BJD leader and party's key election strategist VK Pandian slammed Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma over the latter making 'disparaging comments' about Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik during BJP election rallies in the state. Calling Sarma a 'guest', Pandian, during a meeting in Nimapara, asked the Assam CM to learn the cultural ethos of Odisha and show respect towards Naveen, the colleague of his (Sarma's) 'guru'.

SARMA: NAVEEN BEHAVE LIKE A HELD 'HOSTAGE' GUEST: PANDIAN

Sambalpur, May 23: Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma Thursday claimed that his Odisha counterpart, Naveen Patnaik, is running the government under the instructions of BJD leader VK Pandian, who is calling the shots in the state by holding Naveen as 'hostage'.

During a poll campaign here, Sarma said elections this time is all about the dignity of Odisha. Sarma alleged that Patnaik is always accompanied by Pandian and is "not free to move anywhere in the state without the 5T Chairman's approval".

"I am also the CM of a state. I can personally meet anyone and people can also meet me. The same is in the case of West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee. However, the Odisha CM cannot meet anyone personally. No one can also meet him alone as Pandian always stays



with him. One needs to find out whether Naveen babu himself is with Pandian or if Pandian is playing some game due to which Naveen babu cannot get out of his grip," Sarma alleged.

"If a CM, a constitutionally-elected CM, is in a hostage situation, it is not good for Odisha and the country as well," the Assam CM pointed out.

"I feel that the Chief Justice or a judge of the Orissa High Court, or the Governor should talk to Naveen babu alone to assess his well-being and ensure he is not under any duress," he suggested.



Nimapara: Launching a scathing attack on Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma for 'disrespecting' his Odisha counterpart, BJD leader and party supremo Naveen Patnaik's close confidant VK Pandian asked Sarma to learn the cultural ethos of Odisha, especially when he is a guest in the state, and desist from making any disparaging comments about Patnaik during his election speeches.

Addressing an election meeting at Nimapara, Pandian said several big leaders are coming to the state from outside and have

been disrespecting the CM with their rude utterances.

Pandian reminded the Assam CM that Naveen was a minister in Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee's Cabinet.

"Naveen babu worked with the guru (Vajpayee) of your guru (Narendra Modi). He was a Cabinet minister in PM Vajpayee's Cabinet. Since Assam CM is a guest in Odisha, I will not tell him much. But I will pray Mahaprabhu (Lord Jagannath) to inculcate in him the right values so that he knows how to speak about a popular CM," Pandian said.

Pandian, BJD's chief election strategist, also asserted that Opposition parties are resorting to violence to influence the outcome of the elections while Naveen believes in peace.

"The CM has a special focus on the development of Nimapara," he added.

8 die in Thane factory blast

Thane, May 23: As many as eight persons were killed and more than 60 others injured following an explosion at a chemical factory in the district here in Maharashtra Thursday afternoon, officials said.

As a boiler exploded at Amudan Chemicals located in Phase II of Dombivli MIDC area around 1.40pm, the impact of the explosion and the resultant blaze affected adjacent factories and houses, they said.

The affected chemical fac-

tory produced food colours and uses peroxides that are highly reactive and unstable chemicals that can cause violent explosions under certain conditions, the NDRF said.

"Six men and two women were killed in the incident but their bodies were charred beyond recognition," said Yasin Tadvil, chief of the Disaster Management Cell of the Thane Municipal Corporation.

As per the preliminary information, those killed were working in neighbouring factories, Maharashtra Industries Minister Uday Samant said.

Seven Naxals gunned down

Narayanpur, May 23: Seven Naxalites were killed in an encounter with security personnel in a forest along Narayanpur-Bijapur inter-district border in Chhattisgarh Thursday, police said.

The gunfight broke out around 11am when a joint team of security personnel was out on an anti-Naxal operation and the intermittent firing was still underway, Narayanpur SP Prabhat Kumar said.

"Seven Naxalites in Maoist uniform have been gunned down in the exchange of fire so far," added the SP.

PHASE III CAMPAIGNING ENDS

94.48 lakh to decide fate of 447 May 25

Bhubaneswar, May 23: Curtains came down Thursday on the high-decibel campaigning for the third phase of elections in the state wherein over 94.48 lakh voters will decide the fate of 447 candidates in fray for six Lok Sabha seats and 42 Assembly segments May 25.

Addressing media, Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) NB Dhal said the Election Commission will deploy 121 companies of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) for the polling in the state.

Polling will take place in six LS constituencies — Puri, Bhubaneswar, Cuttack, Dhenkanal, Keonjhar, and Sambalpur — and 42 Assembly seats within their jurisdictions. Dhal said out of the over 94.48 lakh voters, approximately 21 per cent are youths aged 30 years or below.

Voting will take place in 10,551 polling stations, with about 2,000 designated as model polling stations. Over 2,000 polling stations have been identified as critical, with special security arrangements in place to ensure peaceful voting, Dhal added.

There are 383 MLA candidates — 339 men and 44 women — and 64 MP aspirants for May 25 election.

'Euclid' spies rogue planets in Milky Way

Paris, May 23: Astronomers have spotted dozens of rogue planets floating free from their stars after turning the Euclid space telescope to look at a distant region of the Milky Way, 'The Guardian' reported.

The wandering worlds were seen deep inside the Orion nebula, a giant cloud of dust and gas 1,500 light years away, and described in the first scientific results announced by Euclid mission researchers.

The European Space Agency (Esa) launched the 1bn (£851m) observatory last summer on a six-year mission to create a 3D map of the cosmos. Armed with its images, scientists hope to understand more about the mysterious 95 per cent of the universe that is unexplained.

According to as-

tronomers' theories, most of the universe is made up of dark matter, an invisible substance that clings around galaxies and behaves like a cosmic glue, and dark energy, which is said to drive the accelerating expansion of the universe.

The first wave of scientific results come from only 24 hours of observations, which revealed 11m objects in visible light and 5m in infrared. Along with

the rogue planets, the researchers describe new star clusters, dwarf galaxies and very distant, bright galaxies from the first billion years of the universe.

A flurry of new images from the same observations are the largest ever taken in space and demonstrate the stunning wide-field views that astronomers can expect from Euclid in the coming years. Among those released

Thursday is a breathtaking image of Messier 78, a vibrant star nursery shrouded in interstellar dust, that reveals complex filaments of gas and dust in unprecedented detail.

"I've been absolutely amazed at the images I've seen," said Prof Mark Cropper, the lead scientist on Euclid's VIS camera at UCL. "These are not just pretty pictures, these images are packed with new information."

One of the newly released images shows Abell 2390, a giant conglomeration of more than 50,000 Milky Way-like galaxies. Such galaxy clusters contain up to 10 trillion times as much mass as the sun, much of which is believed to be elusive dark matter. Another image of the Abell 2764 galaxy cluster reveals hundreds of galaxies orbiting within a halo of dark matter.



Phase V turnout at 62.2%; women outnumber men

New Delhi, May 23: The voter turnout in the fifth phase of Lok Sabha polls held May 20 has now climbed to 62.2 per cent, the Election Commission said Thursday with women outnumbering men.

According to an EC statement, 61.48 per cent of the registered male voters turned up at the polling stations as compared to 63 per cent of female electors.

In phase 5, 49 seats across six states and two union territories went for polling where over 8.95 crore people, including 4.69 crore men, 4.26 crore women and 5409 third gender were eligible to

vote.

The participation of women in voting was higher as compared to men in Bihar, Jharkhand, Ladakh, Odisha and Uttar Pradesh.

The male-female turnout gap was wide in Bihar and Jharkhand. While in Bihar, the male turnout was 52.42 per cent, the female turnout was 61.58 per cent.

Similarly, in Jharkhand, the male turnout was registered at 58.08 per cent, while the female turnout was 68.65 per cent.

A maximum of 38.22 per cent of voters registered in the third gender category turned out to vote in West Bengal.

EC noted that repolls at two polling stations in the Kandhamal parliamentary constituency was concluded Thursday and the figures 'may' change accordingly, once the data is updated for post-repoll.

In the corresponding phase in the 2019 polls, the turnout was registered at 64.16 per cent when 51 seats across seven states went to polls.

According to EC, the voter turnout in the fourth phase stood at 69.16 per cent, 3.65 percentage points higher than the corresponding phase in the 2019 parliamentary elections.

The voter turnout figures for the third phase of polling in the Lok Sabha elections were 65.68 per cent. In the third phase of the 2019 elections, the turnout was 68.4 per cent.

In the second phase of the 2024 elections, the turnout was recorded at 66.71 per cent as against 69.64 per cent in the second phase of the 2019 polls.

In the first phase of the ongoing general elections, a 66.14 per cent turnout was recorded. In the 2019 polls, the turnout in the first phase was 69.43 per cent.

The poll panel has said the final turnout will only be available after the results, with the counting of postal ballots and its addition to the total voting percentage.

Publishing polling booth-wise data will 'vitiolate' electoral space: EC to SC

New Delhi, May 23: The Election Commission has opposed in the Supreme Court an NGO's demand to upload polling station-wise voter turnout data on its website within 48 hours of the conclusion of polling for each phase of the Lok Sabha elections, contending it will "vitiolate" the electoral space and cause "chaos" in the poll machinery in the midst of the general elections.

A vacation bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and Satish Chandra Sharma is scheduled to hear the plea of NGO Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) which has also sought direction to the poll panel that scanned legible copies of Form 17C Part-I (Account of Votes Recorded) of all polling stations be uploaded immediately after the polls.

In its counter affidavit, the poll panel said there is no legal mandate to provide Form 17C to any person other than the candidate or his agent.

It said that public posting of Form 17C - which gives the number of votes polled in a polling station - is not provided in the statutory framework and could lead to mischief and vitiation of the entire electoral space as it increases the possibility of the images being morphed.


"The Petitioner is trying to create an entitlement when none exists in the law by way of filing an application in the middle of the election period. It is respectfully reiterated that for credible multiple practical reasons, the result as per the statutory mandate, is declared on the basis of the data contained in Form 17C at the time as prescribed under the statutory rule regime in existence," it said.

It further said that "indiscriminate disclosure" of polling station-wise voter turnout data and posting it on a website will cause chaos in the election machinery which is already in motion for the ongoing Lok Sabha elections.

The EC also dismissed as false and misleading the allegation that there was "5-6" per cent difference between the voter turnout data released on the day of the polling for the first two phases of the Lok Sabha elections and the press releases issued subsequently. The NGO claimed the final voter turnout data jumped sharply from the initial figures released by the poll panel.

The Election Commission's 225-page affidavit said, "It is submitted that if the reliefs sought by the petitioner is allowed, it will not only be in teeth of the aforesaid legal position but will also cause chaos in the election machinery which is already in motion for the ongoing General Elections to the Lok Sabha, 2024."

Bhubaneswar, May 23: The ruling BJD in Odisha Thursday appointed former minister and Simulia MLA Jyoti Prakash Panigrahi as its Balasore district unit president.

Panigrahi's appointment comes after BJD did not accept his resignation from the primary membership of the party.

He was upset after BJD denied him a party ticket this time to contest from Simulia Assembly segment. The party nominated Subhasini Sahoo from Simulia.

