
Reflecting on her deep connection with the wild, Nimrat revealed that she celebrated her birthday amidst nature in the Binsar Wildlife Sanctuary.





Security forces to fill vacuum, realign forces

Srinagar, April 23: In the aftermath of the terror strike at Pahalgam that left 26 tourists dead, authorities are working on a plan to fill the security vacuum with a permanent deployment of army and paramilitary forces in the mountains overlooking the tourist destination in the Kashmir valley.

Officials in the security establishment told PTI that a realignment of the security forces was also required ahead of the annual Amarnath pilgrimage, which begins July 3.

There are no security forces in the immediate vicinity of the meadows of the Baisaran Valley which is ringed by dense forests. The nearest is a unit of the 3rd battalion of the Rashtriya Rifles (RR) of the Army and a company of the 116th battalion of the CRPF, the sources said.


It takes time for the troops to reach this place from their locations, which are as far as 10-11 km, to the Baisaran area that is only approachable on foot or on horseback, they said.

The security forces usually patrol the peaks and control access to them and the meadows from the ground by deploying check posts in the Kashmir valley.

The security agencies are now planning to readjust the deployment of troops so that they can be based closer to the Baisaran Valley area and also secure the rear of the forests so that any terrorist movement is kept under check.

₹20 LAKH BOUNTY FOR INFO ON TERRORISTS: J&K POLICE

Srinagar: Police Wednesday announced a bounty of ₹20 lakh for information leading to the neutralisation of terrorists involved in the gruesome killing of tourists in a Pahalgam resort of Jammu and Kashmir. Twenty-six people, including 24 tourists, were killed when terrorists opened fire in Pahalgam Tuesday afternoon. Any information leading to the neutralisation of terrorists involved in this cowardly act shall be rewarded ₹20 lakh, Anantnag police said in a post on its official X handle. The identity of the informer shall be kept a secret, the police added. Earlier in the day, security agencies released the sketches of three men suspected to be involved in the terror attack. The men, all Pakistanis, are Asif Fauji, Suleman Shah and Abu Talha, officials said. They had code names Moosa, Yunus and Asif and were involved in terror-related incidents in Poonch. The sketches were prepared with the help of survivors, they said. From the pencil sketches, in black and white, they appear to be young and have beards.



Cabinet nod to 6 major proposals

Bhubaneswar, April 23: The state Cabinet headed by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Wednesday approved ₹108 crore for the construction of the integrated Anandapur Barrage Project in Keonjhar district. The decision was among six major proposals cleared across five departments.

Briefing the media, Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja said the project, under the Water Resources department, aims to provide irrigation to 60,000 hectares in Keonjhar and Balasore districts.

The current proposal covers a segment of the larger project, focused on creating irrigation potential for 2,221 hectares under the Baitarani Left Bank Canal (BLBC) and Baitarani Right Bank Canal (BRBC) systems.

The project will use an underground pipeline network to serve a total of 3,450 hectares of culturable command area in Keonjhar, Ahuja said. The project's deadline is 18 months.

the Cabinet approved an amendment to the Odisha Children's and Women's Welfare Service Rules, 1989, raising the minimum educational qualification for appointment as an ICDS (Integrated Child Development Services) supervisor.

Under the revised rules, an anganwadi worker must now hold a graduate degree or its equivalent from a recognised university, up from the previous Class X qualification. The change will apply only to fresh appointments.

The state government also announced a restructuring of the Odisha Subordinate Welfare Service and Odisha Welfare Service cadres. This includes the creation of 24 new posts across various ranks to improve administrative efficiency.

The Cabinet also approved the proposal of the Health and Family Welfare (H&FW) department to allocate ₹2,398.45 crore for 108 Emergency Medical Ambulance Service (EMAS) for a period of five years from 2023-24 to 2027-28, he added.

Besides, two proposals of the Excise department on recruitment of constables and exemption of extra hour operation fees for distilleries, bottling units and brewery units were approved by the Cabinet.

New Delhi, April 23: India Wednesday downgraded diplomatic ties with Pakistan and announced a raft of measures including expulsion of Pakistani military attaches, suspension of the over six-decade-old Indus Water Treaty and immediate shutting down of the Attari land-transit post in view of the cross-border links to the Pahalgam terror attack.

A day after the brazen attack that killed 26 civilians, the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) met Wednesday evening under the chairmanship of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and firmed up New Delhi's retaliatory measures to the dastardly strike and directed the security forces to maintain high vigil.

At a late evening media briefing, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri announcing the decisions said the overall strength of the Pakistani and Indian high commissions will be brought down to 30 from the present 55 through further reductions, to be effected by May 1. The new retaliatory measures shut down the few existing diplomatic mechanisms between the two sides taking bilateral relations to yet another new low.

The foreign secretary said the CCS resolved that the perpetrators of the Pahalgam attack will be brought to justice and their sponsors held to account. Misri said the CCS was given a briefing on the incident in-



cluding the "cross-border linkages" of the terrorist attack.

Misri said "the defence, military, naval and air advisors in the Pakistani High Commission in New Delhi are declared Persona Non Grata" and they have a week to leave India. India will be withdrawing its own defence, navy and air advisors from the Indian High Commission in Islamabad, he said.

"These posts in the respective High Commissions are deemed annulled. Five support staff of the Service Advisors will also be withdrawn from both High Commissions," he said.

The CCS meeting that lasted for two-and-a-half hours decided to close the Integrated Check Post at Attari with immediate effect. It is the only operational land border crossing between the two countries.

Pakistani nationals will not be permitted to travel to India under the SAARC Visa Exemption Scheme (SVES) and any such visas issued in the past to Pakistani nationals are deemed cancelled, Misri said.

The CCS decided that the Indus Water Treaty of 1960 will be held in abeyance with immediate effect, until Pakistan credibly and irrevocably abjures

its support for cross-border terrorism, he said. On closing of the Integrated Check Post at Attari, Misri said those who have crossed over with valid endorsements may return through that route before May 1.

"Strong expressions of support and solidarity have been received from many Governments around the world, which have unequivocally condemned this terror attack," he said.

The foreign secretary said the CCS recorded its appreciation for such sentiments, which reflect zero tolerance for terrorism. In the briefing to the CCS, the cross-border linkages of the terrorist attack were brought out, he said.

Meanwhile, official sources said the government will be calling an all-party meeting Thursday in the wake of the terror attack in Pahalgam. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh is likely to chair it, they said.

Home Minister Amit Shah and Singh are speaking to leaders of various parties on the issue, the sources said.

It was a day of hushed silences, angry discussions and cries of despair as an entire nation mourned those killed in the brazen attack. **More P6&7**

Lakhs of Olive Ridley hatchlings head to sea

Kendrapara, April 23: In a grand culmination of the annual mass nesting of endangered Olive Ridley turtles, lakhs of hatchlings broke out of eggshells to emerge from sandy pits and crawl towards the sea at the idyllic Gahirmatha beach off Bay of Bengal coast in Kendrapara district.

The natural phenomenon of the birth of the hatchlings sans their mothers left wildlife enthusiasts elated, officials said.

Lakhs of hatchlings have broken out of their eggshells in the past 48 hours and crawled towards the sea, an official said.

The emergence of the hatchlings marks the grand culmination of the annual sojourn of the Olive Ridley turtles along the Gahirmatha beach, regarded as the world's largest nesting ground for these aquatic animals.

The annual sojourn of the Olive Ridley turtles for mass nesting, also called 'arribada'

had come to an end at Nasi-1, Nasi-2 and Eakakulanasi islands in Kendrapara district between March 5 and March 10 with over six lakh female turtles turning up at the beach to lay eggs, the Assistant Conservator of Forest, Manas Das, said. The emergence of hatchlings would last for at least seven to 10 days.

The number of babies would swell considerably in the coming days, the forest official said.

The nesting sites were packed with the Olive Ridley turtle hatchlings and the wildlife officials of Bhitarkanika National Park stationed at these nesting grounds were sole witnesses to the unique natural event, involving the birth of the babies sans their mothers, the official said.

In an attempt to curb the light-induced distraction, the DRDO has masked the high-power light from its Wheelers' Island missile test range centre, which is located close to the nesting ground.

Vadra's remarks on Pahalgam attack spark controversy

New Delhi, April 23: Congress leader Sonia Gandhi's son-in-law and businessman Robert Vadra Wednesday triggered a row by suggesting that non-Muslims were attacked in Pahalgam as terrorists feel Muslims are being "mistreated" in the country, with the BJP accusing him of using the language of terrorists and demanding his apologies.

Vadra condemned the Pahalgam terrorist attack and said that whenever there are communal issues and people feel vulnerable, there is division in the country and neighbouring countries benefit from it. He said it is time to separate politics and religion, and political parties should introspect.

"When this terrorist act took place, they (terrorists) were looking at IDs, people who were non-Muslims were attacked and messages were given to the prime minister. Why is this happening? Because, they are feeling that Muslims are being mistreated in our country," Vadra said.

He, however, clarified that it was his personal view and he was not speaking on behalf of the Congress party or his family.

Old folios of Shakespearean plays up for auction

London, April 23: A set of the first four editions of William Shakespeare's collected works is expected to sell for up to 4.5 million pounds at auction next month.

