it may not be safe for witnesses if the petitioner is enlarged at this stage.


### **Bengal minister held** over school iobs scam

**KOLKATA:** West Bengal Industry and Commerce Minister Partha Chatterjee was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) Saturday in connection with the investigation into the alleged school jobs scam, an official of the agency said. He was later produced before a judge in Bankshall court here and sent to the ED custody for two days. The Trinamool Congress secretary general, who was the state education minister when the alleged irregularities took place, was arrested after around 26 hours of grilling in his residence in connection with the probe since Friday morning. ED also arrested Chatterjee's close aide Arpita Mukherjee, from whose property ₹21 crore in cash was seized during a raid on Friday, the agency official said.

# Tricolour can fly at night too

The Union government amends Flag Code of India, 2002 ahead of 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign that begins August 13

New Delhi, July 23: The Centre has changed the country's flag code by allowing the tricolour to fly both day and night and be machinemade besides use of polyester.

The move came as the government is going to launch a 'Har Ghar Tiranga' (hoisting of flag in every home) from August 13 to 15 as part of the 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'.

In a letter to secretaries of all cen tral ministries and departments, Union home secretary Ajay Bhalla said the display, hoisting and use of the Indian national flag is governed by the Flag Code of India, 2002 and the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971.

The Flag Code of India, 2002 has been further amended through an order July 20, 2022 and clause (xi) of paragraph 2.2 of Part-II of the Flag

Now, machine made, cotton/ Earlier, the polyester/ wool/silk flag was allowed to be flown khadi from sunrise and hand to sunset, flags are

Code of India, 2002 shall now be read as under: (xi) "where the Flag is displayed in open or displayed on the house of a member of public, it may be flown day and night".

Earlier, the tricolour was allowed to be flown from sunrise to sunset, irrespective of weather conditions.

Similarly, paragraph 1.2 of Part-I of the Flag Code of India, 2002 shall now be read as under: 1.2. "The National Flag shall be made of hand spun and hand woven or machine made, cotton/ polyester/ wool/ silk khadi bunting.

Earlier, machine made and polyester flags were not allowed to be used. 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' is being celebrated to commemorate 75 years of a progressive independent India.

The 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign has been launched to encourage the citizens to hoist the national flag in their homes from August 13 to 15.

The home secretary also enclosed with his letter the salient features of the Flag Code including the changes made December, 30, 2021 and July 20. 2022 and the frequently asked questions (FAQs) about the use

and display of the national flag. "You are requested to ensure that these are widely disseminated among various organisations. PSUs under your administrative control," the home secretary said in his letter.

### Kangaroo courts by media bane of healthy democracy: Ramana

■ *Ill-informed* and agendadriven debates on issues involving justice delivery are proving to be detrimental to the health of democracy, says the CJI

New Delhi, July 23: Chief Justice NV Ramana Saturday hit out at electronic and social media 'trials', saying that media run 'kangaroo courts' at times on issues and even experienced judges find it difficult to decide. Speaking at the inaugural 'Justice SB

Sinha Memorial Lecture' on "Life of a Judge" organised by National University of Study & Research in Law, Ranchi, the Chief Justice stressed the need to ensure proper judicial infrastructure, the problems created by media trial in judicial administration, future challenges of the judiciary and the importance of judicial review in protection of the Constitution.

Asserting that we are living in a complex society, Ramana said that the role of a person holding a position in the judiciary or governance becomes extremely crucial as their decisions at critical junctures influence the

growth and progress of humanity. "Doing justice is not an easy re-



sponsibility. It is becoming increasingly challenging with each passing day," he said, pointing out the increasing number of media trials.

"New media tools have the enormous amplifying ability but appear to be incapable of distinguishing between the right and the wrong, the good and the bad and the real and the fake. Media trials cannot be a guiding factor in deciding cases," he said in the speech.

Rapping the biased views appearing on social media, he said, "Ill-informed and agenda-driven debates on issues involving justice delivery are proving to be detrimental to the health of democracy.

He said further that biased views propagated by media are affecting people, weakening democracy, and harming the system.

In the process, justice delivery gets adversely affected. "By overstepping and breaching your responsibility, you are taking our democracy two steps backward," he blasted

Print media still has a certain degree of accountability, he said, adding that electronic media has zero accountability as what it shows vanishes into thin air.

At times, there are concerted campaigns in media, particularly on social media, against judges, he said.

Owing to the frequent transgressions and consequent social unrest, there is a growing demand for stricter media regulations and accountability, CJI Ramana said.





# **Odisha Police opposes** Jagadev's bail plea in SC


New Delhi, July 23: The Odisha Police has opposed the bail petition of MLA Prasanta Jagadev in the Supreme Court on a case wherein the legislator is accused of ramming his SUV into a crowd near Banpur block in Khurda district of Odisha injuring many in March this year.

The Odisha Police informed the apex court that Jagadev is a habitual offender having as many as 13 cases registered against him.

In an affidavit, filed through advocate Sibo Sankar Mishra, the Odisha Police submitted that the Chilika MLA was granted bail in other cases with riders that he would not commit any crime. But the MLA has violated the bail condition by committing more heinous crimes and an application has also been filed for cancellation of the bail granted in other cases, the police said.

Opposing Jagadev's petition, the police said it may not be safe for witnesses if the petitioner is granted bail at this stage. The police also rejected Jagadev's claim that the people suffered minor injuries in the incident.

The police said that out of 20 victims, 18 sustained simple injuries while two including a SHO received grievous injuries. One in-

jured person is yet to recover and he has been bedridden for last five months, the police said.

"The MLA was driving the SUV without a driving licence. The vehicle had also a fake number plate," the police said.

Notably, the Orissa High Court had rejected the bail application of Jagadev May 20. The HC asked him to surrender before a court

in Banpur with the end of his interim bail period. Jagadev filed a special leave petition in the apex court challenging the decision of the High Court.

Jagdev has been charged with serious offences like attempt to murder, obstructing police personnel from performing their duty, injuring public and using car as weapon to hurt people.



Bhubaneswar, July 23: For the second time, Congress MLAs created a ruckus in state Assembly over Enforcement Directorate (ED) summon to Congress interim poresident Sonia Gandhi, Saturday.

During zero hour, Congress mem bers rushed into the well and created a ruckus over the issue. Congress MLA Taraprasad Bahinipati alleged that an attempt is being made by the Narendra Modi government at the Centre to suppress the voice of the Opposition by serving notices through Central agencies like CBI and ED.

On the other hand, BJP said that the summons and notices are being served after getting substantial evidence. Earlier, BJP chief whip Mohan Majhi raised the issue over the seizure of about Rs 20 crore from a West Bengal Minister Partha Chatterjee by the ED.

Countering it, Congress MLA SS Saluja said issues related to a person, who is not a member of the

House, should not be raised, as per the tradition. However, the BJP repeatedly raised such issues, he said.