In an official order signed by BJD president Naveen



Patnaik, the party said, "Jyoti Prakash Panigrahi is hereby appointed as the president of Balasore district unit and Aswini Kumar Patra is hereby appointed as the state general secretary, Biju Janata Dal, with immediate effect." In a video message, Panigrahi

had said his late father Parshuram Panigrahi was associated with former chief minister Biju Patnaik for over 40 years and he also served the party for 10 years.

"My family will continue to serve the people of Khaira and Simulia. I also hope for your co-operation," he said.

In 2019, Panigrahi retained the Simulia Assembly seat by defeating Padmalochan Panda of the BJP. Subhasini Sahoo, the BJD nominee from Simulia, is the wife of Shashi Kumar Sahoo, who unsuccessfully contested the Assembly segment on a BJP ticket in 2014.

Two candidates with zero assets in fray for Phase IV

Bhubaneswar, May 23: Two candidates in the fray in the fourth and final phase of Assembly elections in Odisha have declared zero assets in their affidavits, according to a report.

Mayurbhanj, Balasore, Bhadrak, Jajpur, Kendrapara and Jagatsinghpur Lok Sabha constituencies along with 42 Assembly segments falling under these parliamentary seats will go to polls in the last phase June 1.

The Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) and Odisha Election Watch have analysed the self-sworn affidavits of 394 candidates, who are contesting from 42 Assembly seats in Odisha.

Sanjay Kumar Das, an Independent candidate contesting from Dhamnagar Assembly segment, and Ambedkarite Party of India nominee from Korei constituency, Gopal Krushna Mohan, declared that they did not own any asset.

Several other candidates have declared that they own assets worth less than ₹10,000.

Independent candidate Benudhar Mohapatra is contesting from Udala Assembly seat with only ₹645 cash in hand. Another Independent nominee Jharanarani Jena, who is contesting from Basta constituency, has declared that

she has only ₹1,000. On the other hand, as many as 121 candidates (31 per cent of total nominees) in the fray in the fourth phase are 'crorepatis', with BJD candidate from Basta segment, Subasini Jena, being the richest with ₹135.17 crore assets, the report said.

BJD candidate from Simulia, Subasini Sahoo, is the second richest candidate with assets worth ₹91.75 crore. Congress nominee from Bhandaripokhari Assembly segment, Niranjan Patnaik, was in third place with total assets worth ₹86.58 crore.

Of the 394 MLA candidates contesting in the fourth phase, 96 have declared that they have criminal cases registered against themselves. A total of 149 candidates have declared their educational qualifications to be between Classes V and XII, while 220 nominees have educational qualifications of graduate or above. Moreover, 22 candidates are diploma holders and three candidates have declared themselves to be just literate.

Merlène's incredible migration to Odisha

Bhubaneswar, May 23: In a remarkable turn of events, bird-watchers in Odisha have successfully located a Whimbrel, named Merlène, which was satellite-tagged on Réunion Island in the southern Indian Ocean.

This discovery is part of an international effort to track and understand the migratory patterns of these extraordinary birds.

Merlène's journey began March 7 when she was equipped with a GPS tag at Réunion Island, her wintering site. After spending a month in Mauritius, she embarked on her northward pre-breeding migration, making significant stopovers in Socotra and the Indus River delta in Pakistan before arriving in India.

Chhattisgarh birdwatchers reported the sighting first May 20, generating excitement among ornithologists and bird enthusiasts worldwide. Merlène was



taking a stopover at a small pond north of Bhilai, enduring the extreme daytime temperatures of 48°C.

Now, the bird has crossed over to Odisha and has been

seen at the mouth of Rushikulya by local conservationist Rabindra Nath Sahu. The operation was coordinated by Bhubaneswar-based bird-watcher Panchami Manoo Ukil.

Merlène's migration is part of the French Office for Biodiversity's LIMOIO project, aimed at studying the ecology and conservation of migrating waders in the western Indian Ocean. This project provides valuable insights into the habitats and migration routes of these birds.

"Tracking Merlène's journey is truly fascinating," said Mathieu, the lead researcher on the project. "We are thrilled to share this incredible story and hope it raises awareness about the importance of migratory bird conservation."

Birdwatchers and enthusiasts across India are encouraged to keep an eye out for Merlène and other color-flagged Whimbrels. Merlène has a yellow tag with the code "AM" on her right leg and a green ring on her left leg. This discovery not only high-

lights the arduous journeys these birds undertake but also emphasises the importance of international cooperation in wildlife conservation.

Merlène's journey is far from over, as she is expected to continue her migration to her breeding grounds in northern Siberia.

Scientists and bird-watchers are excitedly sharing predictions on what Merlène will do next. Will it fly north crossing the Himalayas, or will it stay in rich habitats of Odisha for some more time.

Impending climatic disturbances in the Bay of Bengal might also make the bird stay for longer duration in our coasts. Initiatives like this have proven effective in the past, creating excitement and interest in migratory birds.

Man held for hurting in-laws

Bhubaneswar, May 23: The Airport police station here Thursday arrested a 34-year-old man who allegedly tortured his wife over dowry demands and assaulted his in-laws.

Two sharp weapons which were used in the attack have been recovered, said an officer at the police station. The accused has been identified as Sanjay Debanath, 34, a native of Kendrapara district. He has been residing at Kargil slum for the last 10 years. Sanjay and his wife are parents to two children, he added.

Speaking about the incident, IIC of Airport police station, Tusharkant Sethi said Sanjay as-

saulted and abused his wife over dowry issues, Wednesday afternoon. Protesting against such behavior, his wife left for his maternal house in a huff. This enraged Sanjay who later turned up at his in-law's home at night and hurled abuses at them. While they tried to pacify him, Sanjay, in a fit of rage, assaulted them with a sharp weapon. His father-in-law sustained deep injuries on his neck in the attack. When they tried to overpower him, he slipped off and fled from the spot, Sethi added.

The Airport police station later arrested Sanjay and booked him under Sections 498 (A), 294, 307 and 323 of IPC. He was produced before a local court Thursday for remand.

Thursday said squally wind speed reaching 40-50 kmph gusting to 60 kmph is likely along and off adjoining north Odisha coasts from May 25 evening.

It said the low pressure area over southwest and adjoining west central Bay of Bengal (BoB) has moved northeastwards and lays as a well marked low pressure area over west central and adjoining south BoB.

It is very likely to continue to move northeastwards and concentrate into a depression over central parts of BoB by morning of May 24 and thereafter, it is very likely to continue to move northeastwards, intensifying further into a cyclonic storm over east central BoB by May 25 morning.

Subsequently, it would move nearly northwards and reach near Bangladesh and adjoining West Bengal coasts by May 26 evening as a severe cyclonic storm.

Safeguard Olive Ridley turtles' habitat: CM

Bhubaneswar, May 23: On World Turtle Day Thursday, Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik called upon people to create a welcoming environment and a safe nesting cove for the endangered Olive Ridley turtles.

The CM said, "With our exemplary conservation efforts and sustained campaigns, Odisha coast has become a favourite destination for mass nesting these species."

In Odisha the nesting sites of Olive Ridley turtles are located at Rushikulya river mouth in Ganjam district, Gahirmatha beach in Kendrapara and Devi river mouth in Puri. The mass nesting of turtles usually begins in March after the November-December mating season in deep sea. Every year lakhs of turtles visit the sites to lay eggs.

Odisha government had banned visitors from entering the nesting sites of Olive Ridley sea turtles along eastern coast of the state. Earlier, the state government had also clamped a seven-month ban on sea fishing from November to May within 20 km off the coast to ensure the safety of marine species including Olive Ridley turtles for their mating and



breeding. However, some experts alleged that many fishermen continue fishing activities without intervention from fisheries and forest officials.

This year the Olive Ridley turtles had already made their way to Odisha's Gahirmatha beach for mass nesting. According to report, their arrival was delayed by a month, reportedly due to the unsteady sea and spells of unseasonal rain. The turtles chose the Gahirmatha Beach due to its unique topography that keeps the beach safe from erosion by waves. It is believed to be the world's largest-known nesting ground of Olive Ridley turtles.

The female turtles invade the Gahirmatha beach for nesting between February and March. Each turtle typically lays 120-150 eggs, in conical nests that are dug 1.5 feet deep. The nestling process takes place over three to 10 days. After laying the eggs, the female turtles return to the sea. The hatchlings emerge after 45 to 60 days and soon make their way to the ocean in the night as they follow the light reflected on the ocean's surface.

All species of sea turtles in India, including the Olive Ridley turtles, are protected under Schedule I of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, which bans their hunting, domestication, or trade.

Epidurals cut risk of severe childbirth complications by 35%

An epidural during labour is associated with 35 per cent reduced risk from post-birth complications, new research published in the British Medical Journal (BMJ) has found.

The complications, referred to as severe maternal morbidity (SMM), can include heart attack, sepsis (chemicals that fight infection cause inflammation), and hysterectomy, in which the uterus is removed surgically.

Researchers said that epidural analgesia, whereby anaesthetic drugs are delivered via small tubes into the

space outside the spinal cord, is recommended for women at risk from SMM because of being obese, while delivering more than one baby, or in premature delivery.

While previous studies have suggested that epidural analgesia in labour may reduce the risk of SMM, the researchers, including those at the University of Glasgow, said that evidence was limited.

For their study, the team used data from the Scottish National Health Service of more than 5.5 lakh mothers in labour, delivering vaginally or via unplanned caesarean



section in the country between 2007 and 2019. More than 1.25 lakh mothers of the 5.5 lakh (about 22 per

cent) were found to have had an epidural in labour and SMM was found to have occurred in 4.3 per 1000 births.

"Epidural analgesia during labour was associated with a 35 per cent reduction in SMM, and showed a more pronounced

effect in women with medical indications for epidural analgesia and with preterm births," the authors wrote.

"This effect was more pronounced in specific groups, showing a 50 per cent risk reduction in women with pre-defined risk factors, and a 47 per cent reduction in those delivering prematurely," they wrote.

The researchers suggested possible explanations for the risk reduction, which included blunted physical stress experienced by mothers during labour because of the anaesthesia.

21 JUMBOS FOUND IN ROURKELA FOREST DIVISION

Rourkela, May 23: The elephant census under Rourkela Forest division ended Thursday, officials said. They added that counting of elephants was undertaken in six ranges of this division.

"This year, the census was undertaken after seven years," informed Rourkela DFO, Jasobant Sethi. "A total of 21 elephants are staying in the division. Nine of them were found in Rajgangpur range and 12 in Lathitaka range. All of them were found in healthy condition," Sethi added. Officials informed that out of

the nine elephants in Rajgangpur, three are males, four females and two are calves. In the Lathitaka range, two males, four females and six calves were

found, they added.

The elephant census started May 21 and 250 Forest department staff were used for it. A number of teams comprising

three to four persons were formed to track down the elephants. A total of 44 platforms (machans) were set up at various locations of the two ranges, officials stated. They added that most of the platforms were set up close to water bodies.

"We had well-trained staff for conducting the census. They were assigned the task of approximately guessing the weight and height of the elephants and determine its gender. After the elephants disappeared from the vicinity of the platform, the staff came down to measure its hoofs," Sethi stated.