Sotheby's auction house announced the sale Wednesday, Shakespeare's 461st birthday. It said the May 23 sale will be the first time since 1989 that a set of the First, Second, Third and Fourth Folios has been offered at auction as a single lot.

The auction house estimated the sale price at between 3.5 million and 4.5 million pounds.



After Shakespeare's death in 1616, his plays were collected into a single volume by his friends John Heminges and Henry Con-

dell, actors and shareholders in the playwright's troupe, the King's Men.

The First Folio — fully titled

"Mr. William Shakespeares Comedies, Histories & Tragedies" — contained 36 plays, of which half were published there for the first time. Without the book, scholars say, plays including "Macbeth," "The Tempest" and "Twelfth Night" might have been lost. Sotheby's called the volume "without question the most significant publication in the history of English literature."

About 750 copies were printed in 1623, of which about 230 are known to survive. All but a few are in museums, universities or libraries. One of the few First Folios in private hands sold for \$9.9

Candlelight marches held to condemn Pahalgam attack

Across the state, political parties and organisations called for justice and a thorough investigation into the massacre

Bhubaneswar, April 23: Many political parties, including BJP and Congress, and a number of organisations Wednesday evening took out candlelight marches across Odisha, condemning the Pahalgam terror attack and demanding stringent action against those responsible for the ghastly act.

Das alleged that the Pahalgam incident exposed 'intelligence failure' and 'failure of both the Prime Minister and Home Minister'. He demanded a high-level probe into the incident.

"The BJP-led government is strong at the Centre, but it could not take measures to prevent a repeat of terrorist activities and eliminate terrorism from the valley," he said.

Twenty six tourists, including one from Odisha, were killed in the terror attack in Pahalgam. Prashant Satpathy, a resident of Balasore district and an employee of Central Institute of Plastics Engineering and Technology (CIPET), was among them.

BJD president and Leader of Opposition in the Assembly Naveen Patnaik Wednesday spoke to Prashant's elder brother Sushant. "Patnaik conveyed his deep sympathies to the bereaved family and assured all support," a statement issued by the regional party said.

CPI(M) and other Left parties also took out separate rallies protesting the terror attack.

An organisation of the Muslim community took out a rally in Balasore town condemning the attack and demanding safety for the common citizens. "We want justice," said a banner displayed during the rally.

The Hindu Jagaran Manch and other right-wing organisations also hit the streets condemning the terror strike in the valley and urged the Central government to take action against those responsible for the terror activities.

Jai Hind, an organisation following the ideology of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, also took out a silent rally protesting the ghastly act and expressed their solidarity with the Indian Army to root out terrorism from the country.

Reports of candlelight rallies were also received from different districts across Odisha.

Emergency ambulance service till 2027-28

Bhubaneswar, April 23: The state Cabinet, led by Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, Wednesday approved continuation of the Emergency Medical Ambulance Service (EMAS) from 2023-24 to 2027-28, official sources said.

The EMAS, a joint initiative of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) and the state government under the banner of the 'National Ambulance Service', has been operational in Odisha since March 5, 2013.

The 108 Emergency Medical Ambulance Service has served as a lifeline for the people of Odisha.

Under this initiative, provision has been made for the delivery of comprehensive pre-hospital emergency medical services through a fleet of ambulances free of cost for the residents of Odisha.



CABINET DECISION

The EMAS-108 service is managed and monitored through a centralised and 24x7 integrated call centre with 150 seats.

Phase-II of the scheme will be implemented over five years, from 2023-24 to 2027-28, with an estimated 11-12 lakh

emergency cases (including pregnant women and children) to be transported annually by EMAS-108 ambulances to designated public health facilities within a targeted response time of 20 minutes.

The current EMAS-108 fleet in the state comprises 866 ambulances, including 411 Advanced Life Support (ALS), 449 Basic Life Support (BLS), and

six boat ambulances.

The EMAS-108 ambulance service is managed by a private partner agency.

A total of ₹2398.45 crore has been provisioned for the scheme for a period of five years from 2023-24 to 2027-28, according to Chief Secretary Manoj Ahuja, who briefed the media following the Cabinet meeting.

Vision document for 2036, 2047 to be finalised in 15 days: Govt

Bhubaneswar, April 23: The state government has decided to finalise its vision document for 2036 and 2047 in the next 15 days after consulting with public representatives, common citizens, members of civil society and intellectuals at various levels, an official statement said Wednesday.

The decision was taken at the 7th meeting of the state council of ministers held here under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi.

Odisha will complete 100 years of formation in 2036, while India will complete 100 years of independence in 2047. So, with the support of NITI Aayog, the government has started preparing for 'Odisha Vision 2036 and 2047' from August 2024, said the statement issued by the Chief Minister's Office (CMO).

In his address, Majhi said that on the occasion of centenary celebrations of the formation of the state, the government has taken an ambitious resolve to make Odisha a prosperous and developed state by 2036. This will also help in achieving the goal of making our country a



developed nation by 2047, he said.

Inclusion, prosperity and wellness are the three pillars which form the basis of this vision document. To achieve the GSDP target of USD 1.5 trillion by 2047 and to contribute 5 per cent to India's GDP, Odisha needs to exceed and accelerate the rate of economic growth it has achieved so far, he said.

"This is both a challenge as well as an opportunity. This goal can be achieved through a collaborative environment, public-private investment, implementation and coordination through technology," the CM said.

In this regard, the state's growth transformation journey

will be accelerated by launching a strategic initiative '36 for 36', identifying 36 flagship initiatives aimed at making a significant impact in key sectors by 2036, he added.

Majhi stressed on the need for prioritising infrastructural growth and suggested special plans for expansion of roads and railways networks, ports and air connectivity.

It was decided in the meeting that the 'Odisha Vision 2036 and 2047' document will be finalised in consultation with public representatives, common citizens, members of civil society and intellectuals at various levels in the next 15 days by organising regional workshops at four different locations in the state.

CBI searches 12 locations in GDS recruitment fraud

Bhubaneswar, April 23: The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) conducted extensive searches at 12 locations across five districts in Odisha in connection with alleged irregularities in Gramin Dak Sevaks (GDS) recruitment in 2023, officials said Wednesday.

The Central agency had registered a case in this connection May 9, 2023 following a reference from the Chief Postmaster General, Odisha Circle, Bhubaneswar, who alleged that certain candidates had submitted fake matriculation certificates to secure jobs during the 2023 GDS recruitment process an official statement said.

"The CBI search operation conducted in Khurda, Kalahandi, Bolangir, Sambalpur and Keonjhar districts of Odisha targeted the premises of individuals involved in the case including middlemen and those engaged in preparing forged matriculation certificates of the Uttar Pradesh Board and the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS)," the CBI spokesperson said in a statement.

Several 'incriminating' documents and articles - highlighting the 'fraudulent activities' - were seized by the CBI during the searches, the officials said.



7 held with heroin, illicit liquor

Bhubaneswar: Cracking the whip on drugs and illicit liquor trade in the City, the Excise sleuths Wednesday seized 31 grams of heroin and 215 litres of liquor in connection with three separate cases, and arrested seven peddlers in connection with the incident. Prima facie, the peddlers had manufactured the liquor with intent to sell to locals, while more details are yet to be ascertained in the heroin seizure incident. A senior Excise official said the man arrested in the heroin seizure has been identified as Hasim Khan. He is a local of Jadupur Tangi Sahi. While, in the later case, the sleuths have seized 100 litres of illicit liquor, and arrested three persons near Excise Range-II division. The sleuths also seized a scooter from them following their arrest. Similarly, the excise team arrested three persons in another case near the scene, and seized 115 litres of illicit liquor. The Excise department booked the seven men under Section 21 (B) of NDPS Act, and produced them before a local court Wednesday.

Majhi launches Works dept's project monitoring dashboard

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Man gets 20-yr RI for raping minor

Baripada: A POCSO court here sentenced a man to 20 years rigorous imprisonment (RI) for raping a 12-year-old girl in Mayurbhanj district. Special POCSO court judge Santosh Kumar Nayak also imposed a fine of ₹10,000 on convict Md Mustakim, 35, special public prosecutor Manaranjan Pattnaik said. The court directed the secretary of Mayurbhanj DLSA to pay ₹4 lakh aid to the victim, he said. The judgement was based on the victim's statement, seven witnesses and medical report, he added. Police said Mustakim, a relative of the victim, had taken her to a nearby riverbank located in Bahalda police station area and raped her March 8, 2023.

In shock, Pahalgam victim Prashant's mom turns mute

Bhubaneswar, April 23: Forty-one-year-old Prashant Satpathy's mother has turned mute due to the shock she received on hearing the news of his son's death in a dastardly attack by the terrorists on innocent tourists in Pahalgam of Jammu and Kashmir Tuesday.

Prashant from Remuna of Balasore district was gunned down by terrorists in front of his wife and nine-year-old son in Baisaran meadow of Pahalgam.

"Upon hearing the news of my brother's death, my mother has turned mute due to shock,"

Prashant's elder brother Susanta Satpathy said, adding that he had saved money for months for the trip and was really excited about it.