# Coffee cultivation checks migration among tribals

Koraput, July 23: "Life has transformed due to coffee. Although work was available, it took months to get the money. However, now the Tribal Development Cooperative Corporation of Odisha Limited (TDCCOL) comes home and buys coffee berries directly from us. We pluck the berries at night and send them for processing; we also receive the money within the day. This year alone, I earned a profit of Rs 21,500, selling 480 kg of coffee berries," says Balram Huntal of Kiramba village, Nandpur block.

Koraput, nestled in the hilly terrain of the Eastern Ghats, at an altitude of 3,000 ft above sea level, is ideal for coffee cultivation due to its cool climate and favourable rainfall. However, before coffee became a viable economic possibility, distressed migration was the only option, with most tribal families travelling from Koraput to Odisha's neighbouring states vearly.

The scarcity of employment opportunities, climate change-induced environmental factors, poor agricultural production, lack of irrigation and drought, deforestation, inadequate food security, low working wages, economic deprivation, exploitation by moneylenders or middlemen, deplorable working conditions, excessive debt, and an overall bleak prospect of surviving with dignity forced people to leave their homes and seek better options. Keeping these socio-economic roadblocks in mind, the district administration has tried to provide alternative employment through coffee cultivation to those workers who do not hold job cards. The government is extending support to the adivasis from Koraput, Nandpur, Dasmantpur, Laxmipur, and Lamatput; two coffee nurseries have been set up in Nandpur, Lamatput and Dasmantpur, and one each in Koraput, Similiguda and

district during the Covid-19 pandemic. Of this, 3,843 migrant construction workers returned. Of these, 2,678 were unskilled and 172 went to work at brick kilns. Many of them are now employed as labourers at coffee plantations.'

Manik Kooda of Golur village, Nandpur block, says: "Three self-help groups (SHG) in the villages have been involved in growing and selling coffee, earning more than Rs 40,000 yearly. This year, our profit margin rose by Rs 12,000 per SHG. This crop has, indeed, brought about a remarkable change in the lives of the tribal people, who mainly practised shifting cultivation, or podu, for generations. "We've been growing coffee since 2012

but did not get much money out of it because traders used to buy from us at Rs 10 to 15 per kg. However, TDCCOL started buying it at Rs 35 per kg. Last year, with the help of the Coffee Board, the Coffee Development Trust, and the district administration, we began to sell at Rs 45 per kg."

"Earlier families were supported through daily working wages. But now, I earn some money by cultivating coffee on 2 acres and selling 294kg of coffee berries. Besides coffee, we cultivate black pepper and dragon fruit, which has led to economic recovery. The Odisha Livelihood Mission (OLM) has also provided us employment as labourers working in the coffee nursery for the past eight months," Badnayak adds.

"Every year, the whole family used to go to Andhra Pradesh in search of work.

Due to the unavailability of work at the time of Covid. we borrowed a lot of money," recalls one Diba Jani of Punjisil village, Dasmantapur block. "My children even had to drop out of school. But with the help of TDCCOL, we sold 750kg of coffee in 2021 and made a profit of Rs 34.000, Now, I can work on my land in my village, and the children have also resumed school."

Until a few years ago, Sumoni Dami of Ghumar village under Lamtaput block would travel to Visakhapatnam in Andhra Pradesh or Jagdalpur in Chhattisgarh in October-November in search for work. They were forced to migrate with their entire family, looking for a means to earn a living and escape the looming threat of Naxalites within their native village.

The situation has since improved, as Dami and other farmers from the village are now keen on coffee cultivation after the government gave them incentives. For the past eight months, they have received funds to grow coffee in government nurseries, using scientific techniques prescribed by the Coffee Board and cultivating the crop on their own farmlands. Sasmita Samantaray, OLM project manager in charge of coffee nurseries says that for the first time, through the cultivation of coffee, people have won their rights. Starting from seedlings, farmers can cultivate in their authorised hill lands and earn a profit through the berries.

"Presently, the government has sanctioned the official papers of the hill forest land under the forest land rights, wherein people receive encouragement and support to cultivate coffee. Beyond the coffee nursery, the sale of fertilisers and garden soil through the efforts of women's SHGs is also paving the path for new employment," she adds.

According to Director, Migration & Education, at Aide Action International Umi Daniel, in 2020, at the height of the pandemic, around 2 lakh migrant labourers returned to undivided Koraput, of whom, a high number of adivasis had travelled to Chhattisgarh and Andhra Pradesh to work at brick factories.

On July 19 the state recorded 1122 cases which went up to 1196 on a subsequent day but declined to 1178 on July 21 and again marginally reduced to 1130 in the past 24 hours.

Health department sources said out of 1130 new cases, 662 were registered from the quarantine centres and 468 from local contact cases. At least 143 positive cases were reported in the age group of 0 to 18 years.

For the first time, the Sundargarh district topped the district tally with a maximum number of 225 cases followed by Khurda (209), Cuttack (111) and Sambalpur (106).

The number of active cases rose to 7,345, of which 1,982 are in Khurda, followed by 1,178 in Sundargarh.

The daily positivity rate was at 4.85 per cent as the fresh cases were detected from among 23,314 samples that were tested for COVID-19.

Fifty-three other coronavirus

patients have died due to comorbidities so far.

A total of 12,88,970 people have recovered from the disease so far,

including 1,029 in the last 24 hours,

The daily Test Positivity Rate (TPR) of the state continued to remain above 5 per cent for the last several days. However, as many as five districts have registered over 7.5 per cent TPR and are categorized as Red Zones while two coastal districts with above 5 per cent were in Yellow Zones

### Fertiliser crunch irks Malkangiri farmers

**ADMIN URGED TO TAKE ACTION AGAINST UNSCRUPULOUS DEALERS**

Malkangiri, July 23: Though parts of Malkangiri district have been battered recently by floods, agricultural activities are gradually picking up across the district. However, farmers are worried at present over the shortage of fertilisers.

They alleged that some dealers are deliberately creating artificial shortage of the fertilisers. They have pleaded with the district Collector to sort out the issue at the earliest. This is because fertilisers are needed for growth of paddy saplings.

Sources said that most farmers are reeling due to fertiliser shortage. They pointed out, the crisis is largely due to an unholy nexus between officials of the Agriculture department and some unscrupulous dealers.

Peeved over the shortage, tribal and farmers' leader Sharat Buruda along with others met the collector and complained about the issue. They alleged that for the last several weeks dealers have hiked the price of urea fertiliser which is required for the proper development of paddy saplings.

A 25kg packet of a particular brand of urea is being sold for Rs 400. Farmers pointed out that the brand is harmful for the saplings and soil, yet it is the only product available.

However, the district agriculture officer said that no such com-

plaint has been received from farmers. He added that action will be taken only after the complaints are lodged.

It should be stated here that multi-purpose societies (LAMPS) and primary agricultural cooperative societies (PACS) in the district have no stock of fertilisers, forcing farmers to buy it from the open market at higher prices.