Repolling underway in 2 booths of Kantamal Assembly segment

Remains of ancient urban civilisation found in Junagarh

Bhawanipatna, May 23: Remains of an ancient urban civilisation have been discovered in Junagarh, a town in Kalahandi district. Following the publication of a report in the international journal 'Heritage', the curiosity regarding the remains has increased considerably among intellectuals, historians, and the residents of Kalahandi.

The report states that senior researcher Lokesh Durga belonging to the History department of Delhi University and Professor Damayanti Bag from the History department of Rayagada Autonomous College were conducting a month-long survey of the land when they found the remains of the civilisation.

In their findings, the two researchers have stated that the remnants belong to the ancient and medieval periods. Various artefacts including pillars, statues, ruins of temples, idols of Hindu deities and earthenware



products have been found among the remains. According to the researchers, these products prove the existence of an ancient city during the medieval period in Junagarh.

The archaeological remains reflect the characteristics of an ancient urban civilisation, the research revealed. Features such

as advanced irrigation and water resource management, religious foundations, arts and culture, agriculture, political activities and commercial development contributed to transforming a settlement into a large community. The archaeological findings from Junagarh highlight these attributes.

In the early medieval period, Junagarh and its surrounding areas were renowned for the Chhakodi Bandha (120) and Nakodi Tota (180). The city's reservoirs like Ranibandha, Samiyabandha, Hiranila Bandha, Tala Bandha provide evidence of these structures.

The statues of Hindu deities in Bhairiguda and Samiyabandhapada are estimated to be remains from the fifth to the ninth centuries. Additionally, temples like Sameshwar Temple, Dadhibamana Temple, Poda Mahadev Temple, Lankeshwari Temple and Kanaka Durga Temple exhibit the development of art and culture from the seventh to the 17th century.

In the early medieval period, Junagarh was known as 'Jenabalipatana'. The term 'Patana' identifies it as a trade centre. Hence, Junagarh was a well-known business and commercial hub. The archaeological remains from the city substantiate this claim.

Filipino sailor dies at Paradip Port

PARADIP: A sailor from the Philippines died here after falling from the crane of a ship while cleaning at the Paradip Port, police said Thursday. The deceased has been identified as Azaron Earl Wilhelm Curao (26). He was a part of the crew of 'MV Yukad', which is anchored at the Port to load coal, officials said. The sailor was brought ashore by a boat from the anchorage zone and taken to Paradip Port Hospital, an official said. However, despite prompt medical attention, Curao died upon arrival at the facility, he added. Another official pointed out that the deceased must have slipped while carrying out the cleaning work and fell from a height of around 40 feet. Babita Dehuri, the inspector in-charge of Marine police station in Nehru Bangla province, said an investigation is underway. The Philippine Embassy has been contacted, and arrangements are being made to repatriate Curao's body, police said.

Labourer dies of asphyxiation while cleaning well

Digapahandi, May 23: A labourer died of asphyxiation while cleaning a well at Ganianal Ganeswarpur village under Siddheswar panchayat and this block in Ganjam district, Thursday.

The deceased was identified as Dibakar Sahu, a native of Narayanpur village under Sadar police limits in Berhampur. The incident has spread shockwaves in the area.

The tragedy struck when Dibakar and two associates were cleaning a well at a villager's residence at Ganeswarpur.

Dibakar descended into the well in order to clean the muck but failed to come outside. He did not respond when others outside the well called him.

Suspecting something amiss, his associates Durga Rout and Suresh Swain went inside the well and found Dibakar lying unconscious. They informed the Digapahandi fire personnel who rushed to the spot and rescued Dibakar from the well.

Fire personnel rushed him to Digapahandi community health centre (CHC) where he succumbed during treatment.

Digapahandi police registered a case of unnatural death and sent the body for post-mortem.

EP METHOD COMES TO AID OF HEART PATIENT IN MKCG

Berhampur, May 23: Doctors at MKCG Medical College and Hospital here have successfully conducted a surgery on a heart patient with electrophysiology (EP) method.

The EP method, a test performed to assess the electrical system or activity in a person's heart, is used to diagnose abnormal heartbeats or arrhythmia. The procedure is performed by inserting catheters and then wire electrodes, which measure electrical activity, into the heart

through the blood vessels and treatment is done through radio frequency. Notably, natural electrical impulses coordinate contractions of the different parts of the heart. This creates the heartbeat, or heart rhythm and keeps blood flowing the way it should.

The surgery was performed under the direct supervision of Professor Dr Chhabi Satapathy, head of the Cardiology department in the hospital, and cardiology experts from Vishakhapatnam in the presence of all doctors and staff of

the department.

Speaking to mediapersons, Dr Satapathy said the surgery costs around Rs 2 lakh in the private hospitals. "The surgery being successfully performed at the MKCG Medical College and Hospital has brought glory for us," he added.

He said the costly procedure could be performed on patients suffering from abnormal heartbeats in future if the higher authorities provide them with the necessary equipment.

The heartbeat of a normal person ranges from 60 to 100 per minute but people having heart problems often experience abnormal heartbeats exceeding 150 per minute. The hospital has an EP machine to identify the disease but they lack some essential equipment to carry out the treatment. As a result, it was difficult to treat the heart patients on a regular basis and doctors at the hospital had to refer them to other hospitals.

Earlier, doctors at the Cardiology department in the hospital under the direct supervision of Dr Satapathy have performed complicated surgeries like intra-vascular ultrasound (IVUS), optical coherence tomography (OCT) and intra aortic balloon pump.

11 persons held for ivory trade

Rourkela, May 23: Forest personnel here seized two pieces of ivory and nabbed 11 persons in this connection during a joint operation with police, Thursday.

The Forest personnel with the help of Bargaon police initially arrested seven persons - Rameshwar Nayak (51), a resident of Bargaon, Biraja Munda

During the operation two pieces of ivory weighing around 3 kg each were recovered and seized.

The accused were brought to the Banki forest range office for interrogation where they admitted their involvement in the illegal trade. During interrogation, they revealed that Jasobant Patra alias Susant (58) of Keonjhar and Bidyadhara Patra (48) of Karanjia in Mayurbhanj district were also involved in this illegal activity.

Following the confession, the duo was also nabbed and taken for interrogation. All the above mentioned persons were involved in the illegal trade of ivory smuggling. They have been booked under Sections 9, 39, 44, and 49 B of Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972. A case (15/2024) has been registered in this connection at the Banki forest range office.

Later, the accused persons were produced in the SDJM court at Bonai.

The accused persons will face jail terms ranging from a minimum of three to seven years and penalties up to Rs 1 lakh when convicted. Rourkela DFO Jasobant Sethi confirmed that further inquiry was going on to ascertain where the ivory was sourced from.

CHANGE FOR CLIMATE



A change in the paradigm of political power is essential for sustainable solutions for humanity's existential problem of climate change

investors to adopt. Nature's hydrological infrastructure has been destroyed with concrete and steel infrastructure: hills with natural runoffs flattened and water channels and lakes covered to level land for urban development and highways; and big dams constructed for "scientifically" managing water storage and flow which have large and unintended consequences for environmental sustainability.

Thirdly, the world needs local system solutions cooperatively developed and implemented by communities to solve the global climate problem. Environmental problems are interlinked with livelihood and economic problems everywhere. However, these problems take different shapes in different places. Therefore, "one size-fits all" climate solutions will not be applicable everywhere. Solutions must be congruent with local realities, and local communities must resolve the give-and-take amongst themselves that systemic solutions always require.

Fourthly, those who produce wealth by their work must accumulate financial wealth themselves and not have to pass it to external investors. Wealth has been flowing upwards in the last few decades increasing inequalities.

A change in the paradigm of political power is essential for sustainable solutions for humanity's existential problem of climate change. Climate solutions which may be technologically exciting and investor enriching will not change the paradigm of power. People at the bottom of the pyramid must accumulate more wealth and power. Cooperative forms of economic enterprises, in which local producers are also the owners, are required to ensure that wealth circulates locally and is reinvested for the community's gain.

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Global climate change is running ahead of solutions to mitigate it. Climate scientists are fixated on reducing carbon emissions to prevent further densification of the atmosphere's carbon layer which is causing global warming. National governments have met 28 times since they first met in Berlin in 1995, most recently in the COP28 in Dubai in 2023. Every time they meet, climate scientists raise further alarms. Solutions are not keeping pace.

Why? Because modern climate science is an incomplete science. Climate scientists are overly focused on the physical and chemical system in which they want to improve the circulation of energy and materials. Whereas changes must be made simultaneously in the economic and political system to increase the circulation of wealth and power which are presently concentrated with the richest countries and the richest people.

The physics and chemistry of climate change is driven by Einstein's formula, $E=mc^2$. Energy and materials in different forms can be converted into each other. Overall, the material and energy content of any closed system is in balance. In the last century, economic productivity and growth, and improvement of living standards, have become increasingly dependent on the use of carbon and hydrocarbon sources of energy which take eons to renew. Therefore, other sources of energy must be found and ways of reducing hydrocarbon use.

Changes in lifestyles and production systems are essential to reduce carbon emissions. Also, substitution of non-renewable with renewable energy, especially solar which brings new energy into the Earth's system every day. Hydro and wind energy, which do not require any material to be converted into energy—only conversion of energy in one form to another—do not deplete the planet's material resources. Nuclear energy, which derives energy from material, has great risks associated with disposal of toxic

wastes. Hydrocarbon energy makes the atmosphere toxic; nuclear energy may make the ground toxic for centuries.

Physicists are not concerned with the distribution of wealth and power in social systems. Changes in forms of energy used in products and production systems require changes in economic structures. There will be winners and losers amongst industries and amongst nations too. The largest and most profitable industries, who are the greatest beneficiaries of the present paradigm, have the greatest political power. Resistance from countries, like the US, whose citizens are the most dependent on hydrocarbon dependent lifestyles, and who also have the largest industries dependent on the production and use of hydrocarbons, resist change in the paradigm the most.

Within countries, the richest people, who have the most energy dependent lifestyles, and have the largest houses and cars and most appliances, and who travel the most by air for work and leisure, do not feel an urgency to live in harmony with Nature. They can afford to buy more gadgets to reduce pollution and keep their homes cooler. Those gadgets require energy to run and for their production too. Thus, rich people with higher per capita incomes exert more pressure per capita than the poor on the Earth and its atmosphere, which are common resources which should be shared equitably. With greater privatisation of all industries,

including banking and financial services, those who have more money call the tunes in public policy. More decision-making power in choosing technologies for climate change is with rich investors, who are least affected personally by climate change, and are more concerned with monetary returns on their investments. Products and solutions by the private sector for the poor require financial investors to extract profit from the bottom for returns on their investments. Thus, wealth continues to flow to the top of the pyramid. The rich get richer; inequalities in wealth and power increase; delaying further the discovery of equitable solutions for climate change.

The scientific paradigm of climate change has become too narrowly focused on carbon circulation, capping, and pricing. It must be broadened in at least four ways.

Firstly, it must be expanded even on the materials and energy side. The circulation of water in various forms on the planet must become more central in the climate model. Water is fundamental for all forms of life. Billions of people have been suffering and dying from scarcity of water and water pollution long before carbon became the overriding concern of climate science and policy in this century.