An accounts assistant with the Central Institute of Plastics Engineering and Technology (CIPET) in Balasore district, Prashant had gone to Kashmir with his wife and son on LTC.

A video sent by Prashant to his elder brother from Baisaran meadow hours before his death showed him playing with snowballs and hurling ice packs at his son Tanuj and wife Priya Darshani Acharya.

In the video, Prashant clad

in a white shirt and blue jeans, was seen throwing snowballs at his son and wife and enjoying the environment of Baisaran valley.

He was also seen hugging Tanuj, wearing a red jacket. "This was probably the last hug to his son by Prashant," an emotionally charged elder brother said.

Prashant was the second of the three sons of their parents. He had gone to enjoy nature after the completion of his son's school examinations.

"Prashant was shot in the head while we were alighting from a ropeway in Baisaran... he collapsed on the spot. The



army came an hour later," his wife Priya Darshani told an Odia news channel from Jammu and Kashmir.

She, along with her son Tanuj and three of Prashant's rel-

atives who rushed to Srinagar after hearing about the attack, would accompany the body that was expected to arrive in Bhubaneswar on Wednesday night.

A dark cloud of despair hovered over Ishani village in Remuna block in Balasore district as locals and politicians made a beeline to the residence of Satpathy to express condolences to his family.

Prashant's father-in-law Radhamohan Acharya said: "My son-in-law was a noble-hearted person. He had never harmed anyone. But, he was killed in a terrorist attack. This is something not acceptable."

His family said they were making arrangements for conducting the final rites on Thursday and Odisha government representatives were expected to attend it.

Bhubaneswar MP Aparajita Sarangi, who was in Jammu and Kashmir to attend a meeting, reached out to Prashant's family and consoled his wife and son. Though terrorists mostly killed men, an Odia woman staying in Karnataka identified as 65-year-old Sash Kumari, was also injured in the attack. She was undergoing treatment at Government Medical College in Anantnag.

CSR funds: Mining-affected areas in Jajpur get peanuts

Jajpur, April 23: Jajpur district administration might have collected more than ₹45 crore in Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funds over the past four years, but it has reportedly failed to utilise the funds in development of regions that are bearing the brunt of mining and industrial activities.

Information obtained through a Right to Information (RTI) plea revealed a total of ₹45.87 crore was collected from various mining companies, industries and associated agencies between financial years 2021-22 and 2024-25 in the district. Of the amount, ₹42.06 crore was spent predominantly in Jajpur town and surrounding non-industrial areas, while the communities directly affected by mining and industrial activities got peanuts.

RTI petitioner Pradeep Kumar Pradhan alleged that there was a deliberate attempt to mislead the applicant by concealing information regarding the source of CSR funds at 15 locations listed in the response. As a result,

apart from Odisha Mining Corporation (OMC), the contributions made by major mining and industrial companies operating in Sukinda and Kalinganagar areas remained unclear.

He also alleged that the administration might be painting a rosy picture of employment and development in the district, as promised by companies in Kalinganagar and Sukinda, but the reality is completely different. A deeper analysis of the CSR financial records supports this discrepancy, he said.

The RTI report said ₹1,60,98,000 of CSR funds have been collected in FY 2021-22, ₹20,60,27,925 in FY 2022-23, ₹18,03,45,698 in FY 2023-24, and ₹1,81,44,353 in FY 2024-25 so far. Of this, OMC alone contributed ₹6.82 crore in fourth phase. The report also lists the names of over 30 companies, including some central PSUs, Megha Engineering, and Kalinganagar Commercial.

The collected funds have been utilised in provision of clean drinking water and sanitation facilities in schools and Anganwadi centres, plastic

waste management, land development at Sathipur, and improvement of 13 schools in Jajpur block. Funds also went towards other projects in the district like development of additional facilities for sportspersons at Kusuma park, an interpretation centre, an adventure sports unit, a sports park in Sathipur, a rural tourism centre at Petapara, Sadhei pond restoration project and other development projects.

However, the report indicates that large sums have been spent under vague headings like "Implementation Activities" at some locations, raising allegations of misappropriation of crores of rupees. Local communities continue to bear the brunt of industrial expansion, facing environmental degradation without receiving proportional developmental support. While mining companies extract natural resources for profit, affected residents remain deprived of adequate infrastructure, such as hospitals, quality educational institutions or proper road connectivity.

Meanwhile, promises of model schools and four-lane roads remain unfulfilled. When approached, Kalinganagar Additional District Magistrate Sapan Kumar Nanda confirmed the existence of a district-level committee responsible for CSR fund utilisation but claimed to have no specific knowledge of how the funds have been allocated.

Man rapes daughter-in-law, gets life term

Balasore, April 23: A 60-year-old man was sentenced to life imprisonment by a court here and imposed a fine of ₹50,000 for raping his daughter-in-law.

Additional sessions judge, Fast Track Special courts, Anita Sahoo Wednesday convicted the father-

in-law on the charge committing rape against his daughter-in-law and sentenced him to life imprisonment along with ₹50,000 fine.

The court further ordered another two years of rigorous imprisonment in case the convict failed to pay the penalty amount. A case was registered in June 2023

against the accused identified as Gopinath Jena, resident of Bhoisahi village under Sadar police station following the allegation of the victim.

He was tried under section 376 (2) (f), 506 and 376 (2)(n) of IPC. The court after examining 15 witnesses and 18 exhibits pronounced the judgement Wednesday.

5 held for running firearms racket

Berhampur, April 23: Police have arrested five members of a gang from Ganjam district for illegal possession of firearms and involvement in supply of country-made guns.

The arrested have been identified as D Muna Rao, 24, Tofan Bhuyan alias Santosh, 28, Chinu Patra, 24, Surya Pradhan, 24, and Sanu Naik alias Chila, 38.

IIC of Bhanjanagar police station Jeebananand Jena said, "Rao, Tofan and Patra were apprehended during a raid conducted Tuesday. Surya Pradhan reportedly fled the scene but was later taken into custody.

Naik was arrested for allegedly acting as a middleman in the illegal supply of firearms to anti-social elements, including members of the arrested gang.

Sanu was involved in at least eight cases in Nayagarh district and a case in Jharkhand, Jena said. He further added that Tofan alias Santosh was wanted by Chennai police for his alleged involvement in multiple criminal cases there, while Rao was wanted by Bhanjanagar police in connection with a theft case, and an arrest warrant had been pending against him.

During the operation, police seized three country-made pistols, six live rounds of ammunition, a magazine, and a scooter from the accused.

STRATEGIC IMPERATIVE



India has never voted against Russia in the UN on the Ukraine issue which has been highly appreciated by Moscow

Since the signing of the "Declaration on the India-Russia Strategic Partnership" in October 2000, the summit meetings between the Prime Minister of India and the President of Russia are the highest institutionalised dialogue mechanisms, where both countries take stock of their relations at the highest level and impart direction and impetus to them. The visits alternate between the leaders of each country. Since Indian Prime Minister visited Russia last year, on July 8-9, 2024, the next visit by Russian President is expected this year.

Following the start of the Ukraine War in February 2022, Western sanctions and diplomatic isolation made Russia look for partners outside the West. Russian President Vladimir Putin has used every opportunity to meet with leaders in forums like BRICS, SCO and G20. But more useful and helpful are stand-alone bilateral meets. Russia has tried both multilateral and bilateral formats. In 2022 itself, all the five Central Asian leaders attended the Victory Day Parade in Moscow, which is held every year on 9 May to commemorate victory over Nazi Germany in 1945. This year, Russia has invited leaders from several other "friendly" countries including India and China to the 80th anniversary of the victory.

For Russia, this commemoration has acquired special meaning following the war in Ukraine. One of the main goals of Russia's Special Military Operations in Ukraine has been "de-Nazification." The invitation to leaders of friendly countries is not just aimed demonstrating the reliability of Russia's partnership but also to give a message that fascists still use the garb of nationalism to break multi-ethnic and multi-cultural countries. Thus, the fight against them is still relevant and essential.

But more than meeting on the sidelines of multilateral events, the annual strategic partnership meet format has been more productive. India-Russia relations have grown from strength to strength on this basis. Since 2000, the highest leadership of both countries have been meeting until the start of the Ukraine war. After a gap of two years Modi visited Russia in 2024 and this year the visit from Putin is due. In 2021, when Putin visited India last, there was a focus on transportation corridors like the International North-South Corridor or INSTC and Vladivostok-Chennai corridor. The meeting, the next year in Samarkand (SCO), took place against the background of the Ukraine war. Russia's interests were mainly focused on how to make friendly countries understand its position on Ukraine. Modi in Samarkand made the famous statement that "now is not an age of wars." Modi's meeting with Putin took place during the BRICS Summit in Kazan in 2024, which followed the 22nd Annual Strategic Partnership Summit in July 2024. These meetings help keep trade and economic relations going regardless of sanctions against Russia. India kept up its Russian oil purchases despite calls from the West to stop the imports. India has never voted against Russia in the UN on the Ukraine issue which has been highly appreciated by Moscow.