During this period of the crop cycle, farmers apply the second dose of urea for growth of paddy. If they do not apply the fertiliser now, it will impact their paddy yield at the end of the season, they said. Small and marginal farmers are to be the worst affected by this crisis. Farmers have warned of agitation if no step is taken.

NHRC asks CS to pay damages immediately

Bhubaneswar, July 23: The

National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has issued a reminder asking the state chief secretary to immediately pay Rs 2 lakhs compensation to the relatives of a pregnant woman, who died as the ambulance carrying her stopped midway after it ran out of petrol in October, 2019. The commission, while hearing a plea filed by rights activist and lawyer Radhakanta Tripathy, asked the state government to pay the compensation immediately and send the compliance report within eight weeks from the receipt of order.

The deceased identified as Tulasi Munda of Hanida village was admitted to the Bangiriposhi community health centre in Mayurbhanj October 4, 2019. However, the doctors there referred her to Pandit Raghunath Murmu medical college and hospital in Baripada, 40 km away, after she was diagnosed with\_ high blood pressure, claimed the petitioner. The ambulance carrying her ran out of fuel after the fuel pipe burst draining all the oil. The ASHA worker accompanying the woman, called another ambulance which arrived after an hour, but Munda had died by that time.

Earlier, December 31, 2021, the Commission had directed the chief secretary to release the compensation of Rs. 2, 00,000 in favour of the deceased.

# Low serotonin not the only cause of depression: Study

recent study conducted by psychologists from University of Edinburgh and King's College, London found inconsistent evidence linking the neurotransmitter serotonin to depression.

Depression is a common and serious life-limiting condition. Low mood and loss of enjoyment are its core symptoms, but many unique symptom combinations can lead to a diagnosis. Two people with depression can have very different symptoms.

The roots of depression are varied and people can have very different reasons for their symptoms. Psychological trauma is a well-established risk factor. And inflammation is increasingly recognised as a likely cause in many research studies.

Many genetic factors have also been identified, each with a very small effect. There are probably thousands of small genetic effects with each person having an almost unique combination that can increase the risk of depression.

These risk factors explain why some people get depression more often than others, but multiple risk factors are often reported by people with depression, and it is not usually possible to conclude which – if any – led to their symptoms.

Depression, like many conditions defined chiefly by its symptoms, is unlikely to be a single condition with a simple set of discrete causes.

Similarly, it is unlikely that there would be a single therapy or drug that would treat all people effectively. But the diverse symptoms and risk factors underlying depression do not mean we lack effective treatments.

Antidepressants were discovered initially by repurposing a drug used to treat tuberculosis, with little understanding of its effects on the brain.

Initial research revealed that antidepressants increased the quantity of serotonin and noradrenalin in the brain. These findings formed

This simplistic explanation of depression and its treatment has been met with conflicting data and justifiable scepticism, and several alternative theories of depression and antidepressants have

been proposed.
Yet it would be unwise to dismiss the role of serotonin entirely, as there remains some evidence for its involvement in depression. Although limited access to living human brain tissue means that direct confirmation of serotonin's role in depression is difficult.

These critiques are not new, but they incorrectly imply that an understanding of the mechanism is necessary for effective treatment. In contrast, the cornerstone for identifying effective treatments is the randomised controlled trial (the gold standard of clinical research), which has been widely applied to the study of antidepressants and psychotherapies. This type of study can reliably tell us whether a treatment works or not – even if we have no idea why the treatment is effective.

Randomised controlled trials of thousands of depressed people have shown beyond reasonable doubt that antidepressant drugs are effective in depression. Studies of people with depression treated with antidepressants can also provide important information on how treatments deliver their benefits and may in future provide important information on why some people respond more than others.

Conditions defined largely by their symptoms are difficult to research and treat, but this has not prevented the development of effective treatments. Depression is usually managed effectively with antidepressants or by talking treatments, such as cognitive behaviour therapy, despite an incomplete understanding of the condition

and how these treatments work.

We cannot know if treatments address the underlying problem because we haven't yet identified what that is. To imply that SSRI antidepressants may not be worthwhile is to misunderstand an evidence base that says the very opposite.

Steadily, we are beginning to understand more about the causes of depression and identify subtypes, or "depressions", that have more specific mechanisms and treatments.

Our understanding of depression and its treatment has been advancing for more than a century and shows no signs of slowing. Identifying the causes and new treatments for depression is difficult but essential if we are to address one of the most common causes of disability worldwide. PTI

### Murmu's village wants prosperity for her as Prez

Rairangpur, July 23: As Taranisen Tudu and his wife Sukri Tudu leave for New Delhi to attend the swearing-in ceremony of the county's first tribal president Droupadi Murmu Monday, the people in her Uparbeda village are praying for her prosperity.

Taranisen is the brother President-elect Droupadi Murmu, who lives along with his family at Uparbeda village, about 20 kilometres from Rairangpur in Mayurbhanj district. Though the residents of Uparbeda

village are poor, they are highly satisfied that Murmu has made them proud. Her being sworn in as the President of India in the 75th year of Independence has added to their joy. Most of the residents of



Uparbeda, her birthplace, and Pahadpur, her in-laws' house, have basic facilities like electricity, drinking water, phone service, schools. hospitals and others. They just want Murmu to earn a separate and unique identity for herself and the state as the President.

"We pray for her prosperity more than anything else," said Saunta Majhi, an elderly priest of the Santhal community

"Every girl and woman of our village and the tribal community have now gained confidence which no government or leader can do,"

said Chandramani Hansda, a 25vear-old woman.

However, when insisted that they say what they want from the new President for the village, a number of suggestions were put forth.

A group of boys and girls said that they need a college at Uparbeda as they have to travel at least 5 kilometres to go to the nearby institute of higher learning.

Some women said that they have a government public health centre (PHC), but not a full-time doctor or a female nurse there

Women are reluctant to go for institutional delivery due to the lack of a female nurse at the hospital, pointed out Jamuna Hembram the Sarpanch of Uparbeda Gram Panchayat. She said a skill development centre for youths may help check large-scale migration from the village. A pregnant woman, who did not want to be identified said that if she gives birth to a girl, her name will be "Droupadi"

Sukhlal Murmu, who was two years senior to Droupadi Murmu at the Government Upper Primary School. said. "We have roads, schools, a hospital and phones in the village. If she wants, we will like to have a dam on the natural spring to irri gate our agricultural fields. Our cultivation mostly depends on rain. The headmaster of the Presidentelect's school, Manoranjan Murmu, also said they do not want any major project.

"We want better infrastructure for the school. It should be made a model school. We will name a classroom after Droupadi Murmu when its construction is completed," he said.

### Hear & Decide

t has been about five years since the Electoral Bonds scheme was challenged in the Supreme Court, which has not decided on it. The scheme was introduced as a 'money bill' in the Budget of 2017 so that it could not be debated and voted on in the Rajya Sabha. Essentially, the scheme allows anyone — including foreign governments and foreign companies and even criminal elements — to anonymously donate unlimited sums to political parties. The Reserve Bank of India objected to the scheme, saying that a bearer bond was essentially cash but the government overruled the objection and implemented it. The Supreme Court has not taken up the matter and decided on it.