Secondly, scientists and technologists must understand the planet's natural systems much better before proposing solutions for governments and in-

THE SCIENTIFIC PARADIGM OF CLIMATE CHANGE HAS BECOME TOO NARROWLY FOCUSED ON CARBON CIRCULATION, CAPPING, AND PRICING

With limited resources to dedicate to the Indo-Pacific, Biden seems to hope that he can prevent a war over Taiwan through personal diplomacy with Chinese President Xi Jinping. Last month, in a telephone call with his Chinese counterpart, he stressed the importance of maintaining peace across the Taiwan Strait.

Biden seems to believe that a more conciliatory approach toward China can also forestall the emergence of a comprehensive Sino-Russian alliance. The "no-limits partnership" between China and Russia, reaffirmed during Russian President Vladimir Putin's recent visit to Beijing, is problematic enough; China already has undercut Western sanctions by providing an economic lifeline to Russia, in exchange for cheap energy and some of Russia's most advanced military technologies, including air-defence and early-warning systems. A full military alliance, with China supporting the Kremlin's war machine directly, would be America's worst geopolitical nightmare.

The problem for Biden is that appeasing China and strengthening the Quad—which Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi has derided as the "Indo-Pacific version of NATO"—are fundamentally incompatible. It might not be a coincidence that the Quad leaders have not met since Biden sent a series of cabinet officials to Beijing and met with Xi in California last November.

In fact, Biden has lately shifted his focus to less provocative initiatives like the "Squad," an emerging unofficial regional grouping involving Australia, Japan, and the Philippines—countries that already have mutual defense treaties with the US. But what good is an anti-China alliance without India? It is, after all, the only power that has truly locked horns with the People's Liberation Army this century: the tense military standoff along the disputed Himalayan border, triggered by China's stealthy territorial encroachments, has just entered its fifth year. Moreover, as the leading maritime power in the Indian Ocean, India must play a central role in checking China's westward naval march from its new citadel, the South China Sea.

The US has also been touting its AUKUS security partnership with Australia and the United Kingdom. But this grouping will not be able to play a meaningful role in Indo-Pacific security until Australia is equipped with nuclear-powered submarines, and that will not happen for another decade.

So far, Biden's overtures to China have yielded few positive results. On the contrary, Xi has lately intensified coercive pressure on Taiwan, and Chinese provocations in the South China Sea have been increasing. Unless the US changes its approach, it may well fail to deter China from attacking Taiwan or cementing a strategic axis with Russia, just as it failed to deter Russia from invading Ukraine.

To maintain security in the Indo-Pacific, there is no substitute for a strong Quad with a clear strategic mission. Rather than unraveling years of efforts to build a coherent and credible regional strategy, thereby enabling yet more Chinese expansionism, Biden and his fellow Quad leaders must get to work defining such a mission and then commit to pursuing it. Otherwise, the Quad risks becoming a kind of Potemkin grouping. The façade of an alliance will not fool China.

Potemkin Alliance

When four of the Indo-Pacific's leading democracies—Australia, India, Japan, and the United States—revived the long-dormant Quad in 2017, their objective was clear: to create a strategic bulwark against Chinese expansionism and reinforce a stable regional balance of power. But the coalition is now adrift, and the security risks this poses should not be underestimated.

The Quad's resurrection reflected a paradigm shift in US foreign policy. After decades of engagement with China, including aiding its economic rise, US policymakers—Democrats and Republicans alike—realised that America's biggest trade partner had become its biggest strategic adversary, bent on replacing it as global hegemon. As US President Joe Biden indicated in his 2022 National Security Strategy, China is "the only competitor with both the intent to reshape the international order and, increasingly, the economic, diplomatic, military, and technological power to advance that objective."

Biden, like his predecessor, Donald Trump, viewed the Quad as an essential instrument to uphold a "free and open Indo-Pacific"—a concept formulated by the late Japanese Prime Minister Abe Shinzō. So, Biden elevated Quad discussions from the level of foreign ministers—who had been meeting annually since 2019—to heads of state or government, initiating a flurry of leaders' summits in 2021-23. But it has been more than a year since the Quad leaders last met, and with the US focused on the upcoming presidential election, their next summit is unlikely to be held before 2025.

The reason for this drop-off is simple: America's priorities have changed. Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine—together with the hybrid war the West is waging in response, not to mention renewed conflict in the Middle East—has stymied US efforts to position the Indo-Pacific at the "heart" of its grand strategy. It is striking that the latest US foreign-assistance package provides \$60.8 billion for Ukraine but only \$8.1 billion for security in the Indo-Pacific, including Taiwan, on which China has set its sights.

Losing the fight, but winning the war

The concept of "losing the fight but winning the war" is not just a powerful strategic paradigm in military contexts. It finds relevance in various aspects of life, including business, sports, politics, and personal development, making it a concept of universal applicability. This strategy underscores the importance of long-term vision and the ability to endure short-term setbacks to achieve ultimate success.

In military history, this strategy is epitomised by numerous examples where tactical retreats and deliberate sacrifices have paved the way for strategic victories. One of the most renowned instances is the Battle of Marathon in 490 BCE, where the Greeks, under the command of Miltiades, initially appeared to be at a disadvantage against the numerically superior Persian forces. Another quintessential example of this strategy can be Amazon's growth trajectory. In its early years, Amazon consistently reported losses and reinvested its revenue into expanding infrastructure, developing technology, and entering new markets. Several critics questioned this approach, but Amazon's leadership focused on long-term goals under Jeff Bezos. This strategy paid off, as Amazon eventually dominated e-commerce, cloud computing, and other sectors, transforming it into one of the most influential companies globally.

Netflix's transition from DVD rentals to streaming is another case study of strategic sacrifice. When Netflix shifted its business model to streaming, it faced significant financial losses and customer backlash. However, this bold move positioned Netflix as a pioneer in the streaming industry, eventually leading to its current status as a leader in digital entertainment.

The automotive industry offers further insights into this strategy. Tesla, for instance, endured years of financial losses and production challenges as it focused on innovation and scaling its EV technology. Despite scepticism from industry experts and financial analysts, Tesla's commitment to its long-term vision of sustainable transportation has paid off. Today, Tesla is a market leader in the EV sector.

A critical aspect of this strategy is the willingness to invest in R&D even when it doesn't yield immediate returns. Pharmaceutical companies, for example, often allocate significant resources to R&D, understanding that the path to a groundbreaking drug is fraught with failures and financial losses.

Moreover, this strategy involves understanding and anticipating market trends and consumer behaviour. Companies that adapt to changing landscapes, even at the cost of short-term profitability, often emerge stronger. The "losing the fight but winning the war" strategy emphasises the importance of maintaining a long-term perspective and the courage to endure short-term setbacks. Whether in military history, business or personal endeavours, this approach highlights the value of strategic patience, resilience, and the ability to adapt to changing circumstances. Success often requires sacrificing immediate wins for the greater goal, demonstrating that true victory lies not in the battles we lose but in the wars we ultimately win.

Wheels of justice

Sir, The International Court of Justice (ICJ) recently issued a provisional ruling on the Israel-Hamas conflict in response to South Africa's claims that Israel is committing genocide in Gaza. The ICJ's measures, voted on largely in favour, mandate Israel to prevent acts that could amount to genocide, preserve evidence, and allow international observers access to Gaza. The court underscored Israel's obligations under the Genocide Convention, stressing the need to protect civilians and ensure humanitarian aid amidst ongoing hostilities. However, the enforcement of this ruling poses significant challenges as the ICJ lacks direct mechanisms to ensure compliance. Historically, Israel has ignored international rulings, such as the 2004 judgment against the separation wall in the West Bank. The ICJ's decision highlights the importance of political and diplomatic pressure in enforcing international law, with the UN Security Council (UNSC) playing a crucial role despite past interventions often being hindered by political dynamics, particularly the US' veto power supporting Israel. The ruling includes an obligation for Israel to report within one month on the measures taken to comply with the court's orders, allowing for continuous monitoring and potential international actions if Israel is non-compliant. The ICJ's decision is seen as a pivotal moment for reinforcing international norms and preventing further atrocities.

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Delhi labourers toil in 'red hot' conditions

New Delhi, May 23: Working on a highway project in one of India's hottest areas this summer, Banwari Singh handles iron bars that he says often turn "red hot".

Temperatures hit 47.8 degrees Celsius (118 degrees Fahrenheit) last Sunday, among the highest recorded in India this year, in Najafgarh, an area on the outskirts of New Delhi where Singh works.

"This is among the hottest it has been in this area," Singh, in checked trousers, a half-sleeved shirt, a bright orange safety vest and a hard-top hat, said.

"But we have no option. If we want to eat, we have to work whatever the conditions are," said the 40-year-old, resting near a pillar he is helping to build.

The northwest of India is experiencing an unusually hot summer and the national weather office has forecast three times the usual number of heatwave days this May. Experts say climate change adds fuel to the heat.

Work can resume after sun-down, he said. Sumit Goswami, 21, who had to take time off this week after a heat-related illness, said he has worked in hot conditions before.

"But this year it has become extreme," he said. "Still, we have to continue because we have to support the family."

With the peak power demand in Delhi making history - clocking in 8,000 Megawatts, the highest-ever figure - leaders of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) sought to turn it into a poll pitch, stating that since "there are no power outages in Delhi, the BJP wants to destroy the AAP."

Lantern Festival, also known as Glow Fest, is scheduled to be held Saturday at Morjim beach which is notified as a turtle nesting site. The festival, where people can participate in a lantern lighting ceremony, also features live music, dance performances and other activities.



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Deputy Conservator of Forest Prem Kumar, in a letter written to the secretary of the state environment department, has pointed out that the Goa forest department has a turtle hatch-

ery at the Morjim beach. "The entire stretch of the Morjim beach is a nesting site of Olive Ridley turtles," the letter reads.

Kumar said that organising the festival will be a violation of rules and regulation of the Goa Coastal

Zone Management Authority.

"In this regard, letters have already been issued from the office of the Range Forest officer, Marine range, Wildlife and Ecotourism (North), Goa to the Member Secretary, Goa Coastal Zone Management Authority and to the Police Inspector, Morjim," he said.

"Necessary intervention from your office is solicited under applicable rules and regulations to maintain the sanctity of the turtle hatchery and the nesting sites at Morjim beach," it added.

Flights diverted after lightning damages runway lights in Goa

"MIA took NOTAM (Notice to Airmen) up to 8 pm by which time the damaged lights were rectified to bring the airport operations to normalcy," he said.



During NOTAM, six flights were diverted to nearby destinations, the official said.

"Inconvenience caused to the passengers is sincerely regretted. Such natural calamities are beyond human control," he added.

Apart from the MIA, the coastal state has another airport at Dabolim in South Goa.

Unsold housing inventory dips by 57 per cent in NCR

Mumbai, May 23: The unsold home inventory in Delhi-NCR declined by a massive 57 per cent in the last five years, from nearly 2 lakh units in the first quarter of 2018-end to around 86,420 units by Q1 2024, a report showed Thursday.