The next meeting of the two leaders will be held in India this year in the backdrop of some major shifts in the global economic and political environment. In political terms, Russia is being pressed by the US to reach a ceasefire agreement with Ukraine. While Russia has shown a desire to end the war, it is not willing to do so at the cost of the gains it has made in three years nor at the cost of its other core security interests like opposition to NATO membership for Ukraine. Notwithstanding the Easter Ceasefire declared by Russia, a real ceasefire seems to be still eluding the two countries.

Today the US tariff threat hangs over all the trading partners of America. This includes India as well, which despite being willing and working to negotiate a trade deal with the Trump administration, is not sure what the future will hold given the unpredictable nature of Trump. Countries are aware that making concessions would lead to demands for further concessions, which may be detrimental to their economies. To cushion themselves from more shocks, India and Russia need to further expand trade and economic relations among themselves as well as with other countries. For example, China has recently been negotiating

with Vietnam, Cambodia and Malaysia to expand bilateral trade. India and Russia have to strengthen their trade and investment ties, with Indian companies investing in Russia's oil and gas, pharmaceuticals, and IT sectors, and Russian companies investing in India's energy, infrastructure, and manufacturing sectors. All these have to be done without antagonising the US. And that requires deft negotiations and strategies.

The global geopolitical, geo-economic and strategic contexts have changed since Trump became President. Russia is no longer an outcaste, which the US is engaging to get a deal on Ukraine. Moscow can be helpful in talks for a US-Iran nuclear deal. The US also wants energy deals with Russia. In this background, Putin's visit to New Delhi would receive much global attention. Since India is also close to the US, the Americans may indicate to New Delhi what they wish from the talks with Russia.

Modi may or may not visit Moscow for the May Day Parade, due to other engagements on 9 May. But what is more important is the visit of Putin this year in the Strategic Partnership format. Putin's visit to India is now confirmed, only dates are to be announced. On 28 March, Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov announced that Putin has accepted the invitation from the Indian side and would be visiting India. Preparations for the visit are underway. The trade and tariff issues and post-war peace efforts would require Moscow and New Delhi to be strategically engaged, which is best served by the meeting of leaders at the highest level. This makes the forthcoming visit of Putin significant.

Writing On The Wall

In mid-March, Lee Zeldin, President Donald Trump's newly confirmed administrator of the US Environmental Protection Agency, announced that the EPA was undertaking a formal reconsideration of its "endangerment finding." The Trump administration has made no secret of its desire to rescind the 2009 declaration that greenhouse-gas (GHG) emissions endanger "both the public health and the public welfare of current and future generations." In other words, Trump wants to walk back the US government's assertion that climate change is real and caused by humans.

This scientific finding stemmed from a 2007 US Supreme Court ruling that various GHGs are pollutants covered by the Clean Air Act. The Court held that the EPA must determine whether GHG emissions from new motor vehicles "cause[s], or contribute[s] to, air pollution which may reasonably be anticipated to endanger public health or welfare" (emphasis added). To be clear, the ruling did not command the EPA to regulate GHG emissions. But if the agency found that emissions caused or contributed to air pollution, the Clean Air Act would require it to establish air-quality standards that accurately reflect "the latest scientific knowledge."

To make this determination, the EPA had to survey the scientific literature, assess existing and emerging risks based on that science, and evaluate the costs and benefits associated with alternative options for prospective regulation. The agency then posted a preliminary draft of its findings and policy options for a 60-day public-comment period, and was required to respond publicly to each comment while revising the document.

After publishing a final version of its endangerment and "cause or contribute" findings – the latter recognises that GHG emissions from new motor vehicles contribute to harmful air pollution – in December 2009, the EPA began to design its response and implement appropriate measures. But the pushback was almost immediate. By July 2010, the agency had received and denied ten petitions for reconsidering both findings. In June 2012, after a group of lawsuits, the US Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit upheld the endangerment finding. Later, in April 2022, the EPA denied another four petitions for reconsideration.

But now, with a US president who calls climate change a "hoax" and is following a governing blueprint that seeks to roll back US environmental and climate policy in the name of fossil-fuel extraction and deregulation, the EPA has abruptly changed course. The stated rationale for reconsidering the endangerment finding is tenuous, based in part on false claims about the climate agenda – most notably that it has imposed trillions of dollars in costs on Americans.

Still, the EPA faces a difficult road ahead. Before the agency can reach the opposite conclusion – that GHG emissions do not endanger public health and welfare – it must undertake the same rigorous, multi-step process that produced the 2009 finding. And now it must contend with a much larger body of scientific evidence for the observed and projected damages from these emissions: the past 16 years have produced reams of research pointing to GHG emissions' harmful effects.

The severity of the climate crisis became clearer in 2019, when 15 scientists published a review of the then-current literature in Science. They concluded that, since 2009, "the amount, diversity, and sophistication of the evidence" had "increased markedly, clearly strengthening the case for endangerment." In 2023, the sixth assessment from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change brought home the message, finding that "adverse impacts from human-caused climate change will continue to intensify." The report emphasized that the effects were worsening at a faster pace than ever before.

Simply embarking on an official reassessment of the endangerment finding may produce the Trump administration's desired effect: a massive retreat from climate action at the federal level. That is already happening to a certain degree. The EPA has announced plans to eliminate its scientific-research arm, even though almost every US agency depends on the climate science that it produces.

Moreover, the new leaders of the many government departments that support research on global warming – from Health and Human Services (which houses the National Institutes of Health) to Commerce (which houses the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) – largely share Trump's climate skepticism. The EPA's reconsideration of the endangerment finding will give them cover to defund existing scientific programs, discontinue the collection of valuable data series, reject creative research proposals, freeze government hiring, and undertake large-scale personnel reductions.

The Trump administration's disdain for established science, coupled with dramatic cuts to research funding for universities, NGOs, and the private sector, may end up discouraging an entire generation of young people from studying climate change. Whatever the EPA decides about the endangerment finding, the process is almost certain to drag on, involve multiple court cases, and make its way to the Supreme Court – by which point, the damage may already be done. Dismantling the world's most prodigious climate-research programme threatens to harm Americans – and everyone else.

A game-changer for obesity in India

WHILE THE LONG-TERM USE OF TIRZEPATIDE IS STILL BEING STUDIED, CURRENT EVIDENCE SUPPORTS IT AS AN EFFECTIVE OPTION FOR PEOPLE WHO HAVEN'T SUCCEEDED WITH LIFESTYLE CHANGES ALONE

According to the National Family Health Survey 5 (2022), 23% of Indian women and 22.1% of men are overweight based on Body Mass Index (BMI). Abdominal obesity affects upto 40% women and 12% of men, significantly increasing the risk of diabetes, hypertension, cardiovascular issues, sleep apnea, and joint problems. Historically, treatment options in India have been limited to lifestyle changes and older medications like Orlistat, which have shown only modest results.

That landscape is changing with the launch of Mounjaro (Tirzepatide) in India in March 2025 as a once-a-week subcutaneous injection. Known for aiding weight loss of up to 22%, Mounjaro is considered one of the most significant medical developments since the COVID-19 vaccine. First approved by the USFDA in May 2022 for type 2 diabetes and in November 2023 for weight management, it now enters the Indian market with nearly 18 months of global usage data.

Why the delay in India? India's delayed rollout was mainly due to global supply shortages, with manufacturers prioritizing established markets. Additionally, efforts

were made to price it affordably and make it easily available for Indian consumers.

What makes Tirzepatide unique? Tirzepatide's edge lies in its dual-action mechanism, targeting both GLP-1 and GIP receptors, unlike other medications such as liraglutide (marketed as Saxenda) and semaglutide (marketed as Ozempic/Wegovy), which act only on GLP-1 receptors. Tirzepatide promotes weight loss by suppressing appetite and promoting satiety by means of its effect on hypothalamus in brain; slowing the emptying of food from stomach thereby increasing the sense of fullness; improving insulin action and metabolism by reduction off at storage, stimulation of fat breakdown and by reducing cravings for high calorie and high fat foods.

Older weight-loss drugs typically yield a 5-8% weight reduction, and injectable semaglutide (Ozempic/Wegovy) averages about 15%. Tirzepatide, on the other hand, can help users lose up to 22%—comparable to the 25-30% loss seen with bariatric surgery. This makes it a vital option for people struggling with weight despite consistent diet and exercise.

The SURMOUNT trials re-

vealed that after 72 weeks, once-a-week 5mg users lost 15% of bodyweight; once-a-week 10mg users lost 19.5%; once-a-week 15mg users lost 20.9%; and placebo group (just adhering to diet & Lifestyle modification) lost just 3.1% of bodyweight.

Beyond weight loss, these new-generation drugs also support diabetes management—lowering HbA1C by 1.5-2.4% over 40-52 weeks, according to SURPASS trials. They additionally offer benefits for heart and liver health protection.

Tirzepatide also showed efficacy in treating obstructive sleep apnea (OSA)—a condition linked to snoring, daytime fatigue, and lethargy. In December 2024, it became the first drug till date approved by the USFDA specifically for OSA. In India, the drug is sold in vial form, making it roughly 80% cheaper than the pen form available in the US.