It has been over two years since the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) was passed and challenged in the Supreme Court as being in violation of the Constitution. Home Minister Amit Shah said that it was the first part of a pincer, along with the National Register of Citizens, which would then go after what he said were the 'termites'. Readers will of course remember a massive protest against it in all of India's cities after CAA was passed. For some reason, the Supreme Court decided not to hear this matter either.

Around the same time, the status of Jammu and Kashmir was changed and though Article 370 was not abrogated it was hollowed out. Kashmir lost its status as a state, it was demoted to a Union territory, Ladakh was separated from it (causing a problem with China, though that is another issue) and Kashmir's elected representatives were dismissed and many jailed. The Supreme Court did not hear or decide the habeas corpus pleas of the detained Kashmiri leaders, including former Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti. Our highest court has still not decided whether all this was constitutional. It has not shown urgency in cases that many people think it should have.

Divisive laws that the government favours, such as the so-called love jihad laws passed by seven BJP states after 2018, the Supreme Court has chosen to not hear. These laws essentially criminalise marriages between Hindus and Muslims but are not seen as important enough

to be heard quickly. Much noise was made by the court about the farm laws, but after setting up a committee the matter was forgotten till the government itself withdrew the laws. On Pegasus, the current Chief Justice has said strong things but it has been a year since the victims of the criminal hack have moved court but nothing of significance has happened. In fact the government re fused to file an affidavit though the court asked it to reveal whether it was using this surveillance weapon on media, the Opposition, its own ministers and the judiciary

We have to compare this state of affairs with some of the other things that the court has decided to do. On 16 August 2019, senior advocate Dushyant Dave wrote a letter to the Supreme Court's judges, in which he repeated an accusation previously made by four rebel Supreme Court judges: that cases dear to the Prime Minister were being given to a bench comprising of Justice Arun Mishra out of turn.

Dave said that then Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi had surprised the legal fraternity by putting himself and Mishra on the vacation benches for the summer of 2019 (when only a few judges work and senior judges are usually off), and then taking up and deciding cases of import.

Cases concerning the Adani group were taken up by Mishra without a regular bench ordering their hearing by a vacation bench, and without there being any urgency in the case. One such case was heard and disposed of 22 May. The next day, Mishra took up another Adani case, which had last been heard in February 2017. Mishra finished it off the next day. The benefit to Adani from these two cases, wrote Dave, would 'run into thousands of crores'

Dave said that out-of-turn allotment to Mishra and then quick judgements in Adani's favour had

also happened 29 January 2019 and 29 May 2018. Mishra and Gogoi did not respond to this accusation or initiate any action. None of the other judges said anything. An investigation by journalists Abir Dasgupta and Paranjoy Guha Thakurta into seven Adani cases showed that Mishra had always ruled in favour of Adani, After he retired, Mishra was made the Chair of the National Human Rights Commission and has shown no interest since in challenging the government on the issue of human rights.

The Supreme Court retains credibility as an independent institution that is able to rise above politics and protect the Constitution. This reputation has not been easy to build and has come because of some brave judges across the decades who have defied the government and the political leadership. The judiciary and particularly the Supreme Court are special because they are theoretically immune from the pressures that media, Opposition and civil society face. History would not see the institution kindly if it continues to avoid, as appears to be the case, hearing and deciding some of the most pressing issues of our time.

An even earlier version is the English dialect up-a-day. This is just as nonsensical a phrase, but it does show that the final part of the modern expression is actually a corruption of day.

### Upsizing

his word has turned up on occasion in recent years in the computing field, where it is used as the opposite of the much more common downsizing with the sense: "(the action of) replacing a smaller system with a larger one, especially one with networking capabilities". It may be about to become a fashionable word in business, if we are to judge from an article in the Economist, which asked "Will upsizing be the next management fad?" and answered its own question with a qualified "yes". cion of the Gandhi family Rahul Gandhi, who has been reluctant to take-up the responsibility of Congress president for almost three years, is left with no option now. Keeping in mind the health of his ailing mother and more importantly due to the Congress getting decimated fast all over the country, Rahul will be forced to occupy the party's top post. Though his coronation will be no surprise to anyone, what will be of interest is to see if he is able to save the party.

Unlike the Shiv Sena, where the rebel leader Eknath Shinde was able to split the party, walking out with a major chunk of MLAs, in the Congress, no one has the courage to desert the dynasty, even if the party is on a losing spree. The fate of the G-23 leaders Kapil Sibal Ghulam Nabi Azad, Anand Sharma and Manish Tewari is known to everyone, as not many came forward to speak up against the leadership.

Interestingly, though everyone would vouch for the fact that Uddhav Thackeray appears to be more stern and strong than Rahul, the latter undoubtedly is leading a national party, where it is difficult to bring about a coup. Moreover, while Shinde had the backing of the BJP, to satisfy the greed of the MLAs in Maharashtra. the Congress is too large a party, where all the disgruntled leaders cannot be satisfied. Instead of a fullblown revolt against the leadership, one, therefore, witnesses a handful of leaders deserting the party in the states for greener pastures.

Fault does not lie solely with the Congress leadership, which has been dilly-dallying to assume power, but the entire party, which can't think beyond the Gandhi family. Sonia Gandhi refused to succeed as Congress president in the wake of the tragic assassination of her husband Rajiv Gandhi, but the Congressmen were adamant and patiently waited for seven years, till she finally agreed to assume charge. Later, despite the insistence of UPA leaders, she re-

Everyone was amazed to see the 'josh' of the Congressmen, who thronged the AICC headquarters and ED office, despite being lathi-charged by police. Seniors like P Chidambaram

and KC Venugopal were man-handled by the Delhi Police, but the leaders and hundreds of party workers were unfazed. They vied with one another to show their loyalty towards the Gandhi family. The same scenario was repeated, when Sonia appeared before the ED. With Rahul finally expected to

don the mantle of Congress president in the party elections to be held in September, the 137-year-old party which is gradually fading out, will presumably get recharged once again. Soon after his coronation, the party would hold the Bharat Jodo Yatra, from Kanyakumari to Kashmir, with the sole agenda of highlighting the failures of the NDA government under Modi.