Bangalore, Hyderabad and Chennai saw their collective unsold stock shrink by 11 per cent in the same period, according to Anarock Research.

In the last five years, Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR) and Pune saw their cumulative unsold stock reduce by 8 per cent. Meanwhile, Kolkata saw its unsold inventory decline by 41 per cent in the period

notably over the last two years. The city saw its housing stock almost quadruple in the last 5 years.

However, Bangalore saw unsold inventory decline by 50 per cent in this period, the report noted.

"NCR's upbeat performance also reflects renewed buyer confidence in the region," said Kumar. Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act 2016 (RERA), Goods and Services Tax (GST) and the intervention of Alternate Investment Funds (AIFs) like the 'SWAMIH' fund have played a major role in this sentiment revival.

Braving the Odds Triple amputee Tinkesh Kaushik conquers Everest base camp

Panaji, May 23: Braving physical disabilities, cold weather and bad health, 30-year-old triple amputee Tinkesh Kaushik from Goa never lost his grit and mental strength as he set out on a trek to the Mount Everest Base Camp.

While the first day of preparation for the trek was grueling, Kaushik promised to himself that he will do it and then nothing could stop him or shake his determination.

Overcoming all odds, he reached the Everest Base Camp, located 17,598 feet above sea level, after a week-long journey and hoisted the national

"I found trekking to be challenging, but I said to myself that I have to do it, and I did it because of my mental strength," Kaushik, who works as a fitness coach, said at a press conference here Wednesday.

Kaushik lost his both limbs below knees and a hand following an electrocution acci-

The amputee said he initially thought the trek would be easy as he is a fitness coach but realised the challenges when he started preparing for it.

Kaushik said as he started work on the ground, it was very painful for him on the first day because of his level of amputation and prosthetic limbs.

He started the journey May 4 from Nepal, saying it was really challenging for him being a triple amputee, but he could finish the trek because of his

mental strength. "I faced challenges a couple of times, my health was bad because of mountain sickness and my oxygen level dropped. I suffered from headache and vomiting, but I had the strong desire to complete the mission because I wanted to set an example for people with disabilities that if you have strong mental health, then you can certainly achieve it," he said.

Kaushik said he felt proud that he went from Goa and did it. "When I hoisted the flag at the Everest Base Camp, it was a really proud and emotional moment for me," he said. Kaushik has made Goa proud with his achievements, D'Souza said.



121 candidates in LS polls illiterate: ADR

New Delhi, May 23: About 121 candidates contesting in the Lok Sabha elections have declared themselves illiterate, and 359 have stated that they have studied up to Class V, according to an analysis of the reports shared by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR).
The data shows that 647 candidates have reported their education level up to the Class VIII. About 1,303 candidates have declared themselves as having passed Class XII and 1,502 candidates have a graduate degree. There are 198 candidates with a doctorate, according to the analysis.
ADR has analysed the educational qualifications of 8,337 out of 8,360 candidates contesting the Lok Sabha elections.
In the first phase, 639 candidates reported their educational qualifications as being between

the 5th and 12th grades, while 836 candidates have qualifications of graduate level or higher. Additionally, 36 candidates declared themselves as just literate, 26 as illiterate, and four did not disclose their educational qualifications.
During the second phase, 533 candidates declared their education levels as between the 5th and 12th grades, while 574 candidates reported being graduates or higher. About 37 candidates declared themselves as just literate, eight as illiterate, and three did not provide their educational qualifications.
In the third phase, 639 candidates reported their educational qualifications as being between the 5th and 12th grades, while 591 candidates declared themselves as graduates or higher. Additionally, 56 are just literate, and 19 are illiterate. Three candidates did not disclose their educational qualifications.

For the fourth phase, 644 candidates declared their education levels as between the 5th and 12th grades, while 944 reported being graduates or higher. Thirty candidates declared themselves as just literate, and 26 were illiterate.
In the fifth phase, 293 candidates reported their educational qualifications as being between the 5th and 12th grades, while 349 declared themselves graduates or with higher degrees. Around 20 candidates are just literate, and five are illiterate. Two candidates did not disclose their educational qualifications.
In the sixth phase, 332 candidates declared their educational qualifications as between the 5th and 12th grades, while 487 reported being graduates or higher. There are 22 diploma holders, 12 candidates who are just literate, and 13 who are illiterate.
In the seventh phase, 402 candidates reported their educational qualifications as being between the 5th and 12th grades, while 430 declared themselves as graduates or higher. There are 20 diploma holders, 26 candidates who are just literate, and 24 who are illiterate. Two candidates did not disclose their educational qualifications.
The elections are being conducted in seven phases from April 19 to June 1, with the vote counting scheduled for June 4. With five phases being completed, the sixth and seventh phases are set for May 25 and June 1, respectively.

Yogi: Bulldozers to be used against mafia

Bhubaneswar, May 23: Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister and senior BJP leader Yogi Adityanath Thursday said if the 'double engine' government is formed in Odisha, bulldozers will be used against the mafia.
During the last 20-25 years, the "officer raj" has "pushed Odisha to 50 years back", he claimed, alleging that the ruling BJD is playing politics with the future of youths in the state.
Addressing an election rally in Chilika Assembly constituency under Puri Lok Sabha seat, Yogi said, "Give us strength to form a double engine government in Odisha so that we can clear the path by running bulldozers on 'land, sand, forest and cattle' mafia in the state, as we did in Uttar Pradesh."
The term "double engine" is used by BJP leaders to refer to the party being in power at the Centre as well as in a state.
"The BJD government is surrounded by bureaucracy and when the bureaucracy surrounds any government, it gives birth to dictatorship. Then corruption rises, the poor are exploited and the administration collapses," he alleged.
In an apparent reference to Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik's aide and bureaucrat-turned-BJD leader Kartik



Pandian, Adityanath said, "An officer should not be given so much freedom that he starts controlling the government. Only elected public representatives should govern the state, which is the basis of a healthy democracy."
He claimed that the BJD's 'misrule' is because "Naveen babu has been surrounded by bureaucracy and he has been misled by bureaucrats."
"Power generated from Odisha is being provided at a cheaper price to other states. What kind of misrule is this?" he asked.
The BJP leader also accused the BJD government of "destroying" the Odia culture and said the Narendra Modi government has brought Ram Lalla to his birthplace in Ayodhya after 500 years.
"In the last 10 years, Modi has lifted more people from poverty than the population of Pakistan. Modi is providing free healthcare services up to ₹5 lakh every year to 60 crore people. But, in Odisha, a Tamil babu has not allowed the scheme to be implemented," Yogi said at another rally held in Mahanga Assembly constituency under the Kendrapara Lok Sabha seat. His allusion was to Pandian was born in Tamil Nadu, studied in Delhi and started his career as a Punjab cadre IAS officer, but shifted to Odisha cadre after marrying an Odia.
Adityanath appealed to voters to help the BJP form a "double-engine" government in Odisha, claiming that his state Uttar Pradesh has become a model for good governance.

MPs, MLAs unable to meet CM: Nadda

The dialects and languages used in these songs – from Hindi and Bhojpuri to Haryanvi and Punjabi – are reflective of the linguistic and cultural diversities of the national capital, inhabited by people from all parts of the country.
"Phir se Modiji ki sarkar dekhnai chahusu" (want to see a Modi government once again) is one such Haryanvi song renting the air at the rallies of BJP candidates.
Underlining the progress

achieved under the Modi government, BJP bigwigs have got composed several songs that also talk about their roots and their family background.
Bansuri Swaraj, BJP's New Delhi candidate and daughter of late party stalwart Sushma Swaraj, has also got a song composed that pays tributes to her mother and launches a fervent appeal to voters.
The song starts with "Modiji ko jeetana hai, Bansuriji ko lana hai (we have to make Modiji win, we have to bring in Bansuriji)."
The lyrics refers to Bansuri as her Sushma Swaraj's shadow. "Sushmaji ki parchhai ko aage le kar jana hai."
The Congress has fielded Kanhaiya Kumar from North East Delhi Lok Sabha seat, where he is up against BJP candidate

Manoj Tiwari.
The battle between Tiwari – also a Bhojpuri actor and singer – and Kumar is also being fought, it seems, through musical instruments. The two leaders have tweaked Bollywood songs to attract voters' attention.
Dham Dharam Dharaiya Re dekhao aaya Kanhaiya re," is Kanhaiya Kumar's campaign song. It bor-

rows its music from Bollywood number "Omkara Re Omkara" from the movie 'Omkara'. The lyrics further narrate Kumar's journey from Purvanchal to now knocking on the doors of Parliament. "Yaar hamara Sansad ki dahaleje pe dastak deta bhaarat".
Manoj Tiwari has released a number of songs, including in Bhojpuri, seeking people's support. "Ek bar phir se Manoj bhैया ke apnai liha ho, Modiji ko jeetaye diya ho (Please embrace your brother Manoj once again, make Modiji victorious once again)."
The BJP has also released several party songs – like "Tabhi sab Modi ko chunte hain (That's why all elect Modi)" – to take on the INDIA bloc which has emphasised unity among its con-

Delhi goes to polls May 25 and the silent period begins this evening.

Additionally, Kejriwal Wednesday also shared on his X account a new campaign song sung by Anmol Gagan Maan.

12 killed, 25 hurt in Israel attack

Jerusalem: The Israeli military said Thursday it has completed a two-day operation in the occupied West Bank that the Palestinian Health Ministry says killed 12 Palestinians and wounded 25. Rippling tensions from the Israel-Hamas war were also felt in the Red Sea, where a missile splashed down in the water near the crucial Bab el-Mandeb Strait Thursday, but caused no damage, and in Lebanon, where state-run National News Agency says an Israeli drone strike killed one person and wounded three school students who were passing nearby in a bus.

9 killed as wind blows away stage

San Pedro Garza Garcia: A strong gust of wind toppled the stage at a campaign rally Wednesday evening in the northern Mexican state of Nuevo Leon, killing at least nine people — including a child — and injuring 63, the state's governor said. The collapse occurred during an event attended by presidential long-shot candidate Jorge Álvarez Máynez, who ran to escape. Mexican President Andrés Manuel López Obrador said he "sends a hug to family members, friends of the victims and political supporters".

1st trilateral talks in Seoul next week

Seoul: Media here reported Thursday that leaders of South Korea, China and Japan will meet next week here for their first trilateral talks since 2019. Yonhap news agency reported Thursday that the trilateral summit among South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol, Chinese Premier Li Qiang and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida will take place in Seoul Monday. Other South Korean media have carried similar reports citing South Korea's presidential office. Since their inaugural stand-alone trilateral summit in 2008, the three Asian countries were supposed to hold such a meeting among their leaders each year.

Norway tightens entry of Russians

Copenhagen: Norway Thursday said it will further tighten its restrictions on the entry of people from Russia, saying those with tourist visas issued by Norway before regulations were tightened in 2022 or issued by another European country will be barred from entering the Scandinavian country as of next week. Justice Minister Emilie Enger Mehl said the tightening was a response to "Russia's illegal war of aggression against Ukraine."