Gastrointestinal symptoms like nausea, diarrhoea, and constipation are relatively common, found in 31%, 23% and 17% of the participants in the clinical trials respectively; but are usually mild and temporary. Only 4-7% of participants stopped treatment due to side effects. To reduce discomfort, the drug is typically initiated at a low dose

followed by gradual increment.

However, Tirzepatide is not recommended for individuals with a history of medullary thyroid cancer or pancreatitis. Rapid weight loss may also increase the risk of gallbladder complications, such as gallstones & Cholecystitis, reported in about 0.6% of participants.

A 2024 study found that participants who stopped taking Tirzepatide regained about 14% of lost weight within a year. In contrast, those who continued using it lost an additional 5.5% over the same period. This raises an ongoing question: How long should treatment continue?

While the long-term use of Tirzepatide is still being studied, current evidence supports it as an effective option for people who haven't succeeded with lifestyle changes alone. It represents a major advancement in the fight against obesity and related health issues, with benefits far outweighing the risks. As with all new treatments, ongoing monitoring and research will be essential to maximise benefits and ensure safety.

Bangalore, April 23: Expressing concern over the widening gap between the number of NEET aspirants and available medical seats, the Karnataka government Wednesday urged the National Medical Commission (NMC) to significantly increase undergraduate medical seats across the country.

Speaking at the graduation ceremony of the 2019 batch of Sri Atal Bihari Vajpayee Medical College and Research Institute (SABVMC), minister for medical education and skill development Sharan Prakash Patil, said over five lakh students appear for the NEET examination every year, but only around one lakh medical seats are available.

"This disparity needs immediate attention. The doctors we train in India are not just for our country, but for the world," he said, pointing to the rigorous training and high demand for Indian medical professionals globally.

"There is a stark mismatch between demand and availability. The NMC must intervene," he said, addressing NMC chair-

person Dr BN Gangadhara, who was present at the event.

According to Patil, a formal proposal has already been sent to the NMC seeking approval for an additional 800 undergraduate and 600 postgraduate medical seats in Karnataka starting this academic year. Reiterating the state's commitment to expanding healthcare infrastructure, the minister emphasised the government's plan to establish a medical college in every district.

"Each of these colleges will be equipped with a hospital and we aim to set up cancer care units, trauma centres and super-specialty hospitals in every district," he said.

"The chief minister has approved this initiative. Soon, districts without medical colleges will have fully equipped institutions, allowing deserving students from economically weaker sections to pursue medicine at government expense," he added.

NMC chairperson Dr Gangadhara, in his address highlighted the global shortage of nearly three crore doctors and encouraged the younger generation to take up medical careers.

PAHALGAM ATTACK Security beefed up at India-Nepal border in UP's Maharajganj

Maharajganj, April 23: Security has been heightened along the India-Nepal border in Sonauli here in the wake of the terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam, officials said Wednesday.

The Uttar Pradesh Police, Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), and intelligence agencies are working in tandem to prevent the possible movement of terrorists, and strict identity checks are now mandatory at all border crossings. Superintendent of Police (SP) Somenendra Meena said.

Saplings planted on 310 acres of land using Miyawaki method

Lucknow/Mathura (UP), April 23: On the occasion of Earth Day Tuesday, the Uttar Pradesh government said that saplings have been planted on 310 acres of land using the Miyawaki method, known for creating dense, fast-growing forests.

The Miyawaki technique, developed by Japanese botanist Akira Miyawaki in the 1970s, is a revolutionary method for creating dense forests in limited spaces. Often referred to as the "pot plantation" method, it involves planting saplings and shrubs close to one another to accelerate their growth, an official statement said.

In addition, afforestation is being undertaken on 32 acres of land under the 'Upvan' policy, which is expected to increase carbon dioxide absorption by nearly 30 times, it added.

To tackle plastic pollution, one of the most hazardous components of urban waste, the state government has launched a campaign to construct roads

using plastic waste.

A target has been set to build approximately 1,500 km of roads by incorporating single-use plastic, which is expected to re-purpose around 2,000 tonnes of waste, the statement said.

Speaking to PTI on the sidelines of an Earth Day event in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh minister of state in charge of forest and environment, Arun Kumar Saxena, said, "People should install rooftop solar panels in their homes, and make an effort to save electricity. Also, they should

use air-conditioners only when required."

Emphasising the importance of proper garbage disposal, he said, "Garbage should not be set afire. Rather, it should be segregated into biodegradable and non-biodegradable waste and then disposed of."

The minister informed reporters that the state government will launch a campaign in July to plant saplings for which preparations are on.

UP govt to link 7,500 rural groups to silk production

Lucknow, April 23: The Uttar Pradesh government has set an ambitious target to boost silk production by connecting 7,500 rural groups to the State Rural Livelihood Mission in the 2025-26 action plan, an official statement said Wednesday.

To boost silk production, the state government has devised a focused strategy for intensive implementation across 15 districts during this financial year, it said.

These districts will get support for training, adopting modern technology, and financial assistance to help silk producers compete globally. This initiative aims to blend traditional industries with innovation, strengthening the rural economy and promoting sustainable livelihoods.



An agreement has already been signed between the State Rural Livelihood Mission and the Silk Department to increase women's participation in silk production. Under this agreement, a target has been set to connect 50,000 members of 5,000 women's groups with silk production in the next five years, the statement said.

Seeds, equipment, and marketing support will be provided to the groups associated with silk production, which

will help increase their income. The step will also help promote silk production under the ODOP (One District, One Product) scheme, giving a new identity to the state's traditional artisans.

The state's annual silk production is 400 metric tonnes, while its consumption has reached 3,500 metric tonnes. Varanasi, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's parliamentary constituency and a key centre under the ODOP scheme, has the highest demand for silk.

For making the state self-reliant in silk production, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has launched the Mukhyamantri Resham Vikas Yojana this year.

Silk exports from the state have grown 28-fold over the past eight years, and this scheme aims to further elevate silk production to new heights.

K'TAKA ROAD RAGE CASE

DK Shivakumar assures justice to bike rider

Bangalore, April 23: Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar spoke to Vikas Kumar, the local bike rider, in connection with the road rage case involving the Wing Commander of the Indian Air Force (IAF) and assured him of justice.

Taking to the social media platform X, Shivakumar stated, "I called and consoled Vikas Kumar, the Kannadiga who was assaulted in connection with the Nagavarpalya incident. If Kannadigas are in trouble, the Karnataka government will stand by them; we are committed to ensuring that the culprits are brought to justice."

A statement from the office of the Dy CM said, "Shivakumar offered Kumar words of encouragement. He assured justice would be ensured in this case and told him there is no need to fear anything."

The road rage incident involved IAF Wing Commander Shiladitya Bose and Vikas Kumar, a biker who is a call centre employee. Kumar was arrested after Bose posted a video on social media claiming that he was attacked for not speaking Kannada.

However, later the CCTV footage revealed Bose overpowering Kumar, banging, kicking, and punching him. Following the surfacing of the video, Kumar was released on bail. The FIR has been filed against the Wing Commander under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita Sections 109 (attempt to murder), 115(2) (voluntarily causing hurt), 304 (snatching forcefully), 324 (mischief), and 352 (intentional insult to provoke breach of peace).

The Indian Air Force (IAF), responding to the incident involving the brutal assault of a bike rider by a Wing Commander, described the incident as "unfortunate" and assured full cooperation with local authorities in the investigation.

In its official statement, the IAF said, "An unfortunate incident, involving an IAF officer, took place in Bangalore (April 21). The IAF is assisting the local authorities in investigating and following up the case to its lawful resolution."

What is TRF, the group that said it attacked tourists?



Kashmir Resistance, also known as The Resistance Front (TRF), has claimed responsibility for Tuesday's attack on tourists in Indian-administered Kashmir, the deadliest incident of its kind in India since the 2008 shootings in Mumbai. Here are some facts about the group. WHAT IS TRF? TRF emerged in 2019 and is considered an offshoot of the Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), according to the South Asia Terrorism Portal, a Delhi-based think tank. Indian security officials said TRF uses the name Kashmir Resistance on social media and online forums, where it claimed responsibility for Tuesday's attack in Indian Kashmir's Pahalgam area. Lashkar-e-Taiba, listed as a foreign terrorist organisation by the United States, is the Islamist group accused of plotting attacks in India and in the West, including the three-day assault on Mumbai in November 2008. "This is basically a front of the LeT. These are groups which have been created over the last years, particularly when Pakistan was under pressure from the Financial Action Task Force and they were trying to create a pattern of denial that they were involved in terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir," said Aaj Sahni, head of the South Asia Terrorism Portal.

WHAT HAS THE GROUP DONE? The group has not previously had any large incidents attributed to it, according to Sahni. "All TRF operations are essentially LeT operations. There will be some measure of operational freedom as to where they hit on the ground, but the sanction would have come from the LeT," Sahni said.

WHAT DOES INDIA SAY ABOUT TRF? India's interior ministry told parliament in 2023 that the group had been involved in the planning of killings of security force personnel and civilians in Jammu and Kashmir. The group also co-ordinated the recruitment of militants and the smuggling of weapons and narcotics across the border, the ministry said. As per the Intelligence officials TRF had also been issuing online threats against pro-India groups for the past two years.