The padyatra, to be inaugurated by Rahul, is expected to infuse the much-required adrenaline into Congressmen, who have been directionless and lethargic in the past few years. The Congress is expecting to create a similar magic which was created by the Rath Yatra undertaken by LK Advani on the issue of construction of the Ram Temple,

which saw the revival of the BJP With Rahul in the saddle, accompanied by senior leaders, travelling all-over the country, it will not only be an image-makeover for him, but also perhaps the beginning of the party's graph upwards. Ever since Modi has assumed power, the Congress has always been at the receiving-end, with its political graph declining sharply in all states. Both the party and its leadership were ridiculed for inaction and policy paralysis

As it dawned on the party leadership and the workers at the brainstorming session in Udaipur, Congressmen can no longer afford to remain inside their barracks They will have to work really hard to come back to power. Congress is the sole national party which can lead the Opposition to launch a tirade against the Modi government. But to lead regional parties it is imperative for Congress to win the ensuing Assembly elections in Himachal Pradesh and Guiarat this year and in Karnataka Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh and Telangana next year. Only then, it will be in a position to dictate its terms to other Opposition parties which have lined up to fill the vacuum created by the Congress' decline. The more time Rahul takes to set his house in order, the more he will lose, vis-à-vis other parties, vving to compete with the Congress Both in Himachal Pradesh and Gujarat, the Aam Aadmi Party has widened its base to give tough competition to Congress and BJP. In Maharashtra, NCP is strong, while in the North-East, the Trinamool is fast replacing the Congress.

It's the last chance for Rahul to take up the mantle of the Congress if he really is keen to save the party. No more can he afford to take holidays with his ailing mother on his side and the party losing out badly, every single day.

# Confronting the growing drought risk

scourge, but it is getting worse. No region or country today is immune to its effects. Southern drought – the worst in 70 years for people affected by 2050. Italy. In western US, the past two decades have been the driest in 1,200 vears. Chile is in its 13th consecutive year of drought, and Monterrey, Mexico's third-largest city, is now being forced to ration water.

In the Horn of Africa, Ethiopia, Kenya, and Somalia are recording their fourth consecutive year without rains, and the situation has grown increasingly dire for people, livestock, and the ecosystems that support them. Owing to a lack of adequate nutrition, children are dving from diseases they would ordinarily survive. Even camels – which typically survive longer than people or other animal species - are dropping dead in large numbers across this region.

This suffering evokes traumatic memories of my own first encounter with drought in Mauritania. I was barely 12 years old when every household in our community lost everything - food, livestock, and their livelihoods. Unable to provide for their families, many adults took their own lives. The experience has stayed with me, motivating my efforts to ensure that no more children have to live through what I did. Sadly, many still are being traumatised by

drought, and many more soon will be: Scientists project that climate change will increase the frequency. duration, and geographic spread of Europe is in the grip of a severe droughts, with three out of four

> Areas across all regions are becoming drier, and while there is not yet a consensus on where exactly the most acute drought conditions will emerge, scientists agree that land degradation exacerbates the problem. Together, recent traumatic experiences and the latest scientific projections should convey a sense of urgency, compelling everyone to build resilience against future drought risks. Drought is a natural phenomenon; but it need not become a natural disaster.

In a recent report, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations and the UN Convention to Combat Desertification identify successful examples of systems that have reduced drought risk among vulnerable populations. In Brazil, Ethiopia, India, and Tunisia, a combination of water harvesting and sustainable land-management practices are being used to reduce the impact of droughts. While it may take time, all countries can adopt similar strategies to help move their people from water scarcity toward water security.

A major shortcoming of the current approach, however, is that it is based on national systems, even though droughts do not observe planning across sectors within countries is essential; but without international collaboration, the efknock-on effects include conflicts over diminished water resources. soaring food prices or shortages, wildfires, mass wildlife and livestock loss, sand and dust storms, human displacement and forced migration, and civil unrest.

Collaborative arrangements to anticipate and respond to droughts quickly can avert or reduce the scale of these outcomes. Australia and the US, for example, have long had policies and planning protocols in place to ensure that affected communities can endure droughts with dignity. Building such resilience globally will take time and political will. Fortunately, even in the world's most vulnerable regions, policymakers already have foundations that they can build on. For example, Africa's Sahel has a regional droughtrisk system, set up 50 years ago to bring together a broad range of stakeholders, from producer associations to political decision-makers, and benefits from the pooling of scientific and technological capabilities at the regional level.

India has adopted an even more comprehensive approach that includes drought management as part of its national disaster-management plan. An intricate strategy

is in place to include all the relevant government ministries and closely coordinate national, state, and local responses. After a process that fects of drought eventually will started 15 years ago, India now has reach other countries. Common an integrated water-management system that also serves as a drought warning system. In June, the US announced that drought will henceforth be considered a strategic domestic and foreign-policy priority. As home to one of the most sophisticated and advanced drought-monitoring and response mechanisms in the world, the US could help to fasttrack the development of better risk-management systems globally.

Around the world, there is a strong appetite among governments to act quickly before the effects of increasingly frequent and severe droughts become unmanageable. And following the creation of an intergovernmental working group on drought at the UNCCD's summit in May, we now have a platform for mobilising collective action according to what the science says is necessary. We can rein in drought impacts together. But all leaders, down to the community level, will need to commit to doing what it takes to build effective resilience – starting immediately.





### WB minister sent to 2-day ED custody

Kolkata, July 23: West Bengal Industry and Commerce Minister Partha Chatterjee was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) Saturday in connection with its investigation into the alleged school jobs scam, an official of the agency said.

He was later produced before a judge in the Bankshall court here and sent to the ED custody for two days. The Trinamool Congress secretary general, who was the state education minister when the alleged irregularities took place, was arrested after around 26 hours of grilling in his residence in connection with the probe since Friday morning.

ED also arrested Chatterjee's close aide Arpita Mukherjee, from whose property Rs 21 crore in cash was seized during a raid on Friday, the agency official said."Chatterjee was not cooperating with our officers who were questioning him since Friday morning. He will be produced before a court during the day," the ED official said.

The minister, who also holds the parliamentary affairs portfolio, was taken to an ESI Hospital where a medical check-up was conducted on him. While coming out of the hospital, Chatterjee, when asked by reporters whether he tried to contact Chief Minister **ED** arrested Chatterjee's close aide Arpita Mukherjee, from whose property Rs 21 crore in cash was seized during a raid Friday, the agency official said

Mamata Banerjee, said, "I tried, but could not connect (to her)."

Later, his counsel told reporters that as it is a Saturday, he would be again produced before the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) court on Monday. His lawyer argued in the court that since no unaccounted money and documents have been found at his residential premises but the house of Mukherjee, he should be granted bail, which the ED lawyers of the directorate opposed.

The court remanded him to the custody of the ED for two days. While Mukherjee was whisked away by ED officials in a car, she told reporters: "I have done no wrong, it is a conspiracy by the BJP to malign me."

Chatterjee, who was the state education minister from 2014 to 2021, was grilled by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in April and May this year in connection with the scam.

Shillong, July 23: Six children were rescued and 73 people arrested from a "brothel" allegedly run by BJP's Meghalava vice-president Bernard N Marak in Tura Saturday, a senior police officer said.

Rimpu Bagan, a farmhouse

run by Bernard N Marak and his accomplices as a brothel, for the purpose of prostitution," Singh said.

All the children were handed over to District Child Protection Officer (DCPO) for safe custody and further necessary action as per law, he said. In the raid, 27 vehicles, eight two-wheelers, about 400 bottles of liquor, over 500 unused condoms, and crossbows and arrows were seized, he said.