Thousands of journos forced to flee: UN

UN investigator flags repression, threats and conflict behind sorrows of mediapersons

United Nations, May 23: Thousands of journalists have fled their home countries in recent years to escape political repression, save their lives and escape conflict — but in exile they are often vulnerable to physical, digital and legal threats, a UN investigator said Wednesday.

Irene Khan said in a report to the UN General Assembly that the number of journalists in exile has increased as the space for independent and critical media has been "shrinking in democratic countries where authoritarian trends are gaining ground".

Today, she said, free, independent and diverse media supporting democracy and holding the powerful to account are either absent or severely constrained in over a third of the world's nations, where more than two-thirds of the global population lives.

Nepali woman now fastest to ascent Mount Everest



Kathmandu, May 23: Nepali climber Phunjo Lama Thursday reached Everest's summit in 14 hours and 31 minutes, smashing the record for the world's fastest ascent of the mountain by a woman.

Climbers usually take days to reach the top of the 8,849-metre (29,000-foot) mountain, spending nights on its different camps to rest and acclimatise.

But Lama, who is in her thirties, shaved more than 11 hours off the previous best that had stood since 2021. It means she has reclaimed her own record.

"She started (from the base camp) at 15:52 May 22, summited 6:23 am May 23," Khim Lal Gautam, chief of the tourism's department field office at the base camp, told AFP.

Earlier this month, when Lama was still at Everest's base camp, she said in a post on Facebook that she was "100 percent sure" she would reach the top of "the Mother Goddess".

In 2018, Lama clinched the record for the fastest ascent by a woman by climbing Everest in 39 hours and six minutes.

That record was broken in 2021 by Ada Tsang Yin-hung from Hong Kong, who conquered the mountain in 25 hours and 50 minutes.

Nepali climber Lhakpa Gelu Sherpa holds the record for the fastest-ever ascent of Everest, reaching the summit in 10 hours and 56 minutes in 2003.

But Khan, a Bangladeshi lawyer who previously served as secretary general of Amnesty International, said exiled journalists often find themselves in precarious positions, facing threats against them and their families from their home countries without assured legal status or adequate support to continue working in their country of refuge.

"Fearing for their own safety or that of their families back home and struggling to survive financially and overcome the many challenges of living in a foreign country, many journalists eventually abandon their profession," she said.

Khan, whose mandate comes from the Geneva-based UN Human Rights Council, said there are international legal protections for journalists in exile who range from full-time

professional reporters to bloggers publishing on the internet and elsewhere. The problem is "the failure of states to respect their obligations under international law", she said.

Khan said there is no data on human rights violations committed by countries outside their borders. But there is anecdotal evidence including victims' testimony, scholarly research and the experience of civil society organizations suggesting that "a high prevalence" of such "transnational repression" targets exiled journalists and media outlets, she said.

Czech Constitutional Court rejects Indian national Nikhil Gupta's petition against US extradition in Pannun assassination attempt

London, May 23: The Czech Constitutional Court has rejected a petition by Indian national Nikhil Gupta, detained in a prison in Prague, against his extradition to the US to face murder-for-hire charges in an alleged assassination attempt on a Khalistani extremist on American soil.

Gupta, 52, was charged by US federal prosecutors in an indictment unsealed in November last year with working with an Indian government employee in the foiled plot to kill Khalistani separatist Gurbatwant Singh Pannun, who holds dual American and Canadian citizenships, in the US.

Gupta was arrested in Prague, the Czech Republic June 30, 2023, and is being held there currently. The US government is seeking his extradition to America.

The Czech Constitutional Court heard a petition by Gupta against the extradition.



Gupta was charged by US federal prosecutors in an indictment unsealed in November last year

"The Constitutional Court did not find any circumstance for which declaring extradition admissible would lead to a violation of any of the constitutionally guaranteed fundamental rights and freedoms," the court said in a statement Wednesday.

The court said it ruled that lower courts had given due consideration to aspects that may prevent extradition. It also rejected arguments that the case was political.

"For the complainant, this brings the proceedings before the Czech courts to an end."

The Constitutional Court said it has now confirmed the decision of the general courts on the admissibility of extradition, upholding the Municipal Court and The High Court's order.

The court also upheld the local court's decision to reject Gupta's request for release from pre-trial detention and did not accept compensation for detention in the form of a monetary guarantee, or in the form of a ban on travel abroad.

Russia arrests another military official

Moscow, May 23: A deputy chief of the Russian military general staff has been arrested on charges of large-scale bribery, Russian news reports said Thursday, the latest in a series of bribery arrests of high-ranking military officials.

The arrest of Lt Gen Vadim Shamarin followed the arrest this week of Maj Gen Ivan Popov, a former top commander in Russia's offensive in Ukraine, also on bribery charges.

In April, Deputy Defence Minister Timur Ivanov was arrested for bribery. Ivanov was a close associate of Sergei Shoigu, whom President Vladimir Putin dismissed as defense minister soon after Putin's inauguration to a new term in May.



Lt Gen Yury Kuznetsov, head of the defence ministry's personnel directorate, was arrested on bribery charges two days after Shoigu was replaced.

Shamarin is also the head of the defence ministry's main communications directorate. He is being held in custody for two months, Russian news agencies cited a military garrison court as saying, but other details of the case were not reported.

Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said the wave of arrests of defence officials did not indicate a campaign against the military.

A Czech high court in January ruled Gupta can be extradited to the US.

The Indian Ministry of External Affairs, however, dismissed the report, saying it makes "unwarranted and unsubstantiated imputations" to claim that Indian agents were involved in the plot to kill Pannun.

India has publicly said a high-level inquiry is looking into the evidence shared by the US in the alleged plot to kill Pannun.

'Punishment' drills

Beijing: A furious China launched "punishment" drills around Taiwan Thursday in what it said was a response to "separatist acts", sending up heavily armed warplanes and staging mock attacks as state media denounced newly inaugurated President Lai Ching-te. The exercises, in the Taiwan Strait and around groups of Taiwan-controlled islands beside the Chinese coast, come just three days after Lai took office, a man Beijing detests as a "separatist". China, which views democratically governed Taiwan as its own territory, denounced Lai's inauguration speech Monday, in which he urged it to stop its threats, saying the two sides of the strait were "not subordinate to each other". On Tuesday, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi called Lai "disgraceful". Lai has repeatedly offered talks with China but has been rebuffed. He says only Taiwan's people can decide their future, and rejects Beijing's sovereignty claims. The drills are being held in the Taiwan Strait, the north, south and east of Taiwan, as well as areas around the Taiwan-controlled islands of Kinmen, Matsu, Wugu and Dongyin, the command said in a statement, the first time China's exercises have included navy rounds these islands. Taiwan's defence ministry said 15 Chinese aery ships, 16 coast guard and 33 aircraft were involved, but no live fire drills were held in any areas close to Taiwan.

Accomplice of four Sri Lankans arrested in Gujarat nabbed

Colombo, May 23: Sri Lanka police Thursday said they have nabbed an accomplice of four of its citizens arrested in India who was on an alleged mission to carry out terror activities there at the behest of the banned Islamic State.

The accomplice, who is the son of a renowned drug lord, was arrested at the central Colombo ward of Maligawatta, police said and added that he is being continuously quizzed at the terrorist investigation division of the police.

Earlier Wednesday, a senior Deputy Inspector General was appointed to head a team to investigate the four Sri Lankan citizens arrested Sunday by the Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) in India after acting on a tip-off at the Sardar Vallabhai Patel airport in Ahmedabad.

The investigators said the four men had taken an Indigo flight out of Colombo to Chennai May 19.

Indian police said the men travelled to India to carry out terror activities at the behest of the banned terror outfit Islamic State (IS) and are members of IS radicalised by a leader from Sri Lanka, who is living in Pakistan.

The appointed DIG has the crime investigation division and the terrorism investigation division of the police under his command and would coordinate with the intelligence agencies in the probe.

The accused, Mohammad Nusrat (35), Mohammad Faarukh (35), Mohammad Nafran (27) and Mohammad Rasdeen (43), informed investigators that they were earlier associated with the banned Sri Lankan radical militant outfit, National Thowheeth Jamath (NJT), and joined IS after getting in touch with Pakistani handler Abu Bakr Al Bagdadi, Gujarat Director General of Police Vikas Sahay had said.

The men were paid Rs 4 lakh in Sri Lankan currency to carry out the activities, he had said.

World Water Forum calls for integrated management

Bali, May 23: Indonesian President Joko "Jokowi" Widodo officially opened the World Water Forum in Bali Tuesday, just as his country mourned dozens of victims of a "cold lava" mudslide from the Mount Merapi volcano, triggered by heavy rainfall.

Hundreds of people have been killed by historic floods in Brazil and East Africa and by flash floods in Afghanistan. Central America and southern Africa face extreme drought.

"These disasters once again show the vulnerability of society to the cascading impact of water-related hazards: either in the form of too much or too little," World Meteorological Organization (WMO) Secretary-General Celeste Saulo said in a statement to the conference. "Better forecasts and risk management are pivotal to the success of Early Warnings for All."

Asia is the region worst affected by weather, climate and



water-related disasters. 80 percent of these were due to flood and storm events in 2023. There were more than 2,000 fatalities and nine million people directly affected.

At the same time, 3.6 billion people globally face inadequate access to water at least a month per year and this is expected to increase to more than 5 billion by 2050.

A ministerial declaration issued an urgent call for more efficient and integrated water resources management; more financing of climate change

adaptation and biodiversity and ecosystem loss; and accelerated progress towards the Sustainable Development Goal 6 on safe and affordable drinking water and sanitation for all.

The World Water Forum is held every three years. The theme this year is Water for Shared Prosperity. It brings together tens of thousands of participants from international institutions, academia, civil society and the private sector.

No Surprises by Floods: Ensuring communities are not caught off guard by floods.

Drought Preparedness: Preparing everyone for drought conditions. **Support for Food Security:** Using

hydroclimate and meteorological data to bolster food security. High-Quality Data: Providing robust data to support scientific research.

Scientific Basis for Hydrology: Ensuring that operational hydrology is grounded in solid science.

Knowledge of Water Resources: Thoroughly understanding global water resources.

Sustainable Development: Supporting sustainable development with reliable hydrological information.

Water Quality: Ensuring comprehensive knowledge of water quality.

Mumbai: A 32-year-old man was killed after a minor in Mumbai's Mazgaon area allegedly hit him with his motorcycle Thursday morning. The victim has been identified as Irfan Nawab Ali Shaikh who got hit by a bike which was being driven by a minor aged 15. According to police, the victim was badly injured and was died during the treatment. Mumbai Police said that the minor has been sent to the juvenile home. Police has detained the minor along with his father and a case has been registered under section 304(2) of IPC and section 3,4 of Motor Vehicle Act.

Air India gives salary increments to staff

New Delhi: Air India Thursday announced annual salary increments for its staff, and also introduced an annual target performance bonus for pilots, according to sources. This is the first appraisal process after Tata Group took over the loss-making airline a little over two years ago. The quantum of monthly hike varies from ₹5,000 to ₹15,000 for pilots, depending on their experience and position. The annual target performance bonus for pilots can be up to ₹1.80 lakh, the sources said.