WHAT DOES PAKISTAN SAY? Pakistan has denied that it supports and funds militants in Kashmir, saying it offers only moral and diplomatic support. REUTERS

'Terrorism contradicts Islam's policy of peace'

Prominent Muslim organisations Wednesday strongly condemned the Pahalgam terror attack, with the Jamiat Ulema-e-Hind asserting that it is wrong to give a religious colour to the incident as terrorism is a "cancer" that contradicts Islam's policy of promoting peace. The All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) condemned the terror attack and decided to pause its ongoing protest programmes against the new Waqf law for three days, starting Wednesday, in solidarity with the victims' families. As a mark of solidarity with the bereaved families, the board has suspended its campaign against the "controversial amendments" to the Waqf Act for three days, it said. S Q R Ilyas, national convener of the Majlis-e-Amal for the protection of Waqf under the AIM-PLB, said in a statement. Therefore, the board has decided to suspend its protest programmes under the Waqf Protection Campaign for three days as an expression of mourning and sympathy for the victims' families. Imam Umer Ahmed Ilyas, the head of the All India Muslim Organisation, said the imams of more than 5.5 lakh mosques in the country will give a strong message against terrorism, along with praying for the victims of the Pahalgam terror attack, during the Friday prayers this week.

Valley sees 1st shutdown in 35 years

A wave of protests swept J&K and other states Wednesday against the Pahalgam massacre, with political parties as well as religious and social organisations asserting that such acts were against Islamic teachings and calling for unity in the face of the challenge posed by terrorists and their backers

Srinagar, April 23: Kashmir valley observed a shutdown against a terror attack for the first time in 35 years Wednesday as organisations from all walks of life supported the bandh call to protest the killings in Pahalgam tourist resort, officials said. Terrorists struck at a prime tourist location in Pahalgam in south Kashmir Tuesday, killing at least 26 people, mostly tourists, and injuring several others. Security has been beefed up across the valley, especially at vital tourist spots. Most of the shops, fuel stations and other business establishments were shut in Srinagar, the officials said. They said only shops dealing in essential commodities were

open across the city. Public transport was also sparse, but private vehicles were plying normally, they added. Private schools were also shut across the valley, but government schools were open, the officials said. The effect of the shutdown was also witnessed in the other district headquarters of the valley, they said. Peaceful protests were also held at several places in the valley, with the protesters denouncing the attack. They called for stopping the

Travel agents in J&K said most of the tourists were leaving the valley due to fear. "We know tourists have by and large been safe in Kashmir but with such an incident happening here, one cannot expect them to stay back. The cancellations are massive, close to 80 per cent," Aijaz Ali, a travel operator from Srinagar, said. He said there were cancellations of packages even for next one month. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said it was "heartbreaking" to see the exodus of tourists. He has called for a special cabinet meeting Wednesday evening to discuss the impact of the dev-

astating strike on tourism, the main stay of the economy in Kashmir. In the national capital, travel agencies reported that nearly 90 per cent bookings for Kashmir have been cancelled, while some tourists are negotiating to shift their plans to alternative destinations. Tourism industry leaders in Kolkata, a key hub in eastern India for travel to J&K, claimed that the incident could undo years of recovery and growth in the Kashmir valley. Union Tourism Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat said that his ministry will do the best to "minimise" the dent on tourism in J&K in the wake of the Pahalgam attack. Interacting with reporters in Delhi, Shekhawat said he and his office are in "continuous touch" with the chief secretary and the tourism secretary of the Union Territory and keeping an eye on the situation. Meanwhile, the Civil Aviation Ministry has asked airlines to ensure there is no surge in airfares on the Srinagar route, and airlines will be operating additional flights to the city. Air India and IndiGo will operate a total of four additional flights from Srinagar to the national capital and Mumbai Wednesday. Airlines have also waived ticket rescheduling and cancellation charges.

The striking act of protest by the newspapers, each bearing powerful headlines in white or red, was a powerful public display of solidarity and grief, symbolising the collective sorrow felt by the residents and the media over the inhuman act. The change in format by leading English and Urdu dailies, including Greater Kashmir, Rising Kashmir, Kashmir Uzma, Aftab and Taameel Irshad, serves as a stark reminder of



the violence that has plagued the region for decades. "Gruesome: Kashmir Gutted, Kashmiris Grieving", screamed the headline of leading English daily Greater Kashmir in white



on a black layout, followed by the subhead "26 killed in deadly terror attack in Pahalgam" in red. The paper's front-page editorial with the headline "The massacre in the meadow - Protect Kashmir's soul" said the attack has cast a dark shadow over J&K, a region striving to reclaim its legacy as a "Paradise on Earth". "This heinous act is not merely an assault on innocent lives but a deliberate blow to Kashmir's identity and values - its hospitality, its economy, and its fragile peace. Kashmir's soul stands in unequivocal condemnation of this brutality and offers heartfelt condolences to the victims' families, who sought beauty but found tragedy," the editorial said.

TERROR TRAGEDY SHAKES NATION

Terrorists targeted male tourists after asking their religion

The daughter of a businessman from Pune killed in the terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam has claimed that terrorists specifically targeted male tourists after asking them to identify their religion. Two businessmen from Maharashtra's Pune, Santosh Jagdale and Kaustubh Ganbote, sustained gunshot wounds in the dastardly terrorist attack in Pahalgam Tuesday and later succumbed, officials said. Terrorists asked an LIC manager from Indore, who belonged to the Christian community, to recite the 'Kalma' before shooting him dead, his relatives claimed Wednesday and demanded harshest punishment for the assailants.

Par panel on Home calls off tour of J&K

A key parliamentary panel has called off its scheduled tour of Jammu and Kashmir from April 25 following the terror attack on tourists in Pahalgam in order to avoid diverting the focus of the security agencies, which are currently fully engaged in handling the situation. The Standing Committee on Home Affairs headed by BJP MP Radha Mohan Das Agrawal was to go on a study tour of Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh, both Union territories, from April 25 to May 1, official sources said. However, Agrawal conveyed to the members of the panel the decision to defer the tour after the terror attack in which at least 26 persons were shot dead by terrorists.


J&K govt announces ₹10 lakh ex-gratia

Delhi court issues non-bailable warrant against Medha Patkar

Delhi court Wednesday issued a non-bailable warrant against Narmada Bachao Andolan leader Medha Patkar and said she "deliberately" flouted its order to submit probation bonds and deposit ₹1 lakh fine in a defamation case of Delhi LG V K Saxena.

Observing her plea for adjournment was "frivolous and mischievous" and filed with the intent to "hoodwink" it, the court cautioned Patkar against her action saying it could make it "reconsider the benevolent sentence".

Additional sessions judge Vishal Singh said, "Instead of appearing before the court to comply with the order on sentence dated April 8, the convict (Patkar) is absent and has deliberately failed to comply with the order on sentence and to avail of the benefit of probation subject to furnishing of the compensation amount." The court went on, "The intention of the convict is apparent that she is deliberately violating the court order; she is avoiding appearing before the court and also avoiding accepting the terms of the sentence passed against her. There is no order of suspension of sentence passed by this court April 8."

Supreme Court Wednesday invoked Article 142 of the Constitution to protect 250 students from facing hurdles in education due to the shifting of their institute's campus.

Article 142 of the Constitution empowers the top court to pass any decree or order necessary for doing "complete justice" in any case or matter pending before it. A bench of Justices B R Gavai and Augustine George Masih was dealing with a matter related to a property in Mangaluru from where a hotel management institute was run.

"Faced with the difficulty that on the one hand the appellant has to vacate the present premises and on the other hand, the campus where it is proposing to relocate its institute, is not ready, the appellant is required to shift its institute at a temporary location," the bench said.

The verdict went on, "We find that this is a fit case wherein this court should exercise its extraordinary jurisdiction under Article 142 of the Constitution of India to meet the ends of justice. If we fail to exercise the said power, the career of about 250 students would be jeopardised."

According to a settlement agreement arrived at between the property owner and the institute, the latter was required to vacate the property on or before April 30, 2025.

Potentially 315 million people in India could be exposed to environmental risks arising from rivers contaminated with antibiotics, according to the study, which measured amounts of 21 antibiotics at 877 locations globally

New Delhi, April 23: Eighty per cent of total length of India's rivers could be posing environmental and health risks due to antibiotic pollution, a study has estimated.

Along with India, Nigeria, Ethiopia, Vietnam, and Pakistan are among the countries facing similar risks due to pollution from antibiotics, the research, published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences (PNAS) Nexus, said. Researchers from McGill University, Canada, explained that antibiotics -- they help fight bacterial diseases

-- are not completely metabolised while passing through the body, nor completely destroyed or removed by most wastewater treatment facilities.

Potentially 315 million people in India could be exposed to environmental risks arising from rivers contaminated with antibiotics, according to the study, which measured amounts of 21 antibiotics at 877 locations globally. Findings highlight the need for appropriate wastewater management plans and improving current practices, the team said.

Regulations and guidelines on use of antibiotics also need to be updated, with a particular



focus on high-risk substances and locations that pose the greatest risk, they said. Most high-risk areas were noted to coincide with places where antibiotics are readily available without prescription and are sometimes used preventively.