Seventy-three people were arrested for their indulgence in "nefarious activities" as evident from the material seized, the officer said. adding that the farmhouse has 30 small rooms. It is suspected to be

# Shun partisan politics: Prez Kovind to parties

New Delhi, July 23: Outgoing President Ram Nath Kovind Saturday asked citizens to use Gandhian means to express opposition and pursue demands, and said parties should shun partisan politics to deliberate on what is necessary for people's welfare by keeping in mind that the nation is supreme.

In his message to political parties, he said, "As in any family, Parliament has at times differences and different political parties may have different views on the way forward. But we are all members of this parliamentary family whose top priority is to work continuously in the interest of the giant family which is our nation.'

His comments assume significance at a time when parliamentary proceedings have been frequently disrupted due to the Opposition's vocal protests over a number of issues in both Houses of Parliament. Different parts of the country have also witnessed protests, at times violent, at different points of time.

Political parties and people have many constitutional means to express their opposition, he said, noting that Mahatma Gandhi had used peace and non-violence to achieve his goals while also respecting the other side.

# Locals say 'ganga-jamuni' culture must not erode

Though the matter has obvious political underpinning with religious bodies differing on many points, they are united in their call for calm and keeping intact the original bonhomie of the city

Varanasi, July 23: With Gyanvapi Shringar Gauri case in the Supreme Court, leaders from both religions voice different opinions, yet want the "Ganga-Jamuni tehzeeb" of Kashi to stay intact.

Hearing the matter Thursday. the Supreme Court said it would wait for the Varanasi district judge's decision on the objections of the Gyanvapi Mosque Committee regarding the admissibility of a civil suit filed by Hindu devotees.

The top court had May 20 transferred the civil suit filed by Hindu devotees regarding the Gyanvapi Mosque from a senior civil judge to the Varanasi district judge.

Though the matter has obvious political underpinning with religious bodies differing on many



points, they are united in their call for calm and keeping intact the original bonhomie of the city.

Former Mahant of Kashi Vishwanath Temple Kulpati Tiwari said that some people are deliberately dragging the Gyanvapi issue "from here to Delhi" just to gain popularity.

Tiwari said that when the matter is in the court at the district level, then one should wait for the deci-

"We are waiting for the district court's decision and if the verdict does not come in our favour, we will approach the high court," he

Mohd Yasin, secretary, Anjuman Intezamia Committee, concurred saying the people of Kashi too want the verdict of the local court.

Swaran Mukherjee, a resident of Mahmoorganj in Varanasi, insisted that the matter is first settled in the local court, saying that "the maters of Banaras and there is no need to make it national issue.

Amit Rai, a resident of Sigra, however, said that Muslims should voluntarily forfeit their claim on the

"History is witness that Muslim invaders demolished the temple and built a mosque, so Muslims should set an example by handing over Baba Adi Vishweshwar and Gyanvapi to Hindus keeping in mind the Ganga Jamuni tehzeeb,'

"Baba Vishwanath himself has appeared in Gyanvapi, hence that particular place is very significant for Hindus," said Mahant Vijay Puri of Baba Batuk Bhairav.

He said, "Kashi has been a believer of Ganga-Jamuni tehzeeb, Muslim brothers have got a chance to rectify the mistake of their ancestors, they should not miss it."

Haji Syed Farman Haider, spokesperson of Shia Jama Masjid and secretary of Hazrat Ali Masjid Committee, said the court's decision will be supreme, and rued the wedge that has been driven between the two communities.

"We have offered prayers at the ghats of Banaras with water of Holy Ganga. No one ever stopped us," Haider said.

"But today there is a ruckus in the country for even offering Namaz. Kashi has always been an example of Ganga-Jamuni tehzeeb.

The atmosphere of the country should not be spoiled over a temple or a mosque," he said, adding that the communities were as inseparable as water.

Shahar-e Mufti Maulana Abdul Batin Nomani said, "Although this trial is not maintainable under the Worship Act, we will accept the court's decision.'

One Rakhi Singh and others from the Hindu side have filed a petition in the court of civil Judge (senior division) of Varanasi with a request for protection of deities and permission for regular worship at Shringar Gauri located in Gyanvapi complex.

In May, a video survey of Gyanvapi campus was also done at the court's order.

During the survey, the Hindu side claimed to have found a Shivling in the 'Wazu Khana' of the Gyanvapi Mosque.

The report of the survey was presented in the court May 19.

The Muslim side objected to the videography survey saying that the trial court's decision was against the provisions of the Places of Worship Act, 1991 and approached the Supreme Court with the same

The court refused to stay the videography survey, but ordered the matter to be transferred to the district court.

Silchar, July 23: Home to a multitude of birds and mammals, Assam's Barak Valley will soon get a second wildlife sanctuary with Governor Jagdish Mukhi approving a proposal for the creation of Barak Bhuban Wildlife Sanctuary.

The Barak Valley also houses the Borail Wildlife Sanctuary.

"In exercise of the power ferred by Section 35 of Wildlife (Protection) Act. 1972 as amended up to date, the Governor of Assam is pleased to declare its intention to constitute the area described in the Schedule annexed hereto as the Barak Bhuban Wildlife Sanctuary," an official order dated July 19 stated.

The Barak Bhuban Wildlife Sanctuary will be spread over an area of 320 sq km between the Barak river and the Sonai river.

Around 17,200 people were affected by the deluge in four districts till Thursday.

The toll due to floods and landslides in the state this year stood at 197. Presently, 44 villages are under water and 210 hectares of farm-

land have been damaged. Around 1,084 people, including 190 children, have taken shelter in seven relief camps in two districts. Erosion has been reported in Bongaigaon, Nagaon and Nalbari

districts. Embankments, roads, bridges and other infrastructure have been damaged by floodwaters in Baksa,

Kamrup and Tamulpur districts. No river is flowing above the danger level in the state as of now,



# **Yasin Malik on** hunger strike

Malik, 56, head of the banned Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF), began his indefinite strike Friday as he had threatened to earlier this month, they said. Friday morning, he refused to eat anything despite repeated requests by jail authorities, the officials said. His health is being closely monitored.

Appearing before a special CBI judge through video conference, Malik had said he wanted to appear physically in the case related to the kidnapping of Rubaiya Sayeed. daughter of the Union home minister Mufti Mohammed Sayeed, in December 1989.

Malik informed the court that he had written a letter to the government seeking his transfer to a Jammu jail so he could appear physically in the case and contest the allegations against him. He had said he would like to personally cross-examine all the prosecution witnesses in the case and would wait for a government nod till July 22. If not, he would sit on an indefinite hunger strike inside

New Delhi, July 23: Air traffic in the Indian skies has returned to normalcy with airports buzzing with a large number of footfalls in the last couple of months.