New Delhi, May 23: Campaigning ended Thursday for the penultimate phase of Lok Sabha elections in 58 constituencies across six states and two Union territories, including all the seven seats in Delhi. Till now, voting has been completed in 25 states and Union territories and 428 constituencies out of 543. The last phase of polling is scheduled on June 1 and counting of votes will be taken up June 4.

Among the key contestants are Dharmendra Pradhan (BJP) from Sambalpur (Odisha), Manoj Tiwari (BJP) and Kanhaiya Kumar (Congress) from North East Delhi, Maneka Gandhi (BJP) from Sultanpur (Uttar Pradesh),

Mehbooba Mufti (PDP) from Anantnag-Rajouri (Jammu & Kashmir), Abhijit Gangopadhyay (BJP) from Tamluk (West Bengal), and BJP's Manohar Lal Khattar (Karnal, Haryana), Naveen Jindal (Kurukshetra) and Rao Inderjit Singh (Gurgaon).

With campaigning reaching fever pitch, the Election commission took exception to utterances of star campaigners and Wednesday directed the leaders of the ruling BJP to refrain from making speeches on religious and communal lines, and Opposition Congress from potentially divisive statements on the socioeconomic composition of the armed forces.

On the last day of campaigning, Prime Minister Narendra

Modi held a rally each in Punjab and Haryana.

The Congress's poll campaign was led by its chief Mallikarjun Kharge, senior leader Rahul Gandhi and Sachin Pilot among others. Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, who was released on interim bail till June 1, held roadshows in support of Congress' candidates while Pilot campaigned for AAP's South Delhi candidate Sahi Ram Pahalwan.

AAP's poll campaign got a shot in the arm with the release of Kejriwal from Tihar. While Kejriwal was in jail, his wife Sunita Kejriwal held roadshows for party candidates and senior party leaders Atishi, Saurabh Bharadwaj, Sanjay Singh, Gopal Rai held various jansabhas and outreach activities under the party's 'Jail Ka Jawab Vote Se' campaign.

Following his release, Kejriwal and Bhagwant Mann led roadshows in some constituencies while Sunita also joined her husband for poll meetings.

The alleged assault on AAP MP Swati Maliwal at Kejriwal's official residence has also become an poll issue with the BJP hitting out at the party for being "anti-women."

Delhi: Several colleges receive bomb threats

New Delhi, May 23: Over a dozen colleges including Delhi University's prestigious Lady Sri Ram College, Hansraj College and Ramjas College received bomb threats Thursday but nothing suspicious was found after thorough searches, officials said, a day after a similar e-mail sent alarm bells ringing in the North Block.

A Delhi Fire Service (DFS) official said they first received a call at 4.38 pm about the bomb threat at the LSR College and two fire tenders were pressed into service. Later, other colleges also made the call to authorities.

The local police, a bomb disposal squad, a bomb detection team arrived at the LSR College along with a dog squad and conducted searches but nothing suspicious was found, the official said. LSR Principal Suman Sharma told PTI the entire campus has been sanitised. "We received the bomb threat e-mail in the afternoon today. Immediately, the police were informed and they sent a bomb (disposal) squad. The search operation went on for two-three hours and the entire campus has been sanitised," Sharma said.

A police officer said along with LSR over a dozen of other colleges in Delhi received a similar kind of threat as the sender - rizer111rizer@beebble.com - marked them in the CC of the e-mail with subject line "Bomb in the University".

The officer said the "beebble.com" is a Europe-based mailing service company, which was earlier used in sending similar kind of threats to schools and hospitals in Delhi and other parts of country.

Barmer sizzles at 48.8 degrees Celsius

New Delhi: Large parts of India sweltered under a heat wave for the seventh day on the trot Thursday, with the mercury soaring to 48.8 degrees Celsius in Rajasthan's Barmer, the highest temperature recorded in the country this year so far. Official data showed that at least 16 places in Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, and Madhya Pradesh recorded maximum temperatures of 45 degrees Celsius or above Thursday.

B'lore: Three hotels receive bomb threats

Bangalore: As many as three five-star hotels in the city received bomb threat, police sources said Thursday. The hotels reportedly received the threat via email, leading to exhaustive search operations. It later turned out to be a hoax, they said. The threat comes against the backdrop of a bomb blast in Rameshwaram Cafe in the city March 1.

Car crash: Cops question accused's grandfather

Pune: Pune Police Thursday questioned the grandfather of a 17-year-old boy who allegedly crashed his high-end car into a motorbike killing two persons earlier this week. The accused teenager's friend and a driver who were accompanying him in the car during Sunday's fatal accident in Kalyani Nagar area here were also questioned by the police. The teenager was remanded to the observation home by the Juvenile Justice Board (JJB) Wednesday. His grandfather was summoned by the police Thursday in connection with an offence registered against the juvenile's father and staff members and the owner of two liquor-serving establishments in Mundhwa area, a crime branch official said.

BJP holds protest over killing of woman party worker

Kolkata: Barely two days ahead of the parliamentary polls, a woman BJP worker was killed in Nandigram in West Bengal's Purba Medinipur district, triggering large-scale protests by the saffron party activists there Thursday, police said. The region, which falls under the Tamluk Lok Sabha seat and is considered to be the backyard of Bengal's Leader of Opposition Suvendu Adhikari, is scheduled to vote May 25 in the sixth phase of the elections. BJP workers burnt tyres, blocked roads and pulled down shutters of shops in Nandigram, alleging that the TMC-backed criminals were involved in the killing of Rathibala Arhi (38), a saffron party worker in Sonachura village.

Bangalore/New Delhi, May 23: Trouble mounted Thursday for Prajwal Revanna, facing allegations of sexually abusing several women, with Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah writing to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for the second time to cancel the diplomatic passport of the suspended JD (S) MP, and the MEA saying it was processing the request for revocation of his passport.

Meanwhile, former Prime Minister and Prajwal's grandfather Deve Gowda issued a "stern warning", asking his grandson to come home and face the matter legally, lest he should face his anger and that of the family members leading to his isolation.

Reacting to the Karnataka Chief Minister's second missive to the Prime Minister, Union minister Pralhad Joshi said there is a process to cancel the diplomatic passport of Prajwal, and asserted the Centre is ready to cooperate in bringing him back to the country.



In New Delhi, official sources said the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has received a letter from the Karnataka government seeking revocation of Revanna's diplomatic passport. "The MEA has received a letter from the Karnataka government for cancellation of diplomatic passport in respect of MP Prajwal Revanna. This is being processed," a source said.



The MEA's explanation came in the wake of Siddaramaiah's second missive to PM Modi on the issue, urging him to take "prompt and necessary" actions to cancel Prajwal's diplomatic passport. In his letter to Modi, the chief minister said it was "shameful that Prajwal, a Member of Parliament from Hassan con-

stituency, who is also contesting for re-election in the present general elections, and who is the grandson of a former Prime Minister, fled the country, the 27th of April, 2024 to Germany using his diplomatic passport...shortly after news of his heinous actions emerged and just a few hours before the first FIR was filed against him."

The Chief Minister, who had written to the PM on May 1 on the subject, further said the Karnataka government has taken prompt action to meet the ends of justice by setting up a special team to probe the matter.

On his part, Deve Gowda said: "At this juncture, I can do only one thing; I can issue a stern warning to Prajwal and ask him to return from wherever he is and surrender before the police. He should subject himself to the legal process." The 92-year-old veteran in a statement in Bengaluru also made it clear it was not an appeal but a warning.

Indian students shun UK varsities for Master's courses

London, May 23: Indian students choosing the UK as their higher education destination have started registering a fall, with over 21,000 fewer Master's degree applicants than the previous year being registered in official statistics released in London Thursday. While the figures will come as a welcome sign for British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak who has made curbing migration one of his key planks for a general election now set for July 4, the student visa figures will worry universities who rely on overseas student fees.

"There were 116,455 sponsored study visa grants to main applicants that are Indian nationals in the year ending March 2024, (26 per cent of the

total), 21,717 fewer than the previous year," the Home Office analysis reads.

"The majority (94,149, or 81 per cent) of Indian students come to the UK to study at Master's level, and the recent decrease in Indian students was driven by 21,800 fewer Indian nationals coming to study at Master's level," it notes. The fall in numbers follows a visa clampdown on students being able to bring their family dependents, spouses or children, from earlier this year.

It comes at a time when university vice-chancellors and diaspora groups are lobbying the government not to safeguard the country's post-study work visa offer under the Graduate Route scheme.

In the year to March 2024, Indian nationals represented



the largest group of students granted visas on this route (64,372), representing almost half (46 per cent) of the grants.

This reaffirms previous statistics around this scheme, which offers a chance to gain work experience at the end of a degree and is seen as crucial to Indians choosing their higher education destination.

Thursday's data also revealed data under the new India Young Professionals Scheme, which

for long-term immigration flows into the UK in the year ending December 2023 were Indian (250,000), Nigerian (141,000), Chinese (90,000), Pakistani (83,000) and Zimbabwean (36,000). Overall, the ONS data estimates about 1.22 million people came to the UK in 2023 and around 532,000 have left.

The ONS said: "Long-term net migration (the number of people immigrating minus the number emigrating) was provisionally estimated to be 685,000 in the year ending (YE) December 2023, compared with our updated estimate of 764,000 for the YE December 2022; while it is too early to say if this is the start of a new downward trend, emigration increased in 2023, while new Home Office data show visa applications have fallen in recent months."

15 dead in rain-related incidents in Tamil Nadu

Chennai: At least 15 people have died in Tamil Nadu between May 16 and May 22 in rain-related incidents, an official said Thursday. In a statement, the Tamil Nadu State Revenue and Disaster Management department said that three persons died in Krishnagiri, Salem and Cuddalore districts in the last 24 hours due to thunder, lightning and wall collapse. Also, 13 cattle deaths were reported while 40 houses and huts were damaged in various parts of the state. The statement mentioned that 4,385 hectares of crops have submerged in rain water. Tamil Nadu received an average of 1.58 cm of rain in the last 24 hours with Nilgiris recording the maximum rainfall of 6.15 cm. The weather department has issued an advisory to fishermen not to venture into the sea. An official said that 10 SDRF teams of 296 members have been stationed in Kanniyakumari, Coimbatore, Tirunelveli and Nilgiris districts. Tourists have been advised to take precautions and to avoid travelling till May 24 in the state.

New Delhi: Diversified entity ITC Ltd Thursday reported a marginal decline in consolidated net profit at ₹5,190.71 crore for the fourth quarter ended March 31, 2024 as consumption demand remained subdued. The company had logged a net profit of ₹5,242.59 crore in the same period of the previous fiscal, ITC said. Revenue from operations in the quarter was at ₹19,446.49 crore as against ₹19,058.29 crore in the year-ago period, up 2 per cent. Gross revenue from the sale of products stood at ₹19,291.40 crore, up 2.61 per cent YoY.

IndiGo profit jumps

New Delhi: InterGlobe Aviation, the parent of the country's largest airline IndiGo, Thursday reported more than doubling of profit after tax to ₹1,894.8 crore in the three months ended March 2024. The airline had a profit after tax of ₹919.2 crore in the year-ago period. In the fourth quarter of the last financial year, total income jumped to ₹18,505.1 crore from ₹14,600.1 crore.