Previous studies have estimated human consumption of antibiotics to have increased by 65 per cent between 2000 and 2015. For this study, the researchers analysed the 'RiverATLAS' dataset. The global network of RiverATLAS contains 8,477,883 individual river reaches (or segments), representing about 36 million kilometres of the world's rivers. The dataset is maintained by McGill University.

The team estimated that in a year, people consume around 29,200 tonnes of the 40 most used antibiotics -- about a third of the amount enters the world's rivers and 11 per cent

enters oceans and lakes, after metabolism and wastewater treatment. Further, six million kilometres of rivers around the world could be exposed to antibiotic levels exceeding thresholds that protect ecosystems, with major contributions from amoxicillin, ceftriaxone, and cefixime, the authors said.

Cefixime, which helps treat bronchitis among others, was found to be the substance contributing the most to pollution in rivers in India. The team also predicted high antibiotic levels in regions already affected by antibiotic resistance, including south and southeast Asia.

DOZENS HURT JUMPING FROM BUILDINGS

POWERFUL QUAKE SHAKES ISTANBUL



Istanbul, April 23: More than 150 people were injured when they jumped from buildings in Istanbul Wednesday as one of the strongest quakes in years hit the city. Many people gathered in parks and others sat on doorsteps, or stood outside their homes in the centre of Istanbul as aftershocks from the magnitude 6.2 quake on the European side of the city continued to be felt.

"It started with a big tremor all of a sudden and we felt it very strongly," said Istanbul resident Neslisah Aygoren, sitting in a park. "I ran straight to my dog in fear, hugged it and we waited for it to end, lying on the ground. After that, we took our belongings and went straight to the street."

A total of 151 people were hurt and received hospital treatment after leaping from buildings in panic during the tremor but none were in a critical condition, the Istanbul governor's office said. It said one abandoned building collapsed in central Istanbul, but nobody was hurt there, while there was no damage to energy or water infrastructure in the city of 16 million on the European and Asian shores of the Bosphorus Strait. Some shops closed. Two years ago Turkey suffered the deadliest and most destructive earthquake in its

modern history. That 7.8-magnitude quake in February 2023 killed more than 55,000 people and injured more than 107,000 in southern Turkey and northern Syria. Hundreds of thousands of people remain displaced, with many still living in temporary housing as a result of that quake. The latest tremor also revived memories of a 1999 earthquake near Istanbul that killed 17,000. The epicentre of Wednesday's quake, which hit at 12:49 pm, was in the area of Silivri some 80 km (50 miles) to the west of Istanbul. It was at a depth of 6.92 km (4.3 miles), Turkey's AFAD disaster agency said. Transport Minister Abdulkadir Uraloglu said inspections did not reveal any damage to highways, airports, trains or subways. President Tayyip Erdogan said on X he was monitoring the situation and his office issued advice on what people should do in the case of further quakes.

Dialysis patients struggle to get treatment in blockaded Gaza

Deir Al-Balah (Gaza Strip), April 23: Twice a week, 54-year-old Mohamed Attiya's wheelchair rattles over the battered streets of Gaza as he makes his way to Shifa Hospital in the north of Gaza City. There, he undergoes dialysis to treat the kidney failure he has lived with for nearly 15 years. But the treatment he receives now, shortened and infrequent due to war and a lack of medical supplies, is far from enough. "It just brings you back from death," says Attiya, a father of six. His story is one of hundreds. According to Gaza's Health

Ministry, over 400 dialysis patients—nearly 40% of all such patients in the territory—have died since the war began 18 months ago. These are not the highly visible casualties of bombings or airstrikes, but slow, preventable deaths caused by the collapse of Gaza's health care system under the weight of conflict and blockade. The situation has worsened dramatically since March, when Israel sealed off the territory, halting imports of food, medical supplies, and fuel. Israeli officials say the blockade is meant to pressure Hamas into releasing hostages. However, the consequences for ordinary civilians have been devastat-



ing. Among them are kidney patients like Attiya, whose survival depends on regular, reliable treatment. Dialysis is a life-sustaining process that removes waste and excess fluid from the blood, something damaged kidneys can no longer do. Patients typically need three sessions a

once walked to his hospital treatments, but the limited dialysis and high cost of mineral water have weakened him so much that he now depends on a wheelchair. "There is no transportation. Streets are damaged. Life is difficult and expensive," he says. Dr Ghazi al-Yazigi, head of nephrology at Shifa Hospital, confirmed that at least 417 patients have died from inadequate dialysis since the war began. Patients suffer complications such as high toxin levels and fluid buildup, which can be fatal without proper care. Mohamed Kamel, another patient, began dialysis only recently after developing kidney failure during the war. "I feel no improvement after each session," he says. With no access to filtered water and missed appointments due to bombings, his health continues to decline. For these patients, survival is not only about war — it's about whether they can get to a hospital, find clean water, and stay alive between sessions

WB lowers FY26 growth forecast

New Delhi, April 23: The World Bank Wednesday lowered India's growth forecast for the current fiscal by 4 percentage points to 6.3 per cent amid global economic weakness and policy uncertainty.

In its previous estimate, the World Bank had projected India's growth at 6.7 per cent for the fiscal year 2025-26.



In India, growth in FY24/25 disappointed because of slower growth in private investment and public capital expenditures that did not meet government targets, the World Bank said in its twice-yearly regional outlook.

"In India, growth is expected to slow from 6.5 per cent in FY24/25 to 6.3 per cent as in FY25/26 as the benefits to private investment from monetary easing and regulatory streamlining are expected to be offset by global economic weakness and policy uncertainty," said its South Asia Development

Update, Taxing Times. The World Bank report said the benefits to private investment from monetary easing and regulatory streamlining are expected to be offset by global economic weakness and policy uncertainty. "Private consumption is expected to benefit from tax cuts, and the improving implementation of public investment plans should boost government investment, but export demand will be constrained by shifts in trade policy and slowing global growth," it said.

It further said that amid increasing uncertainty in the global economy, South Asia's growth prospects have weakened, with projections downgraded in most countries in the region.

Stepping up domestic revenue mobilisation could help the region strengthen fragile fiscal positions and increase resilience against future shocks, it said. The Washington-headquartered multilateral agency has projected regional growth to slow to 5.8 per cent in 2025, 0.4 percentage points below October projections before ticking up to 6.1 per cent in 2026.

Luxury items above ₹10L to attract 1% TCS

New Delhi, April 23: Handbags, wrist watches, footwear and sports-wear, priced above Rs 10 lakh will now attract 1 per cent Tax Collected at Source (TCS), as per a notification issued by the Income Tax department.

TCS at 1 per cent rate is currently being levied on motor vehicles costing above Rs 10 lakh effective January 1, 2025.

The Income Tax department April 22 notified the list of specified luxury goods and collectibles on which 1 per cent TCS will apply henceforth.

The list includes wrist watches, art objects such as paintings, sculptures, and antiques, collectible items including coins and stamps, yachts, helicopters, luxury handbags, sunglasses, footwear, high-end sportswear and equipment, home theatre systems, and horses intended for racing or polo.



TCS is collected from the buyer at the time of sale of specified goods and can be adjusted against the tax liability of the purchaser at the time of filing of I-T returns.

TCS does not garner any additional revenue, but helps the tax department to trace high value spending as PAN details have to be submitted at the time of purchase.

The TCS provision for luxury goods as well as motor vehicles

costing above Rs 10 lakh was introduced via Finance Act, 2024, as part of the Budget presented in July, 2024.

The obligation to collect TCS shall be on the seller in respect of the notified goods such as wrist watches, art objects such as paintings, sculptures, and antiques, collectible items including coins and stamps, yachts, helicopters, luxury handbags, sunglasses, footwear, high-end sportswear and equipment, home theatre systems, and horses intended for racing or polo.

Nangia Andersen LLP Tax Partner Sandeep Jhunjhunwala, said this notification operationalises the government's intent to enhance monitoring of high-value discretionary expenditure and strengthen the audit trail in the luxury goods segment.

It reflects a broader policy objective of expanding the tax base and promoting greater financial transparency.

Surge in export orders pushes business growth

Bangalore, April 23: India's private sector growth rose to an eight-month high in April fueled by robust demand, particularly a surge in foreign orders for manufactured goods, according to a survey, but business confidence showed some signs of softening.

While the latest data underscores a vibrant start to the fiscal year for India's economy, the souring outlook will make it challenging to maintain momentum at a time when US President Donald Trump's tariffs have hurt business sentiment.

The HSBC flash India Composite Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI), compiled by S&P Global, climbed to 60.0, up from 59.5 in March, the strongest



pace of combined manufacturing and services growth since August. The 50-mark separates growth from contraction.

Manufacturing growth underpinned the strong performance, with the index rising to 58.4 from 58.1 and reaching a level not seen in a year. The services PMI index also showed solid growth, rising to a four-month high of 59.1 from 58.5 last month.

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Athletes demand end of sporting ties with Pak

New Delhi, April 23: India's sporting fraternity oscillated between grief and rage as it joined the nation in condemning the deadly terrorist attack in Pahalgam with some demanding that the country should cut all sports ties with Pakistan.