Air traffic data has rightly shown that passengers carried by domestic airlines saw a growth of 66.73 per cent from 343.37 lakh to 572.49 lakh in the January to June period, as compared to the previous year.

However, growth in air traffic has apparently brought a lot of turbulence as planes have witnessed an unusually large number of technical glitches related occurrences and a rising number of such incidents have left the fliers harried.

Shockingly, technical glitches in flights are not limited to one or two airlines. Most of the Indian carriers, including the largest player IndiGo, SpiceJet, Go First or Air India Express, have been plagued by technical snags over the last one month.

Multiple incidents were reported to have occurred on aircraft operated by Indian carriers over the last few days owing to engine snags, burning smell, pressurisation loss in cabin to a bird entering the airplane cockpit.

A top DGCA official said that improper identification of cause of a reported defect and non-availability of required certifying staff to cater to multiple arrivals and departure of flights in short intervals are the



main reasons behind such snags. Explaining about the procedure, the official said that before every flight takes off, a licenced aircraft maintenance engineer (AME) inspects the aircraft and releases it if everything is in order. There are various categories of AME licences, and the Category A licence is given to

technicians who are permitted to maintain the aircraft under certain limits. The Category B licence is more specialised and equip AMEs to deal with intricate components, such as engines, wings, etc.

"Spot checks disclosed that airlines were not adhering to the laid down standards and they were not posting the relevant qualified engineers at all the stations with the Category A licence holders releasing aircraft at some of the smaller airports," said the official.

The official said that shortage of required staff is one of the major reasons and airlines have been accordingly advised to take proper action and deploy the certified staff to conduct checks before departure.

Aviation safety experts also pointed towards the same. Aviation safety consultant, Captain Mohan Ranganathan, said, "The string of incidents occurred because airlines are fudging maintenance procedures due to lack of finance, shortage of trained manpower, and fatigue issues of staff not taken

Rangnathan also pointed out that failure of DGCA to enforce safety regulations, findings of their own safety and financial audits and covering up accidents and serious incidents as minor occurrences are some other reasons.

'One cannot let things ride thinking nothing has happened hence we are safe," he said. Ranganathan said that all occurrences are mandatorily reported to the DGCA which are then analysed and the severity of the occurrence is determined.

"Based on the severity, these occurrences are classified and investigated and safety recommendations emanating from the investigation reports are acted upon by the concerned stakeholders," the official said.

#### Thai PM survives 4th no-trust vote

Bangkok: Thai Prime Minister Prayuth Chan-ocha and 10 cabinet ministers survived noconfidence votes in parliament Saturday, with the government emerging on top in Prayuth's last major test ahead of a general election due within 11 months. The 68-year-old former army chief, in power since a coup he led in 2014, received 256 votes in favour and 206 against with nine abstentions, securing his position as premier until his term ends in March. Three deputy prime ministers and seven other cabinet members also survived the censure motion.

### **Trump aide held** quilty of contempt

Washington: A federal jury Friday found Steve Bannon, an advisor to former US President Donald Trump, guilty of two counts of criminal contempt of Congress. Jail terms and fines will be determined during sentencing, which is scheduled for October 21. Bannon faces between 30 days to one year behind bars and a fine of \$100 to \$100,000 for each count. The trial lasted less than a week; it started Monday, the US attorney and defence up their arguments on Thursday and the jurors returned the guilty verdict Friday.

### **Pakistan reports** 13th polio case

Islamabad: An 18-month-old infant was paralysed by wild poliovirus in Pakistan's northwestern Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province (KP). the National Institute of Health confirmed to the media. The total number of polio cases in the country this vear has increased to 13 with all of them from southern KP, the Health Ministry spokesperson said Friday, adding that the virus has a significant presence in the area. The government is taking practical steps to ensure polio eradication, with access to polio vaccination being facilitated on an emergency basis to the districts in need, said the Health Ministry.

### **Psychiatric test** for Abe's killer

Tokyo: The suspected assassin of Japanese former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe will undergo psychiatric evaluation until later this year, Japanese media reported Saturday. Tetsuya Yamagami, an unemployed 41-year-old, has been identified by police as the suspect who approached Abe at a campaign speech on a street corner July 8 and opened fire with a handmade gun.

WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus made the decision to issue the declaration despite a lack of consensus among members of WHO's emergency committee. It was the first time the chief of the UN Health agency has taken such an action.



and that of those, 98% involved men who have sex with men. Experts suspect the monkeypox outbreaks in Europe and North America were spread via sex at two raves in Belgium and Spain.

In the US, some experts have speculated whether monkeypox might be on the verge of becoming an entrenched sexually transmitted disease in the country like gonorrhea, herpes and HIV, with officials estimating that 1.5 million men are at high risk of being infected.

"The bottom line is we've seen

a shift in the epidemiology of monkeypox where there's now widespread, unexpected transmission,' said Albert Ko, a professor of public health and epidemiology at Yale University.

'There are some genetic mutations in the virus that suggest why that may be happening, but we do need a globally-coordinated response to get it under control." he said. Ko called for testing to be immediately scaled up rapidly, saying that similar to the early days of COVID-19, that there were significant gaps in surveillance.

### In a first, monkeypox diagnoséd in children

New York: Two children have been diagnosed with monkeypox in the US, health officials said Friday. One is a toddler in California and the other an infant who is not a US resident, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The children were described as being in good health and receiving treatment. How they caught the disease is being investigated, but officials think it was through household transmission. Other details weren't immediately disclosed. The US may see more cases of monkeypox before the numbers go down. Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Rochelle Walensky said, "With the scale-up of testing, with the scale-up of information, we anticipate that there will be more cases before there are less." Xinhua news agency guoted Walensky as saving to The Washington Post, The CDC currently does not have specific projections on how serious the situation may be, Walensky added, "I do not think that we have a stable estimate now," the CDC chief said. So far, the US has reported over 2,800 confirmed monkeypox/orthopoxvirus cases, according to CDC data.

### Russian missiles hit Odesa port

The attacks on key infrastructure on the 150th day of Russia's war in Ukraine marked new attempts by the warring parties to tip the scales of the grinding conflict in their favour

Kyiv, July 23: Russian missiles hit Ukraine's southern port of Odesa Saturday, the Ukrainian military said, threatening a landmark deal signed just the day before to unblock grain exports from Black Sea ports and ease global food shortages caused by the war.

The deal signed Friday by Moscow and Kyiv and mediated by the United Nations and Turkey was hailed as a breakthough after nearly five months of punishing fighting since Russia invaded its neighbour. It is seen as crucial to curbing soaring global food prices by allowing grain exports to be shipped from Black Sea ports including Odesa.

UN officials had said Friday they hoped the agreement would be operational in a few weeks but it was not yet clear if that would still be possible given Saturday's strikes.

Two Russian Kalibr missiles hit infrastructure at the Odesa port, while another two were shot down by air defence forces, Ukraine's Operational Command South wrote on the Telegram messaging app.