Male, May 23: Notwithstanding the turbulence in their bilateral ties, the Maldives will soon launch India's RuPay service, which a senior minister has said "will bolster the Maldivian Rufiyaa."

RuPay, a product of the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), is the first of its global card payment network in India, with wide acceptance at ATMs, POS devices, and e-commerce websites across India.

Minister of Economic Development and Trade

Mohamed Saeed while announcing how both India and China have agreed to use local currency in bilateral trade, spoke about the upcoming launch of India's RuPay.

"The upcoming launch of India's RuPay service is anticipated to further bolster the Maldivian rufiyaa (MVR)," Saeed told state-run PSM News Wednesday. He also emphasised that "addressing the dollar issue and reinforcing the MVR is a top priority for the current administration."

However, there has been no announcement of any date for



the launch.

Last week, a news portal, CorporateMaldives.com, reported that Saeed conveyed that the card will be "formally utilised for transactions denominated in rupees within Maldivian territory."

"We are currently engaged in discussions with India to ex-

plore avenues for facilitating payments in rupees," the minister said.

An India-Maldives joint statement during the official visit of the then President of Maldives Ibrahim Mohamed Solih to India in August 2022 said: "The two leaders welcomed the ongoing work to operationalize the usage of RuPay Cards in Maldives and agreed to consider further measures to boost bilateral travel and tourism and economic inter-linkages."

Ever since the pro-China President Mohamed Muizzu assumed power last November, the relations between the Maldives and India have soured. The repatriation of 80 plus Indian military personnel manning three aviation platforms earlier this month from the archipelago nation at his insistence has left a bitter note on bilateral ties.

3 EV makers could be blacklisted from all government schemes

New Delhi, May 23: Three electric vehicle makers, Hero Electric, Okinawa and Benling India, which failed to return the benefits wrongly claimed under the government's flagship FAME-II scheme, could be blacklisted from all central schemes, officials said.

In 2022, complaints were received by the Ministry of Heavy Industries regarding flouting of the FAME-II guidelines by various original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) registered under the scheme, alleging that they were selling electric vehicles in violation of the local sourcing requirements and engaged in rampant imports of vehicle parts.

The ministry investigated 13 companies, out of which six were found to be violating the Faster Adoption of Manufacturing of Electric Vehicles (FAME-II) norms, including Hero Electric, Okinawa Autotech, Benling India Energy and Technology, AMO Mobility, Greaves Electric Mobility, and Revolt Motors.

Out of these companies AMO Mobility, Greaves Electric Mobility and Revolt Motors returned the subsidy amount along with interest within a few months and got a clean chit from the government.

However, Hero Electric, Okinawa Autotech, and Benling India did not return the incentives and were consequently de-registered from the FAME-II scheme. "Hero Electric, Okinawa Autotech and Benling India were deregistered. After that, the next step is debarment from all schemes of the Ministry that has been done for Hero Electric and Benling India. Okinawa was not debarred because they were in court at the time. The next step is blacklisting from all schemes under the Government of India. That has not happened so far because it is a step-by-step process and the Ministry of Finance gives the approval for debarment from all the ministries' schemes/policies for any company," a senior official said.

SENSEX, NIFTY HIT ALL-TIME PEAKS WEEKS AHEAD OF POLL RESULTS

Mumbai, May 23: With nearly a fortnight left for the results of Lok Sabha polls, benchmark stock indices Sensex and Nifty zoomed more than 1.6 per cent to close at lifetime high levels Thursday.

Regaining the 75,000 level, the BSE SENSEX ended at an all-time peak of 75,418.04, up by 1,196.98 points or 1.61 per cent. During the day, it zoomed 1,278.85 points or 1.72 per cent to reach its all-time intra-day high of 75,499.91. The index logged its biggest single-day gain since January 29.

The NSE Nifty inched closer to the 23,000 mark during the day. The 50-issue index went up by 369.85 points or 1.64 per cent to 22,967.65. During the day, it jumped 395.8 points or 1.75 per cent to 22,993.60 -- its intra-day record peak.

Investors richer; mcap of BSE-listed cos shines

Investors' wealth Thursday went up by ₹4,28 lakh crore amid the ongoing optimistic trend in equities where the benchmark SENSEX hit its lifetime peak. Investors' wealth went up by ₹4,28,602.18 crore with the market capitalisation of BSE-listed companies reaching an all-time high of ₹4,20,22,635.90 crore (\$5.05 trillion).

"Nifty shrugged off some of the uncertainty related to election results and hit a new high today," said Apurva Sheth, Head of Market Perspectives and Research, SAMCO Securities.

The results of the ongoing general elections will be declared June 4. The sixth and last phases of polls will be held May 25 and June 1 respectively.

Sheth also attributed the rally to a record dividend announced by RBI to the government and Prime Minister Narendra Modi exuding confidence about winning the elections.

The journey of market capitalisation of listed companies from \$2 trillion (July 2017) to \$3 trillion (May 2021) took about 46 months, \$3 trillion to \$4 trillion (December 2023) took about 30 months and the latest \$1 trillion addition took only about 6 months, the exchange said. The top five companies by market capitalisation on the exchange are Reliance Industries, Tata Consultancy Services, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank and Bharti Airtel.

SEVERE HEAT WAVE Peak power demand touches season's high

The peak power demand met or the highest supply in the day is recorded at 235.06 GW Wednesday

New Delhi, May 23: India's peak power demand hit the season's high of 235.06 GW Wednesday mainly due to excessive use of cooling appliances like air conditioners and coolers amid severe heat waves in most parts of the country.

According to the power ministry data, the peak power demand met or the highest supply in the day is recorded at 235.06 GW Wednesday, which is the maximum so far in the summer season this year.

Earlier this month, the power ministry projected a peak power demand of 235 GW during daytime and 225 GW during evening hours for May and 240 GW during daytime and 235 GW during evening hours for June 2024.

Besides the power ministry has also projected that peak power demand can hit the 260GW mark during this summer season.

The data shows peak power demand was 224.18GW in April 2024, when the country witnessed the onset of the summer season in various parts of the country. It was 221.82GW in March, 222.16GW in February and 223.51 GW in January.

During May, peak supply hit 233 GW May 6 and 233.80 GW May 21. It was 221.42 GW recorded in May 2023. Last week, the peak power supply touched 229.57 GW May 18, while it was around 226 GW May 15, 16 and 17.

The peak supply was 229.77 GW May 4 and 228.71GW May 20. The industry experts are of the view that power demand could soar further and can easily breach the all time high of 243.27 GW recorded in September 2023.

Earlier in March this year, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) projected that India is likely to experience a warmer summer and more heat-wave days this year, with El Nino conditions predicted to continue



at least until May. From March to May, the above-normal number of heatwave days is likely over most parts of the country, except northeast India, the western Himalayan region, the southwest peninsula and the west coast, it stated.

According to the IMD report Thursday, the maximum temperatures were in the range of 44 to 47 degrees Celsius in many places over Rajasthan; Gujarat state; in isolated places pockets over Haryana, West Uttar Pradesh and West Madhya Pradesh; in the range of 40-44 degrees Celsius in many places of Punjab, Delhi, East Madhya Pradesh, Vidharbha and Marathwada; in some parts of Chhattisgarh, Odisha, Telangana; in isolated pockets of East Uttar Pradesh, interior Madhya Maharashtra and North Interior Karnataka.

The IMD, in its bulletin, said that heat wave to severe heat wave conditions are very likely in most pockets of West Rajasthan; in many/some pockets of Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh, West Uttar Pradesh and East Rajasthan during May 23 to 26, in isolated pockets of Northwest Madhya Pradesh and Delhi during May 24 to 26.

May biz growth robust as exports rise at record pace

Bangalore, May 23: Business activity in India expanded robustly in May, helped by the dominant services industry, according to a survey that also showed exports rising at a record pace and the sharpest job addition rate in nearly 18 years.

HSBC's flash India Composite purchasing managers' Index, compiled by S&P Global, rose slightly to 61.7 this month from April's final reading of 61.5, marking the 34th month above the 50-level separating growth from contraction.

The flash services PMI index rose to a four-month high of 61.4 this month from 60.8 in April and a preliminary manufacturing PMI showed strong growth, albeit slightly weaker than last

month. It dipped to 58.4 from 58.8.

Robust demand was supported by new business in the services industry, which grew at the fastest pace since January, as well as rising manufacturing output and new orders.

Strong international demand meant overall exports expanded at the fastest rate since the start of the series in September 2014. It is the second time export growth has set a new high this year.

That boosted business confidence for the coming 12 months, especially in the services sector where it was the strongest since May 2013. Optimism among manufacturers was the highest in over nine years.

The composite PMI ticked up further in May, recording the third strongest reading in close to 14 years, supported by a sharp acceleration in the service sector

Yogesh fed up being 2nd best

But within three years Yogesh started to walk again, thanks to his mother, Meena Devi, who learnt physiotherapy to treat her son.

Yogesh soon took to sport with gusto, finding his calling in para discus throw. The 27-year-old from Haryana secured Monday a silver medal in the men's F56 category discus throw with an effort of 41.80 metres at the World Para Athletics Championships in Kobe, Japan.

"I still get goosebumps when I think about those days. But I was fortunate to be among the one per cent who were able to walk. There are still a lot of neurological disorder issues which can't be cured," Yogesh stated here after his return.

"I walk with AFOs (ankle-foot orthosis) in both legs but I can't walk for long. In GB syndrome, there is muscle loss quickly, so I need to eat well, work out regularly. But I feel motivated thinking about it all because I am representing the country," he added.

Ponting rejects India's offer

New Delhi, May 23: Australia great Ricky Ponting has revealed that he was approached for the soon-to-be-vacant India head coach position but he has declined the offer as it doesn't fit into his 'lifestyle' right now. He did not however, say whether the feelers for the Indian position came from the BCCI.

"...there were a few little one-on-one conversations during the IPL, just to get a level of interest from me as to whether I would do it (coach India)," Ponting was quoted as saying by the ICC website.

"I'd love to be a senior coach of a national team, but with the other things that I have in my life and wanting to have a bit of time at home... everyone knows if you



take a job working with the Indian team, you can't be involved in an IPL team, so it would take that out of it as well. Also, a national head coach is a 10 or 11-month of the year job, and as much as I'd like to do it, it just doesn't fit into my lifestyle right now and the things that I really enjoy doing," he added.

Ponting said he discussed the offer with his son and he seemed game for a move to India. "My family and my kids have spent the last five weeks over at the IPL with me and they come over

every year and I had a whisper to my son about it," he recalled.

"I said, 'Dad's been offered the Indian coaching job' and he said, 'Just take it dad, we would love to move over there for the next couple of years,'" Ponting quipped. "That's how much they love being over there and the culture of cricket in India, but right now it probably isn't the right time," Ponting added.

Some other high-profile names such as CSK head coach Stephen Fleming, LSG head coach Justin Langer and Kolkata Knight Riders mentor Gautam Gambhir have also been talked about as potential candidates for the position that Rahul Dravid will vacate after India's T20 World Cup campaign next month. The BCCI has set May 27 as the last date for submitting applications.

Atalanta win Europa League