On Tuesday, terrorists opened fire at a prime tourist location in south Kashmir's Pahalgam, killing at least 26 civilians and injuring several others. The Resistance Front (TRF), a shadow group of the banned Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terror group, has claimed responsibility for the attack.

Sachin Tendulkar and Virat Kohli expressed shock as they mourned the loss of lives.

"The affected families must be going through an unimaginable ordeal - India and the world stand united with them at this dark hour, as we mourn the loss of lives and pray for justice," Tendulkar wrote.

"Heartfelt condolences to the families of the victims. Praying for peace and strength to families all those who lost their lives and justice to be served for their cruel act," Kohli posted on his Instagram.

Former India cricketer Shreevats Goswami wrote a strongly-worded post, demanding an end to all sporting ties with Pakistan.

"And this is exactly why I say - you don't play cricket with Pakistan. Not now. Not ever. When BCCI or the government refused to send India to the Champions Trophy in Pakistan, some had the audacity to say, 'Oh, but sport should rise above politics'," Goswami wrote.

"...murdering innocent Indians seems to be Pakistan's national sport and India should respond with zero tolerance and not with bats and balls,"

While India has not played bilateral cricket with Pakistan since 2012-13, and the BCCI declined to send its team for the Champions Trophy earlier this year, other Indian teams have continued to travel to Pakistan for international events.

"And now... this bloodshed again. It breaks something inside you. It makes you question how many more times we're expected to stay silent, stay 'sporting,' while our people die. No more. Not this time," he added.

Expressing his grief and anger over the incident, World champion powerlifter Mahant Gaurav Sharma said, "I am deeply shocked by the tragic loss of innocent lives in the gruesome terror attack at Pa-

maintain any form of sporting ties. Enough is enough; strong and uncompromising action is needed," he asserted.

On Wednesday, BCCI Vice-President Rajeev Shukla also addressed whether India and Pakistan will continue to face off in ICC events. "India and Pakistan do not play bilateral series, and we will continue to do what the Government tells us to do," Shukla said.

Indian cricket team head coach and former BJP MP Gautam Gambhir wrote: "Praying for the families of the deceased. Those responsible for this will pay. India will strike."

Olympic gold medallist duo of javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra and Abhinav Bindra prayed for the victims.

"Heartbroken by the tragic attack in Jammu & Kashmir. Prayers for the victims and their families," Chopra wrote. "Heartbroken by the horrific

terrorist attack in Pahalgam. My thoughts are with the victims and their families. Terror has no place in our world, we must stand united against hatred and violence," Bindra added.

The attack is the deadliest terrorist act in the valley since the 2019 Pulwama strike.

Olympic medal-winning former hockey goalkeeper PR Sreejesh, shuttler Saina Nehwal and two-time world champion boxer Nikhat Zareen also called for justice.

"Condemnation is not enough, justice must follow. Our hearts bleed for Pahalgam. Terror must never win. Prayers for all affected in the Pahalgam attack," Sreejesh wrote.

Political tensions between the countries have led to the Indian team avoiding travel to Pakistan since 2008, while the two have not played each other outside of men's major tournaments since 2013.

Hitman fires again

Mumbai Indians pulverise hapless Sunrisers Hyderabad by seven wickets to record fourth win on the trot

Hyderabad, April 23: A rampant Mumbai Indians rode on Rohit Sharma's (70) second consecutive fifty to pulverise a hapless Sunrisers Hyderabad by seven wickets in their Indian Premier League match here Wednesday.

Mumbai Indians' fourth win on the trot, which took them to the third spot from the earlier sixth on the points table, came after SRH posted a below-par 143/8 and Rohit making the most of the perfect batting conditions to score 70 off 46 balls (8x4s, 3x6s).

MI scored 146/3 in 15.4 overs to win the match with 26 balls to spare, with Suryakumar Yadav hitting a 19-ball 40 not out (5x4s, 2x6s).

The fate of the contest was all but sealed when SRH crumbled to 35/5 following an embarrassing collapse. Despite Heinrich Klaasen's 71 and Abhinav Manohar's 43, the hosts did not have enough runs on the board to challenge MI's batting might.

The five-time winners recorded their third consecutive win while chasing, having drubbed Chennai Super Kings by nine wickets last Sunday.

It was also their second win over SRH in the season, having beaten them by four wickets last week in Mumbai.

Earlier, Klaasen's measured 71 and Manohar's 43 rescued a listless SRH from a terrible start and guided them to 143/8.

Klaasen struck nine fours and two sixes for his 44-ball 71, putting on 99 runs for the sixth wicket with impact substitute Abhinav Manohar, who played a steady second fiddle with his 37-ball 43 (2x4s, 3x6s).

But it was a harrowing start for SRH who are placed second-last on the points table and face an uphill battle to keep themselves alive.

The lack of confidence was evident when SRH's top-order crumbled without any apparent pressure from the bowlers.

Instead of putting pressure on the MI bowlers, SRH pre-



sented a meek batting show, which was compounded by a reckless decision from Ishan Kishan (1) who walked back despite not having edged one behind the stumps.

PSG script history with unbeaten streak

Nantes: Paris Saint-Germain made history with their unbeaten run in Ligue 1 with a 1-1 draw against FC Nantes at Stade de la Beaujoire. PSG have not lost any of their last 39 away matches in Ligue 1 (30 wins, nine draws), marking the longest unbeaten away streak by any club in the history of the top five European leagues, surpassing AC Milan's run of 38 from 1991 to 1993. The opening goal of the contest came midway in the 33rd minute with Vitinha breaking the scoreless deadlock. Vitinha played the ball out to the right for Ousmane Dembélé, who accelerated and found Kang-in Lee in the middle.

Barcelona increase Spanish league lead

Madrid: Dani Olmo scored early in the second half as Barcelona defeated Mallorca 1-0 to increase its Spanish league lead. The home win Tuesday gave the Catalan club a seven-point lead over Real Madrid, which visits Getafe Wednesday. Barcelona, seeking its first league title since 2023, has five league games left. Olmo's winner came a minute into the second half at Montjuic stadium, with the playmaker finding the net from inside the area. It was the third consecutive victory for Barcelona in the league. The Catalan side had 40 attempts on goal, while Mallorca had only four - none on target.

Humpy wins FIDE Women's Grand Prix chess meet

Pune, April 23: Indian Grandmaster Koneru Humpy won the FIDE Women's Grand Prix 2024-25 (Pune leg) title on the basis of her superior tie-breaks over Zhu Jiner of China after the two players were tied for the top spot here Wednesday.

Humpy, who regained the women's World Rapid Chess Championship after a gap of five years in New York in December last, beat Bulgarian player Nurgul Salimova in the ninth and final round game to end on seven points, the same as Jiner who beat Russia's Polina Shuvalova.

"Humpy Koneru and Zhu Jin-

er both won their final round games and ended the FIDE Women's Grand Prix tied for first, but it's Humpy who takes the top spot thanks to superior tiebreaks!" wrote FIDE on 'X'.

On Tuesday, the penultimate round of the tournament, the duo were tied on six points. Humpy had survived a scare to hold Alina Kashlinskaya to a draw, while Jiner defeated India's Divya Deshmukh in a tactical battle in the sixth round.

In the other final round matches, India's R Vaishali was held to a draw by Georgia's Salome Melia, while Divya Deshmukh too shared the point with Poland's No 1 player Alina Kashlinskaya.



Richest-ever prize fund: Indian golf gets massive boost

New Delhi to host new \$4mn golf tournament at historic Delhi Golf Club

New Delhi, April 23: India's presence on the global golfing map is set for a major boost with the announcement of a new \$4 million tournament, the richest-ever prize fund for a professional golf event in the country.

Scheduled to be held from October 16-19 at the iconic Delhi Golf Club, the tournament is co-sanctioned by the international tour and the domestic

professional golf circuit, DP World Tour, and will play a key role in the final stretch of the 2025 Race to Dubai calendar.

This new championship signifies the growing importance of India not just as an emerging golfing destination but also as a serious sporting market. It follows the success of this year's Hero Indian Open and strengthens the region's momentum in hosting top-tier golf events.

The event also marks a nostalgic return to Delhi Golf Club for the global tour, with the last event held at the venue in 2016. Originally established in the 1930s, the historic Lodhi



Course, home to the first Indian Open in 1964, has undergone notable redesigns—most recently in 2019—to bring it up to modern championship standards.

Officials expressed excitement about the tournament's

potential to elevate the sport in India. The managing director for the host region highlighted the event as a testament to their long-term commitment to growing golf in the country.

"We are working to elevate

the game in every way and drive community impact. This tournament ensures that golf continues to evolve in exciting ways," he said.

The tour's chief tournament and operations officer echoed

the sentiment, noting that the addition of this event builds on a shared vision to grow the game in India. "We're thrilled to return to such an iconic venue and provide more playing opportunities for local and international professionals," he added.

The president of Delhi Golf Club, Raj Khosla, also welcomed the return of global golf to the venue. "This course offers a unique charm with ancient Lodhi-era monuments and city-centre access. It promises a great setting for international talent and local fans to come together," he remarked.