Shehbaz, the son of Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Saturday took oath as the CM of the Punjab province, a day after he was re-elected to the post by just three votes amidst high drama that sparked protests in the country and prompted the rival candidate Chaudhry Parvez Elahi to move the SC

A three-member bench of the Supreme Court comprising Chief Justice Umar Ata Bandial, Justice Ijazul Ahsan and Justice Munib Akhter took up the case Saturday.

The court after hearing arguments ruled that "Hamza will continue to work as a trustee chief minister till Monday," adding that he should work as per the Constitution and law during the time period, and not use his powers for political gains.

Hamza, 47, was declared the winner in the election though his Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz party did not have a majority in the Assembly after key by-elections held July 17. He managed to retain the post of Punjab CM by the barest of margins after Deputy Speaker Dost Muhammad Mazari rejected 10 votes of Elahi's party Pakistan Muslim League-Q, an ally of ousted PM Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf, citing Article 63-A of the Constitution.

Grantham, July 23: Former British finance minister Rishi Sunak, one of two remaining candidates to become Britain's next Prime Minister, Saturday described himself as the underdog in the

Sunak's resignation helped trigger a revolt that saw Prime Minister Boris Johnson agree to step down after a series of scandals. Members of the ruling Conservative Party will vote for a successor over the summer, with an announcement due September 5.

Sunak led all rounds of the voting among Conservative Party lawmakers to reduce the field to two candidates.

But it is foreign secretary Liz Truss who seems to have gained the advantage so far among the 200,000 members of the governing party who will ultimately choose the winner.

Truss held a 24-point lead over Sunak in a YouGov poll of Conservative Party members published Thursday.

"Be in no doubt derdog," Sunak said in a speech in Grantham, central England, the birthplace of former prime minister Margaret Thatcher. Truss would be only Britain's

third female PM after Thatcher and Theresa May while Sunak would be the country's first leader of Indian origin. "The forces that want this to be

a coronation for the other candidate but I think members want a choice and they are prepared to listen," he So far the focus has been on

pledges, or non-pledges, to cut taxes, at a time when many people are struggling, along with defence spending and energy policy.

In his speech Sunak, laid out his Thatcherite credentials, promising careful management of the economy before tax cuts. He criticised as arbitrary Truss' pledge to increase defence spending to 3% of GDP by 2030.

Colombo, July 23: More than 1,000 valuable artefacts, including items of vintage and antique value have reportedly gone missing from Sri Lanka's Presidential Palace and Prime Minister's official residence at Temple Trees in Colombo after irate anti-government protesters occupied these premises earlier this month, police said

Based on initial investigations at least 1,000 items of value, including rare artefacts have gone missing from the residences of former President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and former Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe, web portal Colombo Page quoted police sources as saving.

Special investigation teams have been formed to begin an investigation, it said.

What is compounding the agony for the investigative officers is that the Sri Lankan Department of Archaeology does not have a detailed record of the antiques and different artefacts at the Presidential Palace, even though it has been gazetted as a place of archaeological importance, the report said.

A senior official of the Department of Archaeology told Sunday Lankadeepa newspaper that it would be difficult to get specific and clear information about the exact number of antiques that have gone missing, even though po-



lice estimate that it could be well Newly-elected President Ranil

Wickremesinghe said he respects the rights of the protesters to peacefully undertake their demon-

# QR code labelling on electronics soon: ICEA

New Delhi, July 23: The decision by the Department of Consumer Affairs on mandatory QR code labeling on various packaged commodities including electronics, will de-clutter the information for the consumers needed at the time of purchase, the India



Cellular and Electronic Association (ICEA) said Friday.

Last week, the Department of Consumer Affairs announced the first step to simplify labelling using digital QR code under a law that is over 30 years old.

"The industry will start working alongside the government to start transforming labelling on electronics commodities over the next one year," said Pankaj Mohindroo, Chairman of ICEA

With this amendment, which covers the electronics industry, consumers will be able to read and retain several mandatory declarations in a digital format via a

QR Code. It means, except information that is needed during the purchase of a specific electronic item, such as the MRP, name of manufacturer/importer, customer support details, unit sales price, month/year of manufacture and

country of origin, which will remain on the label, all other mandatory declarations can be stored and read digitally.

It will de-clutter the label while retaining only relevant information needed at the time of purchase, and make the label neater and more legible.

The move will also provide easy real-time and updated information via QR code to consumers even months after the purchase, thereby reducing the size of labels on commodities.

### Google fires techie who said AI chatbot is sentient

Washington, July 23: Alphabet Inc's Google said Friday it has dismissed a senior software engineer who claimed the company's artificial intelligence (AI) chatbot LaMDA was a self-aware person.

Google, which placed software engineer Blake Lemoine on leave last month, said he had violated company policies and that it found his claims on LaMDA to be "wholly unfounded."

"It's regrettable that despite lengthy engagement on this topic, Blake still chose to persistently violate clear employment and data security policies that include the need to safeguard product information," a Google spokesperson said in an email to Reuters.

### Domino's may shift business away from Zomato and Swiggy

Dominos' warning comes as Zomato and *Swiggy face accusations* by many restaurants that their alleged practices hurt business

New Delhi, July 23: Domino's Pizza India franchise will consider taking some of its business away from popular food delivery apps, Zomato and SoftBank-backed Swiggy, if their commissions rise further, according to a letter seen by Reuters.

The disclosure was made by Jubilant FoodWorks, which runs the Domino's and Dunkin' Donuts chain in India, in a confidential

filing with the Competition Commission of India (CCI) which is investigating alleged anti-competitive practices of Zomato and Swiggy.

Jubilant is India's largest food services company, with more than 1,600 branded restaurant outlets-including 1,567 Domino's and 28 Dunkin outlets.

The CCI ordered in April its probe into Zomato and Swiggy after an Indian restaurant group alleged preferential treatment, exorbitant commissions and other anti-competitive practices. The food delivery apps deny any wrongdoing.

After the CCI sought responses from Domino's India franchise and several other restaurants as part of its investigation, Jubilant sought more time to share data related to its online



sales, but wrote to the watchdog expressing concerns over potentially higher commission of food-ordering platforms.

"In case of an increase in commission rates, Jubilant will con-

sider shifting more of its businesses from online restaurant platforms to the in-house ordering system," the company stated in its July 19 letter addressed to the CCI.




Zomato, which is backed by China's Ant Group, said it had no plans in the pipeline to increase restaurant partner commissions at the top end. "No commercial decisions are unilaterally taken that may adversely impact our stakeholders.'

With the rising use of smartphones and attractive discounts on offer, food delivery platforms have become increasingly popular in India. Jubilant in February said Domino's app was installed 8.2 million times during the quarter to December 2021, and its "own app sales continued to grow faster than the aggregators"

A senior industry executive with direct knowledge said that Zomato's and Swiggy's commissions were a concern for Domino's and many other restaurants.

"If commissions are increased further, they will lead to profit squeeze of businesses and will simply be passed on to consumers," said the executive, who declined to be named.
